WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE: The Chicago Cubs open the 2025 Postseason today with Game 1 of the National League Wild Card Series against the San Diego Padres at Wrigley Field.

- © The Cubs finished the 2025 regular season with a record of 92-70, good for 2nd place in the N.L. Central Division.
- © The team turned in their first 90-plus win season since 2018.
- © This is the first trip to the playoffs for the Cubs since the 2020 season and the fourth postseason berth for the organization since the 2016 season when they won the World Series ... it also marks the ninth winning season since 2015 for the Cubs.
- © The Cubs have played in three Wild Card Series' going 1-2 in those series with a 1-3 game record ... the Cubs played in two, one-game Wild Card Games and one best-of-three Wild Card Series.

VS. SAN DIEGO: The Cubs and Padres will meet for the second time in postseason history and the first since the 1984 National League Championship Series ... the Padres won that series, 3-2 with each team winning all their games at home.

- © In 2025, Chicago and San Diego split their season series, 3-3 ... the Cubs won two-of-three at Wrigley Field while the Padres won the three game series at PETCO Park ... both series took place in early April.
- © Since the 2021 season, the Cubs lead the regular season series, 17-16.
- © All-time at Wrigley Field during the regular season, the Cubs lead the series, 152-110 ... the Cubs lead the all-time regular season series, 285-239.

- © The Cubs enter the Wild Card Series with 14 players having previous MLB postseason experience including: Justin Turner (86 games); Kyle Tucker (64); Dansby Swanson (37); Ian Happ (8); Willi Castro (6); Drew Pomeranz (9); Caleb Thielbar (5); Matthew Boyd (4); Taylor Rogers (4); Aaron Civale (3); Andrew Kittredge (3); Jameson Taillon (2); Michael Soroka (1); Reese McGuire (1).
- © Three Cubs on the roster were members of World Series Championship teams ... **Justin Turner** (2020, Dodgers); **Kyle Tucker** (2022, Astros) and **Dansby Swanson** (2021, Braves).

THE FRIENDLIEST CONFINES: The Cubs open the 2025 postseason with the best-of-three series at Wrigley Field where they went 50-29 (.633) during the 2025 season, good for the sixth-best winning percentage at their home ballpark in MLB.

- © In postseason play, the Cubs are 21-39-1 at home all-time, including 16-31 at Wrigley Field ... the Cubs haven't won a postseason game at Wrigley Field since Oct. 18, 2017 (GM 4, NLCS) vs. Los Angeles and have dropped four straight.

CRAIG'S CUBS: **Craig Counsell** recently completed his second season with the Cubs, and now has a career record of 175-149 (.540) at the helm of the Northsiders and an overall regular season record of 882-774 (.533) as a major league manager ... he has a career postseason record of 7-12 (.368) ... he was named the 56th manager of the Chicago Cubs on November 6, 2023, replacing David Ross ... Counsell managed the Milwaukee Brewers from 2015-23, going 707-625 (.531) in 1,332 regular season games ... the 2025 season marks Counsell's 35th in professional baseball.

- © Counsell's 2025 staff includes bench coach **Ryan Flaherty**, pitching coach **Tommy Hotovy**, hitting coach **Dustin Kelly**, first base coach **Jose Javier**; third base coach **Quintin Berry**; bullpen coach **Mark Strittmatter**, assistant hitting coaches **Juan Cabreja** and **John Mallee**, major league coach **Jonathan Mota**, major league strategy coach **Alex Smith** and bullpen catchers **Garrett Lloyd** and **Erick Castillo**; assistant pitching coach **Casey Jacobson** and staff assistant **A.J. Lewis**.

30, 30, 30: **Pete Crow-Armstrong** is the first player in franchise history to record 30 home runs, 30 doubles and 30 stolen bases in a single-season ... he is the second Cubs player in franchise history with 30 home runs and 30 stolen bases in a single-season (also **Sammy Sosa** - 1993, 1995)

- © With Crow-Armstrong, **Michael Busch** (34) and **Seiya Suzuki** (32) reaching the 30-homer plateau, the Cubs have at least three players with 30-plus homers in a season for the second time in franchise history (four in 2004 - **Moisés Alou** 39; **Aramis Ramirez** 36; **Sammy Sosa** 35; **Derrek Lee** 32).
- © Chicago is one of four major league teams this regular season with three players having at least 30 homers (also Yankees, Mets, Athletics).

SEIYA'S SHOW: **Seiya Suzuki** homered in each of the final four games of the regular season, marking his longest career homer streak ... he has hit safely in seven-straight games (8-for-26/.308) since Sept. 21 and in the month of September hit safely in 16 of 21 games, posting an .811 OPS during the stretch.

- © Suzuki joined **Shohei Ohtani** (3x) and **Hideki Matsui** (2004) for the fifth 30-homer, 100-RBI season by a Japanese-born player in major league history.

GOT HEEM!: **Matthew Boyd** this season recorded a major league-leading and franchise record 11 pickoffs ... on Sept. 6, he surpassed **Charlie Smith** (9 in 1913) for the single-season franchise record.

- © Boyd is the first player in the major leagues to pick off at least 11 runners in a season since **Clayton Kershaw** in 2012 (also 11).
- © Chicago's 27 pickoffs as a staff are nine more than any other team in the major leagues.

Current Trends:

- Ⓞ His 31 starts this season were the third-most in a single season in his career, his most since 2019 (32).
- Ⓞ His 3.20 ERA this season is the seventh-lowest among qualified N.L. pitchers ... has allowed two runs or fewer in 14 of his last 21 starts since May 28 (3.07 ERA).
- Ⓞ Picked up the win in his last start of the regular season, Sept. 24 vs. New York-NL, tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with three strikeouts.
- Ⓞ Led the major leagues in pickoffs this season (11) ... ranked in the 97th percentile in the majors in Offspeed Run Value (9), the 90 percentile in Pitching Run Value (17) and the 87th percentile in Fastball Run Value (10) ... ranks in the 86th percentile in walk percentage (5.8%).
- Ⓞ Opponents hit .208 (20-for-96) with 38 strikeouts off his slider and .205 (39-for-190) with 46 strikeouts off his changeup.

Postseason Notes:

- Ⓞ Set to make his fourth postseason start and fifth appearance of his career.
- Ⓞ Made three starts with the Guardians in the 2024 Postseason, tossing 11.2 innings and allowing just one earned run ... held hitters to a .175 (7-for-40) batting average in the 2024 Postseason ... made two starts against the Tigers and one against the Yankees.
- Ⓞ In 2022, pitched in one game for the Mariners in the postseason, allowing one hit and one walk in 0.1 inning,

2025 Notes:

- Ⓞ Completed at least 5.0 innings in 19-straight starts from May 28-Sept. 12.
- Ⓞ Sept. 6 vs. Washington picked off two runners in a game for the first time in his career ... his 10 pickoffs this season set a franchise single-season record, passing Charlie Smith (9 in 1913) ... became the first player in the major leagues to pick off at least 10 runners in a season since Eric Lauer in 2018 (also 10).
- Ⓞ August 2 vs. Baltimore made his third start this season of at least 7.0 scoreless innings.
- Ⓞ Allowed two runs or fewer in 10-straight outings from May 28-July 22, posting a 1.14 ERA (8 ER/63.1 IP), the lowest ERA among qualified major league starters during the run.
- Ⓞ Recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in the third inning July 28 in Milwaukee (Jackson Chourio swinging).
- Ⓞ Tossed a career-high 25.0-straight scoreless innings from July 1-28 ... the scoreless streak was the longest by a Cub since Ryan Dempster went 33.0-straight scoreless innings from June 5-July 14, 2012.
- Ⓞ Was selected as an All-Star for the first time in his career, but did not pitch in the game.
- Ⓞ Tossed a season-high 8.0 scoreless innings July 12 at the Yankees, the third time in his career that he has thrown at least 8.0 scoreless innings (last - July 31, 2018 vs. Cincinnati).
- Ⓞ Reached 1,000 career innings after completing the sixth inning June 25 in St. Louis.
- Ⓞ Picked a runner off in a career-high three consecutive games from June 4-14, tying a Cubs franchise record (also Rick Sutcliffe - June 17-27, 1985 and June 7-17, 1986 and Bill Hands - May 28-June 6, 1970).
- Ⓞ June 9 in Philadelphia made his fifth career start with no strikeouts, his first since May 22, 2018 at Minnesota.
- Ⓞ Took a perfect game into the sixth inning in a 2-0 loss June 4 in Washington ... tossed 7.1 innings, his longest outing since April 24, 2021 vs. Kansas City (8.0 IP).
- Ⓞ Recorded a season high-tying eight strikeouts in 6.0 innings May 28 vs. Colorado.
- Ⓞ Allowed four runs May 23 at Cincinnati, snapping a 17-start stretch dating to Aug. 13, 2024 of allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing ... posted a 2.87 ERA (29 ER/91.0 IP) during the stretch.
- Ⓞ Recorded his 50th career win May 17 vs. the White Sox (3 ER/6.0 IP).
- Ⓞ Did not allow a run in 16.0-straight innings to begin his Cubs tenure, spanning into his third start.
- Ⓞ Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in his Cubs team debut March 30 in Arizona.
- Ⓞ Pitched 4.0 scoreless innings in relief during the Cubs' 4-2 exhibition win over Yomiuri March 16 in Tokyo.
- Ⓞ Went 1-2 with a 6.59 ERA (10 ER/13.2 IP) and 12 strikeouts in four Spring Training starts.

Career Notes

- Ⓞ Signed a two-year major league contract with the Cubs Dec. 6, 2024 ... has spent time in the major leagues with Toronto (2015), Detroit (2015-21, 2023), Seattle (2022), Cleveland (2024) and the Cubs (2025).
- Ⓞ Ranked fourth among A.L. left-handed pitchers in SO/9.0 IP ratio (9.54) from 2018-24 (min. 500 IP).
- Ⓞ Struck out 238 batters in 185.1 innings in 2019, tied for the 10th most in the majors.
- Ⓞ Made his major league debut with the Blue Jays on June 27, 2015, striking out seven.
- Ⓞ Was named a Baseball America Minor League and Double-A All-Star in 2015.
- Ⓞ Was selected by Toronto in the sixth round of the 2013 draft.
- Ⓞ Attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the College World Series in 2013 ... graduated from Eastside Catholic High School in Washington.
