RHP Logan Webb (8-8, 3.72 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (9-11, 3.79 ERA)

THE PIRATES: had the day off on Monday and will begin their penultimate homestand of the 2026 season vs. San Francisco (Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles-AL (September 4-6) with tonight's series opener vs. the Giants at PNC Park...Went 4-5 on their recent season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, August 21-23), San Diego (2-1, August 24-26) and St. Louis (2-1, Friday-Sunday), including a 5-4 win over the Cardinals on Sunday at Busch Stadium...Have hit 162 home runs (they hit 117 home runs all of last season)...Have 1197 hits, tied with Tampa Bay for the second-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Chicago-NL (1205)...Have scored the fifth-most runs (669) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Chicago-NL (742), Washington (726), Milwaukee (686) and Los Angeles-NL (670), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs all of last season (they are looking to become only the fourth team in Major League history to finish top three in the league in runs the year after finishing last in the league in runs and the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915).

HOME SWEET HOME: Pittsburgh will play its first home game since August 19 vs. Detroit (a game that Brandon Lowe ended with a walkoff home run) tonight vs. San Francisco...The Pirates have won back-to-back home series (they won two of three games from August 14-16 vs. Boston and two of three games from August 17-19 vs. Detroit) for the second time in 2026 (they also swept a three-game series from May 1-3 vs. Cincinnati and won two of three games from May 12-14 vs. Colorado)...They last won three straight home series from August 18-September 4, 2025, when they won two of three games from August 18-20 vs. Toronto, swept a three-game series from August 22-24 vs. Colorado & swept a three-game series from September 2-4 vs. Los Angeles (NL).

DO YOU REMEMBER?: The Pirates will play 15 of their 24 September games at PNC Park...They will play three games vs. San Francisco (Tuesday-Thursday), three games vs. Los Angeles-AL (September 4-6), three games vs. Milwaukee (September 15-17), three games vs. Kansas City (September 18-20) and three games vs. St. Louis (September 22-24)...Pittsburgh will play three road games at Chicago-AL (September 8-10), three games at Chicago-NL (September 11-13) and three games at Detroit (September 25-27)...The Pirates are 34-32 at home this year and are looking to post winning records at home in back-to-back seasons (they went 44-37 at home during the 2025 season) for the first time since 2017 (44-37) & 2018 (44-36).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: Pittsburgh has won two of three games in each of its last two series, coming from August 24-26 at San Diego and Friday-Sunday at St. Louis...The Pirates are looking to win three straight series for the first time since winning each of their final three series in 2025, when they won two of three games from Sept. 19-21 vs. the A's, two of three games from Sept. 23-25 at Cincinnati and two of three games from Sept. 26-28 at Atlanta.

MONTGOMERY WARDS: Mason Montgomery earned his seventh save on Sunday at St. Louis...He has a 0.75 ERA (24.0ip/2er), 45 strikeouts and a .088 batting average against (7-for-80) in 25 games since June 29 at Philadelphia.

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez hit his 16th home run of the year with his two-run blast (off Matthew Liberatore) on Sunday at St. Louis...His 16 home runs are the most by a Pittsburgh rookie since Jack Suwinski (19) and Oneil Cruz (17) in 2022 and are the most by a Pirates right-handed rookie since Jason Bay (26) in 2004...He ranks third among all Major League rookies in home runs since hitting his first homer in the 4-1 win on May 24 at Toronto.

GIANT IMPACT: Bryan Reynolds collected hit No. 1100 in his Major League career on Sunday at St. Louis...He ranks first among Major League switch hitters and seventh among all Major League players in hits since making his Major League debut on April 20, 2019 vs. San Francisco...Reynolds, who was selected by the Giants in the second round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, is 21-for-69 (.304) with an .801 OPS in 18 career home games vs. the Giants.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY	
September 1, 1979: Pittsburgh swept a doubleheader from San Francisco at Candlestick Park. Willie Stargell led the way in the Pirates' 5-3 win during Game One after going 3-for-4 with two solo home runs, while Bruce Kison earned the win after tossing 7.0 innings. Jim Bibby allowed two runs (one earned) in a complete game in the 7-2 win in Game Two, while Lee Lacy was 3-for-5 with a two-run homer.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes had a no-decision after allowing just three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings in Pittsburgh’s 1-0 win on August 25 at San Diego (Oneil Cruz delivered the Pirates’ only run with his two-out, solo shot off Mason Miller in the ninth inning)...It marked his first scoreless start, as well as his first start without allowing a walk, since pitching 8.0 scoreless innings in the Bucs’ 3-1 win on May 12 vs. Colorado.

AGAINST THE GIANTS: Skenes had a no-decision after allowing one run over 6.0 innings in his only career start against San Francisco, which came in Pittsburgh’s 7-6 loss on May 23, 2024 at PNC Park (it marked the third start of his Major League career).

SUPPORT SYSTEM: Skenes has received one total run of support when he has been in the game in his last four starts, dating back to August 5 at Milwaukee (the run came on Oneil Cruz’ RBI single in the first inning on August 19 vs. Detroit)...His 0.44 average run support per game in that stretch is the lowest in MLB (minimum 20.0 innings pitched).

SEPTEMBER TO REMEMBER: Skenes has a 1.01 ERA (44.2ip/5er), 63 strikeouts and a .194 batting average against (31-for-160) in nine career September starts, including a 1.31 ERA (20.2ip/3er) in four September starts last season...He has the best September ERA in Major League Baseball over the last two years (minimum 40.0 innings pitched).

BEST WESTERN: Skenes is 9-2 with a 1.72 ERA (99.2ip/19er), 113 strikeouts and a .181 batting average against (64-for-354) in 16 career starts vs. the National League West, including a 1.12 ERA (40.1ip/5er) and a .143 batting average against (19-for-133) in six starts vs. the division this season...He has eight career scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings pitched vs. the division, including his last start on August 25 at San Diego.

K COLLECTOR: Skenes enters tonight’s start vs. San Francisco at PNC Park with 561 career strikeouts, the 31st-most in franchise history (since 1887)...Charlie Morton ranks 29th on that list with 563 strikeouts, while Joe Gibbon ranks 30th with 562 strikeouts.

AND THE WHIFF: Skenes struck out a career-high-tying 11 batters (also May 17, 2024 at Chicago-NL and July 11, 2024 at Milwaukee) in 5.1 innings on July 25 vs. Chicago (NL)...His three career outings with at least 10 strikeouts and fewer than 6.0 innings are the most by a Pirate in the Modern Era (since 1901)...He also did it on July 6, 2025 at Seattle (5.0 innings, 10 K) and this season on May 28 vs. Chicago-NL (5.1 innings, 10 K).

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes was named to his third straight National League All-Star team on July 4...Per Sarah Langs, he was one of eight Major Leaguers to make the All-Star Game in at least each of his first three career seasons, joining Rod Carew (18 straight, 1967-84), Ichiro Suzuki (10 straight, 2001-10), Joe DiMaggio (seven straight, 1936-42), Tom Seaver (seven straight, 1967-73), Dwight Gooden (three straight, 1984-86), Evan Longoria (three straight, 2008-10) and Yu Darvish (three straight, 2012-14)... He became only the third Pittsburgh pitcher to be named to three consecutive All-Star teams, joining Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Elroy Face (1959-61) on that short list.

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)’s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)’s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego’s Mat Latos (2010).
