Road Work Ahead

The Brewers (3-1) are currently playing their second season-long 10-game road trip as they are visiting Cleveland (2-1), New York-NL (1-0) and Pittsburgh (3g)....the team went 7-3 on its last 10-game road trip to Arizona (1-2), San Diego (3-1) and Seattle (3-0) from April 10-19.

Beat The Mets

The Brewers have won their last 5 games against the Mets, including 4-0 this season....they have outscored the Mets, 35-7, during the 5-game streak.

Metsmerizing!

The Brewers allowed a season-low 3 hits last night for the fourth time....it was the second time this season that the team held the Mets to just 3 hits (also April 3)....the Brewers have held the Mets to a .167 AVG (21-for-126) and just 7 runs in 4 games in 2023.

I Think We've Met

Julio Teheran has made 28 career starts against the Mets, his most against any opponent....since 2011, Teheran and Gio Gonzalez have the most starts against the Metropolitanans.

Rebel Yeli

Since June 6, Christian Yelich has hit .348 (24-for-69) with 2 HR and 9 RBI in 18 games while he has produced a .430 OBP/.580 SLG/1.010 OPS.

Take Me To Your Leader

Christian Yelich is the team leader in runs (52 - 9th in NL), hits (76), walks (38 - T10th in NL), SB (17 - T5th in NL), doubles (15), total bases (120), extra-base hits (25), OBP (.367), SLG (.432) and OPS (.799) and tied for the team lead in RBI (34).

Perk Up

Rookie Blake Perkins is batting .361 (13-for-36) with 2 HR and 10 RBI in 16 games since he was recalled from Triple-A Nashville on June 3....he hit just .083 (1-for-12, 0hr, 0rbi) in his first stint with the team (4/19-4/30).

It's Milner Time!

Hoby Milner is unscored upon in each of his last 15 appearances (13ip) to lower his ERA from 4.50 to 2.61.

Four Goodness Sake!

The Brewers are a Major League-best 36-6 (.857) when scoring 4+ runs.

One and Done

The Brewers are 13-4 (.765) in 1-run games....the Marlins (19-5, .792) are the only MLB team with a better mark.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is game 5 (3-1) of a 10-game trip to Cleveland (2-1), New York-NL (1-0) and Pittsburgh (3g)....following this trip, the team returns to American Family Field for 7 games against Chicago-NL (4g) and Cincinnati (3g) leading into the All-Star break.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 22-18 at home, going 7-6-0 in series play....the Brewers went 46-35 at home last season, going 15-8-4 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 19-19 on the road, going 5-7-0 in series play....the team went 40-41 on the road last season, going 9-12-5 in series play.

MANAGER: Craig Counsell - the longest-tenured active manager in the National League and third in the majors - is in his ninth season as Brewers manager (656-592) and eighth full season....he has the most wins (656) and games managed (1,248) of any manager in franchise history....Counsell was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke....he is signed through the 2023 season.

COACHES: First base coach **Quintin Berry** (3rd season), hitting coach **Connor Dawson** (2nd season), bullpen coach **Jim Henderson** (2nd season), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (5th season), third base coach **Jason Lane** (8th season, 3rd as 3B coach), associate pitching, catching and strategy coach **Walker McKinven** (4th season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (8th season) and hitting coach **Ozzie Timmons** (2nd season) all returned from the 2022 staff....**Néstor Corredor**, who was bullpen catcher (2021-22), is now a coach.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 16 replay challenges this season, going 7-9....their last challenge (lost) came on 6/25 at Cleveland as an out call at first base on a pickoff attempt of Blake Perkins stood.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #49 - RHP JULIO TEHERAN (6gs, 2-2, 1.53)

TEHERAN AT A GLANCE: Julio Teheran, 32, will be making his seventh start.....he last started last Wednesday vs. Arizona and received no decision in the Brewers' 5-1 loss (5ip, 2h, 0r, 4bb, 3k, 1hbp, 88 pitches).....the team is 2-4 in his starts.....he has 4 quality starts.....opponents are batting .192 (23-for-120, 3hr).....the team has scored 11 runs in his 6 starts (1.8 rpg).....he signed with Milwaukee as a free agent on May 25 after opting out of his contract with San Diego on May 22.....after pitching in the Atlantic League and Mexican League last season, Teheran signed with San Diego in December as a non-roster invitee.....he went 4-2 with a 5.63 ERA in 8 starts at Triple-A El Paso this season (40ip, 51h, 26r, 25er, 16bb, 45k, 7hr).....he was born and resides in Cartagena, Colombia.....name is pronounced "teh-RON."

WELCOME BACK: Prior to his Brewers debut on 5/25 vs. San Francisco, Teheran had not pitched in the majors since a start and win with Detroit on 4/3/21 vs. Cleveland.

LAST SEASON: Teheran began his 2022 season with the Staten Island FerryHawks of the independent Atlantic League and went 1-1 with a 1.60 ERA in 6 starts.....he held opponents to a .198 batting average with 35 strikeouts in 33.2 innings.....he then pitched in the Mexican League for Toros de Tijuana (6gs) and Sultanes de Monterrey (1gs), going a combined 4-2 with a 4.41 ERA in 7 starts.....he had 35 strikeouts in 32.2 innings in the Mexican League.

CAREER: Is 80-79 with a 3.75 ERA in 246 games/242 starts (1431.2ip, 596er).....is in his 12th Major League season with Atlanta (2011-19), Los Angeles-AL (2020), Detroit (2021) and Milwaukee (2023).....the two-time All-Star (2014 and 2016) made 30+ starts in seven consecutive seasons from 2013-19.....he was the Braves' Opening Day starter in six straight seasons from 2014-19.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 1-3 with a 2.34 ERA in 7 starts (42.1ip, 11er).....is 1-1 with a 1.57 ERA in 4 starts this season (23ip, 4er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 41-42 with a 3.90 ERA in 116 games/114 starts (677.2ip, 294er).....is 1-1 with a 1.46 ERA in 2 starts this season (12.1ip, 2er).

CAREER vs. METS: Is 10-9 with a 2.98 ERA in 29 games/28 starts (169.1ip, 56er), including 6-3 with a 2.40 ERA in 14 starts at Citi Field (82.1ip, 22er).
