METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets notched a 7-6 victory over the Rockies last night at Citi Field...The Mets have won four straight games and six of their last seven...New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break..They are 9-6 in that span... The Mets close out the first-half with a six-game homestand (4-0) against Nationals (3-0) and Rockies (1-0)...New York returns from the All-Star break with a four game set in Miami beginning on Friday, July 19.

WINNING!: The Mets are three games above 500 for the first time since April 21 (12-9). Their season-high is four games above . 500 following a victory on April 20 (12-8)...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under . 500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets have gone 24-10...Their 24 wins are tied with the Astros for the most in the majors in that span, as is their .706 winning percentage.

DREW SMITH MEDICAL UPDATE: Yesterday, Drew Smith underwent right elbow UCL reconstruction with internal brace augmentation with Dr. Keith Meister in Arlington, TX... Additional updates will be provided as appropriate

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets are on a four-game winning streak...They are batting .316/.381/.594 in that span with nine doubles, two triples, eight home runs, 12 walks and a . 975 OPS...They have posted a 3.25 ERA ( 13 ER/36.0 IP) with 13 walks and 38 stirkeouts... The Mets have outscored their opponents $27-13$ during the streak.

DINGERS: The Mets recorded a season-high five home runs last night...The team's five home runs at Citi Field were the most since they also hit five on May 29, 2021 vs. Atlanta...It's tied for the second-most in Citi Field history...The Mets are fourth in the major leagues and second in the majors with 119 home runs.

ROTATE THE BOARDI: Over the last seven games, the Mets starting pitchers have posted a 1.91 ERA ( $9 \mathrm{ER} / 42.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 14 walks and 37 strikeouts...The Mets are 6-1 in that span...In 12 starts in July, the rotation has posted a 2.78 ERA ( 24 ER/74.1IP) with 24 walks and 50 strikeouts...Their 2.78 ERA is the fourth-lowest in the majors and second-lowest in the National League in July.

JUST THE TWO OF US: Brandon Nimmo moved to the two spot for the first time on June 13 vs . Miami...He has appeared in 26 games in the two-hole and the Mets are 18-8 in that span...Nimmo is batting . 327 (33-101) with 27 runs, seven doubles, nine home runs, $30 \mathrm{RBI}, 13$ walks, three steals with a . 414 OBP, a 663 SLG and a 1.077 OPS when batting second this season

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting . 333 (10-30) with five runs, two doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, one walk with a. 355 OBP and a. 700 SLG...He has collected 62 RBI in 88 games this year...He recorded a career-high 68 RBI in 152 games last season...Entering June, Nimmo was batting .214/.350/378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 34 games since then, he is batting $.304 / .382 / .585$ with 30 runs, nine doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 33 RBI, 14 walks, four steals with a . 967 OPS.... He has safely reached base in 24 of his last 25 games, posting a . 420 OBP in that span...He has brought his OPS up from. 728 on May 31 to .825 entering today.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 50 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .293/.366/.512 with 37 runs, 18 doubles, nine home runs, 28 RBI, 18 walks, 11 steals with an . 879 OPS...Francisco Lindor has posted a 3.2 fWAR since May 1...That is besst in the National League in that span...It is fifth in the majors in that period...In 64 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .273/.339/.485 with 11 home runs and 37 RBI...The Mets are 28-21 when Lindor bats first this season.

FWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Francisco Lindor ranks eighth in the major leagues and fourth in the National League with a 3.9 fWAR...Brandon Nimmo is 19th in the majors and 11th in the NL with a 3.1 fWAR...Nimmo's 3.1 fWAR is second among NL outfielders behind only Christian Yelich (3.2 fWAR).

HOMEGROWN: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2021 (Christian Scott), 2020 (Eric Orze), 2017 (David Peterson, Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts...In addition, the team features several players who signed via International Free Agency including Francisco Alvarez, Jose Quintana, José Buttó and Dedniel Núñez.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have gone 28-22 against the Rockies at Citi Field...New York is 10-6 against the Rockies at the ballpark since 2019.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 12-2 over their 14 games at Citi Field...The team has homered in all but two of those games, hitting .286/.372/.550 in that span with 33 doubles, two triples, 29 homers, 59 walks with a .922 OPS...The Mets pitching staff has posted a 3.66 ERA ( $52 \mathrm{ER} / 128.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 53 walks and 126 punchouts. New York is $25-25$ at home this year $(25-24)$ at Citi Field...Their 3.66 ERA at home is eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL...The Mets went 43-48 at home in 2023.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Congrats to Pete Alonso who was named to the 2024 NL All-Star team...The 94th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 16 in Texas...Alonso, 29, was named to the All-Star team for the fourth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history - one more than Keith Hernandez....Alonso, who was also an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023, becomes the 11th Met to be named to four or more All-Star teams.

DERBY DAY: Alonso will participate in the 2024 Home Run Derby...A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffey Jr.)... He will be the sixth player to compete in the HR Derby at least five times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six) and Albert Pujols (five).

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Brandon Sproat will represent the New York Mets at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game...Sproat, who was promoted to \#98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games ( 12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season...He is a combined 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (14 ER/73.2 IP) with 28 walks and 85 strikeouts...In eight starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (11 ER/48.1IP) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts...The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington.

MEET THE METS: Following a loss on May 29, the Mets have played 38 games, going 26-12 in that span...Their 26 wins are tied for the most in the majors, as is their . 684 winning percentage...The Mets have hit .276/.344/.495 in that period with 88 doubles, eight, 61 home runs, 122 walks and an .839 OPS...They have outscored their opponents 226-177 during those 38 games...Their 226 runs are the most in the majors in that span, as is their 5.95 runs/game.

## BUTTO NEWS \& NOTES

LAST START: Allowed two runs over 5.2 innings on July 8 vs. Pittsburgh at PNC Park and recorded a no decision...Allowed one hit, issued one walk and recorded three strikeouts.

DOWN AT THE FARM: Since he returned to Triple-A, Scott made four starts with the Syracuse Mets, posting a 2.12 ERA (4ER/17.0 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...All together in nine starts at Triple-A, Scott is $3-0$ with a 2.76 ERA ( $13 \mathrm{ER} / 42.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 12 walks and 55 strikeouts.

WHAT A DEBUT: Christian Scott made his major league debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay...He recorded a no decision in the Mets 3-1 loss, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts... He became the third Mets player to make his major league debut this year... Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.

SIZZLING IN SYRACUSE: At the time of his first call up, was 3-0 with a 3.20 ERA (9ER/25.1 IP) at Syracuse...Has made five starts, allowing six walks and striking out 36...Led the International League in WHIP (0.71) and batting average against (.136), while placing fourth in strikeouts (36) and ninth in ERA (3.20).

23 AND ME: Named the New York Mets 2023 Pitcher of the Year after making 19 starts this across three levels season and posting a 5-4 record with a 2.57 ERA ( 25 ER/87.2 IP) with 12 walks and 107 strikeouts.

HE'S GOT PROSPECTS: Entered the 2024 season as the 99th best prospect in the minors by ESPN.

SLIDE TO THE RIGHT: While seeking a third pitch, looked at Pitching Ninja video and discovered the slider grip used by Max Scherzer...It's still the grip he uses today...Was predominately a reliever throughout his career at the University of Florida and transitioned to a starting role after he was selected by the Mets.

MINOR LEAGUE BACKGROUND: In 2023, held opposing hitters to a .199 batting average and posted 10.98 strikeouts per nine innings...Started for the Rumble Ponies in Game One of the Northeast Division Series...In 2022, he split his time between A St. Lucie and A+ Brooklyn with a combined 4.45 ERA in 18 appearances...In 2021, he had three relief outings for FCL Mets and threw 12 strikes out of 16 total pitches.

LAST TIME OUT: Took the bump on July 9 vs. Washington...Earned the win, hurling 7.0 innings and allowing only one hit, one walk and struck out five...The Mets earned a $7-5$ victory.

ON A ROLL: Since allowing eight runs on May 3, Quintana has made 11 starts, going 3-2 with a 3.13 ERA ( 21 ER/60.1 IP) with 17 walks and 46 strikeouts...Over his last five starts, Quintana is $3-0$ with a 0.89 ERA ( $3 \mathrm{ER} / 30.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 10 walks and 27 strikeouts.

JUNE BLOOM: Quintana made five starts in June and went 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (9 ER/24.0 IP) with 11 walks and 26 strikeouts...The Mets went 4-1 in those starts.

- Launched a two-run homer in the 10th on July 2 at Washington...Has five career home runs in extra-innings tied with Kevin McReynolds for second-most in Mets history...Only Howard Johnson (Nine) has more.
- Laced a game-winning double in the ninth on June 18 at Texas...Has 79 game-winning RBI, fifth-most in franchise history.
- Has 547 RBI, seventh-most in franchise history....Carlos Beltrán (559) is next.
- Picked up his second three-hit game of the season on June 17 vs . Texas (Also: 4/13 vs. Kansas City...Has 28 multi-hit games, ninth-most in the NL and tied for 15thmost in the majors.
- Went 2-5 with a two-runhomer and a two-run single on June 16 vs . San Diego...Was his ninth career five-RBI game, the second-most such games in franchise history behind David Wright (10)...Are the second-most such games since 2019 behind only Nelson Cruz (10).
- Has 10 home runs and 17 doubles over his last 55 games dating to May 7...His 17 doubles during that span are tied for the fifth -most in the majors, while his 27 extrabase hits during that span are tied for the 14th-most in the majors.
- Is sixth in the NL and tied for 15th in the majors with 18 home runs...Also ranks tied for ninth in the NL in doubles (21), tied for ninth in extra-base hits (39) and tied for 15th in total bases (159).

- Hit safely in a career-best 10 straight games from June 15-28...Batted .515/.595/.939 with three home runs, five doubles, 10 RBI and seven runs during the stretch...Was the longest hitting streak by a Mets catcher since Wilson Ramos' 26-game hitting streak from August 3-September 3, 2023.
- Went 2-5 with a go-ahead double in the sixth and an RBI triple in the 10th...Was his first career triple.
- Posted a 1.123 OPS in June...Is the highest OPS by a catcher younger than 23 in a month (Min. 50 Plate Appearances) since Johnny Bench in June 1970 (1.208)... Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.
- Went 3-3 with a home run, a double, a walk, three RBI and three runs on June 26 vs. Yankees.... Was the third time in his career reaching base four times in a game.
- Has 30 home runs, the fourth-most by a catcher before turning 23....The only catchers with more homers prior to turning 23 are Johnny Bench (87), Iván Rodríguez (37) and Darrell Porter (31).
- Is batting .346/.429/.577 with 15 RBI and 11 extra-base hits in 26 games since returning from the IL on June 11...His 1.006 OPS during that span is the 11 th-best in the NL and the 16th-best in the majors during that span (Min. 75 Plate Appearances).
- Recorded a game-tying two-run double in the eighth on June 18 at Texas as part of a three-hit night....Went 3-5 with two RBI on June 17 vs. Texas...Is the first Mets catcher with back-to-back three-hit games since Paul Lo Duca (4/4-4/6/07) and the first catcher age 22 or younger with back-to-back three-hit performances since Salvador Perez (9/17-9/20/11).
