### STREAKING

The Reds have won 4 of their last 5 games and 5 of their last 7 games...have **won consecutive series** (2-1 vs Pit, 2-1 vs Mil) after beginning **0-7-1** in their first 8 series, including a 4-game split at Atl to open the season...have **won consecutive series** for the first time since **3 straight series wins** from **7/23-8/1, 2021** (2-1 vs StL, 3-1 at Cubs, 2-1 at NYM).

### PLAYER OF THE WEEK CANDIDATE

Beginning Monday, **Tyler Stephenson** leads the National League in **hits** (9) and **RBI** (7, T1st) while ranking among the NL leaders in **total bases** (15, 2nd), **doubles** (3, T2nd), **runs** (5, T2nd), **OBP** (.529, 3rd), **OPS** (1.411, 3rd) and **slugging percentage** (.882, 4th).

### ROAD TRIPPED

Last night's 4-0 win here snapped the Reds' **13-game road losing streak**, their longest in a single season since an **0-19 road stretch** from **7/5-8/24, 1933**...it included series sweep losses at LA's **Dodger Stadium** (4g), SD's **Petco Park** (3g), Col's **Coors Field** (3g) and Mil's **American Family Field** (3g)...Cin's winless trip at LAD (4g) and SD (3g) was its first **winless road trip** of at least 7 games since **6/7-6/14, 2004** (0-3 at Oak, 0-3 at Cle, 0-1 at Phi).

### TRICYCLE

In Wed's 14-11 win, Brewers **OF Christian Yelich** hit for the **cycle** for the third time in his career, all against the Reds (8/29/18 at GABP, 9/17/18 at Mil)...is 1 of only 5 players in history to hit for the cycle 3 times in a career and the only player since 1901 to hit 3 cycles against the same opponent.

### DOUBLE, DOUBLE, DOUBLE, DOUBLE

**SS Kyle Farmer** on 4/27 vs SD tied the Major League record for **doubles in a game** with 4, accomplished many times and most recently by Pit's **Kevin Newman** on 8/14/21 vs Mil...**Farmer** is the first player with 4 doubles in a game at **Great American Ball Park**...was **Farmer's first career 4-hit game**...below are Reds batters who share the record:

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is **Game 2** (1-0) of an 11-day, 9-game, 3-city road trip to Pit's **PNC Park** (1-0), Cle's **Progressive Field** (off day, 2g) and Tor's **Rogers Centre** (off day, 3g)...is the Reds' longest road trip of the season by day...Cin lost its **last 4 road series** (0-4 at LAD, 0-3 at SD, 0-3 at Col, 0-3 at Mil)...the Redlegs are coming off a winning **4-2 homestand** vs the **Pirates** (2-1) and **Brewers** (2-1)...return to **Great American Ball Park** on **Mon, 5/23** to begin a 7-game homestand vs the **Cubs** (4g) and **Giants** (3g) that concludes with an **11:30 a.m. appearance on Peacock** (Sun, 5/29 vs SF).

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds are **11-23 at PNC Park** the **last 5 seasons**, including an **11-game losing streak** spanning **2018-2019** and an **8-game losing streak** to begin the 2019 season...are **23-10 vs Pit** over the last 3 seasons...including 3 series wins and 2 series sweeps last year, the Reds have won **20 of the last 27 games** vs the Pirates...4 times in 2021 the Reds beat the Pirates by 10 runs, a club record vs any opponent in a season...the **1945 Pirates** club was the National League's last team to beat an opponent 4 times in a season by at least 10 runs (Brooklyn).

**GUARDIANS UP NEXT:** Last season the Reds went **3-3 vs Cle**, their first record of at least .500 against the Indians since **2017** (2-2)...the Reds won or tied **12 of the first 23 Ohio Cup** season series, including **11 of the last 17** and 5 straight from **2006-2010**, but lost **5 of the last 7** season series.

**INTERLEAGUE NOTES:** On Tue night the Reds begin a stretch of **5 straight games vs American League teams** (2g at Cle, 3g at Tor)...beginning in **1997** are **176-241 all-time vs the AL**, at **.422 the lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team (Phi 29th, .442) and including **9-11 in 2021 & 0-2 this season** (0-2 vs Cle)...the Redlegs haven't produced a **winning record vs the American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **9 seasons** since then, the Reds are **61-101 vs AL teams** (.377).

### MINOR MATTERS:

- Class A Daytona **RHP Sam Benschoter** was named **Florida State League Pitcher of the Week** after throwing **5.0 hitless innings** in Sat's 5-0 win vs Jupiter (3bb, 6k)...he was signed as a non-drafted free agent in July 2021 out of Michigan State University.
- The Reds' minor league **Players of the Month for April** are Class A Dayton **LHP Andrew Abbott** (4g, 3gs, 3-0, 0.86, 21ip, 13h, 7bb, 35k) and Class AA Chattanooga **OF T.J. Hopkins** (22g, .259, 6 2b, 6hr, 22rbi, 5sb, .917ops)...**Abbott** was selected in the second round (53rd overall) of last summer's draft...**Hopkins** was selected in the ninth round of the 2019 draft.

### RED HOTS:

- Per @EliasSports, the Reds have played the toughest schedule in the Major Leagues...in games already played, their opponents have posted a winning percentage of **.560**...the winning percentage for the teams remaining on the Reds' schedule is **.510**, 11th-highest.
- Since a 2-2 series split at Atl to open the season the Reds are **6-22**, including a **1-20 stretch** bookended by losing streaks of **11 games** (4/12-4/23) and **9 games** (4/26-5/5).
- The Reds are **2-7-1 in 10 series** this season (2-3 home, 0-4-1 road) after winning each of their last 2 series...have been swept 6 times.
- **42 players** have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds this season...the club record for number of players in a season is **57** (2003).
- The Reds' current injured list includes **14 players**...began the season with **8 players** on the **injured list**, their highest total to begin a season since they began the **2014 campaign** with **8 players** on the **disabled list**...since **2022 Opening Day** have made **15 more additions** to the injured list for a season total of **23 IL stints**.
- The Reds' **11.5-game deficit** on **May 1** was their largest ever on that date.
- The Reds began the season **0-4 at Great American Ball Park**, their first **0-4 home start** since the **1955 club** began **0-4 at Crosley Field**.
- Over **11 games** and **99 innings** from **4/12-4/23** the Reds failed to hold a lead through the end of a full inning, including a **6-game, 54-inning stretch** from **4/12-4/17** in which they never led at any point.

**YOUNG GUNS:** The Reds' **Opening Day** roster included **3 pitchers** with **0.000 days** of service time (relievers **RHP Alexis Diaz** & **RHP Daniel Duarte**, starter **RHP Hunter Greene**) and **9 pitchers** with **less than 1.000 year** of service time...a fourth pitcher with no service time, **LHP Nick Lodolo**, replaced **Duarte** when **Lodolo** was promoted to start on **4/12 vs Cle**...in **LHP Reiver Sanmartin** (Game 2, 3rd Major League start), **Greene** (Game 4, ML debut) and **Lodolo** (Game 6, ML debut), the Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the **first 6 games of a season** for only the **second time in their history**...the **1902 Reds staff** used 3 rookie starting pitchers in their first 5 games, and 4 of their first 6 games that season were started by rookie pitchers...courtesy @EliasSports.

**THE SKIPPER...:** **David Bell** is in his fourth season as a Major League manager...on **9/22 of last season**, the club announced Bell's **2-year contract extension** through the **2023 season**.

# Tonight's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

- Last name rhymes with rally.
- In Sun's 7-3 win vs Pit allowed only 1 hit, a 2-run HR by Michael Perez in the second inning...left trailing, 2-0, while Pirates starter Zach Thompson held Reds batters to 2 singles through the fifth inning.
- A scoring change from his start on 4/12 vs Cle added 3 earned runs to his totals.
- Made the first Opening Day start of his career and earned the 6-3 win at Atl.
- In the 6-3 loss on 5/3 at Mil made the 100th start of his Major League career.
- At just 27 years old, earned a spot on his fifth consecutive Opening Day roster and is in his sixth Major League season.
- In 2021, Tyler Mahle and Luis Castillo were 2 of just 7 pitchers, and the only teammates, to lead the Major Leagues in starts (Sandy Alcantara, Walker Buehler, Kevin Gausman, Charlie Morton, Marcus Stroman).
- In 2021, established single-season career highs in wins, starts, quality starts (12), innings pitched, strikeouts and batters faced (759).
- In 2021, had 13 wins after entering his fifth season with 13 victories in his career.
- In 2021, ranked among the National League pitching leaders in starts (T1st), wins (T10th), ERA (16th), strikeouts (9th) and strikeouts per 9 innings (7th, 10.50).
- In 2021, his strikeouts-per-9 innings ratio of 10.50 was third-best in franchise history behind teammates Luis Castillo (10.67 in 2019) and Sonny Gray (10.52 in 2019).
- In 2021, became only the 13th pitcher in Reds history to record 200 strikeouts in a season.

# Tomorrow's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

- In 2021 made 28 starts, including 2 starts at 1B (8/1 at NYM, 9/29 at WSox), 5 starts at 2B (last, 10/2 at Pit), 2 starts at 3B (last, 5/29 at Cubs), 18 starts in LF (last, 10/3 at Pit) and 1 start in RF (8/3 vs Min)...were his first Major League apps in the outfield.
- In 2021 as a pinch hitter went 7-for-17 (.412, 1 2b, 1 3b, 2rbi, .474obp, .588slg).

### Injured List

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- On 5/4 went on the injured list for the second time this season...from 4/13-4/18 missed 6 games and spent 2 days on the injured list (4/16-4/17).
- In his last 9 apps is hitting .296 (8-27, 2 2b, 1hr, 2rbi), including three 2-hit games.
- 3 times this season and 9 times in his career reached first base on catcher's interference (4/9 at Atl, C William Contreras & 4/26 vs SD, C Austin Nola)...in the expansion era (since 1961), ranks second among Reds batters behind Pete Rose, who reached 19 times on catcher's interference.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall) of the June 2016 first-year player draft...was rated the best pure hitter in that draft.
- For 2 consecutive seasons (2018, 2019) was rated by *Baseball America* and MLB.com's MLB Pipeline the best overall prospect in the organization.
- In 2021, didn't play for the Reds after 5/17...missed the last 123 games of the season with a left knee injury that led to arthroscopic surgery on 5/28 to clean out cartilage on the undersurface of the patella.
