METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Sunday, the team fell to the Red Sox, 6-1, in Boston...New York has dropped back-to-back games...The Mets are 10-7 through 17 games in this month...The Mets have posted a 3.70 ERA, the third-lowest ERA in National League in July...The Mets continue a five-game, six-day road trip (1-2) to Boston (1-2) and The Bronx (two games)...On Thursday, the Mets return to Citi Field for a four-game series against the Washington Nationals.

ROSTER MOVE: Yesterday, RHP Elieser Hernández was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse and placed on the 15-Day IL with a right pec strain.

VERLANDER HORIZON: Since give up six earned runs on May 27 in Colorado, Justin Verlander has pitched to a 2.72 ERA (16 ER/52.0 IP) with 20 walks and 48 strikeouts over his last nine starts...Over the last five starts, Verlander is 2-1 with a 1.74 ERA (6 ER/31.0 IP) with 13 walks and 26 strikeouts.

YANKEE DOODLE: Verlander will make his second start this season against the Yankees tonight...The righty tossed 6.0 innings and allowed one earned run on three hits and struck out six on June 14 at Citi Field...Overall, Verlander is set to make his 25th career start against the Yankees...He is 9-7 a 3.37 ERA (57 ER/152.1 IP) with 43 walks and 144 strikeouts life time against the Yankees... Verlander has made seven regular starts against the Yankees since 2016 and is 4-0 with a 1.90 ERA (10 ER/47.1 IP) with six walks and 48 strikeouts.

INTERLEAGUE, PLANETARY, PLANETARY, INTERLEAGUE: In 62 career Interleague starts, Verlander has gone 40-12 with a 2.65 ERA (120 ER/407.1 IP) with 114 walks and 446 strikeouts...Verlander's 40 career wins in interleague play are the most in major league history...It is seven more than second-place Jon Lester (33)...His 446 strikeouts are the second-most in MLB history...He trails only Max Scherzer who has struck out 469 over 56 interleague games.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets continue the Subway Series tonight in The Bronx...Both teams are 1-1 in the 2023 version of the series...Last year, each team earned a two-game sweep at their home stadium...The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees in 2021, scoring a franchise-record 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020.

STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING DOORS: The Mets are 30-42 against the Yankees in The Bronx...The Amazin's are 61-79 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 109-147-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

YANKEE CLIPPERS: Jeff McNeil has hit .341 (28-82) with 11 runs, four doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .393 OBP and a .463 SLG in 22 career games against the Yankees...His .341 average against the Yankees is the fourth-highest among active players (min. 80 PA)...McNeil has hit .341 (15-44) with seven runs, three doubles, one home run, four RBI and three walks in 12 career games in The Bronx...Francisco Lindor has hit .309 (58-188) with 40 runs, 13 doubles, one triple, 10 homers, 22 RBI, 24 walks with a .390 OBP and a .548 SLG against the team from The Bronx.

ALL-AMERICAN: Jeff McNeil has batted .315 (109-346) with 45 runs, 16 doubles, seven home runs, 43 RBI, 23 walks with a .366 OBP and a .422 SLG in 93 career games against the American League...McNeil's .316 average ranks sixth among active players in Interleague games.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre...There have been 155 players who have played for both clubs, including current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, RHP David Robertson and OF Billy McKinney

ON THE UP: Over his last four games, Pete Alonso is 6-15 with three runs, two doubles, one triple and one RBI...Alonso is one double away from 100 for his

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of eight consecutive games and 14 of 18 games against American League opponents...They are 3-3 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 13-13 against the American League this year... Overall, New York owns a 248-240 record in Interleague play...The team's .508 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

YANKEES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 16-22 at Yankee Stadium since the ballpark opened in 2009.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 37 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 37 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson is 4-2 with 14 saves, and a 2.08 ERA (10 ER/431. IP) with 13 walks and 48 strikeouts in 39 games this year...He is holding lefties to a .190 (15-79) average this year...His 14 saves rank ninth in the National League...His 171 career saves are the eighth-most among active players.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets hit the road for the first time in the secondhalf...New York is 23-31 on the road this season...The team's 54 road games are tied for the most in the National League and are tied for second in the majors.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has hit 15 home runs in 97 games this season... Nimmo's career-high is 17 home runs, which he accomplished in 140 games in 2018...The left-handed hitter smacked 16 home runs in 151 games last season.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .291 (62-213) with 28 runs, eight doubles, three triples, six home runs, 28 RBI, 29 walks, a .379 OBP and a .441 SLG on the road...This compares to a .226/.332/.451 slashline with 18 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .250 (53-212) with 36 runs, 14 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 43 RBI, 20 walks, a .322 OBP, a .505 SLG and an .827 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .195/.301/.371 with 14 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 29-6 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

SECOND HALF SQUAD: The Mets are 274-241 in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .532 winning percentage during that span is the fifth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.626), St. Louis (.597), Chicago (.578) and Milwaukee (.535).

BROOKS WAS HERE: Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.77 ERA (2 ER/23.1 IP) over 28 games...In seven games this month, Raley has yet to allow a run, allowing only three hits and striking out seven in 6.0 innings...Raley has 19 holds, tied for the second-most in the NL and tied for the fifth-most in the majors.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has been successful in all 16 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 77 steals in 84 attempts... Their 77 steals are tied for 11th in the majors and tied for eighth in the NL... The team's 91.7 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 51 of their last 52 stolen base attempts.

YOU CAN CALL ME AL: Francisco Alvarez is tied for the lead all major league catchers in home runs and is third among all rookies in homers...He is tied for second in home runs in the majors this month with seven...Only San Diego's Manny Machado has hit more with 10 dingers.

DOWN ON THE FARM: On Sunday, INF Jacob Reimer went 2-2 with two runs, one home runs, three RBI, one walk and was hit by a pitch in St. Lucie's 12-10 victory over Palm Beach...In 69 games with the St. Lucie Mets this year, the 19-year-old is batting ..278 (64-230) with 40 runs, 10 doubles, six home runs, 36 RBI, three steals with a .401 OBP...He was selected by the Mets in the fourth round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Yucaipa High School in California...He is ranked as the 15th-best prospect in the organization according to MLB.com.

VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high-tying 8.0 innings and earned the win on July 19 vs Chicago-AL...Allowed one run on three hits and one walk while striking out seven batters.

MILESTONES AND MORE: Tonight, Verlander will make his 497th career start...With three more starts after tonight, Verlander will become the 50th player in major league history to reach 500 career starts and will join CC Sabathia (560), Bartolo Colon (552), Zack Greinke (532) and Andy Pettitte (521) as the only pitchers to make 500 starts in the Wild Card Era... Verlander ranks 25th in major league history with 334 quality starts and is three quality starts shy of tying Walter Johnson, Jim Palmer and Rick Reuschel for 22nd all-time...Verlander is the active leader in career wins with 248 and is two wins shy of becoming the 49th player in major league history to reach the 250-career win mark.

BATTLES AGAINST THE BRONX BOMBERS: Verlander has made 24 regular season starts in his career against the Yankees, including 17 quality starts...Verlander is 9-7 with a 3.37 ERA (57 ER/152.1 IP) lifetime against the Yankees during the regular season...Over his last seven regular season starts against the Yankees, Verlander is 4-0 with a 1.90 ERA (10 ER/47.1 IP) and a 0.78 WHIP...The right-hander has also has made nine career Postseason starts against the Bronx Bombers and is 5-1 with a 2.62 ERA (17 ER/58.1 IP) in those starts...Five of those starts have been quality starts, including a complete game, 13-strikeout performance in Game 2 of the 2017 ALCS.

INCREDIBLE IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY: In 62 career Interleague starts, Verlander is 40-12 with a 2.65 ERA (120 ER/407.1 IP)...In Interleague Play history, Verlander has the most wins, the second-most strikeouts (446) trailing only Max Scherzer (469), and the fourth-lowest ERA among qualifiers...In seven Interleague starts this season, Verlander has a 3.20 ERA (16 ER/45.0 IP) and a 0.93 WHIP...Four of those starts have been quality starts.

HITTING STRIDE: Over his last seven starts dating back to June 14, Verlander has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (11 ER/44.0 IP), the fifth-best mark in the majors during that span (Min. 37.0 IP)...The 40-year-old veteran has allowed just two home runs over that span and has the second-lowest HR/9 rate since June 14 with a 0.41 mark (Min. 37.0 IP)...Verlander sported a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) in his first seven starts of the season.

3K AND COUNTING: Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 39 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer... During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

A TRUE COMEBACK STORY: In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...lt was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)... Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186) , opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF: Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher... Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (0-1, 3.60)

LAST TIME OUT: Made his Mets debut on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox, at Citi Field...Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings on six hits and zero walks while recording three strikeouts.

HOT STREAK: Quintana has not allowed a home run over his last 66.2 innings dating back to August 4, 2022...That is the longest active streak in the majors.
