**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Orioles defeated the Reds, 2-1, in the second game of the three-game set at Great American Ball Park, securing their eighth series victory of the campaign...**John Means** picked up the win in his season debut...**Jorge Mateo** and **Adley Rutschman** provided all the offense for the Birds with solo home runs.

**JOHN MEANS BUSINESS:** **John Means** tossed 7.0 shutout innings with three hits and eight strikeouts last night, his fourth career start of at least 7.0 shutout innings and first since his no-hitter on May 5, 2021 at Seattle...Registered 19 whiffs, his most in a game since his no-no (26) and the second-most by an O's pitcher this year, behind the 20 swings and misses induced by **Corbin Burnes** on April 26 vs. Oakland.

**SEEKING A SWEEP:** The Orioles are looking to complete the sweep in today's three-game finale against the Reds...It would be their third sweep of the season, joining three-game sets from April 9-11 at Boston and April 15-17 vs. Minnesota, as well as their first sweep of the Reds since a three-gamer in Baltimore from September 2-4, 2014...The O's have never swept the Redlegs in Cincinnati.

**THIS AND THAT:** The Orioles are winners of three in a row, five of their last six, and six of their last eight...In the last six games, O's hurlers have pitched to a 1.17 ERA (7 ER/54.0 IP) with 48 strikeouts and a 0.80 WHIP; during that span, they have held opposing teams to a .163/.222/.261 (30-for-184) slash line with nine extra-base hits (4-2B, 3B, 4 HR) and a .483 OPS.

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Orioles lead MLB with 51 home runs, the second-most homers through the first 33 games in O's history, trailing 2012 (53)...The most long balls through Baltimore's first 34 games of a season is 54 by the 2012 team; the Birds also hit at least 51 homers through the first 34 games in 1987 (52) and 1996 (51).

⚾ The Orioles have an MLB-best seven players with at least five homers: **Gunnar Henderson** (10), **Colton Cowser** and **Cedric Mullins** (6), and **Ryan Mountcastle**, **Ryan O'Hearn**, **Adley Rutschman**, and **Jordan Westburg** (5); the Padres rank second with five players with at least five homers.

**BIG TIME RUTSCH:** **Adley Rutschman** enters today ranked third in the AL in hits (43) and fifth in batting average (.321)...He is also tied for the MLB lead in multi-hit games (14), along with Cleveland's Steven Kwan, Los Angeles-NL's Shohei Ohtani, and Philadelphia's Trea Turner.

⚾ Rutschman has hit safely in 26 of his 32 games this year and has reached base safely in 27 of 32.

⚾ He has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games, during which time he is slashing .369/.388/.600 (24-for-65) with three doubles, four homers, eight runs, 13 RBI, and two walks.

⚾ Had a career-long 11-game hitting streak from April 19-30, the longest by an O's batter this season.

**O THE PLACES YOU'LL GO:** The Birds are on a five-game road trip with three games in Cincinnati (2-0) and two in Washington...The club has scheduled off days on May 6 and May 9...The O's are 10-4 (.714) on the road to begin year, the second-best road winning percentage in MLB, behind the Brewers at 13-5 (.722).

**AGAINST THE REDS:** The Orioles and Reds conclude their only series of the season today with the finale of the three-game set at Great American Ball Park...The O's dropped two out of three against the Redlegs last year from June 26-28 at Oriole Park...Marks the first trip to Cincy for the Birds since they dropped two out of three from July 29-31, 2022...Entering this series, Baltimore and Cincinnati had only squared off in the regular season 18 times in team history; the 18 regular-season games against the Reds were tied for Baltimore's fewest against a single active opponent with the Cardinals and Dodgers, who the Birds will travel to for three games each later this season...The Orioles and Reds first met in the regular season in 2005, but faced off in the 1970 World Series, with the Orioles defeating the Big Red Machine, 4-1, to win their second World Series title.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE:** **Gunnar Henderson** and **Colton Cowser** were voted American League Player and Rookie of the Month, respectively, for March/April...It marks the first time in team history that the O's have claimed both awards in the same month...The last MLB team to do so was the Dodgers in August 2023: Mookie Betts (Player) and James Outman (Rookie)...The last occurrence among AL teammates was the Guardians in April 2022: José Ramirez (Player) and Steven Kwan (Rookie).

**KIMBREL COUNT:** **Craig Kimbrel** recorded the 425<sup>th</sup> save of his career Friday at Cincinnati, tying Kenley Jansen for fifth in MLB history and the most among active pitchers...Kimbrel has 1,213 strikeouts, the fourth-most all-time as a reliever behind Hoyt Wilhelm (1,363), Goose Gossage (1,340), and Lee Smith (1,225); the 1,213 punchouts by Kimbrel are the most in MLB history by a pitcher who never started a game.

**SWEEPLESS IN BALTIMORE:** The Orioles have gone 102 consecutive regular-season series of at least two decisions (no ties) without being swept...According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, that is the fourth-longest regular-season streak in MLB history, trailing the 1942-44 St. Louis Cardinals (124), 1906-09 Chicago Cubs (115), and 1903-05 New York Giants (105)...Baltimore's current streak is the longest in O's history, ahead of 46 such series from 1971-72...The Birds have not been swept in a regular-season series of at least two games since May 13-15, 2022 at Detroit (0-3), and not at home in a series of at least two games since August 27-29, 2021 vs. Tampa Bay (0-3)...The Orioles were swept by the Rangers in three games in the 2023 ALDS.

**THE SKIPPER:** Manager **Brandon Hyde** is in his sixth season in Baltimore...In 2023, he led the O's to an AL-best 101-61 record, their second straight winning campaign and the first time since 1997 that the Orioles claimed the top seed in the AL...He made his Postseason managerial debut in the ALDS, and was named the BBWAA AL Manager of the Year, becoming the fourth Orioles manager to win the award...He was also voted the *Sporting News* American League Manager of the Year by fellow AL managers for the second consecutive year...Hyde's 337 wins rank fifth all-time among Orioles managers, trailing **Hank Bauer** (407), **Paul Richards** (517), **Buck Showalter** (669), and Orioles Legend and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Earl Weaver** (1,480).

**QUICK HITS:** Scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...Made his fourth Opening Day roster...Went 13-5 with a 4.12 ERA (79 ER/172.2 IP), allowing 171 hits (27 HR) with 55 walks and 157 strikeouts across 32 starts in his 2023 campaign...The O's went 24-8 in his starts and his career-high 13 wins were tied for sixth in the American League...Acquired by the Orioles along with INF Breyvic Valera, OF Yusniel Diaz, RHP Zach Pop, and INF Rylan Bannon in exchange for INF Manny Machado on July 18, 2018...Originally selected by the Dodgers in the 14<sup>th</sup> round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of UNLV.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Won his second straight start on April 30 vs. New York-AL after allowing two runs on four hits (2 HR) and four walks with four strikeouts in 7.0 innings... Tied season highs in innings (2x, last: 4/7 at PIT) and home runs allowed (3x, last: 4/13 vs. MIL)...His four walks were his most since also allowing four on September 11, 2023 vs. St. Louis...Logged his second quality start of the year after also tossing one on April 7 at Pittsburgh...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in three of his six starts this season and three-or-fewer in five of the six...Marked his 10<sup>th</sup> career start against the Yankees, his most against any team...Threw 93 pitches, 57 strikes.

**AGAINST THE REDS:** Today will mark Kremer's second career start against the Reds... His only other appearance against the Redlegs came on July 30, 2022 in Cincinnati... Dealt the loss in that outing after surrendering six runs on 10 hits (2 HR) and one walk with three strikeouts in 4.1 innings...Threw 88 pitches, 60 strikes.

**AGAINST THE NL CENTRAL:** Making his eighth career start against the NL Central and third this year...Has gone 2-3 with a 6.00 ERA (24 ER/36.0 IP) in his first seven career outings against the division, and 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA (6 ER/11.0 IP) in two starts in 2024.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** Has gone 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 ER/18.0 IP) in three road starts this year, and 11-12 with a 4.28 ERA (86 ER/181.0 IP) in 35 career road starts.

**DAY MAN:** Is 1-1 with a 4.41 ERA (8 ER/16.1 IP) in three day starts this year, and 6-7 with a 4.69 ERA (67 ER/128.2 IP) in 25 career day starts.

**RIGHTY TIGHTY:** In his last three starts, Kremer has held right-handed hitters to a .059/.158/.147 (2-for-34) slash line with one home run, four walks, and 14 strikeouts... Has held right-handers to a .644 OPS on the season, compared to .747 against lefties.

**GAME OF ADJUSTMENTS:** Kremer pitched to a 5-1 record with a 3.09 ERA (28 ER/81.2 IP) and seven quality starts in his final 15 outings last season...He went 8-4 with a 5.04 ERA (51 ER/91.0 IP) and seven quality starts in his first 17 starts to open the year, allowing 105 hits (19 HR) and 24 walks with 82 strikeouts.

**2023 HIGHLIGHTS:** Earned the win on September 28 vs. Boston, clinching the AL East...Collected his 300<sup>th</sup> career strikeout on September 17 vs. Tampa Bay, matching Chuck Estrada and Daniel Cabrera as the fifth-fastest Orioles by appearances (69) to reach the mark...Logged four straight quality starts from August 10-29, the longest such streak of his career...Pitched for Team Israel in the 2023 World Baseball Classic; made the start in Team Israel's 3-1 win over Team Nicaragua in Pool Play on March 12, 2023 at loanDepot park in Miami (4.0 IP, 3 H, BB, K).

**POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE:** Kremer made his Postseason debut last season, taking the loss in Game 3 of the ALDS against the Texas Rangers on October 10...Allowed six runs on seven hits and one walk in 1.2 innings...The six earned runs marked the most amount that Kremer had given up in a game since June 30 vs. Minnesota (7 ER)...It was his shortest outing since June 24, 2021 at Toronto (0.1 IP).

Scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his sixth career appearance (third start) against the Nationals...Dealt his first loss of the season his last time out on May 1 vs. New York-AL after allowing two runs on four hits (1 HR) and one walk with six strikeouts in 6.0 innings...Has not picked up a decision in his first five outings (2 GS) against the Nats, pitching to a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP), while his teams have gone 3-2.
