AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game homestand tonight with the second game of a three-game set vs. Seattle (1-0 thus far)...are 4-3 on the homestand after dropping two-of-three games vs. St. Louis, winning two-of-three games vs. Atlanta and winning their series opener against Seattle...following this homestand, will embark on a six-game road trip to Toronto (Fri.-Sun.) and Baltimore (8/18-20).

- **Their 67-52 (.563) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (74-46, .617), Tampa Bay (73-46, .613), Atlanta (72-48, .600), Los Angeles-NL (72-48, .600) and Chicago-NL (70-50, .583).
- Have won three of their last four games (since 8/7) and four of their last six games (since 8/4)...are 13-8 in their last 21 games (since 7/19) and 17-10 in their last 27 games (since 7/9).
- Tuesday marked the Yankees' 30th comeback win of the year...each of the Yankees' last three wins, 10 of the Yankees' last 17 wins (since 7/9), 12 of their last 21 wins (since 6/23) and 18 of their last 32 wins (since 5/31) have been comeback wins.
- Have won or split seven of their last nine completed series since 7/6 (are 5-2-2 in those series).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Mariners in a 4-1 come-from-behind win in their series opener on Tuesday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Ryan Weathers** (5.2IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 3BB, 4K, 1HR) started and allowed only 1R/ER over 5.2IP in a no-decision...**3B Ryan McMahon** (1-for-3, 1R, 2RBI) hit a go-ahead two-run single in the seventh inning, marking his 499th and 500th career RBI...**CF Trent Grisham** (2-for-4, 1 double, 2RBI) recorded his second straight multi-hit game and hit a two-run single in the seventh inning...**1B Luis García Jr.** (2-for-4, 1R, 2 doubles) doubled twice...**LHP Tim Hill** (1.1IP) earned his fourth win of the year after retiring all 4BF and stranding an inherited runner...**LHP Brent Headrick** (1.0IP, 2K) tossed a scoreless eighth inning...**RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 1H, 2K) tossed a scoreless ninth inning to earn his 27th save of the season.

McMAHON OF THE HOUR: INF Ryan McMahon hit a go-ahead two-run single in the seventh inning on Tuesday vs. Seattle...**marked his 499th and 500th career RBI...his five go-ahead RBI in the seventh inning-or-later this season are tied for the second-most in the Majors.**

- **Is hitting .304/.393/.478 (7-for-23) with 4R, 1 double, 1HR, 4RBI, 4BB and 1SF over his last eight games (since 8/2).**

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham recorded his second straight multi-hit game and hit a two-run single in the seventh inning on Tuesday vs. Seattle...is batting .417/.417/.917 (5-for-12) with 2R, 3 doubles, 1HR and 3RBI over his last three games (since 8/8)...six of his last eight hits have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 2HR).

WEATHERS REPORT: LHP Ryan Weathers started and allowed only 1R/ER over 5.2IP in a no-decision on Tuesday vs. Seattle (2H, 3BB, 4K, 1HR)...**had his career-high 22.2 scoreless inning streak snapped in the sixth inning...was the fourth-longest single-season scoreless streak by a Yankees starting pitcher in the last 25 years (since 2002)**, trailing only Clarke Schmidt's 28.1 inning streak from 6/4-28/25, Gerrit Cole's 25.2 inning streak from 4/11-27/23 and CC Sabathia's 23.2 inning streak from 6/30-7/10/11.

- Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in eight of his last 10 starts (since 6/18), posting a 2.75 ERA (52.1IP, 16ER) with 55K during that span.

PUT TO BED: RHP David Bednar tossed a scoreless ninth inning to earn his 27th save of the season on Tuesday vs. Seattle...**has converted each of his last 17 save opportunities (since 5/18), matching the third-longest streak of his career**...also converted 19 straight save opportunities from 4/12-8/3/24, 18 from 4/18-8/1/23 and 17 from 3/28-7/28/25...**marks the longest single-season streak by a Yankees pitcher since Aroldis Chapman converted 22 straight save opportunities from 5/8-7/31/18.**

- Has not allowed a run in 26 of his last 28 appearances (since 5/22), going 4-0 with 16 saves, a 0.85 ERA (31.2IP, 3ER) and 35K during that span...has held opponents to a .121/.190/.159 (13-for-107) slash line over that stretch.

GEORGE OF THE CONCRETE JUNGLE: INF George Lombard Jr. has hit safely in five of his first six career games, batting .286/.375/.571 (6-for-21) with 4R, 2HR, 2RBI and 3BB.

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won or split 16 of their last 18 completed series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 19 of their last 22 completed series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 41-17 in the last 58 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).

- Are 12-3 in their last 15 games vs. Seattle (since 5/22/24).
- Are 20-7 in their last 27 games vs. the Mariners at Yankee Stadium (since 8/26/17).

KING OF THE HILL: LHP Tim Hill earned his fourth win of the year on Tuesday vs. Seattle after retiring all 4BF and stranding an inherited runner...has stranded 26 of his 28 inherited runners this season...his 7.1% inherited runners scored percentage is the best in the Majors.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.28 ERA (1,063.2IP, 388ER) this season...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of their last 18 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 11 of those games, posting a 2.55 ERA (166.0IP, 47ER) during that stretch.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 of their last 26 games (since 7/10), posting a 2.79 ERA (239.0IP, 74ER) with 263K during that span.
- Their 450R allowed this season are their second-fewest through their first 119 games of season in the last 46 162-game seasons (since 1979), trailing only their 418R allowed in 2022 (excludes the 60-game season in 2020 and the strike-shortened 1981 season).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 11 of their last 13 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts, posting a 1.63 ERA (77.1IP, 14ER) during that span...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 14 of their last 18 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 13 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.13 ERA (101.1IP, 24ER) with 121K during that span.

- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 93 starts this season, their most such starts through their first 119 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 92GS in 2022)...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 69 games this season, their second-most starts through their first 119 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 74 starts in 2022.
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 25 of their last 28 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 20 of those starts, posting a 2.68 ERA (151.1IP, 45ER) during that span.
- **Rank second in the Majors this season in ERA (3.40, second in AL)** and opponents' SLG (.370, second in AL), third in strikeouts (671, first in AL), strikeout rate (25.4%, first in AL), K/9.OIP (9.43, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.659, second in AL), fourth in opponents' BA (.225, second in AL) and HR/9.OIP (1.03, second in AL), sixth in K/BB (3.39, third in AL), opponents' OBP (.289, fourth in AL) and WHIP (1.15, fourth in AL), seventh in BB/9.OIP (2.78, fourth in AL) and ninth in walk rate (7.5%, fifth in AL).

AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells has hit safely in each of his last five games (since 8/5)...**is batting .348/.423/.609 (8-for-23) with 2R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 2BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last 10 games (since 7/30).**

- Is hitting .308/.400/.538 (12-for-39) with 5R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI, 4BB, 2HP and 1SB over his last 16 games (since 7/20).
- Has posted a .920 OPS over his last 22 games (since 7/9).
- **Seven of his last 15H since 7/9 have been XBH (3 doubles, 4HR).**
- **His 2.90 catcher's ERA is the best in the Majors.**
- According to Baseball Savant, is tied for fourth in the Majors in catcher framing runs (five), ranks fifth in blocks above average (six) and ninth in shadow strike pct. (49.4%)...is tied for fifth in the Majors in DRS among catchers (eight - FanGraphs).

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: INF Luis García Jr. doubled twice on Tuesday vs. Seattle...has hit .282/.313/.555 (107-for-380) with 51R, 22 doubles, 5 triples, 24HR, 78RBI, 18BB and 4SB in 110 games this season, setting career highs in home runs and RBI...**ranked second in the Majors in SLG, is tied for fourth in multi-HR games (four) and seventh in RBI.**

- Has hit .327/.350/.551 (32-for-98) with 7 doubles, 5HR, 49RBI, 4BB and 1SF with RISP this year.
- Has batted .297/.327/.594 (95-for-320) with 22 doubles, 5 triples, 21HR and 15BB vs. right-handed pitchers this season.
- Over his last 76 games (since 5/9), has batted .301/.336/.643 (82-for-272) with 37R, 16 doubles, 4 triples, 23HR, 62RBI, 14BB and 2SB...during that stretch, leads the Majors in RBI and SLG, ranks second in XBH (43), third in OPS (.979) and is tied for third in HR.

PEN PAL: LHP Brent Headrick tossed a scoreless eighth inning on Tuesday vs. Seattle (2K)...**has not allowed a run in 34 of his last 38 games (since 5/19), going 3-0 with a 0.97 ERA (37.0IP, 4ER) and 47K over that span**...has stranded 19 of his 20 inherited runners over that span.

- Has gone 6-1 with a 1.49 ERA (60.1IP, 10ER) and 73K in 61 relief outings this season...has not allowed a run in 51 of his 61 relief appearances, the most in the Majors this season and the most by a Yankees reliever through the club's first 119 games of a season in franchise history.
- As a Yankee (since 2025), has not allowed a run in 64-of-78 games, going 6-1 with a 1.94 ERA (83.1IP, 18ER) and 103K.
- Has stranded 33 of his 37 inherited runners this season...his 10.8% inherited runners scored percentage ranks fifth among Major League relievers (third in AL).

NEW YORK 'PEN STATION: Yankees relievers allowed only 1H over 3.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday vs. Seattle...**have posted a Major League-best 2.58 ERA (223.0IP, 64ER) over their last 59 games (since 6/3)**, holding opponents to a .200 (161-for-804) BA during that stretch.

- **Own the second-best bullpen ERA in the Majors this season (3.11, second in AL)**...also rank third in the Majors this season in inherited runners scored percentage (22.4%, first in AL), fourth in opponents' SLG (.351, second in AL), opponents' OPS (.654, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.302, third in AL) and WHIP (1.21, third in AL), fifth in opponents' BA (.222, second in AL) and sixth in HR/9.OIP (0.94, third in AL).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (8-6, 4.18 ERA)

RHP Will Warren will make his 23rd start (24th appearance) of the season in tonight's game vs. Seattle...the 27-year-old will pitch on extended six days' rest due to team off days on Thursday and Monday...suffered his sixth loss of the season on 8/5 vs. St. Louis (5.1IP, 7H, 3R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR)...is 8-6 with a 4.18 ERA (114.0IP, 119H, 65R/53ER, 37BB, 114K, 15HR) in 23 games (22 starts) this season...the Yankees have won 14 of his 22 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 15 of his 22 starts...his 15 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the eighth-most in the AL...**his 37 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the second-most in the AL and tied for the fourth-most in the Majors since 2025...the Yankees' 31 wins in his starts since 2025 are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the seventh-most in the Majors...**last season, went 9-8 with a 4.44 ERA (162.1IP, 158H, 90R/80ER, 65BB, 171K, 22HR) in 33 starts, allowing 2ER-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...**according to *Elias*, his 22 starts of 2ER-or-fewer were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season**, trailing only Stan Bahnsen (25GS in 1968)...has gone 11-9 with a 4.01 ERA (177.1IP, 181H, 99R/79ER, 55BB, 168K, 26HR) over 35 games (34 starts) since 7/25/25 after going 6-8 with a 5.92 ERA (121.2IP, 129H, 83R/80ER, 57BB, 146K, 16HR) over his first 27 career games (26 starts) from 7/30/24-7/19/25...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 24 of his 34 starts over that span...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his sixth loss of the season on 8/5 vs. St. Louis (5.1IP, 7H, 3R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR).

2026: Is 8-6 with a 4.18 ERA (114.0IP, 119H, 65R/53ER, 37BB, 114K, 15HR) in 23 games (22 starts) this season...the Yankees have won 14 of his 22 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 15 of his 22 starts...his 15 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the eighth-most in the AL.

- Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in 16 of his 22 starts this season, including 1BB-or-fewer in 10 of those starts...has posted a 2.86 BB/9.0IP as a starter (113.1IP, 36BB).
- His 42 called strikeouts are tied for the seventh-most in the Majors (tied for fifth in AL).
- Has allowed one-or-zero HR in 19 of his 22 starts this season, including 11 starts without allowing a HR.
- Has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 18 of his 22 starts...his 18 such starts this season are tied for the 10th-most in the AL.
- The Yankees are 14-8 in his starts, tied for the sixth-most wins in a pitcher's starts in the AL.
- Since 5/25, has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of 12 starts.
- On 7/31 at Chicago-NL, recorded his eighth win of the season after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 7K)...marked the longest scoreless start of his career, his first scoreless start of the season and first since 8/5/25 at Texas (5.0IP)...also marked his fewest walks allowed (0BB) and most strikeouts (7K) in his previous five starts (7/1 vs. Detroit, also 0BB and 7K)... marked his first win since 5/31 at the Athletics.
- Went 3-1 with a 3.44 ERA (36.2IP, 39H, 21R/14ER, 15BB, 31K, 2HR) over seven starts from 5/12-6/20...the Yankees went 6-1 in those starts...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in five of those seven starts.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.39 ERA (37.2IP, 32H, 15R/10ER, 8BB, 46K, 4HR) in his first seven starts of the season (3/28-5/1)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of those seven starts...the Yankees won six of those seven starts.
- Allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts this season (3/28-5/1), the most in the Majors in that span (most in the AL)...was only the seventh Yankees pitcher (eighth time) in the last 66 years (since 1961) to allow 2ER-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts of a season (excluding openers), joining Max Fried (first 11GS in 2025), Michael King (first 8GS in 2023), Gerrit Cole (2x: first 8GS in 2021 and first 7GS in 2023), Nestor Cortes (first 7GS in 2022), Michael Pineda (first 9GS in 2014) and Hideki Irabu (first 7GS in 1998).
- Recorded at least 6K in six straight starts (4/13-5/12), posting a 12.40 K/9.0IP (45K/32.2IP) over that span...marked a career long streak...was one of only three Yankees (fifth time) in the last seven years (since 2020) to record six-or-more strikeouts in at least six straight games, joining Cam Schlitler (9GS from 9/11/25-4/17/26) and Gerrit Cole (3x: 15GS from 8/8/20-G1-4/30/21, 11GS from 6/22-9/1/21 and 12GS from 6/14/22-8/15/22).
- Made his fifth start of the season and earned his second win of the year on 4/18 vs. Kansas City after allowing only 2R/ER over 7.0 innings (5H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR, 1PO)...**his 11K tied his career high (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)**...marked his third career double-digit strikeout game (also 11K on 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 10K on 5/20/25 vs. Texas)...marked the second time in his career he has recorded at least 10K without surrendering a walk (also 11K and 0BB 6/17/25 vs. Los Angeles-AL)... no other Yankee had done so since Warren last accomplished the feat on 6/17/25...his 7.0 innings marked the second-longest start of his career (7.1IP on 5/9/25 at the Athletics)...also marked his sixth career start with 0BB and his second this season (last on 4/3 vs. Miami).

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 4-3 with a 3.88 ERA (53.1IP, 23ER) and 68K in 11 home games (10 starts) this season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of his 10 home starts.

- Since the start of last season, is 11-7 with a 3.65 ERA (140.2IP, 125H, 68R/57ER, 47BB, 164K, 20HR) in 27 games (26 starts) at Yankee Stadium...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 18 of those 26 starts...his 11 wins at home since 2025 are tied for the fifth-most in the AL over that span.
- Was 3-0 with a 2.30 ERA (27.1IP, 7ER) and 37K in his first five home starts of the season (4/3-5/1)...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in all five starts.

VS. SEATTLE: Is making his third career start vs. the Mariners tonight.

- Is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP, 2ER) in two starts vs. Seattle.
