PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Rookie RF Aristides Aguino is the reigning National League Player of the Week...from 8/5-8/11 he led the Major Leagues in slugging percentage (1.364), tied for the lead in HR (6) and led the National League in hitting (.500) and RBI (11)...he is the first Reds rookie to win a Player of the Week award since RHP Chris Reitsma in April 2001 and the first Reds rookie position player since Hal Morris in July 1990.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Since his promotion on August 1, rookie RHP Aristides Aquino is tied for the Major League lead in RBI (16) leads the National League in slugging percentage (1.026) and ranks among the NL leaders in HR (8, 2nd), batting average (.385, 6th), on-base percentage (.429, 13th), hits (15, T12th) and extra-base hits (9, 4th).

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (0-2) of a brief 3-game road trip, all in Washington vs Elyssa Kaplan's Nationals, and Game 9 (4-4) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play 13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-2 at Wsh, 4g vs StL, 3g vs SD)... tomorrow night return to Great American Ball Park to begin a 7-game homestand vs the Cardinals (4g) and Padres (3g)...the Reds went 4-2 on their previous homestand (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs).

SERIES NOTES: The Redlegs haven't won a season series vs the Nationals since 2015 (5-1)...in 4 seasons since then, including 2019, are 6-20 vs Wsh, including 3-4 in 2016, 1-6 in 2017, 1-6 in 2018 and 1-4 this season...the Reds are 3-11 in their last 14 games at Nationals Park... dating back to a 6-3 Reds win on 6/4/16, the Nationals have won 10 of the last 11 games at Great American Ball Park.

<u>CARDINALS UP NEXT</u>: The Reds are **4-7 vs StL** this season, including **1-3** at Great American Ball Park...are **3-2-2** in their last 7 completed series vs StL, including a 1-1 series split in April in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, home of the Sultanes de Monterrey of the Mexican League... Cin won 6 of their last 11 games at Busch Stadium...the Reds finished the 2018 season with 3 consecutive series wins vs StL, their first singleseason 3-series winning streak vs the Cardinals since a 4-series winning streak from 4/20-7/19, 1979...the 12 runs scored in the 12-1 win on 4/26 was Cin's third-highest total ever at Busch and its most since a 15-2 win there on 9/26/16.

THE PUNISHER: Aristides Aquino produced 8 HR in his first 12 career games, including a 3-homer game on Sat vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th).

- Is the first player in modern Major League history with 8 HR in his first 12 career games.
- Is the second player in modern Major League history with 7 HR in his first 10 career games (Col's Trevor Story, 2016).
- Is the second player in modern Major League history with a 3-homer game within his first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
- Is the first Major League rookie and first Reds player to homer in 3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th), tying the Major League record for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the 13th player to do it, the second this season (Chi's Kris Bryant, 5/17 at
- Wsh. 7th-9th). Is the second Reds rookie to homer in 4 consecutive games (Eric Davis, 9/3-9/6, 1984).
- Is the second Reds rookie with 3 HR in a game (Joey Votto, 2008).

 Is the second Reds batter this season with 3 HR in a game (Derek Dietrich, 5/28 vs Pit)...was the 29th Reds player with at least 3 homers in a game, accomplished for the 37th time

SUSPENDED: LHP Amir Garrett is 2 games into an 8-game suspension...the Reds are 0-2...he cannot be replaced on the 25-man roster...Garrett was 1 of 9 ejected in the 11-4 loss on 7/30 vs Pit and, 2 days later, 1 of 8 suspended by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager David Bell (6g), RHP Jared Hughes (3g) and RF Yasiel Puig (3g) of the Reds and manager Clint Hurdle (2g), RHP Keone Kela (10g), José Osuna (5g) and RHP Kyle Crick (3g) of the Pirates... Bell and Hughes already served their suspensions.

REHABBING: RHP Tyler Mahle, on the injured list since 7/22 with a left hamstring strain, on Friday is scheduled to begin a rehabilitation assignment by throwing 2.0 innings for Class AAA Louisville vs Rochester...yesterday, he threw a bullpen for the Bats without issue...C Curt Casali, on the injured list since 7/18 with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his right knee, made 2 rehab apps before he was shut down with soreness in his left hamstring...in Fri's 3-1 Bats win at Rochester started behind the plate and caught 5 innings (0-3)...in Sat's 6-5 loss in 10 innings at Rochester, he was the Bats' designated hitter (0-2) but left the game with the hamstring injury.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (99), HR (35), RBI (96), batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.372) and slugging percentage (.599)...have outscored opponents in the first frame 99-65, and are 29-7 (.806) when leading after the first inning...6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first...3B Eugenio Suárez leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR in the first frame while ranking second in the National League in slugging (.713) and third in the NL in RBI (21)...SS José Iglesias leads the National League in first-inning batting average (.455) and slugging percentage (.864)...1B Joey Votto is among National League first-inning leaders in extra-base hits (15, T1st), doubles (9, T1st), hits (33, T1st), slugging percentage (.602, 11th) and batting average (.337, 11th).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 72 of the Reds' 118 games so far this season, including 49 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once as a pitcher/ LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF (6/2 vs Wsh), twice as a P/RF, 3 times as a CF, 3 times as a LF, 7 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)...9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter... Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (386.2) to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF... Mahay played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

Today's Pitcher - #27 Trevor Bauer, RHP

RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer this afternoon is making his third appearance for the Reds and his second career appearance vs the Nationals...in Fri's 5-2 win vs Cubs, in his Great American Ball Park debut as a Red allowed only a first-inning HR to Nicholas Castellanos and recorded 11 strikeouts, his 26th career 10-strikeout game and seventh of the season...his 11th strikeout was his 200th, the second 200-strikeout season of his career (221 strikeouts in 2018)....at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds OF Yasiel Puig and LHP Scott Moss and from the Padres OF Franmil Reyes, LHP Logan Allen and IF Victor Nova, while SD received from the Reds OF Taylor Trammell (truh-MELL)...when traded, led the Major Leagues in innings pitched while ranking fifth in the majors and fourth in the American League in strikeouts...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks sixth in strikeouts (421), sixth in ERA (2.96), and 10th in innings pitched (343.2)...in 2018 was an American League All-Star, finished fifth in the Cy Young Award voting, ranked second in the AL in ERA (2.21) and allowed the fewest HR per 9 innings in the league (.0462).

Tomorrow vs Cardinals - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...in his last 8 starts is 4-1, 1.74 with 7 quality starts and 3 times was the victim of blown saves...will take a 13-inning scoreless streak into tomorrow's start, tying his season high (7/3-7/12) and tied for the eighth-longest active streak in the Major Leagues...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings (4/28-5/8, 2015)...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts... the 8.0 innings are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his 12 strikeouts were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until Luis Castillo had a career-high 13 strikeouts on 8/5 vs LAA...has 7 wins and 4 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since...with the completion of the second inning on 7/17 at Cubs reached 1,000 career innings pitched...on 7/12 at Col, his strikeout of Charlie Blackmon to end the fifth inning was the 900th strikeout of his career.
