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Tampa Bay Rays (77-53) at Detroit Tigers (61-69)

FIRST OF ALL: On the heels of a 1-5 road trip through Pittsburgh (1-2) and Kansas City (0-3), the Detroit Tigers tonight return to Comerica Park to begin a two-team, six-game homestand against a pair of first-place clubs in the Tampa Bay Rays (three games through Wednesday) and the Los Angeles Dodgers (three games starting on Friday) ... in fact, the Tigers will host three-straight first-place teams when including the Chicago White Sox to conclude the previous homestand.

- The Tigers return home on a three-series losing streak after winning their previous four series and going 6-1-1 in their first eight series out of the All-Star Break ... yesterday marked Detroit's 37th setback after leading at one point in the game, tied for the third-most losses in baseball.
- The Tigers have now lost five games in a row for the first time since a season-high eight-game skid from May 16-24 ... the club has also dropped eight of its last nine games after enjoying a run in which the Tigers won nine of their previous 12 games leading up to August 14.

WHAT'S LEFT?: Starting tonight, the Tigers have five weeks remaining in the regular season with this series against the Tampa Bay Rays representing somewhat of an outlier ... why might you ask?: because of Detroit's 32 remaining regular season contests, 26 of the games are against either the A.L. Central (14 games) or the National League (12 games) with only six games remaining outside of that bubble: this series vs. Tampa Bay and a three-game set at Toronto next month.

- The Tigers have won almost as many games against the A.L. East (12-13) as the A.L. Central (13-25) this season despite having played 13 fewer games vs. the A.L. East.
- The Tigers have played 38 games vs. the A.L. Central but have considerably more wins against the A.L. West (19-12 in 31 games) and National League (17-19 in 36 games) this season.

THE BIG DIG: The Tigers are 39-31 since the beginning of June, the second-best record in the A.L. behind only the Boston Red Sox (46-26) in this span and the seventh-best mark in baseball.

- The Tigers woke up on June 1 in fourth place in the A.L. Central, 11.0 games behind the first-place Guardians, and 7.0 games behind for the third Wild Card spot with nine teams in the A.L. to leap frog ... and yet since posting the second-best record in the A.L. starting on June 1, the Tigers woke up today again/still in fourth place in the A.L. Central, 7.0 games out of first place, and 3.5-games back for the third Wild Card spot in the A.L. with six teams to leap frog.

IN AWE: Kevin McGonigle has 83 runs scored, 23 doubles, three triples, 14 homers, 12 stolen bases and 79 walks thus far in his rookie campaign ... since the Rookie of the Year was first awarded in the 1947 season, McGonigle is the only rookie to ever reach all of those versatile, all-around-game totals by the end of August ... and we still have a bit of August yet to play.

- With one week in the month still to go, McGonigle is only the eighth player in all of baseball to reach all of those versatile totals by the end of August in the last 10 seasons starting in 2017, joining Kyle Tucker (2025), Geraldo Perdomo (2025), Shohei Ohtani (2023), Mookie Betts (2019), Juan Soto (2019), Jose Ramirez (2018) and Paul Goldschmidt (2017).
- McGonigle is only the third player in baseball history aged 21-years-old or younger to reach those totals by the end of August, joining Juan Soto (2019) and Mike Trout (2013).

SIX APPEAL: Framber Valdez is one of two left-handed pitchers in the A.L. to throw 6.0 innings or more in 14 starts this year, joining Trevor Rogers and his 14 such starts with the Orioles ... Framber has reached six innings or more in 103 starts in the last five seasons starting in 2022, well ahead of the next closest lefties in all of baseball: Tarik Skubal (79 times) and Max Fried (78).

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Kevin McGonigle has a 5.9 bWAR, third in all of baseball alongside Pete Crow-Armstrong (8.1) and Bobby Witt Jr. (6.2) and ahead of Triple Crown candidate Yordan Alvarez (5.7) ... Kevin's 4.9 fWAR is fourth-best among position players in the A.L.

- McGonigle leads major league rookies with a .385 on-base percentage ... only three qualifying rookies in the last 15 years have finished a season with a .380 on-base percentage or better: Aaron Judge (.422 OPB in 2017), Mike Trout (.399 in 2012) and Jose Abreu (.383 in 2014).

THE BEST CATCHER IN BASEBALL: Dillon Dingler has a 5.0 fWAR this year, one of only nine players in all of baseball with an fWAR of 5.0 or greater and the fourth-highest mark by a position player in baseball alongside Pete Crow-Armstrong (8.7), Bobby Witt Jr (6.2) and Yordan Alvarez (5.8).

IT HAS BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games of 2026, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in 104 games since, the Tigers have gone 47-57 to drop to 61-69 and fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 47-57 (.452) record beginning April 24 is the sixth-lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 39-31 in their last 70 games starting June 1, the Tigers have lost 42 of their last 85 games, 45 of their last 89 games and 52 of their last 95 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: Kevin McGonigle has 137 hits this year, already 10th-most by a rookie in a single season in franchise history ... with one more hit, he will tie Lou Whitaker (1978) and Nick Castellanos (2014) ... with two more hits, Kevin will tie three more Tigers rookies, including Al Kaline (1954) ... and with three more hits, Kevin will hold sole possession of fifth-place in club history for most hits in a single season by a Tigers rookie.

- Allowed just one run through 5.0 innings, but walked two between two doubles in the sixth, surrendering three additional runs to end his outing last time out on Aug. 17 at Pittsburgh...allowed five total hits and four walks in the outing.
- One of two left-handed pitchers in the A.L. to throw 6.0+ innings in 14 starts this year, joining Trevor Rogers...has reached 6.0+ IP in 103 starts in the last five seasons...next closest lefties: Tarik Skubal (79) and Max Fried (78).
- Had his 11-start streak of 5.0+ innings snapped on July 21 against the Cubs...recorded just two outs, allowing six earned runs on five hits, two walks and a hit batter...did not record an out until the eighth batter of the game.
- Tossed 7.0 strong innings on July 9, allowing just one earned run on three hits while striking out nine.
- Went on the Bereavement List on Sunday, July 12 and was added back to Detroit's active roster on July 18.
- Earned his first win since April 19 on June 5 against Seattle, allowing just one earned run on five hits and two walks while striking out five over 5.0 innings.
- Tied his career high allowing eight earned runs including six in the first inning on April 8 against Minnesota...had previously surrendered eight earned runs twice, both with the Astros while facing the Angels.
- Spun six scoreless innings in his home debut and Detroit's home opener on Friday, April 3 against St. Louis.
- Made his Tigers debut on Friday, March 27 against San Diego...allowed one earned run on seven hits and a walk while striking out five over 6.0 innings.
- Signed with Detroit as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...went 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA in four Spring Training starts.
- In 2025, led the Astros in wins (13) and innings (192)...marked the 3rd-highest win total of his career behind his 17 wins in 2022 and 15 wins in 2024...also led the team in starts alongside RHP Hunter Brown (31).
- Among AL pitchers on the 2025 season, finished 2nd in GB% (59.2), 2nd in opponent GIDP (22), 2nd in GIDP/9 (1.03), 5th in Pitching WAR (4.3), T-5th in quality starts (20), 6th in innings pitched (192.0), T-6th in wins, and 10th in opponent OPS (.667).
- Surpassed 1,000 career strikeouts in his start on July 28, 2025, vs. WSH, finishing the season with 1,053...surpassed 1,000 career innings during his start on July 5 at LAD last season.

- Second save of the season came on July 23 against KC, threw just two pitches to induce a game-ending double play.
- Struck out all four batters he faced in a perfect 1.1 innings on June 23 against the Yankees.
- Blew a save in the eighth inning against Kansas City on May 8 and ninth inning on May 29 against Chicago.
- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.
- Did not allow a run in his first 11 games (11.0 IP) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks, striking out five over that span...first earned run was on April 24 against Cincinnati.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
- Made his first postseason appearance with the Tigers in 2025, striking out three in six games (7.1 IP).
- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5, 2025, with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goeddel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals in 2025 prior to being traded to Detroit on July 31, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
