THE TWINS: The Twins will open their 66th season with three games in four days against Baltimore through the weekend...today marks the sixth time in Twins history (since 1961) that they have opened against the Orioles (1967, '07, '12, '16, '18)...following this series, the Twins will travel to Kansas City to play a three-game series against the Royals at Kauffman Stadium from Monday-Thursday (off-day Tuesday)...following this trip, Minnesota will open its 17th season at Target Field with a three-game weekend series against the Tampa Bay Rays, followed by a four-game series against the Detroit Tigers, from Monday-Thursday.

SPRING CLEANING: The Twins completed their 36th Spring Training in Fort Myers, FL on Tuesday with a record of 11-18-1...Luke Keaschall led the club in hits (20) and RBI (12)...James Outman led in home runs (4)...Outman, Brooks Lee and Tristan Gray tied for most games played (19)...Mick Abel led the pitching staff in both innings (22.0) and strikeouts (27)...additionally, the Twins drew 104,395 in official total attendance, ranking fourth in the Grapefruit League, behind New York-AL (139,773), Boston (137,027) and Philadelphia (132,464).

THE LAST TIME WE WANNA TALK ABOUT IT: The Twins finished the 2025 regular season with a record of 70-92, in fourth place in the American League Central and 180 games back of the division-winning Cleveland Guardians (88-74)...Minnesota was 51-56 on July 31, then traded away 11 players in a two-day span around the MLB trade deadline...Twins finished the season 38-43 at home and 32-49 on the road.

GRAND OPENING: The Twins opened last season vs. the Cardinals at Busch Stadium, losing 5-3...the Twins are 29-36 all-time in season openers, 11-13 when opening at home and 18-23 when opening on the road...Twins have won four of their last seven openers, their last being a 4-1 victory over the Royals at Kauffman on March 28, 2024...Minnesota is opening at Baltimore for the fifth time in their history (0-4)...their previous four came in 1967 (6-3 loss at Memorial Stadium), 2012 (4-2 loss at Camden), 2016 (3-2 loss at Camden) and 2018 (3-2 loss at Camden)...Twins also opened against the O's at the Dome in 2007 (7-4 win).

THERE'S A NEW SHELTY IN TOWN: 2026 marks Derek Shelton's first as Twins manager and seventh career managerial assignment...has a career managerial record of 306-440 (.410) in five-plus seasons, all with Pittsburgh (2020-25)...he was named the 41st manager in Pirates history on November 17, 2019 and, after beginning the 2025 season 12-26, he was relieved of managerial duties on May 8, 2025...finished his Pittsburgh tenure as one of 11 managers to win 300-or-more games with the team...prior to managing in the majors, coached under Rocco Baldelli (2019) and Paul Molitor in Minnesota (2018), under John Gibbons in Toronto (2017), Joe Maddon in Tampa Bay (2010-16) and Eric Wedge in Cleveland (2005-09)...prior to his time in the major leagues, he coached (or managed) at the minor league levels from 1997-2005.

☛ **NEW FACES:** hitting coach **Keith Bauregard** (3 seasons with DET from 2023-25), ml fielding coordinator **Toby Gardenhire** (AAA St. Paul manager from 2021-25), bench coach **Mark Hallberg** (various coaching roles with SF from 2020-25), bullpen coach **Latroy Hawkins** (1st coaching role), assistant bench coach **Mike Rabelo** (various coaching roles with PIT from 2020-25) and first base coach **Grady Sizemore** (various coaching roles with CWS from 2024-25).

☛ **RETURNEES:** assistant hitting coach **Trevor Amicone** (2nd season with MIN), third base coach **Ramon Borrego** (2nd season with MIN), pitching coach **Pete Maki** (7th season with MIN), assistant pitching coach **Luis Ramirez** (5th season with MIN) and assistant hitting coach **Rayden Sierra** (2nd season with MIN).

CRAB CAKES AND HOT DISH: The Twins and Orioles are playing each other today for the first of six games in 2026...Twins will host the O's for three games at Target Field from August 10-12.

- ☛ Twins went 6-0 vs. Baltimore last season, going 3-0 at Target Field from May 6-8 and 3-0 at Camden Yards from May 14-15, which was part of a season-long 13-game winning streak.
- ☛ Twins are seeking their first seven-game winning streak against the O's since March 31, 2018-May 31, 2021, when they won 16-straight over Baltimore...Twins last loss to Baltimore was September 29, 2024 at Target Field.
- ☛ Twins scored 37 runs against the Orioles last season (6.2 R/G)...they entered 2025 having scored just 22 runs in their previous 11 games against Baltimore.
- ☛ Since 2018, the Twins have hit 72 home runs in 44 games against the Orioles, their second-most vs. any opponent outside of the AL Central (77 vs. SEA)...37 have been hit at Camden.
- ☛ Josh Bell is hitting .346 (28-for-81) with seven home runs, 17 RBI, a .630 slugging percentage and a 1.009 OPS in 22 career games vs. the Orioles...he has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 vs. the O's...he has homered in five of his last nine vs. the O's.
- ☛ Ryan Jeffers is hitting .300 (12-for-40) with three doubles, one triple, two home runs, eight RBI, a .575 slugging percentage and a .953 OPS in 11 career games at Camden Yards.

THE BEST OF BUCK: Last season, Byron Buxton was named to the AL All-Star team, named to *The Sporting News* AL First Team and earned first career AL Silver Slugger Award; marked 10th different Twin to earn the award, third as an outfielder (Kirby Puckett and Josh Willingham)...additionally, he finished in 11th place in AL MVP voting, earning 30 voting points...also earned Most Valuable Twin Award and Jim Kaat Award for Twins Defensive Player of the Year.

- ☛ Buck's start in centerfield marks his ninth at the position (10th overall - DH in 2023), which passes Kirby Puckett (8) and ties Torii Hunter for the most starts in center on Opening Day in Twins history...in fact, according to *Elias*, his eight Opening Day starts in center rank second among actives, trailing only Mike Trout's 12 (chart in the right margin above).
- ☛ Seven Twins have made 10-plus Opening Day starts: Joe Mauer - 14, Harmon Killebrew - 13, Rod Carew - 12, Kent Hrbek - 12, Kirby Puckett - 11, Torii Hunter - 10, Tony Oliva - 10.

ALLOW ME TO RE-INTRODUCE MYSELF: The Twins open the 2026 season with 17 players on their 26-man roster who were not on the 2025 Opening Day roster: pitchers (8) - Mick Abel, Anthony Banda, Taj Bradley, Kody Funderburk, Zak Kent, Cody Laweryson, Eric Orze and Taylor Rogers; catcher (1) - Victor Caratini; infielders (5) - Josh Bell, Tristan Gray, Luke Keaschall, Brooks Lee and Royce Lewis; outfielders (1) - James Outman; utility players (2) - Kody Clemens and Austin Martin.

- ☛ Of the 26 players on the Twins' active roster, 12 began their professional careers in the Twins organization: Buxton, Funderburk, Jeffers, Larnach, Laweryson, Keaschall, Lee, Lewis, Ober, Rogers, Sands and Wallner.
- ☛ None of the 26 rostered players are looking to make their major league debut.
- ☛ Eight players are on their first career Opening Day roster: Abel, Gray, Keaschall, Kent, Laweryson, Lee, Martin and Orze.
- ☛ The oldest player is Taylor Rogers (35 years, 3 month, 10 days) and the youngest is Keaschall (23 years, 7 months, 12 days).

- ☞ Making his first start of 2026 and 115th start of his career (third career start vs. Baltimore).
- ☞ Fifth consecutive season pitching in the Twins opening rotation: Opening Day starter in 2022, third starter in 2023, second starter in 2024 and 2025.
- ☞ Threw 5.0 innings and allowed one earned run on four hits with one walk and nine strikeouts in final start of 2025 on September 26 at Philadelphia; Twins lost 3-1.
- ☞ In 2025, set career highs in innings (171.0) and starts (30), along with a career-high-tying 13 wins...recorded 194 strikeouts, second-most of his career.
- ☞ Is looking for first career win vs. Baltimore, the only American League opponent he has not beaten.

JOE-PENING DAY: Will take the mound on Opening Day for the second time in his career (2022), joining Pablo López as the only current Twins pitchers with multiple Opening Day starts...took the loss on OD 2022, allowing two runs in 4.0 innings with four walks and four strikeouts in a 2-1 defeat against Seattle at T-Mobile Park...only runs of the game for Seattle came on a Mitch Haniger first inning, two-run blast.

- ☞ Will mark the 17th consecutive season in which the Twins' Opening Day starter will be a right-handed pitcher...last left-handed Opening Day starter for the Twins was Francisco Liriano in 2009.
- ☞ At 29 years, 294 days old, Ryan will be the Twins' oldest Opening Day starter since 32-year-old Kenta Maeda took the ball in 2021.

SPRING RECAP: Was slated to start the Twins' opening Grapefruit League game, but removed himself due to a lower back issue...made his first full start on March 11 at Tampa Bay, when he tossed 3.0 scoreless innings...was named a member of Team USA's 2026 World Baseball Classic team, but did not end up participating...started on March 16 vs. PIT and twirled 4.0 innings of one-run baseball with six strikeouts, matching his spring career-high (also on 3/12/24 at DET)...made his final start of the spring on March 21 vs. Tampa Bay at Charlotte Sports Park, firing 5.0 innings of one-run ball with one walk and two strikeouts.

2025 RECAP: Made a career-high 30 starts (31 appearances), finishing 13-10 with a 3.42 ERA (171.0 IP, 65 ER), 39 walks, 194 strikeouts (4.97 K/BB), a 1.04 WHIP and a .218 (138-for-633) BAA...matched his single-season high in wins (also, 2022)...finished top 10 in the American League in strikeouts (6th), WHIP (6th), wins (7-6th), BAA (9th) and ERA (10th)...was named to the American League All-Star team for the first time in his career...received the Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year, as voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America.

FLYIN' WITH RYAN: Ryan is making his third career start against the Orioles (0-1), entering the game with a 4.50 ERA (16.0 IP, 8 ER) and 20 strikeouts...last faced the O's on July 9, 2023, when he allowed five earned runs through 4.1 IP on seven hits, two of them being homers (Austin Hays, Ramon Urias), with two walks and 10 strikeouts in a loss at Target Field.

☞ Baltimore is the only American League opponent Ryan has not beaten.

BEASTS OF THE AL EAST: In 22 career starts against the American League East (BOS 6x, NYY 5x, TB 4x, TOR 4x, BAL 3x), he is 9-6 with a 3.47 ERA (129.2 IP, 50 ER), 25 walks and 141 strikeouts...his nine wins against AL East opponents are his most against a division outside of the AL Central.

☞ Went 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA (34.2 IP, 13 ER) and 41 strikeouts in six starts against the AL East in 2025.

HOME/ROAD SPLITS: In 56 career road starts, Ryan is 20-19 with a 3.93 ERA (309.1 IP, 135 ER), 69 walks and 329 strikeouts, compared to 26-17 with a 3.66 ERA (332.0 IP, 135 ER), 79 walks and 390 strikeouts in 59 home appearances (58 starts).

☞ Posted a 6-5 record and a 3.36 ERA (85.2 IP, 32 ER) through 15 starts away from Target Field in 2025.

☞ His 91 strikeouts on the road ranked eighth in the American League and second in the American League Central, only trailing Cy Young Award winner Tarik Skubal (108).
