TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin the final stretch of their road trip with the first game of a 3 game set against the Minnesota Twins...Seattle is also coming off a series sweep of the St. Louis Cardinals (3-0) on the trip...tonight's game against the Twins will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners beat the Cardinals by a 3-2 score in yesterday's series finale, securing their second series sweep of the season (also: 4 G, 4/10-13 vs. HOU)...it also marked Seattle's first series win on the road in 2026.

- **On a Run** - Seattle is 4-2 over their last 6 series (4/10-c), going 10-6 (.625) in 16 games...over their last 8 games (4/18-c), the Mariners are 6-2 (.750).
- **All is Ferrer in Love and War** - Mariners reliever **José A. Ferrer** yesterday recorded his first save of the season after retiring all 3 batters faced in the 9th inning...he also matched his career high with 2.0 innings pitched in back-to-back appearances (April 22 vs. ATH and April 25 at STL).
- **That's a First!** - **Rob Refsnyder** hit the first pinch-hit home run of his career on a go-ahead, solo home run in the 9th inning of yesterday's game.
- **Julioooo** - Over his last 15 games (4/11-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .345 (20x58) with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 6 walks, 3 stolen bases, a .415 OBP and slugging .500 for a .915 OPS... he has reached base safely in 21 of his last 22 games (4/3-c), including a 19-game on-base streak from April 3-24.

OFFENSE UNLEASHED...since the start of the Astros series on April 10, the Mariners offense has come alive, averaging 4.90 runs a game while batting .273 (146x535) with 27 doubles, 1 triple, 20 home runs, 76 RBI and 64 walks, getting on base at a .358 clip and slugging .439...during that span, the Mariners rank 5th in MLB in batting average, T-2nd in OBP, 7th in OPS (.797), 7th in slugging percentage and T-3rd in wRC+ (129).

HE'S BEEN RALEIGH GOOD AT THE PLATE...**Cal Raleigh** hit his 6th home run of the season in yesterday's series finale against the Cardinals, his 4th homer in the last 6 games (4/20-c)...he has reached base safely in the last 11-consecutive games (4/15-c), during which he is batting .295 (13x44) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 4 home runs, 5 RBI, 6 walks and 1 stolen base, reaching base at a .380 clip and slugging .614 for a .994 OPS...during that span (min. 50 PA), Cal ranks T-9th in average, T-8th in hits, 5th in slugging percentage, 7th in OPS and T-1st in fWAR (0.8) along with Nick Kurtz-ATH and Bobby Witt Jr.-KC.

NAYLZ HEATING UP...first baseman **Josh Naylor** went 2-for-5 with 2 stolen bases in Saturday's game...over his last 7 games (4/17-c), Naylor is batting .480 (12x25) with 2 doubles, 4 RBI, 4 SB and 4 walks, slugging .680 with a 1.213 OPS...Naylor is also batting .357 (15x42) with 2 doubles, 3 HR, 9 RBI and an 1.023 OPS over his past 11 games (4/13-c)...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 23-for-23 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-5th in the Majors and 3rd in AL in stolen bases over that span.

THE YOUNG MAN DELIVERS...**Cole Young** went 2-for-3 with 1 RBI in yesterday's contest, recording his 2nd-consecutive multi-hit game...over his last 10 games (4/16-c), Young is batting .361 (13x36) with 6 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 5 RBI, 3 walks, 1 stolen base and an .897 OPS...Young leads the Mariners with 1.7 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) and ranks 2nd among MLB second baseman behind Nico Hoerner-CHC (1.9 bWAR)...he also has 8 defensive runs saved (*Sports Info Solutions*) this season, **leading** MLB second basemen and tied for the MLB lead among all defenders (also: Pete Crow-Armstrong-CHC).

MARINERS TO RETIRE RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51...the Mariners are set to retire Randy Johnson's #51 on Saturday, May 2...he will join fellow Hall of Famers Ken Griffey Jr. (#24), Edgar Martinez (#11), Ichiro Suzuki (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42) as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson will be the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, and his and Ichiro's #51 will be the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball).

UPCOMING HOMESTAND...on Friday, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 6 game homestand against the Royals (3 G, 5/1-3) and Braves (3 G, 5/4-6)...headlining the homestand is Randy Johnson Number Retirement Night on Saturday...additionally, the Mariners will celebrate '80s Weekend (5/1-3) with Randy Johnson '80s Jersey Night (5/1) and '80s Pin Day (5/3)...fans can also enjoy Mariners Value Games during each game of the Braves series (5/4-6)...visit Mariners.com/Tickets for more information.

THE STARTING FIVE...Mariners starting pitchers have been excellent to start the 2026 season, with the rotation of **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, **Bryan Woo**, **Emerson Hancock** and **Luis Castillo** combining to go 8-9 with a 3.70 ERA (68 ER, 165.1 IP), 37 walks and 146 strikeouts...among MLB rotations, the Mariners ranks 1st in IP, T-6th in fWAR (2.8), T-2nd in quality starts (15), 1st in fewest BB/9 (2.01), 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.95), T-7th in WHIP (1.17) and 7th in ERA.

BRASHTY...reliever **Matt Brash** is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 10.1 IP), 6 strikeouts and 2 walks (1 intentional) in 12 appearances this season...he's posted a 0.48 WHIP and held opponents to a .100 batting average (3x30)...Brash is 1-of-3 players in Mariners history to have multiple season opening streaks of at least 10 games without an earned run (also: 19 G in 2025), joining teammates **Andrés Muñoz** (2023 and 2025) and **Gabe Speier** (2023 and 2025).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Rob Refsnyder** yesterday hit a pinch-hit solo home run in the 9th inning to give the Mariners the 3-2 win against the Cardinals...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...it marked the 12th pinch-hit, go-ahead homer in the 9th inning or later in franchise history and the first since Jorge Polanco on July 13, 2025 at Detroit, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...of the 120 pinch-hit home runs hit in franchise history, Refsnyder's was only the 12th pinch-hit homer hit on a full count?...the last pinch-hit homer on a full count came on **Cal Raleigh's** pinch-hit grand slam on May 7, 2024 at Minnesota.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 27

- **1995** - Randy Johnson, Bill Risley and Bobby Ayala combine for the first opening day shutout in Seattle history, 3-0 vs. Detroit...Ken Griffey Jr. launches a three-run, third deck homer for the game's lone runs.
- **2001** - Kazuhiro Sasaki records his 12th save in April in a game against the White Sox to set a new Mariners record for most saves in any month.
- **2025** - In his first Major League start, **Logan Evans** earned the win, becoming the 14th pitcher in Mariners history to win in his MLB debut and the first since Andrew Moore (6/22/17 vs. DET)...the Mariners went on to earn a 7-6 win in their series finale against the Miami Marlins, collecting their 6th consecutive series win, including a franchise record 4-consecutive where they have lost the series opener.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 6th start of the year and his 249th career start...it will also be his 1st start of the season against the Twins and the 10th of his career.
• Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
• Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
• Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
• Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...

ND on April 21 vs. the Athletics, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 5 hits (1 HR) and 2 walks with 6 strikeouts...he threw 95 pitches (62 strikes) in his 5th start of the season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

is making his 3rd road start of the season (last: 4/16 at SD)...is 2-2 with a 3.60 ERA (10 ER, 25.0 IP) and 21 strikeouts across his last four road starts, stretching back to last season (9/1/25-c).

SEASONED TRAVELER...

his 118 career road starts are 5th-most in MLB since 2017...has thrown 5.0+ innings in 98 career road starts (7th-most such games in MLB since 2017), 6.0+ in 63 starts, and 7.0+ in 18 starts...his 661.1 career innings pitched on the road ranks 7th-most in MLB since 2017.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL...

across 24 career starts against AL Central teams since joining the Mariners in 2023, he is 9-6 with a 3.52 ERA (56 ER, 143.1 IP) and 144 strikeouts to 30 walks and 15 home runs allowed...went 4-0 with a 2.57 ERA (12 ER, 42.0 IP) and 34 strikeouts across 7 starts against AL Central teams in 2025.

SO WE MEET AGAIN...

will be making his 10th career start against the Twins (last: 6/24/25 at MIN) and his 6th career start at Target Field...the Twins will become the 10th team that Luis had made 10+ career starts against (joins: STL, MIL, CHC, PIT, LAA, CLE, HOU, ATH, and SD).

GOING THE DISTANCE...

has tossed 6.0+ innings in 149 career starts, the 6th most in MLB since 2017...has tossed a quality start in 136 of those starts, the 5th-most games since 2017 and has thrown 6.0+ scoreless innings in 40 career starts, 2nd-most since 2017, trailing only Zack Wheeler (42 G).

GETTING STARTED...

across 24 starts in March/April as a Mariner, he is 8-7 with a 3.34 ERA (49 ER, 132.0 IP), and 138 strikeouts compared to his 39 walks and just 11 home runs allowed...among Mariners pitchers with 20+ career starts in the opening month of the season, he ranks 2nd in strikeouts-towalk ratio (3.54) and ranks 3rd in both WHIP (1.258) and strikeouts-per-nine innings (9.41).

IN COMMAND...

has tossed 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks in 54 career games since 2023 (last: 3/30 vs. NYY), 5th-most in MLB across that span, trailing only Logan Webb (70 G), teammate George Kirby (60 G), Zack Wheeler (59 G) and Tarik Skubal (56 G).

STEERING THE SHIP...

across 111 career starts in a Mariners uniform since 2022, he has gone 5.0+ innings in 101 of those starts, 6.0+ innings in 68 starts, and 7.0+ innings in 22 starts...in his start on Aug. 26, 2025 vs. San Diego, recorded his 600th strikeout with Seattle, becoming the 13th pitcher in franchise history with 600+ strikeouts.

WHO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...

his 3.53 ERA with Seattle is the 5th-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), behind Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), and ranking ahead of teammates George Kirby (3.55) and Logan Gilbert (3.61)...is 2 strikeouts shy of tying Joel Piñeiro for the 10th-most strikeouts in franchise history (658 SO)...his 1.164 WHIP and 9.2 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 4th-best.

WHIFF LEADER...

leads MLB since 2017 with 3,447 swings and misses across his career, ranking ahead of Kevin Gausman (3,431) and Max Scherzer (3,308)...also ranks 4th in the league in swinging strikeouts since 2017 with 1,259 swinging strikeouts, trailing Max Scherzer (1,316), Kevin Gausman (1,301), and Gerrit Cole (1,262).

LA PIEDRA...

among qualified pitchers since 2017 (his debut season), he is 5th in quality starts (136), T-5th in games started (248), 6th in innings pitched (1434.0), 7th in total strikeouts (1516) and 12th in wins (84).

ALL-DECADE ACCOLADES...

is one of 5 pitchers in the last 10 seasons (2017-c) to have at least 1,500 strikeouts and a WHIP below 1.20, joining Gerrit Cole, Aaron Nola, Max Scherzer, and Zack Wheeler.

1,500...

collected his 1,500th career strikeout on a swinging strikeout to Aaron Judge in the 6th inning of his March 30 start vs. Yankees...he became just the 7th pitcher to throw 1,500 career strikeouts since 2017.

2025 TOTALS...

went 11-8 with a 3.54 ERA (76 ER, 180.2 IP), 46 walks, 162 strikeouts and a 1.19 WHIP across 32 starts last season.

TOP OF CLASS...

held a 3.54 ERA last season, his 7th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA (2019-25), tied for the most in MLB during that span (also: Shane Bieber-CLE/TOR, Jacob deGrom-NYM/TEX and Zack Wheeler-NYM/PHI)...recorded 11-or-more wins in his 3rd consecutive season with the Mariners (2023-25), and the 4th time in his career (also: 15 wins in 2019 w/CIN).

CAREER...

pitched in parts of 10 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)...named to the All-Star Team three times in his career (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.
