METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 13-1, last night...Despite the loss, the Mets have won eight of their last 10 games and 17 of their last 21 games...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (14-4)...The Mets are 59-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 27-6-3 in 36 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, nine-day road trip to Atlanta (0-1), Philadelphia (four games) and New York-AL (two games).

EI JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil matched his career-high with four hits last night...It was the 10th time in his career that he recorded four hits in a game (tied for fourth-most since his major league debut on July 24, 2018)...He has recorded a hit in 16 of his last 17 games...His lone game without a hit was on August 12, after he left the game due to injury following his only at-bat...McNeil is batting .438 (28-64) with 11 runs, 10 doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, two walks with a .464 OBP and a .747 SLG over the last 17 games...He ranks second in the majors with a .351 road batting average...Leads the majors with a .440 (22-50) average in August...His 22 hits this month rank second in MLB.

AND I WOULD RECORD 500 HITS: Jeff McNeil recorded his 500th career hit last night...In doing so, he became the eighth fastest player in franchise history to reach 500 hits...See below for the complete list, courtesy of *Elias*:

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a MLB-best 2.47 ERA (64 earned runs/233.1 innings) in 40 games with 259 strikeouts and 54 walks...The Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.56 ERA, followed by the Astros with a 3.14 ERA...New York's 259 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.46 in that span...The Mets rank third in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.46 ERA from their starters.

NOBODY LIKES YOU WHEN YOU'RE 23: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in 23 straight road games, the longest stretch of his career...He is batting .371 (36-97) with 23 runs, six doubles, five home runs, 16 RBI, nine walks with a .436 OBP, a .588 SLG and a 1.024 OPS in that span that dates to June 12...Overall, he is batting .318/.407/.509 with 46 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 31 RBI and 26 walks in 56 road games this season...This compares to a .209/.286/.311 slashline with 24 runs in 51 games at Citi Field in 2022...Nimmo's .407 road OBP is second in the National League and fourth in the majors.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Jeff McNeil has hit .377 (23-61) with eight runs, eight doubles, a home run, five RBI and four walks in 17 career games at the home of the Braves...Tyler Naquin has hit .318 (7-22) with four runs, two doubles, a home run, four RBI and a walk in seven games at the yard...Darin Ruf owns a .316 (6-19) mark with three runs, a home run, two RBI and four walks in six games...Pete Alonso has hit .250/.365/.438 with 10 extra-base hits and 20 RBI in 26 career games at Truist Park.

ATL-ONSO: The Mets have eight wins against Atlanta this year and Alonso has driven in the game-winning run in six of those games...Manny Machado (five vs. San Francisco) is the only other player with five or more game-winning RBI against one team this year...Only four players have had more than six game-winning RBI against a single opponent in one season since game-winning RBI started being tracked in 1974: Michael Cuddyer (2009 Twins vs. Royals), Gary Sheffield (2002 Braves vs. Phillies), Andy Van Slyke (1990 Pirates vs. Cubs) and Keith Hernandez (1982 Cardinals vs. Cubs) were each responsible for seven game-winning RBI.

SWEET 16: According to *Elias*, New York has either won or tied each of their 16 series this season against the NL East...That is tied for the second-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves also went 16 straight in the NL East to start the 1999 season...The Cincinnati Reds own the longest streak, an 18-series streak in the NL West to start 1970.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East (2-2)...Overall, the Mets are 39-16 against the East this year...Their .709 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win two of its six remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Since May 27, the team has gone 26-9 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.17 ERA against the East, while hitting .261/.338/.415...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 274-183.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets have won five of their last seven road games and nine of their last 12...New York is 35-22 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...Their .614 road winning percentage is the second-best in MLB...New York is batting .260/.327/.415 away from Citi Field...Their .260 road average ranks third in the majors and second in the NL as does their .327 OBP on the road.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets are second in the majors with 1,108 strikeouts this season...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 60 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 874 times this season...That is the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won five of their last seven games against the Braves...The Mets need to win two of its six remaining games against Atlanta to lock up the season series...It would be New York's first season series victory since 2017.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 75 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .647 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 75-41 record through the team's first 116 games...Only the 1986 (76-40) team posted a better record through the first 116 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 17-6 in the second-half...The team's 17 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .739 winning percentage also ranks second...The team is batting .284/.352/.453 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and OBP and are fourth in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 116-78 following the break.

JUST SHORT: Francisco Lindor has hit 20 home runs this season (19 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...He has recorded 82 RBI in 115 games this season (80 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He is sixth the majors and fourth in the NL with 82 RBI.

GO AHEAD AND MAKE MY DAY: Pete Alonso leads the majors leagues with 31 go-ahead RBI this year...That is nine more than the next player, Francisco Lindor...Lindor is tied for second in the majors with 22 go-ahead RBI...Alonso's 31 RBI are tied for the eighth most in single-season history...His career-high is 32 go-ahead RBI which he accomplished in 2019...Keith Hernandez owns the both the franchise record and the number two spot with 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985 and 35 in 1984.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 97 RBI.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year...He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

POLAR EXPRESS: Alonso recently surpassed 1,000 career road plate appearances...Among the over 2,500 players in major league history with at least 1,000 PA on the road, Alonso's .940 OPS away from home ranks 17th, just behind Lance Berkman (.941), Ty Cobb (.941), Stan Musial (.944) and Mickey Mantle (.958)...Only Mike Trout (.979) and Juan Soto (.965) have better marks among active hitters...Alonso's .583 career road slugging percentage leads active players and is the seventh-best all-time behind six of the top hitters in major league history: Babe Ruth (.681), Lou Gehrig (.644), Ted Williams (.615), Joe DiMaggio (.610), Barry Bonds (.597) and Mark McGwire (.586)...This season, Alonso is third in the majors with 17 road home runs and is eight with a .554 SLG in away games.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 94 strikeouts...That is 22 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.2% of batters faced (94/180), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 47 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.87 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 27 saves, a 1.33 ERA (seven earned runs/47.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 14 walks...The Mets are 41-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 20 outings dating back to June 22, covering 20.0 innings, establishing a career-high scoreless streak...40 of Díaz last 56 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.34 ERA (one earned runs/26.2 innings) with 11 hits, four walks and 56 strikeouts...He has converted all 16 saves in that period.

100 STRIKEOUTS OF SOLITUDE: Díaz has struck out 94 batters in 47 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season...The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019...His career-high best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019...Díaz is eighth on the Mets all-time strikeouts list for relievers...The late Pedro Feliciano is seventh with 350 strikeouts with the Mets.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 78 times this year...It's tied for their third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha (14), Brandon Nimmo (13) and Pete Alonso (10) all rank in the top 10 in hit by pitches this season.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his 10th win of the season after allowing two runs over 6.0 innings on August 10 against the Reds...Had five strikeouts and issued a season-high three walks for the second time this season (also: 5/28 vs. PHI)...Was the second time Walker reached the 10-win mark in his career (11 wins, 2015).

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In 11 road starts this season, Walker is 6-2 with a 3.38 ERA (23 earned runs/61.1 innings)...His six road wins are tied for fourth in the NL and tied for seventh in the majors...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 earned runs/68.0 innings) in 14 road starts.

BECOMING HOME RUN HAPPY: Prior to the All-Star break, Walker had a HR/9 rate of 0.39, the fourth-best marking among pitchers with at least 90.0 innings prior to the break...He allowed four homers in 16 first-half outings...Since the All-Star break, Walker has allowed five home runs in four starts, a HR/9 rate of 2.41, the seventh-highest rate among pitchers with at least 15.0 innings in the second half.

FEW Ks, THAT'S OK: Through 20 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.93 and an ERA of 3.43...Cole Irvin (3.13 ERA, 5.91 K/9) and Miles Mikolas (3.44 ERA, 6.87 K/9) are the only other pitchers with an ERA under 3.50 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 19 starts)...His six quality starts with five strikeouts or fewer are the 10th-most in the National League...Walker joined Drew Rasmussen, Cole Irvin and Michael Kopech as the only starting pitchers to sport a sub-3.50 ERA and 85 or fewer strikeouts through their first 20 starts of the season (Min 90.0 IP).

FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF: In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

VS. ATLANTA: Tonight, Walker will make his seventh career start against the Braves and second this season...In his lone start against the Braves, Walker allowed a season-high eight earned runs over 1.0+ innings on August 5, the third-shortest start of his career...Prior to his last start against the Braves, Walker was 1-1 with a 2.88 ERA (eight earned runs/25.0 innings) over five starts against Atlanta...In two career starts at Truist Park, Walker has a 2.00 ERA (two earned runs/9.0 innings).

SPLIT FINGER SUCCESS: In 20 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just under 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .188 (29-154) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...41 of Walker's 85 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

LIMITING LEFTIES: Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .213 (85-399) average, the 17th-best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 400 LHB faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .232 (352-1516) average, 12th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).

NICE TRY: Walker is tied for the major-league with Robbie Ray and Merrill Kelly with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one earned run over 7.0 innings with six strikeouts and one walk on August 12 against Philadelphia...Finished an outing of 7.0 innings with no more than one run allowed for the seventh time this season, tied for the fifth-most such appearances in the majors.

RETURN OF THE MAX: Has a 1.36 ERA (8 ER/53.0 IP) since his return from the IL on July 5, the second-best mark during that span...His 67 strikeouts are the tied with Gerrit Cole for the most during that span and his 0.91 WHIP is the sixth-best mark during that span.
