## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (69-89) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (80-78)

Sept. 25, 2025 - Great American Ball Park - Cincinnati, OH - 12:40 EDT - Game #159/Road #78  
RHP Braxton Ashcraft (4-3, 2.62 ERA) vs. LHP Nick Lodolo (8-8, 3.44 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** have won each of the first two games on this season-ending, six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta...Have won four consecutive games (since Saturday vs. the Athletics) after dropping 12 of 13 games from September 5-19...Are 57-63 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have recorded at least one extra-base hit in 57 consecutive games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 75 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019... Have played in a Major League-high 59 one-run games (they are 25-34 in those games), their most in any season since 2014 (60).

**FINAL ACT:** Paul Skenes allowed four hits and had seven strikeouts in 6.0 scoreless innings in Wednesday's 4-3, 11-inning win at Cincinnati...He has a 1.97 ERA (187.2ip/41er), making him only the third Pittsburgh pitcher to record a sub-2.00 ERA in a season (since earned runs became official in the National League in 1912), along with Wilbur Cooper (1.87) in 1916 and Babe Adams (1.98) in 1919...Wednesday's start was also Skenes' 12th scoreless start, snapping a tie with Trevor Williams (2018) for the most by a Pirate in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

**THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT:** Braxton Ashcraft will get the start today in Cincinnati...Dating back to Mike Burrows' start on September 9 at Baltimore, Pittsburgh's rookies (Burrows, Bubba Chandler and Ashcraft) have a 2.63 ERA (27.1ip/8er) in six starts.

**THAT'S SO SWEEP:** With a win today, Pittsburgh would complete its eighth sweep of the season (last from September 2-4 vs. Los Angeles-NL) and just its second away from PNC Park this year (also July 28-30 at San Francisco)...The Pirates' seven series sweeps are their most series sweeps (minimum three games) in a season since 2015 (11)...Their last road sweep against a National League Central opponent came right here at Great American Ball Park in a four-game series from September 12-14, 2022.

**SPENCER'S GIFTS:** Spencer Horwitz went 3-for-5 with two doubles and three RBI (including his game-winning, RBI double that scored Bryan Reynolds in the 11th inning) in the 4-3 win on Wednesday at Cincinnati...It was Horwitz' fourth career multi-double game (last on July 22 vs. Detroit), and it also marked his first career game-winning RBI in extra innings...Over his last 16 games, dating back to September 5 vs. Milwaukee, Horwitz has gone 15-for-50 (.300) with six doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, eight walks, seven runs and a .937 OPS.

**JUSTIN TIME:** Justin Lawrence had two strikeouts in a scoreless seventh inning on Wednesday at Cincinnati, extending his career-high scoreless streak to 15.2 innings (since March 30 at Miami)...That is the fourth-longest active streak in Major League Baseball and the longest by a Pirates reliever this year.

**LAST STOP:** The Pirates will depart for Atlanta following today's game and will begin a three-game series against the Braves on Friday night at Truist Park...Pittsburgh, which took two of three games from Atlanta from May 9-11 at PNC Park (was Don Kelly's first series as the manager), has never finished a regular season in Atlanta since the franchise relocated there from Milwaukee in 1966.

**START ME UP:** Ashcraft has made seven starts, coming on June 23 at Milwaukee, August 9 vs. Cincinnati, August 15 at Chicago (NL), August 22 vs. Colorado, August 28 at St. Louis, September 3 vs. Los Angeles (NL) and September 15 vs. Chicago (NL)...He has gone 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (29.0ip/6er), 30 strikeouts and a .192 batting average against (20-for-104) in those seven starts...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first Pirate to make each of his first three career starts against the same division (National League Central) since Cody Ponce did that in his first five starts from 2020-21.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Ashcraft struck out six batters in 3.0 perfect innings of relief on Saturday vs. the A's (no-decision in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win)...He was the first Pirates reliever to strike out at least six batters in an outing of 3.0 or fewer innings since Nick Tropeano (six strikeouts in 2.2 innings) on September 13, 2020 at Kansas City...He was also one of three Pirates relievers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 3.0 perfect innings with at least six strikeouts, joining Bob Patterson (May 25, 1991 vs. Philadelphia) and Chan Ho Park (October 1, 2010 at Florida)...The last Major League relief pitcher to do it was New York (AL)'s Michael King on May 17, 2022 at Baltimore.

**AGAINST THE REDS:** Ashcraft has made one appearance against Cincinnati (it was a start on August 9 at PNC Park)...In that start, he allowed one run on three hits, a walk and a hit by pitch (had five strikeouts) over his 3.1 innings (no-decision in the 2-1 loss).

**FROM THE ASHES:** Ashcraft has posted a 3.22 ERA (36.1ip/13er) and 36 strikeouts in his 18 relief appearances...He's gone at least 2.0 innings in 13 of those 18 appearances.

**HOMER HIATUS:** Ashcraft has allowed three home runs in 65.1 innings pitched, coming on July 4 at Seattle (Dylan Moore, two-run), September 9 at Baltimore (Jeremiah Jackson, solo) and September 15 vs. Chicago-NL (Michael Busch, solo)... Since making his Major League debut on May 26 at Arizona, he is one of only two Major League pitchers to pitch at least 65.0 innings and allow three or fewer home runs...The other is Baltimore's Trevor Rogers, who has allowed three home runs in 100.1 innings.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** Ashcraft pitched at least 3.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in each of his first six Major League starts, joining Los Angeles' Fernando Valenzuela in 1981 (seven starts) as the only pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that...That streak was snapped on September 15 vs. Chicago-NL (allowed three runs).

**HEY, BABE:** Ashcraft pitched 3.0 perfect innings (one strikeout) in relief of Bailey Falter on July 29 at San Francisco, earning a 3-1 win...He became just the second Pirates rookie relief pitcher since at least 1901 to earn a win while also tossing 3.0 perfect innings in a game, along with Babe Adams (5.0ip) on August 18 [G1], 1909 vs. St. Louis.

**CALIFORNIA CALM:** Bailey Falter (5.0ip), Ashcraft (3.0ip) and Dennis Santana (1.0ip) combined to limit San Francisco to two hits in the July 29 win, tied for the fewest allowed by the Pirates in a game this year at the time (also April 23 at Los Angeles-AL and May 31 at San Diego)...Per OptaStats, Pittsburgh was the first Major League team in the Modern Era (since 1901) to allow two or fewer hits in a game in three different road stadiums in the same state in the same season...The Pirates allowed a season-low one hit in Ashcraft's last appearance, a 2-0 win on Saturday night vs. the Athletics...It was the first time Pittsburgh allowed one hit in a game since May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado.

**WHAT A RELIEF:** Ashcraft earned his first Major League win on June 8 vs. Philadelphia, a day after Isaac Mattson picked up his first big-league victory against the Phillies... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Mattson and Ashcraft became only the second pair of Pittsburgh relievers since at least 1893 to each earn their first Major League win in consecutive team games...The only other pair of Pirates relief pitchers to do that were Rick White and Ravelo Manzanillo from April 15-16, 1994 vs. Los Angeles (NL).
