A WILD WIN IN KC: The Orioles beat the Royals, 13-10, yesterday at Kauffman Stadium...Baltimore led 8-1 in the top of the third inning, trailed 9-8 after seven, led 10-9 after eight, and held on for the victory in the ninth with Kansas City bringing the tying run to the plate with one out...**Ramón Urias** drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth inning with a pinch-hit, two-run single and later added two RBI in the ninth inning...**Gunnar Henderson** and **Anthony Santander** both homered for the O's.

- Urias became the first Oriole with four RBI off the bench since Pedro Álvarez on April 6, 2018 at New York-AL (14 innings) and the first to do so in a nine-inning game since Steve Clevenger on September 11, 2015 vs. Kansas City; the four RBI set a career high for Urias.
- Adam Frazier** scored a career-high four runs; he is the second O's player to score four times in a game this season, joining **Austin Hays** on April 11 vs. Oakland; Baltimore has now had three players score four runs in the last two seasons (also **Ryan Mountcastle**, 5/30/22 at BOS) after going seven years (2015-21) between four-run games by a player.
- Marked the 11th comeback victory by the Orioles this season, second-most in MLB behind Boston (13); the O's 47 comeback wins over the last two years are the fifth-most in MLB.
- Baltimore stole four bases in the eighth inning, tying the most steals in one inning by the Orioles since at least 1969, and for the first time since the ninth inning on September 5, 2011 at New York-AL.
- The 3 hour, 24 minute game was the longest of the season for the Birds, one day after playing in 1 hour, 59 minutes, the quickest O's game since 2010.

WHAT'S TRENDING: The O's have won 13 of their last 16 games, 15 of their last 19, and 17 of their last 22...The .773 winning percentage (17-5) since April 10 is the best in the big leagues over that stretch...The 21-10 overall record is tied for the third-best start through the first 31 games of a season in team history (since 1954), done in 1994, 2005, and 2017, and trailing the 22-9 marks in 1970 and 1997 (see chart at right).

- Baltimore owns the third-best record in MLB, trailing Atlanta (22-10) and Tampa Bay (26-6).
- The O's have won seven straight series, the longest since the team won eight series in a row from July 21 to August 13, 2014.
- Last season, the Birds didn't reach 21 wins until the 50th game on May 30 (21-29); they did not reach 22 wins until the 52nd game on June 1 (22-28).
- The Orioles are 69-47 since July 1, 2022, a 96-win pace; the .595 winning percentage during that time is the third-best in the AL and fifth-best in MLB, trailing the Dodgers (.697, 83-36), Braves (.675, 79-38), Astros (.627, 74-44), and Rays (.605, 72-47).

OPENING STATEMENTS: Baltimore is 10-0 in series openers to begin the 2023 campaign, the only team to have won all of their series openers this season...The streak of 10 consecutive series-opening victories to begin a season is the longest in club history (since 1954) and the longest by any MLB team since the 1973 San Francisco Giants won their first 11 series openers, per the *Elias Sports Bureau*...It is tied with the 1963 Orioles — who also won 10 straight from July 23 to August 23 — for the fourth-longest streak at any point in a season in O's history...The club record is 11 straight series-opening wins, done three times: May 16 to June 18, 1980; May 23 to June 20, 1978; and August 30 to September 30, 1974.

AGAINST THE BRAVES: Baltimore and Atlanta meet for the only time this season with this weekend's three-game set, the first matchups between the teams since 2021 and the second series ever between the clubs at Truist Park, formerly known as SunTrust Park...The Braves swept a three-game series at Camden Yards from August 20-22, 2021...The O's took two of three games in Atlanta from June 22-24, 2018, including a wild 15-inning affair in the series opener with the Orioles rallying for six runs in the ninth inning only for the Braves to plate four runs in the bottom half before Manny Machado hit a go-ahead two-run homer in the 15th inning for a 10-7 Orioles victory.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Orioles are currently on an 11-day, 10-game road trip, their longest of the season, which began last Thursday night in Detroit...The O's are 5-2 against the Tigers and Royals before playing three against the Braves through Sunday.

- Baltimore's 12-6 road start is tied for the fifth-best start through 18 away games in O's history (since 1954), behind only the 13-5 starts in 1969, 1970, 2005, and 2012.

ON THE ATTACK: Baltimore ranks fourth in the AL and sixth in MLB with 171 runs scored after finishing 10th in the AL and 20th in MLB with 674 runs in 2022...The Birds rank among AL teams in walks (1st, 127), on-base percentage (3rd, .341), slugging percentage (4th, .430), and OPS (4th, .771).

- The Orioles rank second in the AL and sixth in MLB with 4.01 pitches per plate appearance; the O's have five players in the top 19 in the AL in pitches per plate appearance: **Adley Rutschman** (7th, 4.24), **Anthony Santander** (9th, 4.22), **Gunnar Henderson** (13th, 4.19), **Cedric Mullins** (18th, 4.13), and **Adam Frazier** (19th, 4.11).

KING OF THE CASTLE: **Ryan Mountcastle** has reached base safely in 13 straight games, tying the team high this season (Rutschman, 4/3-16) and the second-longest on-base streak of his career behind a 17-gamer from July 28 to August 26, 2021...His last seven hits have gone for extra bases (5-2B, 2 HR) since April 30...Mountcastle has an extra-base hit in four straight games, tied for the second-longest such stretch of his career behind a six-gamer from May 31 to June 6, 2021...Prior to this stretch, his previous 13 knocks were all singles from April 14-29 (G2).

- The long balls on Tuesday snapped his 15-game homer drought since April 13.
- His homer off Ryan Yarbrough in the fourth inning on Tuesday had an exit velocity of 112.2 mph, the hardest-hit home run by an O's batter since he had a 113.1 mph homer on September 16, 2021 vs. New York-AL; since 2020, Mountcastle owns three of the four hardest-hit home runs and five of the seven hardest-hit home runs by an Oriole, per *Statcast*.
- He tallied five RBI on Tuesday, two more than he had in his previous 17 games combined, since he tied the Orioles record with nine RBI on April 11 vs. Oakland.

QUICK HITS: **Adley Rutschman** has reached base safely 59 times this year (35 H, 24 BB, which leads the AL and ranks second in MLB behind Atlanta's Ronald Acuña Jr. (65)...**Jorge Mateo** now qualifies for the MLB leaderboard, where he ranks among AL leaders in slugging (4th, .595), batting average (5th, .321), and OPS (5th, .967).

ROSTER MOVES: The O's activated **Luis Torrens** today after acquiring him from the Chicago Cubs for cash considerations on Tuesday...In a corresponding move, **Ryan O'Hearn** was optioned to Triple-A Norfolk after yesterday's game.

QUICK HITS: Scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, fourth away, and first against the Braves tonight...Made a career-high 22 appearances (21 GS) in 2022, 11 appearances at home (10 GS), and 11 on the road...Owned an 8-7 record with a 3.23 ERA (45 ER/125.1 IP) and 87 strikeouts...Made six starts of 5.0-or-more scoreless innings, tied for seventh-most in the AL...Acquired by the Orioles along with 2B Breyvic Valera, RF Yusniel Díaz, RHP Zach Pop and 3B Rylan Bannon in exchange for SS Manny Machado on July 18, 2018...Originally selected by the Dodgers in the 14th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of UNLV.

LAST TIME OUT: Dealt his first loss of the season on April 29 (G1) at Detroit... Allowed five runs on a career-high 11 hits with six strikeouts and two walks in 5.0 innings...Threw 89 pitches, 57 strikes.

AGAINST ATLANTA/NL EAST: Making his first career start against the Braves and third against the NL East...Has gone 2-0 against the NL East in his career with a 2.31 ERA (3 ER/11.2 IP), both games against Washington...In his last time out against the division on April 18, 2023 at Washington, earned the win after allowing four hits, six strikeouts, and one hit by a pitch in 6.2 scoreless innings...Threw 95 pitches, 66 strikes.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Has gone 1-1 with a 6.14 ERA (10 ER/14.2 IP) in three road starts this year...In 22 career road starts, has gone 6-9 with a 5.18 ERA (62 ER/107.2 IP)...Went 5-3 with a 3.63 ERA (25 ER/62.0 IP) in 11 road starts in 2022.

'KREM' OF THE CROP: Had his career-high scoreless streak snapped at 22.2 innings on July 4, 2022 vs. Texas...Marks the longest scoreless streak by an Orioles starter since Mike Mussina pitched 27.0 scoreless innings from September 21, 1995 to April 2, 1996...The last Orioles pitcher with a scoreless streak of at least 22.2 innings was Steve Johnson, who tossed 25.1 scoreless frames across eight games (three starts) from August 25 to September 29, 2012.

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC: Pitched for Team Israel in the 2023 World Baseball Classic...Made the start in Team Israel's 3-1 win over Team Nicaragua in Pool Play on March 12 at loanDepot park in Miami (4.0 IP, 3 H, BB, K)...Was the youngest player (20) on Team Israel's 2017 WBC roster...Kremer has dual Israeli-American citizenship and became the first Israeli drafted by an MLB team in 2016.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his second Opening Day Roster...Placed on the 10-day Injured List (left oblique strain) on April 11 (retroactive to April 8)...Tossed 9.0 scoreless innings across three rehab starts with Triple-A Norfolk and Double-A Bowie before being reinstated on June 5...Tossed his first career shutout and complete game on September 23 vs. Houston, allowing four hits and two walks with six strikeouts over a career-high 9.0 innings; marked the first shutout by an O's pitcher since LHP John Means threw a no-hitter on May 5, 2021 at Seattle; was one of 16 players in MLB to throw a shutout in 2022 and joined RHP Jordan Lyles (9/21 vs. DET) as the only O's pitchers with a complete game during the season...Made the start for the O's in their 5-3 win at the Little League Classic on August 21 vs. Boston; did not factor in the decision after allowing one run on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts over 5.1 innings...Allowed 11 home runs in 125.1 innings for a 0.79 HR/9, the ninth-lowest in the AL (min. 125.0 IP), compared to 17 home runs in 53.2 innings in 2021 for a 2.85 HR/9, the highest in the majors (min. 50.0 IP).
