TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners open a 7-game homestand tonight with the 1st of 4 games against the Tampa Bay Rays...following Sunday's series finale against the Rays, the Mariners will host the Philadelphia Phillies for a 3-game series (May 9-11)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost last night by a score of 7-2, but are 10-9 over their last 19 games since April 14...overall this season, Seattle is 11-4 when scoring at least 4 runs and 1-9 when scoring 3 or fewer runs this season...the Mariners are 7-2 at home this season and 5-11 on the road.

- Homestand Highlights** - The Mariners open a 7-game homestand today with a 4-game series vs. Tampa Bay (May 5-8), followed by a 3-game series vs. Philadelphia (May 9-11)...homestand highlights include **College Night** (tonight), **J.P. Crawford Bobblehead Night** (May 6), **Bark at the Park Night** (May 9) and more.
- Happy Birthday** - Mariners right-handed pitcher **Logan Gilbert** turns 25-years-old today...Gilbert was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April.
- Long Stretch** - The Mariners are on their 10th of 16 consecutive days with a scheduled game, their longest streak of days with a scheduled game this season.
- Series Record** - The Mariners own a 3-4-1 series record (3-0 at home) this season.

ROSTER MOVES...the Mariners made 6 roster moves earlier today:

- Danny Young**, LHP, selected from Triple-A Tacoma.
- Riley O'Brien**, RHP, recalled from Triple-A Tacoma.
- Matt Brash**, RHP, optioned to Triple-A Tacoma (post-game May 4)..
- Matt Festa**, RHP, placed on 15-day Injured List (right elbow tendinitis, retroactive May 4).
- Nick Margevicius**, LHP, designated for assignment.
- Matt Koch**, RHP, cleared waivers and outrighted to Triple-A Tacoma.

HOME SWEET HOME...the Mariners went 7-2 during their opening homestand (April 15-24), outscoring opponents 56-31 during that span...during the homestand, the Mariners averaged 6.22 runs/game, while posting a .829 OPS as a team...the pitching staff posted a 2.57 ERA (24 ER, 84.0 IP) with 24 walks and 75 strikeouts during the homestand.

WE GO WITH GENO...Eugenio Suárez hit his 4th home run of the season in yesterday's game, a 2-run shot that snapped a stretch of 24 consecutive innings in which the Mariners were held scoreless...Suárez has hit safely in 13 games this season, with the Mariners averaging 5.3 runs/game in those contests...the Mariners are averaging only 2.8 runs/game in 11 matchups where Suárez does not record a hit this season...11 of Suárez's 18 base hits this season have gone for extra bases (6 2B, 1 3B, 4 HR).

BAD LUCK...Jesse Winker has been the most unlucky hitter in the Majors this season with an expected batting average of .322, compared to his actual batting average of .186...the -.136 gap between his xBA and BA is the largest in the Majors...**Abraham Toro** holds the 5th-least-favorable difference between batting average (.160) and expected batting average (.261) with a gap of -.101...expected batting average measures the likelihood that a batted ball will become a hit based on its exit velocity, launch angle and sprint speed of the batter in some circumstances (via Statcast).

FUN ON THE FARM...the Mariners announced yesterday the Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Month Award winners for April:

- George Kirby** (RHP) - Minor League Pitcher of the Month...went 2-0 with a 1.37 ERA (3 ER, 19.2 IP) with 5 walks and 25 strikeouts, while holding opponents to a .191 batting average over 4 April starts.
- Edwin Arroyo** (INF) - Minor League Player of the Month...hit .288 (21x73) with 16 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 18 RBI, 11 walks, 6 stolen bases, a .395 OBP and a .479 SLG (874 OPS).

HIT THE GROUND RUNNING...Ty France tallied 33 hits over the Mariners first 25 games of the season, the most hits by a Mariners player over the first 25 games since Nelson Cruz tallied 34 hits in 2015...**J.P. Crawford** is right behind France with 32 hits this season, making the duo the first pair of Mariners teammates to each record 32+ hits over the first 25 games since Ichiro Suzuki (39) and Bret Boone (33) in 2001...France and Crawford are the only teammates in the Majors this season to each record 32+ hits over their club's first 25 games of the season.

THE J-ROD SHOW...Julio Rodriguez has reached base safely in 6 of his last 7 games and 10 of his last 12 games dating back to April 22...after starting the season 1-for-18 over his first 5 games, he is batting .275 (19x69) with 9 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run, 9 RBI, 6 walks and 8 stolen bases in 19 games since April 14...during that span, his .275 batting average ranks 2nd among all qualified Major League rookies, trailing only Sheldon Neuse-OAK (.309), while ranking ahead of Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (.270) and Keibert Ruiz-WAS (.255).

ROAD RASH...during the recent road trip (April 26-May 4), the Mariners tallied 53 outs on hard-hit balls (exit velocity 95+ mph)...the 53 outs on hard-hit balls, ranked tied for 5th-most in the Majors during that span...during the road trip, the Mariners hit .395 on hard-hit balls, compared to the expected batting average of .571 on those batted balls...Seattle's -.176 difference between batting average and expected batting average on hard-hit balls during the road trip was the 2nd-most-unlucky gap in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia (-.192).

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners went 7-2 during their first homestand of the 2022 season, winning series against Houston (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Kansas City (3-0), and...**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...the Mariners went 46-35 (.543) at T-Mobile Park in 2021, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Seattle is 61-39 (.610) over the last 100 games at T-Mobile Park (Aug. 23, 2020 - current)?...the 61 wins are tied for 4th-most in any 100-game span at T-Mobile Park since the end of the 2001 season...Seattle has tallied 62 wins in a 100 game stretch 3 times since the beginning of the 2002 season: July 9, 2006 - Aug. 27, 2007, July 8, 2006 - Aug. 19, 2007 and April 20, 2002 - May 23, 2003.

ABOUT RAY...

- The 30-year-old left-hander is set to make his 6th start of the season and first against the Rays this season...he is making his 199th career Major League appearance (195th start) and 9th career start against Tampa Bay.
- Named the 2021 American League Cy Young Award winner, receiving 29 of 30 first-place votes...Gerrit Cole-NYY received the only other first-place vote.
- In 2021 ranked 1st among American League starters in ERA (2.84), strikeouts (248), innings pitched (193.1), games started (32), WHIP (1.045), ERA+ (154) and Baseball-Reference Wins Above Replacement (6.7).
- 1 of 5 starting pitchers named to the All-MLB First Team.
- In 2021 led AL pitchers in quality starts (23), tied for 2nd-most in the Majors with Sandy Alcantara-MIA and trailing only Walker Buehler-LAD (28).
- In 2021, his 10 outings with at least 10 strikeouts were most among MLB pitchers, ranking ahead of Gerrit Cole-NYY (9).
- In 2021 ranked 3rd in the American League in strikeouts per 9 innings (11.54) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.77).
- In 2021 became first pitcher to lead his respective league in ERA, strikeouts and WHIP in a season since Clayton Kershaw-LAD in 2013 and the first in the American League since Justin Verlander-DET in 2011.
- Signed a 5-year contract with Seattle on Nov. 30, 2021.

**LAST TIME OUT...** L #2 in last start on 4/30 at Miami...went 4.0 innings scoreless before allowing 3 runs to score in the 5th...allowed just the 3 runs on 4 hits and 4 walks with a season-high 8 strikeouts.

**RAY KNOWS RAYS**...made 6 starts against the Rays in 2021, going 2-2 with a 2.33 ERA (10 ER, 38.2 IP) with 51 strikeouts and just 5 walks...tossed 7.0 1-hit innings with 11 strikeouts on July 11, 2021 against the Rays.

**WORKHORSE**...was one of just 4 MLB pitchers to throw at least 6.0 innings in each of his first 4 starts (also: Alek Manoah-TOR, Chris Bassitt-NYM, Joe Musgrove-SD) before only going 5.0 innings against Miami on 4/30.

**OPENING DAY W**...earned his first win of the season after tossing 7.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 3 hits (1 HR), 4 walks and a HBP, while striking out 5...became the 4th Mariners pitcher to toss at least 7.0 innings while allowing 1 run or less on Opening Day, joining Félix Hernández (5 times, last: 2015), Randy Johnson (1993) and Mike Moore (1984).

**PIECES OF EIGHT**...his 8 consecutive outings with at least 6.0 innings pitched and allowing 2 or fewer runs from July 28-Sept. 5, 2021 was the longest streak in the American League during the 2021 season.

**AL PITCHER OF THE MONTH**...won the award for the month of August 2021, sporting a 1.76 ERA (8 ER, 41.0 IP) over 6 starts, allowing 27 hits and 8 walks while recording 52 strikeouts with a 0.85 WHIP and a .188 batting average allowed...was his first career monthly award.

**200 STRIKEOUTS**...recorded his 4th season with at least 200 strikeouts (2016, 2017, 2019, 2021)...1 of 6 active pitchers with at least four 200+ strikeout seasons prior to turning 30 (Clayton Kershaw, Chris Sale, Madison Bumgarner, David Price, Justin Verlander).

**ELITE COMPANY**...recorded 49 strikeouts and 1 walk over a 6-start span from April 24-May 22, the 3rd pitcher in AL history to have 49+ strikeouts and no more than 1 walk over a 6-start span in a single season, joining Pedro Martinez (2000) and Gerrit Cole (2021).

**LEFT ON BASE**...his 90.1 left-on-base percentage in 2021 ranked highest in the Majors among qualified pitchers...ranked highest in Major League history in a season (min. 162 IP).

**'RAY' OF SUNSHINE**...tossed 6.1 innings of one-run ball on June 8, 2021 at Chicago-AL with 5 hits, 0 BB, and 13 strikeouts...the 13 K's were his most in a game since recording a career-high 14 on Sept. 4, 2017 at Los Angeles-NL...became the 2nd pitcher in Toronto history with 13+ strikeouts and 0 walks in a game, joining Roger Clemens (4x).

**1,000 INNINGS**...tallied his 10th win on Aug. 30, 2021 vs. Baltimore, giving up 2 runs and 4 hits over 7.0 IP with a walk and 10 strikeouts...reached 1,000 career innings after the 1st out of the 6th frame...his 1,241 strikeouts to that point were the most in a player's first 1,000 career innings in Major League history (2nd: Yu Darvish - 1,222).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP LOGAN GILBERT (4-0, 0.64)

The 24-year-old right-hander will make his 6th start of the season Friday against the Rays...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for April...his 0.67 ERA (2 ER, 28.0 IP) leads the Majors...W#4 in last start at MIA on 5/1 (5.2,3,1,1,4,5,HR)...in his rookie season in 2021 with the Mariners, he went 6-5 with a 4.68 ERA (62 ER, 119.1 IP) with 28 walks and 128 strikeouts in 24 starts in first...ranked 6th in franchise history for strikeouts by a rookie with 124, passing Yusei Kikuchi who ranks 7th with 116 strikeouts during his rookie season in 2019...made MLB debut on May 13 against Cleveland, allowing 4 runs over 4.0 innings, tallying 5 strikeouts...became the 42nd Mariners pitcher to start in MLB debut, the first since Justin Dunn, Sept. 12, 2019 vs. Cincinnati. **CAREER:** Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau. **vs. TB;** making 4th career start against Tampa bay and 2nd this season...overall, is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (7 ER, 16.1 IP) with 20 strikeouts and 7 walks against the Rays.
