LAST GAME: The D-backs won 9-2 @ Orioles to cap a 4-2 roadtrip.

- ◆ **Ketel Marte** hit safely in his 13th straight game with a 2-run single and a sac fly.
- ♦ Randal Grichuk and Jake McCarthy each had 2 RBI.
- ◆ Zac Gallen got the win with a quality start (2 R in 6.0 IP).
- ♦ Matt Bowman (2.0 IP) and Justin Martinez (1.0 IP) closed out the victory with 3.0 scoreless frames.

VS. REDS: The D-backs swept the Reds last Tuesday-Thursday in Cincinnati, their first sweep of the season and first on the road since June 9-11, 2023 @ Tigers.

- ♦ The D-backs have 6 road sweeps @ Reds, including their first ever series June 16-18, 1998 (also: May 7-9, 2024; April 20-22, 2021; Aug. 20-23, 2015; Aug. 13-15, 2002; May 15-17, 2001; June 16-18, 1998).
- ♦ Over their last 23 games vs. Reds, since 2021, the D-backs are 14-9 overall, including 6-4 at home.

AT HOME VS. NL CENTRAL: The D-backs are 14-8 at home vs. NL Central since last season, including an 11-5 mark in 2023.

MONTGOMERY MUSINGS: Jordan Montgomery tossed a quality start (2 ER in 7.0 IP) and earned the win in his last start on May 8 @ Reds.

♦ In 5 career starts vs. Reds, is 3-1 with a 3.10 ERA (10 ER in 29.0 IP) with 9 walks and 27 strikeouts.

STARTERS ROLLING: D-backs starting pitchers during the 6-game roadtrip posted a 2.83 ERA (11 ER in 35.0 IP) with a .234 opponent average (30-for-128), 12 walks and 17 strikeouts

CALL TO THE 'PEN: The D-backs bullpen, in 6 games during the roadtrip, had a 3.79 ERA (8 ER in 19.0 IP), .217 opponent average (15-for-69), .670 opponent OPS, 9 walks and 17 strikeouts.

HOME SWEET HOME: Ketel Marte, in 19 home games, is hitting .346 (27-for-78)/.993 OPS with 8 doubles, 4 homers. 10 RBI and 7 walks.

◆ Joc Pederson, in 17 home games, is hitting .341 (15for-44)/1.062 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 7 RBI and 7 walks.

bWAR(e) OF KETEL: Ketel Marte's 2.7 bWAR is third among all players [pitcher or position], behind Mookie Betts/ LAD (3.2) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (2.9), and ahead of Shohei Ohtani/LAD (2.6) and Gunnar Henderson/BAL (2.6).

games) since May 5 are tied for second most in the Maiors (also: 6 others) behind Kyle Tucker/HOU (5).

♦ Among leadoff batters in the Majors, his 7 homers are tied for third and his .590 SLG ranks fifth.

MARTE'S LUCKY 13: Ketel Marte's season-long 13-game hit streak is the second-longest active hit streak in the Majors, behind Max Kepler/MIN (14).

- ♦ In the span (since April 28), he has 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers, 10 RBI and 2 walks.
- ♦ Marte's career best is 16 games (May 16-June 4, 2022; .390, 23-for-59, 7 2B, 1 HR, 9 RBI and 5 BB).
- ♦ Marte's 10 career 10+-game hit streaks are third most in franchise history, behind Luis Gonzalez (12) and Paul Goldschmidt (11).

CLEAN FIELDING TEAMS: Since April 22, the D-backs' 5 errors are tied for second fewest in the Majors, with the Dodgers, Rockies and Cardinals, behind the Orioles (4).

ABOVE AVERAGE DEFENDERS: The D-backs are the only team to feature multiple players in the top 10 of MLB Outs Above Average leaders: Christian Walker (T-4th, 6), Ketel Marte (T-4th, 6) and Kevin Newman (T-4th, 6).

MAY GROOVING: Kevin Newman, in 9 games in May, is hitting .348 (8-for-23)/.897 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple and 1 walk.

- ◆ Jake McCarthy, in 9 games in May, has a .316 AVG (6for-19)/.985 OPS with 1 double, 1 homer, 4 RBI and 5
- ◆ Joc Pederson, in 10 games in May, is hitting .300 (9for-30) with a .930 OPS, 2 doubles, 2 homers, 3 RBI and 2 walks.

VS. RIGHTIES: Joc Pederson against righties in his last 11 home games is hitting .290 (9-for-31)/.914 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 5 RBI and 2 walks.

◆Christian Walker, in his last 11 games vs. righties, is hitting .281 (9-for-32)/.916 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 homers, 8 RBI and 5 walks.

GRICHUK GAINING STEAM: Randal Grichuk has hit safely in 12 of his last 17 games at a .351 clip (13-for-37)/.877 OPS with 5 doubles, 7 RBI and 2 walks.

- His .573 opponent OPS vs. lefties is third among active starters (min. 500 LHB faced) to Chris Sale (.529) and Clayton Kershaw (.561).
- Has issued walks to just 3 of 215 (1.4%) left-handed batters faced since 2022, the lowest walk pct. against lefties in MLB (min. 200 LH batters faced).
