TAKE A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE: Last night's 4-2 loss vs Pit coupled with NYM's 9-7 win at Chc dropped the Reds 1.0 game off the pace for the NL's final Wild Card spot...it also tied them with AZ, who late last night walked off LAD, 5-4.

- The Mets, Reds (-1.0), Diamondbacks (-1.0), Cardinals (-3.5), Marlins (-4.0), and Giants (-4.5) enter today's games vying for the National League's final Wild Card spot...a Mets' win tonight and/or a Giants' loss would eliminate SF from the chase.
- The Reds entered last night's game tied with NYM for that coveted third Wild Card spot...it marked the first time after the All-Star break that the Reds held a Postseason position.
- Cin owns the head-to-head tiebreakers over NYM and AZ.
- The Redlegs climbed to within a <u>half-game</u> of that final spot on 8/22 before losing 10 of 13 and falling <u>6.0 games</u> off the pace.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both SF and AZ during a 3-11 run.
- Since the 5-4 loss vs NYM on 9/5 (Cin had the bases loaded with no outs in the 9th inning), the Reds have gone 10-6 to tie the Mets, who are 5-11 over that same span.

- For the Reds, 4 of those 8 came within the first 12 games of the season.
- Won 2 games decided by a 1-0 score during the recently-completed 4-game sweep of the Cubs (Thu & Sun)...marked the first time Cin won multiple 1-0 games in a single series since <u>9/24 & 9/26, 2002</u> at Chc.
- Dropped 3 straight games by a 1-0 score from 4/1-4/3.
- Cin's eight 1-0 games this season are the most since 2014 (10).

SERIES NOTES: In the last meeting between the Reds and **Pirates**, the division rivals split a 4-game series at **PNC Park** from 8/7-8/10...Cin lost 2 of 3 at **Pit** from 5/19-5/21 but swept the **Pirates** in 3 games at **Great American Ball Park** in their first meeting (4/11-4/13)...it was Cin's first sweep of **Pit** since 8/5-8/8, 2021 at **GABP** (4g).

- Cin has played the Pirates 506 times since both teams became charter members of the National League Central in 1994 (263-243, .520), more than any other Pit opponent.
- Cin owns a 105-86 record all-time vs Pit at Great American Ball Park...
 the Reds and Pirates played the first regular-season game at GABP on
 3/31/03 (10-1 Pirates triumph).
- The 2-0 loss at Pit on 4/23/23 was the Reds' 100th loss at PNC Park... are 98-109 overall there...the Reds and Pirates played the first regularseason game at PNC Park on 4/9/01 (8-2 Reds triumph).
- The Redlegs have lost 45 of the last 66 and 14 of the last 21 games they've played at PNC Park, including an 11-game losing streak spanning 9/3/18 to 9/27/19 and an 8-game losing streak to begin the 2019 season (4/4-9/27, 2019).

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched his first career 9-inning shutout in the 1-0 win vs Chc on 9/18 (9.0ip. 1h. 1bb. 9k).

- Became the third Reds starter this year to throw a 9-inning shutout (Abbott 6/10 at Cle & Lodolo 7/23 at Wsh).
- Became the first Reds pitcher to throw a 9-inning shutout at Great American Ball Park since RHP Scott Feldman on 5/7/17 vs SF.
- Was his eighth career start of 7.0 innings or more and 2 hits or fewer.
- Carried a no-hitter into the 7th inning before allowing a 2-out double to Seiya Suzuki...marked the second-longest no-hit bid of his career (7.1ip on 5/15/22 at Pit).
- Was perfect before Moises Ballesteros reached on a fielding error by SS Elly De La Cruz to open the 5th inning...was the second-longest perfect bid of his career (4.2ip on 7/28/24 at TB).

SEPTEMBER 13 at ATH: Did not factor in the decision in the 11-5 loss at Ath on 9/13 (2.1ip, 4h, 5r/5er, 4bb, 3k, 2hr, 84TP).

- Was the shortest start of his career.
- · His 4 walks were a season high.
- Left game in the third...the last batter he faced, Jacob Wilson, hit a double off his left ankle...was not injured.
- Threw 17 pitches in the 1st inning, 36 pitches in the 2nd inning, and 31 pitches in the 3rd.
- Recorded his 600th career strikeout (1st inning, Nick Kurtz)...became the fastest Reds pitcher by appearances (89) to reach 600 K since 1900, surpassing Luis Castillo (96g, 2017-21)...became the sixth-fastest Major League starter by innings (479.1ip) to reach 600 K.

SEPTEMBER 7 vs NYM: Earned the 6-4 win vs NYM on 9/7 (7.0ip, 1h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 12k, 1hr, 98TP).

- Was his longest outing since 4/13 vs Pit (also 7ip).
- Struck out each of the first 5 batters he faced in the game for the second time in his career (6 straight Ks to open the 7/11/24 game vs Col).
- Was his 12th career double-digit strikeout game.
- Was his seventh career outing of 7.0 or more innings and 2 hits or fewer allowed.
- Was his ninth quality start of the season, the fourth over his last 5 appearances.

SEPTEMBER 1 vs TOR: Did not factor in the decision in the 5-4 win vs Tor on 9/1 (6.1ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 7k, 101TP).

- Was his eighth quality start of the season, the 37th of his career.
- Retired 16 of 17 batters from innings 2-7...allowed each
 of his last 3 batters to reach in the 7th (double, walk, RBIsingle) before turning it over to Scott Barlow, who retired
 the final 2 batters in the inning.
- Eclipsed the 100-pitch mark (101) for third time this season, the first time since 5/2 vs Wsh (114TP).
- · Was his seventh homereless start of the season.
- His 6th-inning strikeout of Andrés Giménez was his 100th of the season.

AUGUST 25 at LAD: Suffered the 7-0 loss on 8/25 at LAD (5.0ip, 6h, 5r/3er, 2bb, 3k, 2hr, 99TP).

- Was his first loss since 5/28 at KC.
- Was the first time since 4/26 at Col that he gave up multiple home runs.
- Allowed 6 hard-hit pitches (batted balls with an exit velo at 95mph or higher), the most he's given up in an outing since 4/19 at Bal (also 6).

AUGUST 19 at LAA: Did not factor in the decision in the 6-4 win at LAA on 8/19 (6.1ip, 6h, 3r/3er, 0bb, 12k, 1hr, 98TP).

- Became the 10th different Reds pitcher over the last 125 years with as many as 12 strikeouts and no walks in a single game; the first since Tyler Mahle on 6/13/22 at AZ.
- His 6.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio through his 13 starts (91k/14bb) is the highest mark by a Reds pitcher through his first 13 starts of a season since 1900, just ahead of Reds Hall of Famer Mario Soto (6.38, 1982).
- Was in line for the 4-3 win but fell victim to a blown save by Luis Mey.
- Left the game with 1 out in the 7th inning and a runner on second...was replaced by Graham Ashcraft, who allowed the inherited runner to score.
- Was his second consecutive quality start, the seventh of the season, and the 36th of his career.

SINCE HE RETURNED FROM IL: Is 3-1 with a 2.79 ERA in 7 starts since he returned from the injured list on 8/13 (right groin strain)...are his first 7 starts since 6/3.

Made 4 rehabiliation appearances with R-ACL Reds (1g, 2ip) and AAA-Louisville (3g, 11ip) where he pitched to a 6.23 ERA over 13.0 innings (10h, 11r/9er, 5bb, 24k, 4hr).

STRIKE-THROWER DELUXE Pt. 1: His 610 strikeouts are the second-most by a Reds pitcher through his first 4 seasons, trailing LHP Noodles Hahn (658).

- Is the third Cin pitcher since the mound moved to its current distance in 1893 to record 100+ strikeouts in each of his first 4 career seasons, joining Johnny Cueto (2008-2011) and LHP Noodles Hahn (1899-1902).
- Reached 600 strikeouts in 89 apps, faster than any other Reds pitcher since 1900, surpassing Luis Castillo (96g, 2017-21).

STRIKE-THROWER DELUXE Pt. 2:

- Has thrown first-pitch strikes to 69.3% of the batters he's faced (275 of 397)...league average is 62.1%
- Has been ahead in the count to 54.7% of his batters (217 of 397)...league average is 47.6%
- Among plate apps with at least 3 pitches, 2 of his first 3 offerings have been strikes to 63.1% of the batters he's faced in 2025.
- Has 27 three-pitch strikeouts this season.

DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS: Has produced 12 career double-digit strikeout games (most recently Sun vs NYM, 12k)...ranks sixth among all Reds pitchers since 1893 with 12 double-digit strikeout games (courtesy Elias).

KEEPIN' IT 100: Has thrown 762 pitches at least 100mph, the most by a starting pitcher in the pitch track era (Jacob deGrom, 2nd, 323).

VS TOP OF THE ORDER: Is holding top of the order batters (1,2,3) to a .170/.240/.270 slash (24-for-141).

VS LEFTIES: Is holding left-handed batters to a .188/.251/.399 slash (40-for-213, 12hr, 16bb, 58 times on base).
