Division Champions

The Brewers have won the division title for the third straight season and for the fourth time in the last five seasons.....the team has also secured a first-round bye and a berth in the National League Division Series.

Lookin' Out for No. 1

The Brewers' magic number to clinch the best record in the Major Leagues and home field advantage throughout the postseason is 1....a Phillies loss or a Brewers win will clinch the best record in MLB for the second time in franchise history (also 1982).

Jackson Chourio last night recorded his 20th SB of the season to become the youngest player in MLB history with multiple 20 HR/20 SB campaigns [21.199].....the previous record was held by Mike Trout, who notched the feat on his 22nd birthday in 2013.

Rebel Yeli

Christian Yelich has recorded the second 100-RBI season of his career (110 in 2018).....he needs 1 HR to reach 30 in a season for the third time in his career (36 in 2018 and 44 in 2019).

The Brewers notched their 22nd home sellout of the season last night....the team has played in front of sellout crowds in 17 of its last 29 games at American Family Field..... the 22 sellouts are the most at the ballnark since 2011 (37).

IN THE STANDINGS (193 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 79*, SECOND: 57, THIRD: 43, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently in first place, leading the Cubs by 6.0 games (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).....the team clinched the NL Central on Sept. 21.

AT HOME: The team has gone 51-28 at home, going 17-7-1 in series play.....the Brewers have won 50+ home games for the eighth time in franchise history and first time since going 51-30 in 2018.....had a season-high 7-game winning streak from 8/8-8/22.

<u>ON THE ROAD</u>: The team went a Major League-best 45-36 on the road, going 13-11-2 in series play.....went 35-18 in the last 53 road games.....had a franchise-record-tying 9-game winning streak from 7/23-8/16.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 25 replay challenges this season, going 17-8.....their last challenge (won) came 9/24 at San Diego as an out call at second base involving Jackson Chourio was overturned.

<u>BREWING SUCCESS</u>: The Brewers have now made the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three straight seasons.....the team has won the NL Central four times in the last five seasons and three years in a row.....Milwaukee was just two games away from qualifying for the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

<u>BREWING CONSISTENCY</u>: The Brewers have 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons [2017-25].....this does not include 2020.....entering 2025, the Brewers, Dodgers and Astros were the only teams with 86+ wins in the last seven full seasons.... the Brewers have 762 wins since 2017 [4th in MLB/2nd in National League].

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #54 - LHP ROBERT GASSER (1gs, 0-1, 6.00) 2025 Arsenal: Sweeper (33.3%) - 4-Seam Fastball (31.1%) - Sinker (24.4%) - Changeup (6.7) - Cutter (4.4%)

GASSER AT A GLANCE: Robert Gasser, 26, will be making his second start of the season today......Gasser made his season debut last Sunday at St. Louis and took a 5-1 defeat (3ip, 1h, 2r, 2er, 2bb, 2k, 1hr, 1hbp, 45 pitches).....he began the year on the 60-day injured list recovering from "Tommy John" surgery.....he was reinstated from the injured list on August 30 and optioned to Triple-A Nashville after making 8 rehab starts between the Rookie ACL Brewers (1gs), Class-A Wisconsin (3g) and Nashville (4gs)....he went 3-2 with a 2.25 ERA in 10 games/6 starts overall at Nashville (32ip, 25h, 9r, 8er, 10bb, 36k, 1hr).....Gasser was acquired from San Diego with three other players on 8/1/22 as part of the trade for LHP Josh Hader.....he was selected by the Padres in Competitive Balance Round B of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft from the University of Houston..... Gasser also attended the University of New Mexico and San Joaquin Delta College.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON: Robert's father, Jim, was also a pitcher.....Jim Gasser was drafted by Milwaukee (1984) and San Francisco (1986) but did not sign due to injury.

LAST SEASON: Gasser entered the 2024 season as the sixth-best prospect in the organization according to Baseball America.....he made his Major League debut and went 2-0 with a 2.57 ERA in 5 starts with Milwaukee.....the team went 5-0 in his starts.....he had 2 quality starts.....opponents batted .264 (28-for-106, 2hr).....he issued just a single walk compared to 16 strikeouts in 28.0 innings pitched.....Gasser was placed on the 15-day injured list on June 5 with a left flexor strain and missed the remainder of the season after he underwent "Tommy John" surgery on June 24, performed by Dr. Keith Meister.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 19-16 with a 3.63 ERA in 76 games/71 starts (337.1ip, 301h, 153r, 136er, 121bb, 410k, 29hr) while pitching in the San Diego (2021-22) and Milwaukee (2022-25) organizations.....Gasser was named 2023 International League Pitcher of the Year and Brewers Co-Pitcher of the Year (with RHP Carlos Rodríguez) as he went 9-1 with a 3.79 ERA in 26 games/25 starts at Triple-A Nashville....he was an International League All-Star in 2023 as he led all of Triple-A Baseball and ranked second among Brewers Minor League pitchers in strikeouts (166).

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 2-0 with a 1.64 ERA in 4 starts (22ip, 4er).....CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA in 2 starts (9ip, 6er).

ALSO AVAILABLE OUT OF THE BULLPEN: #32 - RHP JACOB MISIOROWSKI (14gs, 5-3, 4.38) - 2025 ALL-STAR 2025 Arsenal: 4-Seam Fastball (54.4%) - Slider (25.1%) - Curveball (14.3%) - Changeup (6.2%)

MISIOROWSKI AT A GLANCE: Jacob Misiorowski, 23, will make his 15th start of the season and second against the Reds.....he last started last Friday at St. Louis and took a 7-1 loss (3.2ip, 5h, 2r, 2er, 3bb, 3k, 1hbp, 77 pitches).....he has 3 quality starts.....the team is 9-5 in his starts.....opponents are batting .210 (48-for-229, 8hr).....his 186 pitches of 100+ MPH trails only **Hunter Greene** (CIN-273) among Major League starters.....he was on the 15-day injured list from 8/3-8/14 with a left tibia contusion, retroactive to 7/31.....Misiorowski was selected by Milwaukee in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft from Crowder (MO) College, where he pitched one season (2022) and became the highest drafted player in school history.....name is pronounced "miz-uh-RAO-skee."

AWESOME!: Misiorowski became the first pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to have more wins (2) than hits allowed (1) after his first two career starts and as many wins (3) as hits allowed (3) after three starts....he joined Logan Henderson (also 2025) as the only pitchers in franchise history to win each of their first three career Major League games.....he became the ninth pitcher - sixth starter - in the Modern Era to throw at least 5.0 hitless innings in a Major League debut as he earned a 6-0 win on 6/12 vs. St. Louis (5ip, 0h, 4bb, 5k, 81 pitches).....Misiorowski followed that performance with a 17-6 win on 6/20 at Minnesota as he took a perfect game into the seventh inning (6ip, 1h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 6k, 1hr, 86 pitches).....he produced the longest hitless innings streak (11.0 IP) in the Modern Era by a starting pitcher to begin a career.....the hat he wore in his second career outing went to the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, NY.....he picked up a 3-0 win against Paul Skenes on 6/25 vs. Pittsburgh (5ip, 2h, 2bb, 8k, 74 pitches).....he was named NL Rookie of the Month for June, joining Ben Sheets (June 2001) as the only Brewers pitchers ever to take home the honors.....he notched the first double-digit strikeout game of his career in a 3-1 win over Clayton Kershaw on 7/8 vs. Los Angeles-NL (6ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 12k, 1hr, 91 pitches).....Misiorowski had just five Major League games under his belt when he was named an All-Star, the fewest in Major League history.....he tossed a scoreless eighth inning in the All-Star Game in Atlanta (1ip, 1h).

AT NASHVILLE: Misiorowski, who entered the season as the third-best prospect in the organization according to Baseball America, joined the team from Triple-A Nashville, where he was 4-2 with a 2.13 ERA in 13 games/12 starts.....he was International League Pitcher of the Week twice and Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Month for May..... the team went 6-6 in his starts.....he made 4 quality starts.....opponents batted .175 (38-for-217, 4hr).....he produced 80 strikeouts in just 63.1 innings pitched (11.37 K/9IP).

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Misiorowski has gone 11-9 with a 3.04 ERA and 1 save in 68 games/55 starts in the Brewers farm system (2022-25).....opponents have batted .170 and he has produced 320 strikeouts in just 233.2 innings pitched (12.33 K/9IP).....he pitched in the 2023 All-Star Futures Game at T-Mobile Park in Seattle.

AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 3-0 with a 3.41 ERA in 7 starts (34.1ip, 13er).....ON THE ROAD: Is 2-3 with a 5.52 ERA in 7 starts (29.1ip, 18er).

vs. REDS: His only outing came 8/15 at Great American Ball Park (ND, 1.1ip, 4h, 5r, 5er, 3bb, 3k, 1hbp).....Brewers won, 10-8, coming back from an 8-1 deficit after two innings.
