## Toronto Blue Jays (19-25) at Detroit Tigers (20-25)

**Y'ALL COME BACK NOW:** Spencer Torkelson's two-out, two-strike, RBI single in the bottom of the ninth inning snapped a 2-2 tie and led the Detroit Tigers to a come-from-behind 3-2, walkoff win in the series opener last night vs. the Toronto Blue Jays ... the win was Detroit's eighth come-from-behind victory this season and snapped a three-game losing streak and an eight-game skid in series openers ... the clubs continue their three-game series today with an afternoon affair.

- Last night was Detroit's 13th one-run game of the season, tied for fifth-most in all of baseball ... the victory upped Detroit's record to 5-8 and snapped a six-game losing skid in such contests, its longest one-run game losing streak since an eight-gamer from September 4-25, 2020.
- After this series with Toronto, this homestand concludes with a four-game set vs. Cleveland.

**DAY AND NIGHT IS NIGHT AND DAY:** The Tigers enter today's contest with an 11-4 record (.733) during day games this season, the best record in all of baseball for games in daylight ... by the same token, the Tigers are 9-21 (.300) in night games this season, the lowest winning percentage in the majors ... Detroit's 9-21 night game record is its roughest through 30 night games to start a season since losing 21 of its first 30 night games 2003.

- The Tigers are a perfect 6-0 in home day games this season, joining the Tampa Bay Rays (7-0) as the lone unbeaten teams at home during the day this year.

**HOME AND ROAD IS NIGHT AND DAY:** Thanks to last night's win, the Tigers are now 13-6 at home this season, the fourth-best home record in all of baseball and a far cry from their 7-19 road record to date, last in all of baseball ... the Tigers are 5-1-0 in their six home series and 1-6-1 in their eight road series so far this season.

**YES MORE MR. MIZE GUY:** Casey Mize makes his first start today since April 28 in Atlanta after missing the past couple of weeks with a right adductor strain ... Mize has pitched 5.2 innings or more with one run allowed or less in four of his six starts this season ... in his last four starts, Mize has pitched to a 1.74 ERA (4 ER/20.2 IP) with 22 strikeouts and just six walks.

**GREENE STREAK PART I:** Riley Greene has reached base safely in 25-straight games, extending his career high and the second-longest active streak in all of baseball behind only Nick Kurtz (38 games) ... it is the longest streak by a Tiger this season and the longest by any Tiger since Gleyber Torres last season (also 25 games) ... the last Tiger to reach base safely in more than 25-straight games?: Jeimer Candelario and his 29-game on-base streak from April 29-June 3, 2021.

- Greene has the longest streak by a Tigers left-handed hitter since Prince Fielder tallied a 29-game on-base streak from August 8-September 9, 2012.

**GREENE STREAK PART II:** Riley Greene yesterday also extended his hitting streak to 10 games, the longest active streak in all of baseball ... Greene is batting .459 (17-for-37) with a .524 on-base percentage and 1.145 OPS during this run ... for Greene, it's his longest hitting streak of the season and second-longest by a Tiger in 2026 (Kevin McGonigle, 13-game hitting streak, April 15-29).

**31DERFUL GAMES:** Riley Greene is now batting .393 (42-for-107) with 10 doubles, four homers, 17 RBI, a .484 on-base percentage, a .598 slugging percentage and a 1.082 OPS in his last 31 games over the past five weeks starting April 11 ... he leads the majors in on-base percentage and batting average and is second in the majors in OPS in this span.

**MAY SOURS:** The Tigers are batting a collective .220 (94-for-428) with a .631 team OPS halfway through the month of May ... the club owns the seventh-lowest batting average and the sixth-lowest OPS in all of baseball this calendar month.

- The Tigers have a 4.18 team ERA (53 ER/114.0 IP) and a .700 OPS against in May, the 10th-highest ERA and 13th-highest OPS against in all of baseball ... Detroit's .308 winning percentage this month is tied for third-lowest in the majors (4-9 record in May).

**IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING:** Kevin McGonigle has a 2.4 bWAR through his first 43 major league games, the fourth-best mark in the A.L. this season and trailing only Bobby Witt Jr (3.0 bWAR), Aaron Judge (2.6 bWAR) and Wilyer Abreu (2.5 bWAR) ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

**EXTRA, EXTRA:** Detroit has an extra-base hit in 43-straight games dating to March 28, the longest active streak in all of baseball ... Baltimore is next at 37-straight games ... this is Detroit's longest extra-base hit streak since a 44-game run from August 4-September 23, 2025.

- Detroit has an extra-base hit in 47-straight home games dating to July 27, 2025, the longest active home streak in all of baseball ... Baltimore is next at 25-straight home games ... it's Detroit's longest home extra-base hit streak since a 50-game run from April 16-August 9, 2019.

**AND FINALLY:** The Tigers have now seen eight games decided in walk-off fashion this season, the most in all of baseball ... the Tigers are 3-5 in such games ... the three wins are tied with the Blue Jays and five other teams for third-most walk-off victories in the majors this season while the five walk-off losses are the most in the big leagues.

- Prior to his start in which he got injured (2.1 innings, three hits, two earned runs), he had turned in back-to-back quality starts and came one out shy of three in a row.
- Placed on the 15-day IL on April 29 with a right adductor strain...at the time of his injury, he was tied for seventh in the A.L. with a team-best 2.51 ERA (min. 28.0 innings pitched).
- Earned his first win of the season on April 11 against Miami, coming one out shy of a quality start...he tossed 5.2 innings allowing just one earned run on six hits and a walk while striking out five.
- Allowed just one run over six strong innings, striking out nine in his first start of the year against Arizona.
- Started 28 games for the Tigers in 2025 and marked a career-best 14-6 record...posted a 3.48 ERA (64ER/149.0IP) and a career-high 139 strikeouts.
- Named a 2025 All-Star for the first time in his career on July 11, becoming the sixth Tigers' player to be named to the team.
- Made his first postseason appearance on Oct. 1 against the Cleveland Guardians...made his first postseason start at home on Oct. 8, posting six strikeouts in three innings to start the game in the teams' 9-3 win over the Seattle Mariners to force a game five of the ALDS. That start marked the first time Mize threw six strikeouts in less than 4.1 innings.
- Mize (14-6) and Tarik Skubal (13-6) were the first Tigers teammates to reach 13 wins since 2014: Max Scherzer (18), Justin Verlander (15) and Rick Porcello (15)...New York's Max Fried and Carlos Rodón were the only other A.L. teammates with at least 13 wins last year.
- Became the first Tigers pitcher to win four games in April since Jordan Zimmerman won five games in 2016...went 4-1 with a 2.12 ERA (6 ER/24.1 IP) in five starts in April.
- Recorded first win at home since 2021 on April 7 last year in a 6-2 win against the New York Yankees...recorded six strikeouts and held the Yankees to four hits and one run through six innings of work.

- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on April 22...recalled on April 29 after making one relief appearance with the Mud Hens...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two over 2.0 innings in the outing.
- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.
