METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the Braves, 13-5...The victory snapped a seven-game losing streak, which was tied for the longest of the year...The Mets moved to 23-16 in series openers this season and 13-7 in home series openers...The Mets are in the midst of a five-game homestand (1-0) against the Braves (1-0) and Mariners for two games...The Mets and Mariners will head to Williamsport, PA on Sunday for the MLB Little League Classic.

THE HOME RUN KING OF QUEENS: Last night Pete Alonso hit his 253rd career home run, which set a new franchise record...It was a record held by Darryl Strawberry since May 3, 1988...Alonso became the fourth active player to hold an all-time home run record for a club, joining Manny Machado (SD), Giancarlo Stanton (MIA) and Mike Trout (LAA)...His 254 home runs are the third-most in Major League history through a player's first seven seasons, trailing only Ralph Kiner (294) and Albert Pujols (282)...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein...He is also the 10th player in Major League history to hit at least 254 home runs through their first 965 career games, joining Aaron Judge (308 HR), Ryan Howard (271 HR), Ralph Kiner (269 HR), Harmon Killebrew (265 HR), Giancarlo Stanton (261 HR), Juan González (259 HR), Albert Pujols (256 HR), Shohei Ohtani (255 HR) and Albert Belle (254 HR).

100 GRAND BAR: Pete Alonso is four RBI away from 100 this season...He is looking to record his fourth season with 100+ RBI...That would place him second in team history...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Alonso ranks third in team history in RBI...Wright is the leader (970), followed by Darryl Strawberry (733)...Alonso's 96 RBI are third-most in the majors.

LONG BALLS: Pete Alonso's 254 home runs since he joined the league in 2019 are tied for the second-most in the majors with Kyle Schwarber (254)...They trail only Aaron Judge (270)...Alonso's 682 RBI are the most in the majors since 2019...Since his Major League debut in 2019, his 25 multi-homer games are the third-most in the league, trailing only Aaron Judge (37) and Kyle Schwarber (28).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Alonso hit his 30th double of the season in the second inning last night...He is the 10th player in franchise history to record at least 30 doubles in three or more seasons (also: 2019 and 2024), joining David Wright (8), Daniel Murphy (5), Carlos Beltrán (5), José Reyes (4), Carlos Delgado (3), John Olerud (3), Kevin McReynolds (3), Keith Hernandez (3) and Howard Johnson (3)...His 30 doubles are tied for the sixth-most in the majors and tied for the second-most in the NL.

PICK SIX: Last night, the Mets offense recorded at least six home runs for third time this season (also: 6/8 and 6/21), which sets a single-season franchise record...The Mets are the only team in the majors this season with three games of six or more home runs...The club's six home runs with two outs were tied for the most by any team in a game since the Expansion Era (since 1961)...The others were Toronto (6/13/21), Cleveland (4/30/13), Los Angeles (5/23/02) and Pittsburgh (7/3/70)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...New York ranks fourth in the National League with 153 home runs.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch where they play 16 of 19 games against the NL East...They are 1-0 in that span...The Mets are 16-11 against the NL East this season.

20/20 VISION: The Mets became the only team in the National League and the third team in the majors to feature four players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor, Nimmo and Juan Soto)...The Yankees and Athletics also have four players with 20+ homers...The Mets have had seven seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (also: 2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets improved to 39-21 at home this season, which is tied with the 1988 and 1990 teams for the seventh-best home start in franchise history...Only the 1985, 1986, 1989, 2000, 2015 and 2022 squads had better records through their first 60 home games of a season...Their 39 home wins are tied for the second-most in the majors (most: Milwaukee - 41) and their .650 winning percentage at home is the fourth-best in the majors.

SIXTH SENSE: Over David Peterson's last six starts (since July 3), he has gone 2-1 with a 2.15 ERA (9 ER/37.2 IP), 11 walks and 29 strikeouts...Has recorded a quality start in five of those six outings...He has completed 6.0 innings in a career-high six consecutive starts and in 15 of his 22 starts this season...He is the first Met to record at least six straight starts of 6.0 innings since Sean Manaea's eight such starts from August 16 - September 21, 2024...He is one of 10 left-handed pitchers in the majors this season to post at least 15 games with 6.0+ IP.

ALVY WAY BACK: Since being recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on July 21, Francisco Alvarez has reached base in 13 of his 14 starts, including each of his seven starts in August...In 16 games since July 21, has batted .304/.418/.630 (14-46) with 10 runs, four doubles, one triple, three home runs, eight RBI and nine walks...In eight home games in that span, has posted a 1.288 OPS.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all 10 games this month...He is batting 11-39 (.282) with eight runs, three homers, five RBI, six walks, three steals, a .391 OBP and a .513 SLG...Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 90 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks...With 11 more works, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

TWO AWAY: Edwin Díaz has 248 saves in 503 career games in the major leagues...According to Elias, his 248 saves are the ninth-most saves for any pitcher through his first 500 career games and the most for any active pitcher...The most saves in first 500 career MLB games among active pitchers: Díaz (248), Kenly Jansen (244), Aroldis Chapman (240), Josh Hader (227 in 465 games), Raisel Iglesias (212).

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 34 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...They lead the majors with a 90.3% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 18 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his fifth loss of the year after allowing four earned runs over 6.0 innings on August 6 vs. Cleveland (5 H, 2 BB, 7 K, 2 HR)...The southpaw gave up two home runs at Citi Field for only the third time in his career and for the first time July 1, 2022 vs. Texas... Had gone 43 straight home outings (34 starts) without allowing multiple home runs...His 34 straight starts without allowing multiple home runs at home was the seventh-longest such streak in Mets history and the longest since R.A. Dickey’s 38 straight such starts from July 29, 2010 - September 11, 2012...Was tied with Spencer Turnbull for the longest active such streak in the majors...He allowed four runs at home for the first since September 20, 2024 vs. Philadelphia...His seven strikeouts were his most in a start since May 24 vs. Los Angeles-NL.

PICK SIX: Over his last six starts (since July 3), has gone 2-1 with a 2.15 ERA (9 ER/37.2 IP), 11 walks and 29 strikeouts...Has recorded a quality start in five of those six outings...He has completed 6.0 innings in a career-high six consecutive starts and in 15 of his 22 starts this season...He is the first Met to record at least six straight starts of 6.0 innings since Sean Manaea’s eight such starts from August 16 - September 21, 2024...He is one of 10 left-handed pitchers in the majors this season to post at least 15 games with 6.0+ IP.

POSTCARD FROM QUEENS: The Mets are 10-2 in Peterson's home starts this season...The southpaw has gone 5-1 with a 2.33 ERA (19 ER/73.1 IP), 20 walks and 60 strikeouts at home this year...Among qualified NL pitchers at home this season, he ranks second in groundball percentage (57.5), sixth in opponents' SLG (.314), seventh in ERA and 10th in opponents' OPS (.605)...Has allowed three runs or fewer in 11 of those 12 games and two runs or fewer in 10...Has allowed just 19 earned runs through his first 12 home starts, which is the fewest by a Mets starter since Marcus Stroman (19 ER in first 12 home starts of 2021)...He is the first left-hander to do so since Steven Matz (17 ER in first 12 home starts of 2019)...The Mets have lost each of Peterson’s last two home starts after the club had won each of his first 10 home starts to start the season...The team's 10 consecutive wins in Peterson's starts was the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history...The team's 11 straight home wins in David Cone's starts to open the 1989 season are the most...Courtesy of *Elias*...The Mets are 16-5 in his 21 home starts since the beginning of 2024 and 41-19 in Peterson's games at home in his career.

SUMMER HEAT: Made four starts in the month of July, going 2-0 with a 1.05 ERA (3 ER/25.2 IP)...His July ERA was his lowest in a single calendar month of his career (min. 15.0 IP) and the fifth-best by a Mets pitcher in the month of July in franchise history (min. 25.0 IP)...His ERA was also the eighth-best in a single calendar month by a left-hander in franchise history (min. 25.0 IP), trailing only Jerry Koosman's 1.04 ERA in April 1968, Koosman's 0.72 ERA in June 1969, Jon Matlack's 0.86 ERA in 1972, Frank Viola's 0.86 ERA in April 1991, Al Leiter's 0.92 ERA in April 2002, Tug McGraw's 0.64 ERA in September 1973, Jose Quintana's 0.72 ERA in September 2024...Courtesy of *Elias*.

SEASONS GREETINGS: Over a career-high 22 starts this season, has gone 7-5 with a 2.98 ERA (44 ER/133.0 IP), 45 walks and 112 strikeouts...His ERA is the lowest by a Mets southpaw through 22 starts of a season since Johan Santana's 2.93 ERA through 22 starts of the 2008 season...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 19 of his 22 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in nine starts...Has completed 5.0 innings in 19 of his 22 starts...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is fourth in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.61, second in NL), tied for sixth in opponent GIDP (16, third in NL) and sixth in groundball percentage (54.8, fourth in NL)...Is also sixth in the NL in opponents' SLG (.341) and ninth in ERA.

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 35 of his 43 starts, going 17-8 with a 2.94 ERA (83 ER/254.0 IP), 91 walks and 213 strikeouts...26 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 27-16 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just five runs in the first inning, which is the fewest in the majors during that span (min. 40 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 40 GS), he is second in HR/9.0 IP (0.60, first in the NL), sixth in groundball percentage (52.7, fourth in NL), seventh in opponents' SLG (.345, third in NL) and eighth in ERA (fourth in NL).

VS. BRAVES/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Will be making his 13th career appearance (12th start) against the Braves tonight...Faced Atlanta once this season on June 17 at Truist Park, allowing three earned runs over 7.0 innings (5 H, 3 BB, 3 K)...Has made 17 starts against National League opponents this season, the Mets going 11-6 in those games...Has posted a 7-3 record with a 3.05 ERA (35 ER/103.1 IP) against Senior Circuit opponents this year.

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: He has recorded 15 starts of at least 6.0 innings and he is one of 10 left-handers to do so this year...Has 576 career strikeouts, the ninth-most by a franchise southpaw...John Franco is next on the list with 592...Vs. left-handers this season, has posted a .221/.267/.283 slash line (25-113) and has allowed just one home run to 121 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he is tied for second in groundball percentage (67.5) and is tied for sixth in strikeouts (36)...Among NL southpaws facing lefties, he is sixth in opponents' OPS (.560) and opponents' OBP, seventh in opponents' SLG and eighth in opponents' BA...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

QUALITY CONTROL: Has recorded 14 quality starts in 22 total outings this season, including 12 of his last 16 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from 7/3-8/1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 26 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 24 of them coming in his last 38 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of six pitchers (one of three in NL) to record at least 24 quality starts and one of four left-handers to do so.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR: On July 10, Peterson was named to his first career All-Star Game after posting a first half career-best 3.06 ERA and 93 strikeouts (previous: 3.09 ERA in 2024 and 84 K in 2022)...He is the first Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and is the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...He threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the Midsummer Classic on July 15, becoming the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom in 2019 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to do so since Tom Glavine in 2004.

APPLE PICKING: This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of seven (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which is tied for the best in the NL and the second-best in the majors behind Will Warren (8)...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 31 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Chris Flexen and José Berríos are next on the list at 22...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

SOUTHPAW SHUTOUT: On June 11 vs. the Nationals, Peterson tossed a complete game shutout for the first time in his career (6 H, 0 BB, 6 K)...Was the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He is the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT)...Became the fourth pitcher in the majors this season to throw a 9.0+ IP complete game shutout without allowing a walk, and the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom (4/23/21 vs. WAS)...He became the 63rd pitcher in franchise history to record a shutout without allowing a walk.

CAREER NOTES: Has set new career highs in innings pitched and starts this season...Was selected to the All-Star team for the first time in his career in 2025...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from 6/5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 35-29 with a 3.83 ERA (250 ER/587.0 IP), 242 walks and 576 strikeouts in 123 games (107 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
