TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the current 6-game homestand with the 2nd of a 3-game set against the Chicago White Sox (1-0)...Seattle also hosted the San Diego Padres on the homestand (0-3)...the Mariners previously wrapped up a winning road trip (4-3) against the Chicago White Sox (1-2) and Houston Astros (3-1)...tonight's tilt will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night's series opener by a 6-1 final score...the Mariners are 13-11 over their last 24 games since April 22.

- **On a Stroll** - The Mariners are one of 4 teams in the Majors this season to rank in the top 10 in both most walks by an offense and fewest walks allowed by a pitching staff, along with the Cubs, Yankees and Dodgers.
- **Young and Spry** - Second baseman **Cole Young**'s 11 defensive runs saved lead MLB infielders and rank 3rd in the big leagues among all positions.
- **Anyone Hungry For An Oppo Taco?** - **Julio Rodríguez** has hit 30 career opposite-field home runs, tied for the 6th-most in MLB since 2022.
- **Hop On** - Today's game marks the first scheduled "piggyback" start, with both starting pitcher **Bryce Miller** and **Luis Castillo** expected to pitch multiple innings.
- **Feliz Cumpleaños** - **Victor Robles** celebrates his 29th birthday today.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW, COLT EMERSON!...**Colt Emerson**, the Mariners top prospect and the #3 overall prospect in baseball (*Baseball America*) was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma on Sunday for his MLB debut:

- **The Debut** - At 20 years, 301 days old, Colt became the youngest Mariner to make his MLB debut since Félix Hernández (19 years, 118 days, 8/4/05 at DET)...he is the 12th-youngest player overall to debut for Seattle.
- **Sense of the Dramatic** - Emerson became the 11th player in Mariners history to homer for their first career hit...Colt also homered for his first professional hit (8/4/23) and his first Triple-A hit (9/16/25)...his first Triple-A hit was also a 3-run homer...he is also the first Mariners player to hit a 3+ run homer for their first career homer since **Julio Rodríguez** (5/1/22 at MIA).
- **Young Man** - Colt became the youngest Mariners player to homer since José López (20 years, 294 days, 9/13/04 vs. LAA) and is the 7th Mariners player age 20-or-younger to homer, joining López, Orlando Mercado, Marc Newfield, Chris Snelling, Alex Rodríguez and Ken Griffey Jr.

NAYLOR LOVES A PAIR OF WHITE SOX...**Josh Naylor** went 3-for-4 with 1 RBI and 2 stolen bases in last night's game and is batting .563 (9x16) with 4 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 4 RBI and a 1.401 OPS in 4 games against the White Sox this season...for his career against the South Siders, Naylor is batting .369 (80x217), with 40 runs, 21 doubles, 12 home runs, 46 RBI and 7-for-7 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .409 clip and slugging .631 for a 1.041 OPS...among all opponents Naylor has faced in his career his 12 HR against the White Sox are the most against any opponent while his 1.041 OPS ranks 2nd, trailing only his 1.102 OPS against the Pirates.

RANDY! RANDY! RANDY!...**Randy Arozarena** went 2-for-4 with 2 doubles and 1 RBI in yesterday's game...overall this season he is batting .305 (54x177) with 33 runs, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 19 RBI, 12 stolen bases, a .388 OBP and slugging .458 for an .846 OPS in 49 games this season...among AL left fielders this season, he ranks 2nd in average, 3rd in OBP, 4th in slugging, 2nd in wRC+ (146) and 2nd in fWAR (1.8)...Randy has been scorching hot as of late, batting .439 (18x41) with a 1.110 OPS in his last 11 games (5/8-c).

BIG TEX IS BACK...RHP **Bryce Miller** is scheduled to make his second start of the season tonight...he made his season debut on Wednesday night in Houston, tossing 5.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 8 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts...he was activated off the Injured List prior to the game after missing the start of the season with a left oblique strain...in his season debut, he averaged 97.4 MPH on his fastball, up from his career average (94.9 MPH from 2023-25).

BALL MAGNETS...Seattle has 31 HBP this season, tied for the 2nd-most in MLB, trailing only the St. Louis Cardinals (34 HBP)...Seattle has led MLB in HBP in 3-consecutive seasons (2023-25)...since the '23 season, Seattle has 347 total HBP, with Minnesota having the 2nd-most in MLB at 312 HBP...during that same time frame, Mariners pitchers have 210 HBP, 12th-fewest in MLB.

J-ROD SHOWING OUT...**Julio Rodríguez** belted his 8th home run of the season in last night's game...over his last 22 games (4/25-c), he is batting .269 (25x93) with 15 runs, 6 doubles, 7 home runs, 13 RBI, 3 stolen bases, a .306 OBP and slugging .559 (.865 OPS).

SOLID ON THE MOUND...the Mariners pitching staff has been solid this season, posting a combined 3.69 ERA (179 ER, 436.1 IP) with an MLB-fewest 125 walks and 418 strikeouts...among Major League pitching staffs they rank T-1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.34), 1st in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.58), 7th in ERA and 8th in WHIP (1.23)...Mariners starting pitching leads MLB with 281.1 innings pitched and ranks 4th in quality starts with 22.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Josh Naylor** has been excellent since donning a Mariners uniform, batting .280 (105x375) with 47 runs, 15 doubles, 14 home runs, 55 RBI and 31 stolen bases, getting on base at a .333 clip and slugging .432 (.765 OPS) in his first 100 games with Seattle, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...his 31 stolen bases in his first 100 games with the club are the 6th-most in team history?...he trails **Victor Robles** (35), **Ichiro Suzuki** (33), **Brian Hunter** (33), **Mallex Smith** (32) and **Julio Cruz** (32).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 19

- **1988** - Back-to-back rainouts at New York's Yankee Stadium (5/18 & 5/19) postponed play for the second straight day.
- **1994** - Jay Buhner scores the winning run in the bottom of the ninth on "Jay Buhner Haircut Night" vs. Texas. This inaugural haircut night entices 512 fans to get their hair shaved like Jay's with a "Buhner Buzz". Free admission for these fans.
- **2000** - Rickey Henderson makes his Mariners debut as a pinch-runner in the 8th inning for Jay Buhner. Rickey scores the tying run on a Stan Javier double.
- **2001** - Ichiro records his 7th- consecutive multi-hit game, tying the then Mariners club record.
- **2018** - James Paxton recorded the second complete game of the season and of his career, joining Carlos Carrasco as the only pitchers in the Majors to record 2 complete games to that point in the season.
- **2021** - Kyle Seager hits his 84th home run at T-Mobile park, breaking a tie with Nelson Cruz and Raúl Ibanez for most homers at T-Mobile park.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 2nd start of the season and the 76th of his career...it marks his 1st time facing the White Sox this season and his 4th career start against Chicago-AL.

LAST TIME OUT...

made his 1st start of the season after being activated from the 15-day Injured List (left oblique strain) on May 13 at Houston... he threw 5.1 innings, allowing only 2 runs (2 ER) on 8 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk while striking out 3 batters...tossed 81 pitches and 51 strikes... threw 5.0 scoreless innings before allowing a solo homer to the first batter of the 6th inning.

FACING THE WHITE SOX...

in 3 starts against the White Sox, Miller is 2-0 while the Mariners are 3-0 against the White Sox when Miller makes the start...among active pitchers, he ranks 2nd in WHIP (.738), 2nd in opponent OBP (.203), and 4th in K/BB (10), while his 1.77 ERA against Chicago-AL ranks 11th, trailing Bryan Woo's 1.74 ERA...he is 1-of-2 pitchers to have 3+ starts against the White Sox with 3-or-fewer runs allowed, 2-or-fewer walks and 6+ strikeouts over 6.1+ IP since 2023 (also: Michael Wacha-KC/SD)...is 1-of-10 players since 1988 to record back-to-back starts (6/18/23-6/12/24) of 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 7.0+ innings against the White Sox.

HOME AT LAST...

will be making his first home start of the season tonight... Miller is 13-9 in home games with a 3.34 ERA, 9.1 K/9 and a 1.05 WHIP... is tied with Luis Castillo for 8th best WHIP in home games among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 200.0 IP)...also ranks 7th in opponent batting average (.215), T-8th in ERA (3.34) matching Logan Gilbert T-10th in BB/9 among pitchers in home games since 2023 (min. 200.0 IP)...the Mariners are 24-15 when he starts at T-Mobile...in 27-of-39 career home starts, Miller has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP...17 of those starts are over 6.0 IP.

KEEPING THE PATHS CLEAN...

owns a career 10.40 base runners per 9, ranking 10th in the AL since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 17 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP amassed between 2023-2025 ranks T-7th in MLB, joining rotation-mates Logan Gilbert (21), Bryan Woo (21), George Kirby (17), and Luis Castillo (10) in the top 10 most such games in MLB over that span.

CRACKING THE WHIP...

ranks 4th among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders with a 1.134 WHIP...his 106 walks are the 7th fewest through a starting pitchers first 75 games with the Mariners while his 367 hits allowed are 2nd fewest, trailing Bryan Woo's 330 hits through his first 75 games...of starting pitchers in MLB to have allowed 106-or-fewer walks in their first 75 career starts, Miller has allowed the 8th fewest hits.

BWARE THE 4-SEAM...

owns a career .289 opponent OBP and a .229 opponent average on his 4-seam...his OBP on his primary pitch ranks T-10th in MLB among pitchers that have thrown 2000+ 4-seam fastballs since 2023...his 443 swing and misses on his 4-seam are 7th most in the AL since 2023, despite missing several games to start this season.

BRINGING THE HEAT...

through his first start of the season, he has increased the average velocity of his four-seamer to 97.5 mph compared to 94.8 mph last season...in that first start of the year (5/13 at HOU), he threw 24 pitches over 97 mph, surpassing his previous career-high 10 pitches above 97 mph on Aug. 6, 2023 vs. LAA.

GOING THE DISTANCE...

has pitched 6.0+ innings in 30 career games and 5.0+ innings in 59 of his 75 career starts...the Mariners are 36-23 when he pitches 5.0+ innings and 23-7 when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 9-22 when he tosses fewer than 5.0 innings.

REHAB RECAP...

made 4 rehab starts between Triple-A Tacoma and High-A Everett from April 18-May 6, accumulating a 1.98 ERA (3 ER, 13.2 IP) with 9 hits and 7 walks allowed to 14 strikeouts.

ON THE IL...

started the 2026 season on the 15-day Injured List with a left oblique strain, retroactive to March 22...also spent two separate stints on the 15-day IL in 2025 with right elbow inflammation: May 12-30 and June 7-18.

THE TOTALS...

went 4-6 with a 5.68 ERA (57 ER, 90.1 IP) and 74 strikeouts to 34 walks allowed while posting a 1.406 WHIP to a .267 opponents' batting average across 18 starts in 2025.

2025 POSTSEASON...

made his Postseason debut last year in Game 4 of the American League Division Series on Oct. 8, 2025 at DET, tossing 4.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 4 hits with 2 strikeouts...across 3 Postseason starts last year, he combined for a 2.51 ERA (4 ER, 14.1 IP) with 9 total strikeouts...he tossed 6.0 innings of 1-run, 2-hit baseball in his second Postseason start in Game 1 of the American League Championship Series at Toronto.

11:0...

tossed a career-high 11 strikeouts on Sept. 11, 2025 vs. LAA, marking the 5th time during the 2025 season a Mariners starter tossed 10+ strikeouts without a walk, joining Luis Castillo (10 SO, 9/24 vs. COL), (George Kirby (2x, last: 14 SO, 9/14 vs. LAA), and Logan Gilbert (10 SO, 7/22 vs. MIL)...with Emerson Hancock's 14 strikeout, no walk outing on May 2 vs. KC, 3 of the last 8 players to record 11+ K's and 0 walks in a start in MLB are Mariners pitchers with Kirby's start on Sept. 14.

300 CLUB...

recorded his 300th career strikeout on April 11, 2025 vs. Texas in his 59th career start, doing so in his home state...became just the 6th pitcher in Mariners history to record 300+ strikeouts in his first 59 career starts, joining Logan Gilbert (322 SO) and George Kirby (318 SO).

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 10th appearance of the year and the 253rd of his career (252 GS)...it will also be his 2nd appearance against the White Sox this season and the 6th of his career (5 GS).
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...W#1 on May 14 at Houston, tossing 6 strikeouts across 5.2 innings while allowing 4 hits, 3 runs (3 ER), 3 walks and 1 home run... he threw a season-high 108 pitches and 65 strikes in his 9th start of the season...his 108 pitches are tied for 8th-most thrown by a pitcher so far this season.

WHAT A RELIEF...will be piggybacking off Miller's start in tonight's game, pitching out of the bullpen for the first time in the regular season in his career...he made a relief appearance in the 2025 Postseason, entering the 14th inning of Game 5 of the ALDS vs. Detroit (10/10/25), tossing the final 1.1 innings and retiring all 4 batters faced to earn the win.

AGAINST THE WHITE SOX...is making his 2nd appearance against the White Sox this season (also: 5/9 at CWS)...marks his second ever appearance against the White Sox at T-Mobile Park and his first since Sept. 7, 2022 when he threw 8 strikeouts across 5.2 innings...has thrown a quality start in 3 of his 5 career games vs. the White Sox.

REMEMBER WHEN...he threw 7.0 innings allowing just 1 run (1 ER) on 5 hits, 0 walks and 9 strikeouts on Aug. 21, 2023 at the White Sox, finishing his outing with 47 consecutive fastballs...he was incredibly efficient during his streak of fastballs, allowing no runs, just 3 hits and striking out 6 batters...his 83.2% fastballs (79 of 95 total pitches) during the outing is still the 3rd-highest mark of his career.

KEEPING IT 100...threw season-high 108 pitches in his last start (5/14 at HOU)...is the only Mariners pitcher to throw 100+ pitches in multiple starts this season...**Emerson Hancock** (5/2 vs. KC) and **Bryan Woo** (5/12 at HOU) have also tossed 100+ pitches in a game this season... Castillo has thrown 100+ pitches in 102 career games, the 5th-most such games in MLB since 2017.

WHIFF LEADER...has recorded 10+ swings and misses in 7 of his 9 starts this year...registered a season-high 18 swings and misses plus 5 swinging strikeouts on May 9 at Chicago White Sox, surpassing his previous season-high 17 swings and misses in his first start of the season (3/30 vs. NYY)...leads MLB since 2017 with 3,495 swings and misses across his career, ranking ahead of Kevin Gausman (3,470) and Max Scherzer (3,308)...his 1,281 career swinging strikeouts are 3rd-most in MLB since 2017, trailing Max Scherzer (1,320), Kevin Gausman (1,316), and ranking ahead of Gerrit Cole (1,267).

HOME SWEET HOME...is making his 5th appearance at home this season and first since May 3 vs. Kansas City...across 60 starts at home as a Mariners starter, he is 22-14 with a 2.97 ERA (117 ER, 354.1 IP) and has thrown 6.0+ IP in 41 of those starts with the Mariners going 30-11 when he tosses 6.0+ innings at home.

HOW HE FARES...among Mariners pitchers with 50+ home starts, he leads in ERA (2.97), ranks 2nd in WHIP (1.022) behind rotationmate **Logan Gilbert** (1.003), 2nd in SO/9 (10.11), 2nd in opponents' batting average (.209) and recently surpassed Hisashi Iwakuma for 8th-most strikeouts (398).

SIX IN SIX...has thrown 6+ strikeouts across 6.0+ innings once this season (3/30 vs. NYY)...his 112 career starts of 6.0+ innings pitched and 6+ strikeouts are 6th-most in MLB since 2017...his 41 such games since 2023 are tied for 5th-most in MLB across that span, alongside Framber Valdez and Chris Sale and trails rotationmate **Logan Gilbert** (43 G).
