METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets downed the White Sox, 5-1, last night at Citi Field...The Mets have won three straight games...New York continues the second-half with a seven-day, six-game homestand (3-2) against the Los Angeles Dodgers (1-2) and the Chicago White Sox (2-0)...Following this series, the Mets hit the road for a five-game, six-day road trip to Boston (three games) and The Bronx (two games).

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are seeking their fifth sweep of the season today against the White Sox...The Mets swept the White Sox only once before in franchise history, from July 30-August 1, 2019 in Chicago...The Mets have won five straight vs. the White Sox...Last night's victory secured the Mets 10th series victory of the season and their sixth at home.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Catcher Kevin Parada went 2-4 for the Brooklyn Cyclones last night in the team's 6-4 loss...The backstop has reached base in 12 straight games, posting a .348 (16-46) average in that span with four doubles, one triple, two home runs, five RBI, five walks with a .434 OBP, a .609 SLG and a 1.043 OPS in that span...In 76 games this season, Parada is batting .277/.358/.471 with 19 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 35 RBI with an .829 OPS...He is ranked as the top prospect in organization according to MLB.com.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 29-5 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

HIP, HIP, JOSÉ! Today, José Quintana will make his 2023 season debut... Quintana began the season on the IL with a left rib fracture...The lefty signed with the Mets in the off-season...In 11 major league seasons, Quintana is 89-87 with a 3.75 ERA with 504 walks and 1,532 strikeouts...In 32 starts between Pittsburgh and St. Louis, last year, Quintana went 6-7 with a 2.93 ERA (54 ER/165.2 IP) with 47 walks and 137 strikeouts...Since breaking into the majors in 2012, he ranks in the top 10 among left-handed pitchers in starts (third, 289), innings pitched (fourth, 1,723.2), strikeouts (sixth, 1,532) and wins (t-10th, 89)...Quintana is the all-time leader in games (315), innings (1723.2), strikeouts (1532) and wins (89) by Colombian-born pitchers.

SECOND-HALF Q: José Quintana posted a 1.67 ERA (14 ER/75.1 IP) going 4-2 in 14 second half starts last year...He allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of those starts...Overall, he finished eighth in the NL with a 2.93 ERA with the Pirates and Cardinals.

JULY! JULY! JULY! The Mets are 9-4 through 13 games in this month... The team's .692 winning percentage is third in the majors and is second in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.23 ERA (42 ER/117.0 IP), the lowest ERA in National League in July...Only the Mariners (3.18 ERA) have a lower mark in July...The Mets have hit 20 homers this July, tied for the 10th-most in the majors.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have played 44 games at Citi Field this season, tied for the fewest home games in the majors...The Phillies have also played 44 games at home this year...New York is 23-21 at Citi Field this season, posting a 3.93 ERA.

SIGN OF THE TIMES: The Mets have signed the following draft picks: fourth round selection RHP Wyatt Hudepohl (UNC Charlotte), fifth round selection LHP Zach Thornton (Grand Canyon University), 11th round selection RHP Brett Banks (UNC Wilmington), 13th round selection RHP Ben Simon (Elon University), 14th round selection RHP John Valle (Jefferson HS, FL), 15th round selection RHP Justin Lawson (NC State), 16th round selection 3B Jake Zitella (St. Charles East HS, IL), 17th round selection RHP Bryce Jenkins (University of Tennessee) and 20th round selection OF Kellum Clark (Mississippi State)... Additionally, the club has signed non-drafted free agent RHP Dakota Hawkins from Washington State University...The Mets have signed their first 14 draft picks as well as 20 of their 23 total draft picks.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty put the Mets on the board with a solo home run to center in the third inning last night...Has homered in back-to-back games for the first time in his career...All seven of Baty's homers this season have come while at home...He is batting .263 (30-114) with 16 runs, seven doubles, seven homers, 14 RBI, 10 walks with a .323 OBP, a .509 SLG and a .831 OPS in 35 games at home...This compares to a .214/.288/.223 slashline in 35 road games.

WHITE SOX-METS NOTES: The Mets last faced the White Sox from July 30-August 1, 2019 in Chicago...The Mets have won five straight against the White Sox.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of eight consecutive games against American League opponents...They are 2-0 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)... The Mets are 12-10 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 247-237 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 37 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 37 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

ALL-AMERICAN: Starling Marte has slashed .325/.385/.538 with 47 doubles, 11 triples, 29 home runs and 93 RBI in 189 career Interleague games...Jeff McNeil has batted .318 (105-330) with 43 runs, 15 doubles, seven home runs, 41 RBI, 22 walks with a .369 OBP and a .427 SLG in 89 career games against the American League...Marte's .325 average ranks third, while McNeil's .318 average ranks fourth among active players in Interleague games.

DROVE TO CHICAGO, ALL THINGS GO: The Mets host the Chicago White Sox at Citi Field for the first time since 2016...The Mets are 9-6 all-time against the White Sox including a 4-3 mark at Citi Field...The Mets have hosted the White Sox in a two-game series from May 7-8, 2013 and a three-game set from May 30-June 1, 2016...Starling Marte is a lifetime .270/.386/.426 hitter in 14 career games against the Sox, while Omar Narvaez has hit .361 (13-36) with four runs, a home run and three RBI in 10 career contests... Daniel Vogelbach owns a .323 (10-231) mark with five runs, two doubles, three home runs and nine RBI in 11 career games...Francisco Lindor owns a .270/.344/.447 slashline with 34 extra-base hits and 38 RBI in 92 games against the White Sox.

YOU CAN CALL ME AL: Francisco Alvarez leads all major league catchers in home runs and is tied for first among all rookies in homers with the Rangers' Josh Jung...He is second in home runs in the majors this month with seven... Only San Diego's Manny Machado has hit more with nine dingers...He is tied for seventh in MLB with 14 RBI this month and is hitting .381 (16-42) in July... Alvarez Francisco Alvarez has a .534 slugging percentage, which would be the highest ever by a Met in his age 21 season or younger...Only two other Mets have had a .500-plus slugging percentage at that age or younger: David Wright (.525 in 2004) and Darryl Strawberry (.512 mark in 1983), both in their age 21 seasons.

SECOND HALF SQUAD: The Mets are 273-238 in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .534 winning percentage during that span is the fourth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.627), St. Louis (.599) and Chicago (.576).

BROOKS WAS HERE: Since returning from the IL on May 14, Brooks Raley has posted a 0.81 ERA (2 ER/22.1 IP) over 27 games...Raley has 18 holds, tied for the third-most in the NL and tied for the sixth-most in the majors...In 22 games at Citi Field this season, Raley has posted a 1.57 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 15 punchouts.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has been successful in all 14 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 75 steals in 82 attempts... Their 75 steals are tied for eighth in the majors and tied for fifth in the NL... The team's 91.5 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 49 of their last 50 stolen base attempts...Starling Marte has swiped 24 bags this year, sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 338 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

METS DEBUT: Quintana will make his first start with the Mets today against his former team in the White Sox...Quintana was with the White Sox from his Major League debut in 2012 until 2017...Quintana signed a two year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...Has been on the IL the entire season due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: In his last start with Syracuse on July 8 against the Worcester Red Sox, he allowed five earned runs on four hits and three walks in 4.1 innings while fanning five batters.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

LAST GAME VS. CHICAGO-AL: Threw 2.0 scoreless innings in relief on September 27, 2020 while with Chicago-NL...Allowed two hits and one walk while striking out two batters in a 10-8 Cubs victory.

HOT STREAK: Did not allow a home run in his final 61.2 innings, the longest active streak in MLB...Also had the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022. Currently ranks fifth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,532) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,912), Chris Sale (2,135), Madison Bumgarner (2,070) and Patrick Corbin (1,540).

KNOCK YOUR SOX OFF: Quintana pitched for the White Sox for six seasons (2012-2017) totaling 169 games started with the team and a 3.51 ERA...In 2016, Quintana was an All-Star and placed tenth highest in voting for AL Cy Young Award voting...Will be facing his club for the third time in his career, and Chicago is the only American League team that he has not beaten.

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season... Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022... NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st).

- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 172 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.

- Hit a game-tying home run with two outs and two strikes in the ninth inning on July 5 at Arizona...Has five game-tying/go-ahead home runs in the sixth inning or later, the most by any player in 2023...It was his second game-tying home run with two outs in the ninth inning this season.
- Owns the Mets franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Hit a solo home run on July 1 vs. San Francisco, his first since June 10, to tie Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher.
- Had his second multi-homer game of the season on June 8 at Atlanta...Only three other Mets have had more than one multi-homer game before turning 22: Darryl Strawberry (four), Ed Kranepool (three) and José Reyes (two)...Strawberry is the only other Met to have multiple in a single season (four in 1983).
- His 17 career homers before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.
