DESERT SERIES DUB: The O's beat the Diamondbacks yesterday, 8-5, to win the rubber game of the three-game series after dropping the series opener on Friday...Marked the fifth straight series victory...Baltimore used a four-run sixth inning to re-take the lead after Arizona tied the game in the fifth...Seven Orioles starters reached base multiple times, including Cedric Mullins and Ramón Urias who both reached safely three times...Gunnar Henderson, Ryan O'Hearn, and Adley Rutschman all drove in a pair of runs.
$\theta_{s}$ The Orioles improved to 50-15(.769) when scoring first, the second-best record in MLB behind Atlanta (70-20, .778); despite not trailing, the O's still rank second in MLB with 2 comeback wins this season behe (83). - Baltimore is 12-7 in rubber matches this year after going 11-11 in such games in 2022

SOMETHING IN THE ORANGE: The O's have won eight of their last 11 games, 11 of 15,14 of 20, 19 of 28,22 of 32,28 of 42 , and 36 of $52 \ldots$ They've won five series in a row, six of seven series, and nine of 11 series...At 85-51 (.625), the Orioles have the best record in the AL and second-best the second straight year as they became the first team in the AL to clinch a winning record this season and second in MLB behind the Braves...The Birds are 36-16 (.692) since July 5, the best record in the AL and second-best in MLB during that time, behind only the Dodgers (3714, .725)...The team had a season-best eight-game winning streak from July 5-16, Baltimore's longest since a 10-gamer from July 3-13, 2022...The O's are 147-100 (.595) since June 2022, the second-best record in the AL and fourth-best in MLB during that time
$\theta_{\text {. }}$ The O's hold a 2.5-game lead over the Rays in the AL East.
9. Saturday's victory in Arizona was the team's $84^{\text {th }}$ of the year, surpassing last year's total; the Birds won their $83^{\text {rd }}$ game on August 29 vs. Chicago-AL
SWEEPLESS IN BALTIMORE: The Orioles have gone 83 consecutive series of at least two decisions (no ties) without being swept...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is tied for the fourth-longest streak in MLB history with the 1922-24 New York Yankees and trailing the 1942-44 St. Louis Cardinals (124), 1906-09 Chicago Cubs (115), and 1903-05 New York Giants (105)...Baltimore's current streak is the longest in O's history, ahead of 46 consecutive since May 13-15, 2022 at Detroit ( $0-3$ ) and not at home in a series of at least two sugust $27-29,2021 \mathrm{vs}$. Tampa Bay ( $0-3$ ).

STATING HIS CASE: Gunnar Henderson leads AL rookies with 4.7 bWAR, 3.2 fWAR, 80 runs, 50 extra-base hits, six triples, and nine game-winning RBI, while ranking among AL rookie leaders in home runs (T-1st, 22), RBI ( $1^{\text {stt }} 67$ ), total bases (T-1st, 214), hits ( $3^{\text {rd }}, 114$ ), walks ( $3^{\text {rd }}, 50$ ), and doubles ( $4^{\text {th }}, 22$ )...According to STATS, he ranks among qualified AL rookies in on-base percentage ( $3^{\text {rd }}, .329$ ), and slugging percentage ( $3^{\text {rd }}, .475$ ).
O. His 4.7 bWAR is tied for the second-best by a rookie in O's history (see box at right).
2. Henderson is the third rookie in team history to record $20+$ doubles, $5+$ triples, and 20+ homers, joining Cal Ripken, Jr. (1982) and Ron Hansen (1960), both of whom won AL Rookie of the Year.

0 THE PLACES YOU'LL GO: The Orioles began a nine-game road trip Friday night by taking two of three games in Arizona...The O's face Los Angeles-AL tonight through Wednesday and tour in as many road trips for Baltimore following August 11-20, which had stops in Seattle (21), San Diego (1-2), and Oakland (3-0)...The last two trips are tied for the second-longest of the season behind an 10-game expedition from April 27 to May 7 in Detroit (3-1), Kansas City (2-1) and Atlanta (1-2).
O. Baltimore is 43-25 (.632) away from Camden Yards this season, the best road record in the AL and second-best in MLB, behind Atlanta (46-24, .657); the .632 road winning percentage would be the second-best since the team moved to Baltimore in 1954 behind 1997 (52-29, .642), sixth-best in a full season by an AL club in the last 20 years
and the best since Minnesota (.679, 55-29) in 2019.
. The Orioles have scored 362 runs on the road this year, third-most in the AL and fifthmost in MLB; the 5.32 runs per game away from Oriole Park would be the fifth-highest mark on the road in O's history (since 1954) and the best since 2004 (5.33).

AGAINST THE ANGELS: The O's and Angels are meeting for the second and final time this season with a three-game set at Angel Stadium...The teams split a four-game set at Camden Yards from May 15-18...The Birds are 8-3 against the Halos since the start of last year, including sweeping a four-game
the Angels since 2003.

MAKING THEIR PITCH: The O's have a 3.63 ERA (202 ER/500.2 IP) since July 1, the third-best mark in MLB during that time behind Seattle (3.28) and Toronto (3.45)...The Orioles have gone 37-19 (.661) over that period, the second-best record in the AL and third-best in MLB... Baltimore posted a 4.33 ERA ( 346 ER/719.1 IP) through June, ranked $18^{\text {th }}$ in MLB.

BIG TIME RUTSCH: Adley Rutschman has reached safely 213 times on base ( 138 H, 73 BB, 2 HBP), the most by a primary catcher since Milwaukee's Yasmani Grandal reached safely 240 times ( 126 H, 109 BB, 5 HBP) in 2019, per STATS...His times on base this season are the secondmost by a primary catcher in O's history (since 1954), trailing only Javy López (236 in 2004).

MOUNT UP: Ryan Mountcastle has reached base safely in 37 of his last 39 starts since returning from the IL on July 9...He slashed .360/.444/.540(36-for-100) with three doubles, five homers, 17 runs scored, 19 RBI, 15 walks, one hit-by-pitch, and one stolen base in 27 games in August... He ranked among AL leaders last month in on-base percentage ( $\left.2^{\text {nd }}\right)$, batting average ( $3^{\text {ra }}$ ), and hits (T-4 $\left.4^{\text {th }}\right) \ldots$ Mountcastle had a career-high 28 -game on-base streak from July 21 to August 23, which was the longest by an Oriole since Nick Markakis had a 38-gamer from July 5 to August 18, 2009

His 1.087 OPS against left-handed pitching is the best in the AL and third-best amon MLB qualifiers behind Los Angeles-NL's Mookie Betts (1.158) and Miami's Jorge Sole 1.099).

THE SKIPPER: Brandon Hyde is one win shy of becoming the fifth Orioles skipper since the team moved to Baltimore in 1954 to reach 300 career managerial wins... He would join Ear Weaver ( 1,480 ), Buck Showalter
with 300 wins in an O's uniform.

OUICK HITS: Slated to make his $19^{\text {th }}$ start of the season, ninth on the road, and second career start against the Angels tonight...Recalled from Triple-A Norfolk on July 17, his second stint with the O's...Made his MLB debut on April 5 at Texas, becoming League Oriole to make his debut this season, the first O's pitcher to start his Majo to start his debut since Kevin Gausman (22-137) on May 23, 2013 at Toronto...Had his contract selected to the 40-man roster on November 15, 2022...Originally selected by the Orioles in the first round (No. 11 overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in his last outing on August 28 vs. Chicago-AL. Worked 6.0 scoreless innings on one hit with one walk and six strikeouts..The one hit allowed marked a career low...Completed at least 6.0 innings for the fourth consecutive start...Marked his second career scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings (6.1, 7/28 vs. NYY)...Threw 96 pitches, 62 strikes.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Making his second career start against the Angels tonight. Dealt the loss in his only career outing against the Los Angeles-AL on May 15 at Oriole Park...Allowed eight runs on a career-high nine hits ( 2 HR ) with three punchouts and three walks in 3.1 innings...Left with a runner on, who later scored...Threw 79 pitches, 47 strikes.

MIGRATING WEST: Slated to make his sixth career start against the AL West...Owns an 0-2 record with a 10.23 ERA(25 ER/22.0 IP) in his five career starting assignments against the division.

HITTING HIS STRIDE: Since being recalled from Triple-A Norfolk on July 17, Rodriguez has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 2.83 ERA (15 ER/47.2 IP), a 0.99 WHIP, and five quality starts in eight MLB outings...Entering today's games, he ranked among qualified AL starting pitchers during that span in opponent batting average (2nd .199), H/9 (2 $2^{\text {nd }}$ 6.23 ), opponent OPS (2 $2^{\text {nd }}, .535$ ), opponent slugging percentage ( $2^{\text {nd }}, .271$ ), ERA ( $6^{\text {th }}$ 2.83), and opponent on-base percentage ( $7^{\text {th }}, .264$ )...Tossed a career-high 7.0 innings on August 14 at San Diego, becoming the youngest O's hurler (23-271) to complete 7.0 frames since Dylan Bundy (23-261) on August 2, 2016 vs. Texas (7.0 IP, H, BB, 7K).

CLUB 100: Rodriguez has thrown 21 pitches of at least 100 mph this season, the most by an O's starter in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008); no other Orioles starting pitcher has thrown more than one such pitch, per Statcast...The 21 pitches are also the fourth-most among MLB starting pitchers entering today's games

THROWING GAS: Rodriguez threw the fastest strikeout pitch by an O's starter in the Statcast era(since 2015) on July 28 vs. New York-AL, fanning Anthony Rizzo on a 100.2 mph fastball...Now owns each of the 30 fastest strikeout pitches by Orioles starters this season...His strikeout of Rizzo was tied for the eighth-fastest punchout pitch among MLB rookie starters this season

HIGH QUALITY: Rodriguez has posted four straight quality starts, the longest such streak by an O's rookie since John Means' four-gamer from August 24 to September 11, 2019...The last O's rookie with a longer streak was Brad Bergesen with seven straight quality starts from June 26 to July 30, 2009...Notched his first career quality start on July 28 vs. New York-AL, becoming the youngest O's hurler (23-254) to do so since Miguel Castro (22-222) on August 3, 2017 vs. Detroit ( 6.0 IP, H, BB, 2 K)...Has allowed two earned runs-or-fewer in 10 of his first 18 career Major League starts.

PACKING A PUNCH: Rodriguez's 97 strikeouts through his first 18 career Major League starts are the second-most by an O's hurler in that span franchise history (since 1954), trailing Tom Phoebus (103)...Recorded a career-high nine punchouts on April 29 (G2) at Detroit, becoming the youngest 0's pitcher (23-164) to record nine-ormore strikeouts in a start since John Parrish(22-241) also fanned nine batters on July 24, 2000 vs. New York-AL

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Owned a 6-2 record with a 2.62 ERA (22 ER/75.2 IP) with 109 strikeouts in 17 starts between High-A Aberdeen, Double-A Bowie, and Norfolk.. Started the season with Norfolk and made his Triple-A debut on April 8 vs. Charlotte, allowing just one hit with seven strikeouts to one walk in 4.0 shutout innings...Spent time on the Injured List with a strained right lat muscle...Made three rehab starts one with Aberdeen and two with Bowie, pitching to a 7.50 ERA ( 5 ER/6.0 IP) with 11 strikeouts and five walks...Reassigned to Norfolk on September 11 and made his next start on September 16 vs. Charlotte, allowing two hits with four strikeouts to one walk in 5.0 scoreless innings...Allowed just two home runs across three levels in 2022.
