MLB AT RICKWOOD FIELD

Baseball honors and celebrates the rich and often-overlooked history of the Negro Leagues at America's oldest professional ballpark, while honoring the great **Willie Mays** who recently sadly passed away at age 93 ... The St. Louis Cardinals take on the San Francisco Giants tonight as part of a Major League Baseball Special Event Game at historic Rickwood Field in Birmingham, Alabama.

Tonight's game concludes a seven-game, three-city road trip through Chicago (2-1), Miami (1-1), and Birmingham as the Cardinals visit two of the three oldest active professional ballparks in America with Wrigley Field (1914) and Rickwood Field (1910).

GLOBETROTTERS

For the second consecutive year, the Cardinals will host a regular season "home" game outside of St. Louis as the Redbirds and Giants begin their six-game season series tonight in Alabama.

Rickwood marks the Cardinals 5th regular season showcase series and MLB's first ever regular season game in the state of Alabama ... The Cardinals have played multiple exhibitions at Rickwood Field since the 1920s ... Other St. Louis showcase series have included the following:

- 1997 Padres Paradise Series in Honolulu, Hawaii vs. San Diego
- 2017 Little League Classic in Williamsport, Pennsylvania vs. Pittsburgh
- 2019 Mexico Series in Monterrey, Mexico vs. Cincinnati

PLAYERS IN RICKWOOD FIELD HISTORY

Nearly 30% of the 346 inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame have played a game at Rickwood, which includes 17 notable Cardinals.

Among 2024 Cardinals, **Willie McGee** played at Rickwood for the Nashville Sounds (AA-Yankees) in the early 1980s, while **Riley O'Brien** pitched in the 2019 Rickwood Classic with the Montgomery Biscuits (AA-Rays).

Tom Alston (Cards first Black player) played in a 1954 exhibition against the White Sox ... **Bill Greason** (Cards first black pitcher & 2nd player) was teammates with **Willie Mays** on the 1948 Birmingham Black Barons (NAL) that played home games at Rickwood Field.

NEGRO LEAGUE THROWBACK UNIFORMS

SAN FRANCISCO CONNECTIONS

Brandon Crawford played 13 seasons in San Francisco (2011-23), where he was a cornerstone of two World Series Championship teams (2012, 2014) that eliminated St. Louis from the postseason each time...three-time National League All-Star...four-time Gold Glove Award winner...2015 Silver Slugger Award recipient.

Willie McGee played four seasons (1991-95) with the Giants...was born in San Francisco...graduated from Harry Ells High School in Richmond, CA...played college baseball at Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Hill, CA...resides in Hercules, CA...worked as an asst. coach for Contra Costa College in San Pablo, CA.

Tommy Edman played college baseball at Stanford University (2014-16), where he was teammates with **Austin Slater**.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Keith Hernandez** was born in San Francisco, CA...graduated from Capuchino High School in San Bruno, CA.

Lars Nootbar and **Blake Sabol** were teammates at the University of Southern California (2017-18).

Nolan Arenado's brother, **Jonah Arenado**, was selected by San Francisco in the 16th round of 2013 MLB Draft...played seven seasons (2013-19) in the Giants minor league organization.

Paul Goldschmidt made his MLB debut at San Francisco (Aug. 1, 2011)...singled in first career plate appearance off **Matt Cain** (Aug. 1, 2011)...homered off **Tim Lincecum** for first MLB home run (Aug. 2, 2011).

Giants Community Ambassador and Hall of Famer **Orlando Cepeda** played parts of three seasons with St. Louis (1966-68)...in 1967, was NL All-Star, NL MVP and won the World Series...traded by the Cardinals to Atlanta for **Joe Torre** (March 17, 1969).

Giants' Special Asst. **Will Clark** played in 51 games in his final season (2000) with St. Louis...slashed .345/.441/.621 in eight Postseason games.

ST. LOUIS STARS PARK (1922-31)

Stars Park in St. Louis was the first ever professional baseball park exclusively owned by African Americans and one of the few ballparks purposely built for a Negro league team. Building the 10,000-seat stadium at the corner of Market St. and Compton Avenue placed it in the center of Mill Creek Valley, a prominent Black neighborhood.

Roughly 270 feet from home plate, a trolley car "barn" served as the left field barrier and the wall was 35 feet high, slightly shorter than the 37-foot-high Green Monster at Fenway Park.

Negro League championships were played at Stars Park in 1924, 1928, 1930, and 1931, with the home team winning three out of the four.

The ballpark site is currently on the Harris-Stowe State University campus in St. Louis.

In 2021, the St. Louis Cardinals, in conjunction with Cardinals Care and Harris-Stowe State University, dedicated \$1.2 million to renovate Stars Park Field, the 25th field dedicated by Cardinals Care since its inception in 1997.

BLACK PLAYERS & COACHES TO WIN WORLD SERIES CHAMPIONSHIPS WITH ST. LOUIS

The first Black players to appear on any St. Louis World Series Championship team were **Bob Gibson, Lou Brock, Bill White, and Curt Flood**, who won the 1964 World Series in seven games over the New York Yankees.

Johnny Lewis also played for St. Louis in 1964 before Brock was acquired from the Cubs, but did not appear in the World Series. More recent World Series Champions are listed below:

ALABAMA-BORN CARDINALS

28 players born in Alabama have appeared for the Cardinals in a regular season game in franchise history (1892-2024), most notably **Ozzie Smith** (Mobile), **Terry Moore** (Vernon), **Dave Veres** (Montgomery), and **Gabby Street** (Huntsville) ... One current Cardinals minor leaguer, **Brody Moore** (High-A Peoria), was born in Birmingham and played at Auburn Univ.

Current Cardinals and Alabama natives who were born elsewhere include utility player **Brendan Donovan** (Germany) and hitting coach **Turner Ward** (Florida).

- Donovan tonight becomes the first-ever Alabamian to play in a Major League regular-season game in the state of Alabama ... An Enterprise Ala. native and graduate of Enterprise (Ala.) High School, Donovan played college baseball at the University of South Alabama (2016-18).
- Ward is a native of Saraland, Alabama, where he still resides ... Ward graduated from Satsuma (Ala.) High School and attended the University of South Alabama in Mobile and Faulkner State Junior College in Bay Minette, Ala.

NOTABLES IN ST. LOUIS GIANTS & STARS HISTORY

James "Cool Papa" Bell St. Louis Stars (1922-31)

National Baseball Hall of Fame (1974)

No star shone brighter than James "Cool Papa" Bell, a superb centerfielder, outstanding leadoff hitter, and one of the fastest runners ever in baseball...Bell joined the Stars as a pitcher in 1922 and earned the nickname "Cool" after striking out Oscar Charleston (Papa was added to make it sound better)...Bell led the NNL in stole bases five times, while leading the Stars to league titles in 1928, 1930, and 1931.

Oscar Charleston St. Louis Giants (1921)

National Baseball Hall of Fame (1976)

The left-handed-hitting Charleston is considered by many experts to have been the greatest ballplayer of the Negro Leagues. Charleston played one season for the St. Louis Giants, where he won the league's triple crown while leading nearly every offensive category.

James Allen "Candy Jim" Taylor St. Louis Stars (1923-25, 1927-29)

Taylor began his pro career in 1904 as a player, becoming player-manager by 1919, and continuing to manage until his death in 1948. Taylor is the all-time winningest manager in the Negro Leagues era, having 955 wins with two Negro World Series titles and Negro National League titles.

George "Mule" Suttles St. Louis Stars (1926-31)

National Baseball Hall of Fame (2006)

Renowned for power as well as batting average, Suttles led the league in home runs twice and in doubles, triples, and batting average once each over his six-year run with the Stars. His 1926 season was the fifth time in league history that a player won the batting Triple Crown.

Ben "Old Reliable" Taylor St. Louis Giants (1911)

National Baseball Hall of Fame (2006)

Younger brother of Candy Jim Taylor, Ben Taylor played pre-Negro Leagues era from 1908-1920, appearing with the St. Louis Giants in 1911.

Willie "El Diablo" aka "Devil" Wells St. Louis Stars (1924-31)

National Baseball Hall of Fame (1997)

A slick-fielding shortstop and one of the Negro Leagues premier hitters for two decades, Wells played on three different pennant-winning teams with the St. Louis Stars, Chicago American Giants, and Newark Eagles. Wells hit .352 over eight seasons in a Stars uniform while leading the league in homers three times (1927, 1929, 1930). He won the 1930 NNL Triple Crown batting .411 with 17 homers and 114 RBI.

Biz Mackey St. Louis Giants (1920)

National Baseball Hall of Fame (2006)

Generally regarded as the finest defensive catcher in Negro League history, Mackey has been given credit for furthering the development of a number of Negro Leaguers who would go on to succeed in the major leagues, such as Roy Campanella, Monte Irvin, and Larry Doby.

NEGRO LEAGUE BASEBALL HISTORY IN ST. LOUIS

St. Louis Giants (1906-1921)

Independent (1906-19)

Negro National League (1920-21)

The original St. Louis Negro League team was formed in 1906 by African American bank messenger and baseball fan, Charles Mills.

The Giants played on North Broadway in St. Louis and were a charter member of the Negro National League in 1920.

In 1921, the Giants acquired Hall of Famer **Oscar Charleston**, who batted .423/.499/.743 with a 1.241 OPS, 17 home runs, and 101 RBI in his lone season in St. Louis.

St. Louis Stars (1922-31 Negro National League)

When Dr. Samuel Sheppard, Richard Kent, and Dr. G.B. Key acquired the Giants from owner Charlie Mills after the 1921 season, they built a new park and renamed the club the Stars.

The Stars won three championships (1928, 1930, 1931) and featured some of the Negro Leagues biggest stars, including James "Cool Papa" Bell, Willie "Devil" Wells, George "Mule" Suttles, George Scales, and Ted "High-pockets" Trent.

St. Louis Stars II (1937, 1939 Negro American League)

St. Louis-New Orleans Stars (1940-41 Negro American Lg.)

Harrisburg-St. Louis Stars (1943 Negro National Lg. II)

When the collapse of the Negro National Leagues ended the original Stars in 1931, a new franchise bearing the same name became a charter member of the Negro American League, fielding teams in 1937 and 1939.

Financial struggles caused the team to disband and reappear in the next few years, and the franchise shifted to a co-hometown status, pairing St. Louis with New Orleans in 1940-1941 and Harrisburg in 1943.

St. Louis Giants (1924 Independent Black Baseball League)

The Giants were independent Negro league baseball team in 1924, separate from the Negro National League's St. Louis Giants/Stars at the same time. The Giants featured future Baseball Hall of Famer Willie Wells.

1954: FIRST BLACK PLAYERS IN CARDINALS HISTORY

1B Tom Alston (April 13, 1954):

First baseman Alston was the first African-American to play for the Cardinals, playing in 91 games over four seasons (1954-57)... Alston was traded by the San Diego Padres of the Pacific Coast League to the Cardinals in 1954 in exchange for Eddie Erault, Dick Sisler, and \$100,000.

When August "Gussie" Busch Jr. bought the Cardinals in 1953, he wanted the team to search for more black players, and to help speed up the process, Busch hired Negro Leagues eight-time All-Star Quincy Troupe to scout black players.

While there were 13 other black players in the Cardinals organization during 1954 Spring Training, the 28-year-old Alston became the first to make the St. Louis roster.

RHP Bill Greason (May 31, 1954)

The right-handed pitcher became the 2nd African-American player and first pitcher in Cardinals history, appearing in three games (two starts) in 1954.

At Rochester in 1958, Greason was teamed with another future Hall of Famer, **Bob Gibson**, who has noted that Greason "took him under his wing."

Prior to joining the Cardinals organization, Greason played for 1948 Birmingham Black Barons where he was teammates with **Willie Mays**.

The 99-year-old Greason (born Sept. 3, 1924) is the 2nd-oldest living Major League player ahead of only 100-year-old **Art Schallock** (born April 25, 1924) ... Greason, Mays, and **Ron Teasley** are the only three living former Negro Leagues players from the period when they were major leaguers.

RHP Brooks Lawrence (June 24, 1954)

Right-handed pitcher Brooks Lawrence was the 3rd African American in Cardinals history when he made his MLB debut on June 24, 1954, following Alston and Greason.

Lawrence made 81 appearances (28 starts) for St. Louis over two seasons before being traded to Cincinnati and becoming a National League All-Star in 1956.

NOTABLE BLACK FIGURES IN ST. LOUIS BASEBALL HISTORY

Leroy Robert Satchel Paige St. Louis Browns (1951-53)

National Baseball Hall of Fame (1971)

An American right-handed pitcher who played in Negro League baseball and Major League Baseball for nearly five decades. Paige became one of the most famous and successful players from the Negro Leagues.

After **Bill Veeck** became owner of the Cleveland Indians, he signed the 42-year-old rookie to his first Major League contract in 1948, making him the 7th Black player in the bigs. That season, Paige became the first player from the Negro Leagues to pitch in any World Series as Cleveland won the title.

After Veeck bought the St. Louis Browns in 1951, he brought Paige to St. Louis, where he would pitch three seasons (1951-53) and was a two-time All-Star (1952 & 1953).

Paige was 59 years old when he played his final MLB game in 1965 for the Kansas City Athletics.

Hank Thompson & Willard Brown St. Louis Browns (1947)

In 1947, the St. Louis Browns made MLB history twice in less than one week. 2B Hank Thompson became MLB's 3rd Black player and the first in St. Louis on July 17, 1947 at Sportsman's Park ... Three days later on July 20 with Thompson and Willard "Home Run" Brown in the lineup, the Browns became the first team to have two Black players play in a game, making them the southernmost team in the Major Leagues to integrate.

Willard "Home Run" Brown

National Baseball Hall of Fame (2006)

St. Louis Browns (1947)

An outfielder in the Negro Leagues for Kansas City (1937-44, '47-48) and in Major League Baseball for the St. Louis Browns (1947), the six-time All-Star led the NAL in hits in eight seasons and RBI seven times.

Brown is the first Black player to homer in the AL on Aug. 13, 1947 off Detroit's Hal Newhouser at Sportsman's Park.

Hank Thompson St. Louis Browns (1947)

An American left-handed-hitting infielder in the Negro Leagues and Major League Baseball. Thompson played with the Dallas Green Monarchs (1941), Kansas City Monarchs (1943, 1946-47), St. Louis Browns (1947), and New York Giants (1949-56).

Bill White

St. Louis Cardinals (1959-64, '69)

St. Louis Cardinals Hall of Fame (2020)

White became the first Cardinals African-American All-Star in 1959 .. White was elected to eight All-Star games, won six Gold Gloves, and a member of the 1964 World Series Champions.

White also became the first black play-by-play broadcaster for an MLB team (1971-88 Yankees) and was later named the first black President of the National League (1989-94), becoming the highest-ranking African-American ever in professional sports.

- Led all MLB rookies with 17 ground into double plays in 2022.
- Finished the 2021 Arizona Fall League season with 15.0 consecutive scoreless innings. Named an Arizona Fall League All-Star with a 1.29 ERA, 2nd in the league.

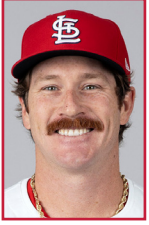
