MIAMI MARLINS (25-40) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (27-41)

June 11, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #69/Home #38

RHP Cal Quantrill (3-6, 5.63 ERA) vs. LHP Bailey Falter (4-3, 3.49 ERA)

THE PIRATES: will conclude their season-high-tying, nine-game homestand against Houston (1-2), Philadelphia (3-0) and Miami (1-1) with this afternoon's series finale vs. the Marlins...Will head to Chicago-NL (Thursday-Sunday) and Detroit (June 17-19) for a seven-game trip following today's game...Have gone 15-15 since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8 (have played in 15 one-run games since Kelly managed his first game on May 9, going 8-7 in those games).

VERY FRIENDLY CONFINES: Following today's game, Pittsburgh will head to Wrigley Field to begin a four-game series against Chicago (NL) tomorrow night...The Pirates won five of their seven games played at Wrigley Field in 2024, their first time winning a season series on the road against the Cubs since 2017 (5-4)...Pittsburgh dropped two of three to Chicago here from April 29-May 1.

BAILEY ON THE BUMP: Bailey Falter, who will make his 14th start of the season in this afternoon's series finale, enters today with the ninth-best ERA (3.49) among all qualified left-handed starting pitchers in the National League (teammate Andrew Heaney, 3.24, ranks eighth)...Since the start of May, Falter has the fifth-best ERA (1.60) among all National League pitchers, trailing only Atlanta's Chris Sale (1.19), Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (1.32), teammate Paul Skenes (1.52) and San Francisco's Robbie Ray (1.57).

QUALITY STUFF: Mitch Keller recorded Pittsburgh's 32nd quality start of the season on Tuesday vs. Miami, allowing three runs over 6.0 innings...The Pirates' 32 quality starts are the fourth-most in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (35), Tampa Bay (34) and Kansas City (33)...Keller's 10 quality starts are tied for the second-most in the National League (Paul Skenes, 11, ranks first).

CRUZING FOR A BRUISING: Oneil Cruz hit his 13th home run of the season on Tuesday vs. Miami with his 416-foot blast in the eighth inning...His 13 home runs as a center fielder trail only Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong (17) for the most in all of MLB.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Ke'Bryan Hayes led off the eighth inning of Tuesday's game vs. Miami with a solo home run before Oneil Cruz followed with a solo shot of his own two batters later...Hayes' homer was his first since April 4 vs. New York (AL)...It marked the third time that Pittsburgh hit multiple homers in an inning this season (also April 18 vs. Cleveland and April 27 at Los Angeles-NL).

#H2P: Isaac Mattson needed a total of 21 pitchers to retire each of the six batters he faced on Tuesday vs. Miami...Since allowing one run in his season debut with Pittsburgh on May 22 vs. Milwaukee, Mattson, who pitched for the University of Pittsburgh, has made four straight scoreless appearances (5.0ip), striking out six batters while allowing just one walk and zero hits in 15 at-bats.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Konnor Griffin doubled twice while making his High-A debut with Greensboro on Tuesday at Rome (the Grasshoppers won, 8-2)...The 19-year-old Griffin, Pittsburgh's first-round selection (No. 9 overall) in the 2024 First-Year Player Draft, ranks first among all Pirates full-season minor league players in batting average (.340), OBP (.396), OPS (.938) and hits (72).

BEASTS OF THE EAST: Pittsburgh has gone 20-9 against the National League East at PNC Park since the start of the 2024 season (6-0-2 in eight series)...The Pirates' last series loss here against the NL East was from September 29-October 1, 2023 vs. Miami...In addition, five of the first six games between Pittsburgh and the Marlins this season have been decided by one run (the only game that wasn't came on Monday in the Pirates' 10-3 win).

FRAZIER EN FUEGO: Adam Frazier has gone 18-for-47 (.383) in his last 13 games (since May 23 vs. Milwaukee)...His .383 average in that stretch ranks sixth in MLB (min. 45 at-bats), behind only Kansas City's Vinnie Pasquantino (.443), Toronto's Alejandro Kirk (.434), the Athletics' Jacob Wilson (.433), Cleveland's José Ramírez (.400) and New York (AL)'s Aaron Judge (.397).

ISIAH'S IMPACT: Isiah Kiner-Falefa doubled on Tuesday vs. Miami and has now hit safely in 18 of his last 21 games (since May 17 at Philadelphia)...During that stretch, Kiner-Falefa is batting .338 (24-for-71) with seven doubles, six RBI, two walks, two stolen bases, eight runs scored and four multi-hit games.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 11, 1990: Jay Bell went 2-for-2 with two triples and two RBI to lead Pittsburgh to an 8-7 win at Busch Stadium. The Pirates took a 2-0 lead in the first inning and extended their lead to 6-0 in the third inning before St. Louis tied it in the seventh inning. Jeff King put Pittsburgh ahead for good with a run-scoring single in the eighth inning, giving Stan Belinda the win in relief.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia for INF Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023.

STARTING OFF: The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He’s in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Falter allowed four runs over 3.2 innings and had a no-decision in the team’s 5-4, walkoff win on Friday vs. Philadelphia...Four Pirates relievers combined to toss 5.1 scoreless innings before Nick Gonzales ended the game with a sacrifice fly.

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Falter will make his second start this season and his 10th career appearance (seventh start) against Miami...He allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in his season debut on March 29 at loanDepot park, but had a no-decision in the team’s 12-inning loss...In his only start against the Marlins here at PNC Park, which came last season on September 11, Falter allowed two hits in 7.1 innings in a 3-1 win...He took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before Jonah Bride broke it up with a one-out single.

THE MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Falter finished the month of May with a 0.76 ERA (35.2ip/3er), the third-lowest mark among qualified Major League pitchers during the month, behind Cincinnati’s Andrew Abbott (0.55) and Kansas City’s Kris Bubic (0.56)... Falter’s 0.76 ERA was the lowest by any Pirates pitcher in a single month (minimum six starts) during the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...In his outing on May 31 at San Diego, he became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to throw 6.1-plus scoreless innings on one/zero strikeouts since Jeff Locke (9.0ip/1k) did in a 10-0 win on May 30, 2016 at Miami.

WINNING THE DAY: Falter brings a season-high three-game winning streak into today...He has posted a 1.67 ERA (32.1ip/6er) and a .182 batting average against during the streak (began on May 9 vs. Atlanta)...This is Falter’s longest winning streak since winning four consecutive decisions last season from July 30 to September 11.

SHUT ‘EM DOWN: In his starts on May 3 vs. San Diego and May 9 vs. Atlanta, Falter pitched 6.0-plus innings while allowing one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he joined Sam Leever (June 28-July 2, 1900) as the only Pirates since at least 1893, within a single season, to pitch 6.0-plus innings with one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer in consecutive games (Babe Adams did it in his final appearance of 1915 and his first outing of 1916).

NOTHING TO SEE HERE: Falter has recordeed three separate scoreless streaks of at least 11.0 innings this season...He had his 11.0-inning scoreless streak end in the first inning in his start on June 6...Falter also compiled a scoreless streak of 11.0 innings from April 11-22, as well as a 16.2-inning streak that stretched from May 9-20.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS: Falter enters today with a 3.49 ERA (69.2ip/27er)...That ranks ninth in the National League (16th in MLB) among lefties with at least 65.0 innings.

THE FALTER FILE: Attended Chino Hills High School, where he was classmates with NBA players Lonzo and LaMelo Ball...Had committed to play collegiately at the University of California, Santa Barbara prior to being drafted by Philadelphia in 2015.
