


I love hearing directly from our students, and one of my favorite parts about this magazine is that there's a section dedicated to our graduating class of Jeter's Leaders, who share what they gained from this program. In the 26 years since The Turn 2 Foundation was created, there have been countless moments that have demonstrated the lifechanging impact of our initiatives on the youth we serve. Every day, Turn 2's diverse mix of programming continues to open doors to brighter futures for so many young people.

Our Turn 2 Us program in partnership with NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital addresses mental health directly in elementary school classrooms, and over the past academic year alone, provided more than 2,400 New York City students, educators, and caregivers with access to vital resources. In Florida, the Derek Jeter Center at Phoenix House has continued to offer hope in a safe space for teens who are struggling with substance abuse through its tailored treatment plans and programs. Throughout the year, our Jeter's Leaders immersed themselves in invaluable experiences that provided the tools they need to pursue their ambitions - including paid internships at prestigious organizations, college tours, and much more - which resulted in our entire class of senior Leaders graduating high school and getting accepted into top colleges and universities.

Through it all, the most humbling moments for me are witnessing the spark that ignites within young people when they discover the strength to overcome challenges, grow with confidence, develop a passion for creating meaningful change, and realize their utmost potential.

This shined through during our 2022 Social Change Project over the summer in New Orleans, held in partnership with Goldman Sachs Community TeamWorks and HandsOn New Orleans. I had the pleasure of joining our Jeter's Leaders for the impactful initiative where we worked together to help beautify a beloved community space. As we spent the day landscaping, repainting tennis courts, refurbishing picnic tables and making more improvements to the area, I listened to the Jeter's Leaders as they shared words of encouragement with one another, like "you got this," "this is going to make such a difference," and "look how much we accomplished today." Later in the afternoon, the students created murals with leadership values that are important to them, featuring principles like respect, trust, positivity, communication, and role models.

Throughout the four-day initiative, I was in awe of these students. They were eager to devote their time to giving back to this local community, and they recognized they aren't just future leaders - they are leaders now, who are at the forefront of making the world a better place.

As you turn the page and read more about our incredible programs in this year's magazine, I hope you feel a sense of pride knowing that your support enables our Foundation to have a profound, transformational impact each day.

There is much more work to be done to cultivate an inclusive, equitable society, and I know that together, we will continue to inspire more young people to lead healthy, successful lives, and show them that, as youth, they can create positive change.

### TURN 2 HONORS THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF Gerald Williams with 2022 MVP Award



ajor League Baseball outfielder Gerald Williams' impact on the field is undeniable, but his integrity and passion for creating positive change off the field are what truly set him apart.

During spring training with the New York Yankees in 1993, Williams became more than just a teammate to then-young shortstop Derek Jeter, when he invited the rookie from Kalamazoo to dinner and took him under his wing. Jeter was grateful to Williams for his act of kindness, and the two developed a strong bond that blossomed into a nearly 30-year friendship.

"Gerald was the definition of a good friend," said Derek Jeter. "He was always someone I could turn to for support or words of encouragement, and I reflect on the conversations we shared often."

Throughout his life, Williams supported local initiatives in New Orleans where he was raised and served as a mentor to countless individuals. When The Turn 2 Foundation was established in 1996 he was eager to join its mission, and was one of the first athletes to volunteer to participate in its initial fundraisers and events in New York, Kalamazoo and Tampa.

Williams also devoted his time to serving as a special guest speaker and instructor during several of Turn 2's Baseball Clinics. At each event, he shared important life lessons with local children, inspiring them to dream big, lead healthy lifestyles and reach their utmost potential.

"Gerald was truly a selfless and caring individual who touched the lives of so many, and our family is incredibly grateful for the many years of friendship we shared," said Sharlee Jeter. "His character and positive spirit were unmatched, and he served as a tremendous role model to young people through his work with our Foundation and beyond."


In 2011, Williams joined Turn 2's Board of Directors, and in the years since served as a dedicated, active member. His voice on the Board reflected his passion for supporting young people, and his steady guidance and policy recommendations helped further the Foundation's mission to provide young people with opportunities to succeed.

Hoda Kotb. co-anchor of NBC News' TODAY and co-host of TODAY with Hoda & Jenna, returned as emcee, kicking off the program by highlighting Turn 2's work to create positive change through its signature initiatives for youth across the country.

"For the last 26 years, Turn 2 has had an incredible impact on so many young people, and as we look ahead to the future, it is so important that we continue advancing our mission to support youth

and provide them with the tools they need to succeed," said Derek Jeter. "The ongoing support of our partners, sponsors, donors and friends has not only helped Turn 2 become what it is today, but ensured that we can truly bolster our programs and reach hundreds more young people."

During the evening, Turn 2 honored the late Gerald Williams, Major League Baseball outfielder, with the 2022 MVP Award for the profound impact he had on countless young people across the country through his work both on and off the field. In addition to supporting local initiatives in New Orleans, where he was raised, Williams served as a dedicated member on Turn 2's Board of Directors and devoted his time to inspiring children to dream big during the Foundation's Baseball Clinics. Williams' wife, Liliana, accepted the award on his behalf during a moving presentation that paid tribute to his life and legacy.

"We are so grateful to Gerald for serving as an extraordinary role model to young people through his work with our Foundation and beyond, and we are even more grateful for the many years of friendship we shared," Sharlee Jeter expressed during the recognition.







"Inspiring youth to rise above negative influences, lead healthy lifestyles and serve as leaders is at the core of Turn 2's mission. Each of our programs motivate young people to channel their passion and determination into greatness, and recognize the endless possibilities that lie ahead for their future," said Sharlee.

Throughout the program, guests bid on unique memorabilia and experiences during live and silent auctions, and later in the evening, enjoyed an insightful conversation presented by The Players' Tribune. Moderated by former NBA player and television analyst Jay Williams, the program featured a conversation with Derek Jeter and Misty Copeland, the first African American female principal ballet dancer with the American Ballet Theatre, where they reflected on what greatness means to them, what motivated them to achieve success, and how to inspire future generations to pursue their dreams and reach their utmost potential.

"I view greatness as a mindset, and that's how you should go about your life on a daily basis," shared Derek. "It's about finding things you're passionate about, it's working hard - if you have that







mindset day in and day out, then you can achieve your goals." This year's event went out with a bang, as iconic, multi-platinum, GRAMMY Award-winning artists Joey Fatone of \*NSYNC and Wanyá Morris of Boyz II Men presented AFTR PRTY. Guests were blown away by the performances, which also featured surprise guests including lead vocalist of Creed Scott Stapp, Impractical Jokers' James Murray, and hip-hop artist Rob Base.

Turn 2 is grateful to all who supported and joined the 26th Annual Dinner, which will help the Foundation to expand its initiatives and provide more youth with opportunities to succeed and leave their mark on this world.

n the 14 years since the Derek Jeter Center at Phoenix House Florida was established, its tailored programs and treatment plans have helped thousands of youth transform their lives and create paths to brighter futures.

Over the years, The Turn 2 Foundation contributed more than \$1.6 million to the Center. This support led to its renovation in 2017, which enabled the facility to double its treatment capacity, catapulting its services to provide essential resources to families throughout Florida and help more young people struggling with substance abuse regain control of their lives.

"As a foundation that is rooted in motivating youth to turn away from drugs and alcohol, we are proud to partner with Phoenix House Florida and support its mission of providing substance abuse treatment to teens," said Derek Jeter. "This Center has offered vital support for so many young people over the years, and continues to have a profound, life-changing impact on this community."

In subsequent years, youth have experienced heightened uncertainty and increased levels of stress due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which had a devastating impact on their mental health. These challenges, coupled with the rise in the opioid

epidemic - which are substances teens are likely to experiment with after abusing marijuana and alcohol - pose immense pressure on young people.

Keeping youth sober with a well-rounded support system is a priority for the Derek Jeter Center, which has remained at the forefront of ensuring young people in Florida have access to vital treatment and mental health services.

"Providing resources that are centered on overcoming peer pressure, substance abuse, and mental health challenges is more important than ever. The Derek Jeter Center at Phoenix House Florida does incredible work to meet the changing needs of young people and their families, ensuring they are fully supported," said Sharlee Jeter.

With its highly trained and compassionate staff, the Derek Jeter Center helps vulnerable teens cope with peer pressure by providing



early intervention services and treatment that give them the tools to make healthy decisions. The Center provides both intensive outpatient and outpatient treatment to youth nine or more hours weekly, with sessions taking place after school hours from one to four days each week.

Services are individualized to best meet the needs of each patient, and include assessments, individual, group and family counseling, drug and alcohol screenings, psycho-educational therapy and life-skills training sessions that emphasize how to lead healthy, sober lives. In addition to treating the individual, the Derek Jeter Center also puts a focus on family involvement to help parents and guardians understand the vital role they play in their teens' recovery.

The Derek Jeter Center continually works to refine and improve treatment services which incorporate a wide range of techniques and programs for substance abuse care. Currently, Phoenix House Florida is developing Dialectical Behavior Therapy as a more intensive addiction recovery program at the Derek Jeter Center to serve young adults ages 18-24 years old. Its main objective is to teach young people how to live in the moment, develop healthy ways to cope with stress, regulate their emotions, and improve their relationships with others.

To advance the Center's mission of providing vital resources and support to vulnerable populations of youth, in October Phoenix House Florida hosted its inaugural fundraising event "Rise with Phoenix," at the Bryan Glazer Family JCC. The event raised critical funds to support the Derek Jeter Center's mission to serve more young adults in need of addiction recovery options, and included live entertainment, a live auction, a raffle and more.








# LOCAL YOUTH IGNITE SOCIAL CHANGE IN NEW ORLEANS (CONT'D)

ince its inception, The Turn 2 Foundation's mental health promotion program created in partnership with NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital, Turn 2 Us, has been working to address mental health directly in the classroom with thousands of elementary school students, school staff, parents and caregivers in Washington Heights, through a comprehensive range of services before, during, and after school hours.

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the CDC found that one in five children had a mental disorder, but only 20% of those children received care from a mental health provider - an alarming statistic that highlights mental health support for youth has been critically needed for years.

The past three years have demonstrated that Turn 2 Us' mission is more important than ever before, as mental health issues continue to be exacerbated by challenges surrounding the pandemic. In 2020, the Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago conducted a survey to 1,000 parents around the country, where 71 percent of parents said the pandemic took a toll on their child's mental health, and 69 percent said the pandemic was the worst thing to happen to their child.





Turn 2 Us has continued to provide vital resources to students, staff, and caregivers throughout the pandemic, and over the past academic year, served more than 2,400 individuals through in-person and virtual workshops geared toward mindfulness exercises, social media and internet safety, healthy lifestyles practices that promote mental well-being and academic success, and more. The program also held staff development workshops for teachers, administrators, and other school staff, while increasing awareness of the critical need for mental health support in households through tailored workshops for caregivers.

While the world rebuilds and returns to normalcy, the impacts of social distancing, virtual learning, and uncertainty have had negative, long-term impacts on countless young people and their mental wellbeing. Turn 2 Us is committed to ensuring more students have access to resources that will guide them through challenges, educate them on ways to effectively communicate, and most importantly, to reach out for support when they need it.

"I'm really proud of how much we've all grown over the past few years," said Evan, a New York Jeter's Leader. "The sky is the limit and I'm excited for all that's ahead!"




