OPENING DAY RECAP: The Orioles opened their 72nd season in Baltimore by beating the Blue Jays, 12-2, at Rogers Centre.

♫ The O's improved to 47-25 all time on Opening Day; the .653 winning percentage in the first game of the season since the team moved in 1954 is the best in the majors during that time.

♫ Baltimore has won the last three Opening Days by a combined score of 33-14; the Orioles' streak of scoring at least 10 runs in the first game of the year ties the MLB record, held by the Cincinnati Reds (1893-95) and Milwaukee Brewers (1994-96), per the *Elias Sports Bureau*.

♫ The team's six home runs are a franchise record on Opening Day; the O's six homers are tied for the second most on Opening Day in MLB history, trailing only the eight by the Los Angeles Dodgers on March 28, 2019 vs. Arizona.

♫ **Tyler O'Neill** homered in the third inning to extend his MLB record by going deep in his sixth consecutive Opening Day; the previous record was four held by three players.

♫ O'Neill is the first Canadian to homer on Opening Day in his home country.

♫ **Cedric Mullins** and **Adley Rutschman** both hit two home runs, tying the most on Opening Day in team history; entering yesterday, only two Orioles in franchise history had multi-homer games on Opening Day: **Sam Horn** on April 9, 1990 at Kansas City and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Brooks Robinson** on April 6, 1973 vs. Milwaukee.

♫ Mullins set a career high with five RBI and joined Horn (6 RBI, 4/9/90) as the only players in club history (since 1954) with 5+ RBI on Opening Day...Rutschman joined Don Baylor as the only players in MLB since 1900 to have 10 total hits in their first three career Opening Day games (*Elias Sports Bureau*).

UNCLE CHARLIE: **Charlie Morton** makes his Orioles debut tonight...At 41 years, 136 days, he will become the first pitcher to start for Baltimore over the age of 40 (since 1954)...The only pitcher older than Morton to pitch for the O's since the team moved in 1954 is reliever Jesse Orosco, who made his last appearance for the club at 42 years, 160 days on September 29, 1999 vs. New York-AL.

OPENING STATEMENTS: The starting rotation for the O's finished with a 3.77 ERA (369 ER/881.1 IP) in 2024, ranking fifth in MLB behind the Mariners (3.38), Royals (3.55), Braves (3.58), and Tigers (3.69)...That marked the second-best rotation ERA by the Birds since 1985, behind 2014 (3.61).

♫ O's starting pitchers compiled a 3.64 ERA (177 ER/437.1 IP) away from Oriole Park last year, the best road mark by the team's starters since 1976 (3.23).

ROAD WARRIORS: Baltimore finished last season 47-34 on the road (.580), the third-best winning percentage away from home in the majors behind the New York Yankees (.617, 50-31) and San Diego Padres (.593, 48-33)...Since the start of 2023, the Orioles are 100-63 (.613) in road games, the best mark in MLB.

BATTLE OF THE BIRDS: The O's and Blue Jays meet at Rogers Centre for a four-game series to open the 2025 campaign...Baltimore won't return to Toronto until September 12-14, while the clubs meet in a pair of three-game sets at Oriole Park at Camden Yards from April 11-13 and July 28-30.

♫ The O's went 7-6 against the Blue Jays last season, their second consecutive winning season against Toronto; Baltimore has won back-to-back season series against the Jays for only the second time since 1997, joining 2012 (11-7), 2013 (10-9), and 2014 (11-8).

♫ **Adley Rutschman's** 1.024 OPS against the Blue Jays is the second best among active players behind only Los Angeles-AL's Mike Trout (1.032); after yesterday, Rutschman has three career multi-homer games, all against Toronto.

2024 RECAP: Baltimore went 91-71, securing the first Wild Card spot in the AL and finishing 3.0 games behind New York in the AL East...The O's have made the Postseason in back-to-back years for the fourth time in franchise history and for the first time since 1996-97...With another playoff trip this season, they would match the longest streak in franchise history set from 1969-71...The Orioles were swept in two games in the AL Wild Card Series with Kansas City.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN: The Orioles started the season with 13 position players and 13 pitchers on the active roster...Five players made their first career Opening Day roster: **Heston Kjerstad**, **Jackson Holliday**, **Cade Povich**, **Albert Suárez**, and **Tomoyuki Sugano**...Twelve of the 26 players were on Baltimore's Opening Day roster in 2024, while five players will be making or have made their O's debut: **Ramón Laureano**, **Charlie Morton**, **Tyler O'Neill**, **Gary Sánchez**, and **Sugano**...Seven players were placed the Injured List: **Gunnar Henderson** (right intercostal strain) on the 10-day, retroactive to March 24, **Andrew Kittredge** (left knee debridement), **Chayce McDermott** (right lat strain), **Grayson Rodriguez** (right elbow inflammation), and **Trevor Rogers** (right knee subluxation) on the 15-day, retroactive to March 24, and **Kyle Bradish** (right elbow UCL surgery) and **Tyler Wells** (right elbow UCL surgery) on the 60-day.

THE SKIPPER: Manager **Brandon Hyde** enters his seventh season in Baltimore...The 2023 AL Manager of the Year earned his 400th career win on September 19 last season...He earned his 407th win as a manager yesterday, tying **Hank Bauer** for fourth in team history...Hyde trails **Earl Weaver** (1,480), **Buck Showalter** (669), and **Paul Richards** (517).

GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE RECAP: Baltimore finished the Grapefruit League season 13-14-2, including 5-8-1 at home and 8-6-1 on the road...The club's exhibition game on Monday in Washington, DC was canceled due to inclement weather...The team drew 100,156 fans during 14 dates at Ed Smith Stadium, which does not include 6,680 people who attended the Spring Breakout game on March 15...The 7,154 average spring attendance was the team's best since 2017 (7,223).

♫ In the penultimate Spring Training game on March 22 at Pittsburgh, seven pitchers combined to throw the first spring no-hitter by the O's since the team moved to Baltimore in 1954; it was the second spring no-hitter in MLB since 2018, along with the Chicago Cubs on March 3, 2023 at San Diego.
