**OPENING DAY RECAP**: The Orioles opened their 72<sup>nd</sup> season in Baltimore by beating the Blue Jays. 12-2. at Rogers Centre.

- The O's improved to 47-25 all time on Opening Day; the .653 winning percentage in the first game of the season since the team moved in 1954 is the best in the majors during that time.
- 8 Baltimore has won the last three Opening Days by a combined score of 33-14; the Orioles' streak of scoring at least 10 runs in the first game of the year ties the MLB record, held by the Cincinnati Reds (1893-95) and Milwaukee Brewers (1994-96), per the Elias Sports Bureau.
- (b) The team's six home runs are a franchise record on Opening Day; the O's six homers are tied for the second most on Opening Day in MLB history, trailing only the eight by the Los Angeles Dodgers on March 28, 2019 vs. Arizona.
- 7) Tyler O'Neill homered in the third inning to extend his MLB record by going deep in his sixth consecutive Opening Day; the previous record was four held by three players.
- O'Neill is the first Canadian to homer on Opening Day in his home country.
   Cedric Mullins and Adley Rutschman both hit two home runs, tying the most on Opening Day in team history; entering yesterday, only two Orioles in franchise history had multi-homer games on Opening Day: Sam Horn on April 9, 1990 at Kansas City and
- National Baseball Hall of Famer **Brooks Robinson** on April 6, 1973 vs. Milwaukee.

  Mullins set a career high with five RBI and joined Horn (6 RBI, 4/9/90) as the only players in club history (since 1954) with 5+ RBI on Opening Day...Rutschman joined Don Baylor as the only players in MLB since 1900 to have 10 total hits in their first three career Opening Day games (*Elias Sports Bureau*).

<u>UNCLE CHARLIE</u>: Charlie Morton makes his Orioles debut tonight...At 41 years, 136 days, he will become the first pitcher to start for Baltimore over the age of 40 (since 1954)...The only pitcher older than Morton to pitch for the O's since the team moved in 1954 is reliever Jesse Orosco, who made his last appearance for the club at 42 years, 160 days on September 29, 1999 vs. New York-AL.

**OPENING STATEMENTS**: The starting rotation for the O's finished with a 3.77 ERA (369 ER/881.1 IP) in 2024, ranking fifth in MLB behind the Mariners (3.38), Royals (3.55), Braves (3.58), and Tigers (3.69)...That marked the second-best rotation ERA by the Birds since 1985, behind 2014 (3.61).

(17 ER/437.1 IP) away from Oriole Park last year, the best road mark by the team's starters since 1976 (3.23).

**ROAD WARRIORS**: Baltimore finished last season 47-34 on the road (.580), the third-best winning percentage away from home in the majors behind the New York Yankees (.617, 50-31) and San Diego Padres (.593, 48-33)...Since the start of 2023, the Orioles are 100-63 (.613) in road games, the best mark in MLB.

**BATTLE OF THE BIRDS**: The O's and Blue Jays meet at Rogers Centre for a four-game series to open the 2025 campaign...Baltimore won't return to Toronto until September 12-14, while the clubs meet in a pair of three-game sets at Oriole Park at Camden Yards from April 11-13 and July 28-30.

- The O's went 7-6 against the Blue Jays last season, their second consecutive winning season against Toronto; Baltimore has won back-to-back season series against the Jays for only the second time since 1997, joining 2012 (11-7), 2013 (10-9), and 2014 (11-8).
   Adley Rutschman's 1.024 OPS against the Blue Jays is the second best among active
- Adley Rutschman's 1.024 OPS against the Blue Jays is the second best among active players behind only Los Angeles-AL's Mike Trout (1.032); after yesterday, Rutschman has three career multi-homer games, all against Toronto.

**2024 RECAP**: Baltimore went 91-71, securing the first Wild Card spot in the AL and finishing 3.0 games behind New York in the AL East...The O's have made the Postseason in back-to-back years for the fourth time in franchise history and for the first time since 1996-97...With another playoff trip this season, they would match the longest streak in franchise history set from 1969-71...The Orioles were swept in two games in the AL Wild Card Series with Kansas City.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN: The Orioles started the season with 13 position players and 13 pitchers on the active roster...Five players made their first career Opening Day roster: Heston Kjerstad, Jackson Holliday, Cade Povich, Albert Suárez, and Tomoyuki Sugano...Twelve of the 26 players were on Baltimore's Opening Day roster in 2024, while five players will be making or have made their O's debut: Ramón Laureano, Charlie Morton, Tyler O'Neill, Gary Sánchez, and Sugano... Seven players were placed the Injured List: Gunnar Henderson (right intercostal strain) on the 10-day, retroactive to March 24, Andrew Kittredge (left knee debridement), Chayce McDermott (right lat strain), Grayson Rodriguez (right elbow inflammation), and Trevor Rogers (right knee subluxation) on the 15-day, retroactive to March 24, and Kyle Bradish (right elbow UCL surgery) and Tyler Wells (right elbow UCL surgery) on the 60-day.

<u>THE SKIPPER</u>: Manager Brandon Hyde enters his seventh season in Baltimore...The 2023 AL Manager of the Year earned his 400<sup>th</sup> career win on September 19 last season...He earned his 407<sup>th</sup> win as a manager yesterday, tying **Hank Bauer** for fourth in team history...Hyde trails **Earl Weaver** (1,480), **Buck Showalter** (669), and **Paul Richards** (517).

**GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE RECAP**: Baltimore finished the Grapefruit League season 13-14-2, including 5-8-1 at home and 8-6-1 on the road...The club's exhibition game on Monday in Washington, DC was canceled due to inclement weather...The team drew 100,156 fans during 14 dates at Ed Smith Stadium, which does not include 6,680 people who attended the Spring Breakout game on March 15...The 7,154 average spring attendance was the team's best since 2017 (7,223).

(b) In the penultimate Spring Training game on March 22 at Pittsburgh, seven pitchers combined to throw the first spring no-hitter by the O's since the team moved to Baltimore in 1954; it was the second spring no-hitter in MLB since 2018, along with the Chicago Cubs on March 3, 2023 at San Diego.

QUICK HITS: Morton is set to make his Baltimore debut and toe the rubber for his 18th major league season tonight in Toronto...Made four Grapefruit League starts, recording a 3.38 ERA (3 ER/8.0 IP) on nine hits and one walk with six strikeouts... Signed a one-year contract with the Orioles on January 3, 2025...Made 30 starts with the Braves in 2024, going 8-10 with a 4.19 ERA (77 ER/165.1 IP) on 154 hits (23 HR), 85 total runs, 65 walks, and 18 hit batters with 167 strikeouts...Was on Atlanta's NLWC roster, but did not appear in a game.

NORTH OF THE BORDER: He has made nine career starts opposite Toronto, going 2-2 with a 4.01 ERA (23 ER/51.2 IP) on 50 hits (4 HR), 16 walks, and five hit batters with 60 strikeouts...Is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP) on eight hits (1 HR), five walks, and two hit batters with seven strikeouts in two career starts at Rogers Centre.

Oh In 53 career starts against AL East opponents, he is 23-13 with a 3.75 ERA (122)

ER/292.2 IP) on 255 hits (30 HR), 101 walks, and 22 hit batters with 348 strikeouts.

LIKE FINE WINE: Tonight, at 41 years and 136 days old, Morton will become the oldest pitcher in franchise history to start a game for the Orioles, surpassing Orlando Peña (39y, 177d) on May 13, 1973-G1 at New York-AL...the oldest pitcher to ever appear in a game in club history is Jesse Orosco (42y, 160d) on September 28, 1999 at New York-AL. His 167 strikeouts were the most by an Atlanta pitcher age 40 or older since Phil Niekro in 1980 (176).

MODEL OF CONSISTENCY: Morton has made 30+ starts in each of his last six full seasons (excluding 2020) since 2018...He joins TOR's José Berríos, TEX's Patrick Corbin, and PHI's Aaron Nola as the only pitchers in MLB to accomplish the feat during that stretch...Morton had not reached the 30-start mark in each of his first 12 seasons from 2008-19.

(2017), Last season, he became the fifth player in Braves franchise history to make 30 starts in his age 40 season or older, joining R.A. Dickey (2017), Phil Niekro (1979-80, 82-83), John Smoltz (2007), and Warren Spahn (1961-63).

ABOVE THE CURVE: In 2024, Morton utilized his curveball 42.2 percent of the time, limiting opponents to a .200 (55-for-275) average on the offering while producing a 34.2 percent whiff rate...Of his 167 strikeouts last season, 102 came on the curveball (61.1%).

He held left handed hitters to a .181 (26-for-144) clip against the curveball with 62 strikeouts, compared to .221 (29-for-131) with 40 strikeouts against right handers.

MERRY-GO-ROUND: Morton has issued multiple walks in eight straight starts dating to August 18, 2024, tied for the second-longest streak of his career (also 6/9-7/25/18). he had a career-long 10-game stretch with multiple walks from 7/18-9/11/09.

IT'S A MARATHON: Last season, opponents slashed .272/.371/.491 (62-for-228) with 16 doubles, two triples, 10 home runs and 27 walks against Morton from innings 1-2... from innings 3-5, however, he limited the opposition to a .230/.314/.390 (69-for-300) line with 15 doubles, 11 home runs, and 29 walks.

UP'S AND DOWN'S: Morton's 3.97 run support average in 2024 was sixth lowest in MLB (min. 120.0 IP) behind PIT's Luis Ortiz (3.32), PIT's Jared Jones (3.48), WSH's Patrick Corbin (3.50), CIN's Hunter Greene (3.89), and STL's Andre Pallante (3.93).

① Under the same parameter, Morton's 6.72 run support average in 2023 was third highest in the major behind SD's Michael Wacha (7.50) and CHC's Drew Smyly (6.83).

- 6 Since 2023, Morton is 19-4 with a 3.18 ERA (64 ER/181.1 IP) when receiving three runs or more of support, compared to 3-18 with a 4.83 ERA (79 ER/147.1 IP) when receiving two runs or fewer.

CHECKING THE BOXES: Last season, Morton earned the victory on June 28 vs. Pittsburgh, giving him a win against all 30 teams; became the 22<sup>nd</sup> pitcher to accomplish the feat since baseball's most recent expansion in 1998, and one of four active players (TOR's Max Scherzer, NYY's Gerrit Cole, and SF's Justin Verlander) to do so.


