TODAY’S STARTERS: LHP GAGE JUMP (5-7, 4.50) vs. RHP RANDY DOBNAK (2-1, 1.73)

DOWN BUT NEVER OUT: Fueled by a 7-run 8th inning, the Royals overcame a 5-1 deficit last night en route to a 9-7 win vs. the Athletics, their 4th consecutive victory.

- + Trailing 5-1 in the 6th inning, **Vinnie Pasquantino** hit his 1st HR since June 3, which marked the 500th hit of his career.
- + Down 5-2 in the 8th, the Royals sent 11 men to the plate and scored 7 runs on 5 hits and 3 walks, including a game-tying sac. fly by **Isaac Collins** and a bases-clearing double by **John Rave**, who entered as a pinch hitter in the 5th.
- + The 7-run 8th inning matched their highest-scoring frame this season, following a 7-run 7th on July 7 at the Mets and a 7-run 6th on April 1 vs. Minnesota.

RALLY ROYALS: The Royals have overcome a deficit in 11 of their 16 wins since the All-Star break, only 1 shy of the Cubs and Red Sox (12 each) for the most comeback wins in MLB.

- + Last night was the third time this season the Royals erased a deficit of at least 4 runs in a victory, following April 26 vs. the Angels (trailed by 6) and July 7 at the Mets (5).
- + The Royals have overcome a deficit of at least 3 runs in 7 wins this season, tied for 4th most in the Majors trailing the Astros (11), Padres (9) and Twins (9)...four of those such wins have come since the All-Star break, most in MLB.
- + Their 31 comeback wins for the season are just 1 shy of the Rays, Yankees and White Sox (32 each) for the AL lead.
- + They’ve overcome a deficit in 31 of their 54 wins (57.4%), the highest rate in the American League and 2nd-highest rate in the Majors, trailing only the Rockies (62.0%).
- + The Royals have held a lead in 26 of 31 games since the All-Star break, tied with the Dodgers and Red Sox for the 2nd-most such games in the Majors, 1 behind the Tigers (27).

NEW TEAM, SAME RESULT: **Craig Kimbrel** pitched a 1-2-3 8th last night, ahead of the Royals 7-run rally, to earn his 1st win as a Royal and his 1st win in the big leagues in almost two years, since Aug. 23, 2024 vs. Houston (with Baltimore).

- + The Royals are the ninth team Kimbrel has won a game with, the most among active pitchers, according to *Elias*.
- + Kimbrel’s 57 career wins are tied with **Kenley Jansen** for the 2nd most among active relievers, trailing only **Aroldis Chapman** (62).

FULL STRENGTH: **Maikel Garcia** and **Vinnie Pasquantino** were reinstated from the Injured List on Monday and their returns have ignited the Royals lineup in 3 games, in which the team is slashing .333/.427/.485 (33-for-99) with 7.3 runs per game.

- + In this series, Garcia and Pasquantino have combined to go 11-for-26 (.423) with 5 runs, 4 extra-base hits and 5 RBI.
- + With runners in scoring position in this series, the Royals are 16-for-36 (.444) with 5 walks, 5 XBH and a 1.151 OPS.
- + The Royals have overcome a deficit to win all 3 games in this series...they trailed 1-0 in Monday night’s 9-5 win, and erased a 3-0 deficit—including a 2-run deficit in the 9th—in Tuesday night’s walk-off victory...they overcame a 5-1 hole last night en route to a 9-7 win.

SWEEPSTAKES: After winning the 1st 2 games of this series, the Royals are hoping to win again today to clinch their 4th series sweep of the season...they also swept the Angels here in Kansas City from April 24-26, the Mariners in Seattle from May 1-3 and the Giants at home from July 20-22.

- + The Royals are 3-5 with a chance to sweep this season.
- + The Royals are attempting to sweep the Athletics for the first time since May 17-19, 2024 in a 3-game set here in Kansas City...they last swept the Athletics in a 4-game set 32 years ago, from Aug. 1-4, 1994.

FOUR SQUARE: This series vs. the A’s marks the Royals last of 6 4-game series this season...after clinching the series last night, the Royals are 2-0-4 in 4-game series this season.

- + The Royals are one of three teams that has played at least 6 4-game series this season without losing any of them, along with the Guardians (2-0-4) and Braves (4-0-2).
- + The Royals today are seeking their 1st 4-game sweep since May 5-8, 2025 vs. the White Sox...their last 4-game series sweep of a non-division opponent was 11 years ago, from July 7-9, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay.
- + Since the start of 2024, the Royals are 11-5-5 in 4-game series and their 11 series wins are 2nd most in MLB, trailing only Cleveland (12)...they’ve played 21 4-game sets in that time, 3 fewer than Cleveland (24) for the fewest in the MLB.

STREAKS: The Royals have won 4 straight games to match their 2nd-longest win streak of the season, trailing only their 5-game win streak from May 1-5...they’ve won 5 of their last 6 games on the heels of a 3-10 skid in their previous 13 games.

HBD, NATE!: Royals right-handed reliever **Nate Pearson** is celebrating his 30th birthday today and shares this date of birth with former Royal **Israel Sánchez** (63) and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Todd Helton** (53).

HOME: The Royals today continue this 7-game homestand vs. the Athletics (3-0) and Tigers (3 games) in Kansas City... Monday night began a stretch in which they’re playing 22 of their final 37 games here at Kauffman Stadium.

- + The Royals are 32-30 at home this season but they are 13-4 in their last 17 games here since July 5, which is the best home record in the Majors during that time, ahead of the Red Sox and Padres (14-5 each).
- + The Royals are 10-8-2 in 20 series at home but are 5-1-0 in their last 6...they’re 4-3-3 on 10 completed homestands but a win today would clinch a winning stay, no matter the outcome of this weekend’s series vs. Detroit.
- + The Royals rank 2nd in the American League at home this season in extra-base hits (199) and 3rd in runs per game (4.8), batting average (.264) and OPS (.759).

QUALITY TIME: Royals starters have 52 quality starts this season, tied with the Red Sox for the 4th most in the Majors, trailing only the Dodgers (67), Mariners (57) and Phillies (55).

- + They’re 30-22 (.577) in quality starts with the 2nd-worst record in the Majors, and their 22 losses in quality starts are the most in the Majors and 3 more than any other team.
- + Today’s starting pitcher **Randy Dobnak** ranks 3rd in the Majors with a 1.73 ERA (8 ER in 41.2 IP) in 8 appearances (6 starts) since making his Royals debut on July 2, trailing only **Troy Melton** (1.34) and **Dylan Cease** (1.49).

SOUTHPAW STORY: The Royals are 11-28 (.282) in 39 games vs. left-handed starting pitchers, which is the worst record in the Majors...last season they were 20-13 vs. lefties, 2nd best.

- + The Royals today will face a southpaw starter for the 8th game in their last 11...they’ve won back-to-back games vs. left-handed starters after losing each of their last 6.
- + Lefty starters own a 2.96 ERA (69 ER in 210.0 IP) vs. KC and have allowed 3 earned runs or fewer in 36 of 39 starts.

SECOND THOUGHTS: The Royals are 1 game over .500 (16-15) since the All-Star break, a record bested by only six teams in the American League...they were 21 games under .500 (38-59) before the All-Star break, which tied for the worst record in Major League Baseball in the 1st half.

- + The Royals are 5-4-1 in 10 series since the All-Star break, after going 9-19-3 in 31 series before the break.
- + The Royals 13 quality starts since the All-Star break are tied for 2nd most in the AL, trailing only the Orioles (15).
- + Royals starting pitchers own a 3.93 ERA (73 ER in 167.0 IP) since the All-Star break, which ranks 6th in the AL.

THIN MARGINS: The Royals have played 31 games since the All-Star break and 17 of them (54.8%) have been decided by 1 run, and the Royals are 9-8 in those games...their 17 1-run games since the break are 4 more than the Dodgers and Braves (13) for the most in MLB and are 5 more than the Yankees and Angels (12) for the most among AL teams.

- + For the season, the Royals 40 1-run games are tied for the 3rd most in the Majors, trailing only the White Sox and Dodgers (42 each)...they are 18-22 (.450) in 1-run games and their 22 such losses are tied for the most in the Majors.
- + The Royals have played 70 games this season decided by 2 runs or fewer, most in the Majors ahead of Cleveland (69), and they’ve played 86 games decided by 3 runs or fewer, tied with Toronto for 2nd most, trailing only Cleveland (87).

VS. ATHLETICS: The Royals are 4-2 vs. the A’s this season and have already clinched the season series for the second time in three years (also 2024), after going 0-5-2 in their previous 7 season series from 2016-23...a victory today would mark their 5th vs. the Athletics this season, which would be their most since 2015, when they went 5-1.

- + The Royals have won 2 of their last 3 series vs. the A’s at Kauffman Stadium after losing 7 straight from 2016-23.
- + The Royals are 16-11 (.593) vs. the American League West this season, which is their best mark vs. any division.

RANDY DOBNAK is making his 28th career start (48th appearance) this afternoon in the series finale of this 4-game set here at The K vs. the Athletics, who he is facing for the second time in his career but for the first time as a starter...he was acquired by the Royals from the Mariners on June 17 in exchange for cash considerations.

- + On July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak joined the Royals rotation, filling the void of **Stephen Kolek**, who was placed on the Injured List with a right flexor strain...the outing marked his 1st MLB start since Sept. 3, 2021, with 1,779 days in between.
- + His 1.69 starter ERA (6 ER in 32.0 IP) is tied with **Michael Lorenzen** (2024) for the 2nd-lowest mark through a pitcher's 1st 6 starts with the club in Royals history, trailing only **Seth Lugo**, who posted a 1.66 ERA across his 1st 6 starts in 2024.
- + Across 13 starts with Triple-A Tacoma to begin the season, Dobnak went 5-5 with a 4.24 ERA (33 ER in 70.0 IP), and at the time of the deal on June 17, his 6 quality starts ranked 3rd in Minor League Baseball...as part of the trade, Randy had his contract selected, but was optioned to Triple-A Omaha, where he made 2 starts (June 19 and June 25) before being recalled on July 1.

LAST TIME OUT: Dobbak did not factor into the decision of the Royals 1-0 defeat last Saturday at the Angels despite spinning 5.2 shutout innings on 4 hits and 2 walks, with 6 strikeouts...worked with traffic on the bases in each of his 1st 3 innings, stranding only a 1-out single by **Mike Trout** in the 1st, escaping a 2-on, 2-out jam in the 2nd and pitching around a 2-out single in the 3rd...went 1-2-3 in the 4th and 5th after which he recorded 2 outs in the 6th, but exited with 2 runners on in favor of **Craig Kimbrel**, who retired **Josh Lowe** to strand the inherited runners and preserve the 0-0 tie.

- + Randy threw 1st-pitch strikes to 16 of 23 batters (69.6%), and over his last 3 starts since Aug. 4 vs. Minnesota, his 70.0% 1st-pitch strike percentage marks a sharp turn from his 54.6% rate across his 1st 5 outings (3 starts) to begin the season.
- + The start marked Dobnak's 4th outing this season in which he completed at least 5.0 scoreless innings, tied with **Noah Cameron** for the most on the team.
- + Recorded a career-high-tying 6 strikeouts, joining Sept. 25, 2019 at Detroit.
- + He leaned heavily on his slider, throwing it to 15.1% of batters, by far his highest rate in any outing this season, as he used the pitch just 2.9% of the time to begin the year.

STORY OF THE SEASON: After each of Dobnak's 1st 15 appearances to open this season on Triple-A with Tacoma (13) and Omaha (2), he was recalled by Kansas City on July 1, and he initially pitched out of the bullpen, making 2 bulk relief appearances on July 2 vs. the Rays and July 8 at the Mets...across 8 games (6 starts) with the Royals, Randy's 1.73 ERA (8 ER in 41.2 IP) since his Royals debut on July 2 is the 4th-best mark in the Majors (min. 40.0 IP), trailing **Troy Melton** (1.16) and **Dylan Cease** (1.49).

SECOND-HALF SURGE: Randy joined the Royals rotation to begin the 2nd half of the season, and has been one of the best pitchers in the Majors since, posting a 1.69 ERA (6 ER in 32.0 IP), the 2nd-lowest mark in MLB following the All-Star break, trailing only **Troy Melton** of the Detroit Tigers (1.54)...Randy has surrendered just 1 home run in this 6-start stretch, posting a 0.3 HR/9 rate that ranks 6th in the American League, behind teammate **Noah Cameron**, whose 0.2 HR/9 mark leads.

- Dobnak has allowed 1 run or fewer in 5 of his 6 starts since joining the Royals rotation, tied with **Ryan Weathers** of the Yankees and **Sandy Alcantara** of the Marlins for the most such starts in the Majors since the All-Star break... additionally, Randy has surrendered just 4 hits or fewer in 5 of those starts—1 shy of **Reid Detmers** (6) for the MLB lead—the lone exception being his Aug. 9 outing vs. the Cubs, when he was tagged for 4 runs on 10 hits over 5.0 innings.

VS. ATHLETICS: Randy is making just his 2nd career appearance (1st start) vs. the Athletics and his 1st since April 21, 2021 at the Oakland Coliseum, where he fired a scoreless 5th inning in the Twins 13-12 walk-off defeat.

- Dobnak is making his 2nd consecutive start vs. the American League West after having made just 1 previous start vs. the division before last Saturday's outing at the Angels...he's completed at least 5.0 innings in each of his 2 prior starts vs. AL West foes, but has yet to factor into a decision, despite his 1.69 ERA (2 ER in 10.2 IP).

WALK THIS WAY: In 8 Major League appearances (6 starts) this season, Dobnak has struggled at times with his command, issuing 16 walks over 41.2 innings (3.5 BB/9), including a career-high 4 walks in his start on July 18 vs. San Diego...this year's rate is more than a full walk higher than his 2.4 BB/9 rate that he posted over 39 career appearances (21 starts) prior to the start of the season...across his 15 Triple-A starts this year, he yielded just 25 walks in 80.2 innings, recording a 2.8 BB/9 rate, which is much more in line with what he has posted in his career.

- + Despite surrendering 16 walks, none of them have scored, and in fact, 4 of them have been stranded as inherited runners thanks to Kansas City's bullpen.

GROUND CONTROL: In his career, Dobnak has posted a 56.9% groundball rate, which is well above the Major League average rate of 43.2% since his debut season in 2019...in this span, his groundball rate ranks 11th in the Majors (min. 20 starts), trailing leader **Clay Holmes** (62.7%)...although a small sample size, Randy has continued this same success this season, producing a 55.6% groundball rate.

HOME SWEET HOME: In 19 lifetime appearances (10 starts) in his home ballpark, Randy has gone 5-5 with a 5.12 ERA (40 ER in 70.1 IP), more than a full run higher than his 3.54 ERA (44 ER in 112.0 IP) across 28 road outings (17 starts)...this afternoon, he is making his 6th career appearance (5th start) here at Kauffman Stadium, where he owns a 2-1 record and a 3.86 ERA (10 ER in 23.1 IP).

- + Over 4 outings (3 starts) at The K this year, Dobnak has posted a 3.93 ERA (8 ER in 18.1 IP) with a .307 opponents' average (23-for-75), while he's yet to allow a run in 23.1 innings with a .183 opponents' average (15-for-82) in 4 road games (3 starts).

HOME RUN REPORT: Three of the 8 runs that Randy has surrendered this season have come on 2 home runs: a 2-run shot by **Cedric Mullins** on July 2 and a solo homer by **Fernando Tatis Jr.** on July 18...in 39 games over his first five Major League seasons, he yielded 17 home runs, which accounted for 26 of his 81 runs allowed (32%).

- + Since yielding a solo home run to Tatis Jr. in the 3rd inning on July 18 vs. the Padres, Dobnak has spun a season-high 29.0 consecutive homerless innings, which trails his career-high 36.1-inning run from Sept. 15, 2019-Aug. 10, 2020.

TOMORROW NIGHT’S STARTER: LHP NOAH CAMERON (7-8, 4.16)

- + **Noah Cameron** will make his 24th start of the season and the 48th of his career (49th appearance) in tomorrow night's series opener against the Tigers.

+ In his most recent start last Sunday against the Angels in Anaheim, Noah pitched his 1st career complete game shutout, allowing just 1 hit and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts in a 3-0 victory...retired the 1st 15 batters he faced before surrendering a walk to **Oswald Peraza** to lead off the 6th, but worked out of trouble with 2 groundouts and a strikeout...after striking out **Mike Trout** to start the 7th, Cameron allowed a 1-out single to **Vaughn Grissom** to end his no-hit bid, but escaped the inning with 2 flyouts...struck out the side in the 8th and sealed a 1-2-3 9th with another punchout of Trout.

+ His outing last Sunday marked the 1st 1-hit shutout by a Royal since **Zack Greinke** did it on Aug. 30, 2009 during his **Cy Young** Award-winning season.

+ Cameron has completed at least 8.0 innings in 3 of his last 4 starts, and since he started calling his own pitches on July 24, he's 2-0 in his last 5 outings with a 1.19 ERA (5 ER in 37.2 IP) and a league-leading .107 opponents' average (13-for-121).
- + In 2 games (1 start) vs. the Tigers, Cameron has posted a 2.45 ERA (3 ER in 11.0 IP) with 12 strikeouts...his last time facing Detroit came in his lone career relief appearance on July 24, when he did not facor into the decision despite tossing 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing just 2 hits and 3 walks with 8 strikeouts in a 2-1 loss.

+ In 14 career games (13 starts) vs. American League Central opponents, he is 6-2 with a 2.26 ERA (21 ER in 83.2 IP) and 77 strikeouts...he has allowed just 1 earned run across his previous 4 outings vs. AL Central foes since June 7, posting a 0.31 ERA (1 ER in 29.0 IP)...his 2.26 ERA against the division since 2025 ranks 5th in the Majors (min. 10 starts), trailing Tampa Bay's **Drew Rasmussen** (1.86).

+ In 12 starts at The K this season, Noah is 5-3 with a 5.17 ERA (36 ER in 62.2 IP)...his last home start came on Aug. 5 vs. Minnesota, when he allowed just 1 run on 3 hits and 1 walk, with a career-high-tying 9 strikeouts, in 8.0 innings of a 2-1 win.

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost's** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 278 wins are 7th most in franchise history, 8 shy of **Hal McRae** (286) for 6th...he's only 22 wins shy of becoming the fifth Manager in Royals history to reach 300 wins (Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317).

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash's** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona's** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

- + **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 30 challenges this season (73.3%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB last Friday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.
- + Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
