STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays begin a six-game homestand against the Padres (three to play) and Mets (three to play) tonight, their shortest homestand since June 8-10 vs. BOS...have won three of their last four games after losing seven of their previous nine contests (Aug. 14-22), which came on the heels of a season-high-tying nine-game winning streak (Aug. 3-12)...are tied with the Padres and Red Sox for MLB's best record since July 20 at 23-12 (.657)...have the hardest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .513...have spent 102 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 62 consecutive days in first place (June 27-pres)...only the Dodgers (149), Braves (147), and Brewers (117) have spent more time leading their divisions...have held the AL's best record for 101 days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), according to Stats Perform.

- ★ The Rays earned the series win in Detroit with a 3-0 victory on Wednesday...it marked the Rays 12th shutout victory, tied for third most in the AL and tied for fifth in the majors...the 12 shutout wins are their most since 2024 (also 12)...the last time they had 13 or more in a season was 2023 (14).
- ★ Rays pitchers allowed two baserunners in the contest, marking the 10th game in franchise history they have permitted two baserunners or fewer (last: Sept. 19, 2024 vs. BOS - 1BR) and the fourth such game on the road (last: Aug. 20, 2015 at HOU - 2BR)...see more notes in "The Armory" note below.
- ★ With 15 wins in August, the Rays have secured their fifth straight month with a winning record...it marks the second time in franchise history the club has begun a season with five straight winning months, joining 2008...the 2008 Rays went 13-14 in September.
- ★ The Rays scored first for the fifth straight game and have plated the opening run in 25 of their last 38 games (July 17 [G2]-pres)...they have held a lead in each of their last three losses, tied for their second-longest streak this season (also: July 17 [G2]-19) behind March 26-April 3 (5G).
- ★ They halted a three-game losing streak in rubber matches, earning their first such win since June 21 vs. WSH and first on the road since May 10 at BOS.
- ★ Snapped a season-high, three-series skid and secured their first series victory since Aug. 10-12 at ATH.
- ★ Improved to 11-6-3 over their last 19 sets (June 19-pres)...they earned their fifth series victory in their last six road sets (July 20-pres) and have gone 15-4 (or better) in a span of 19 road games for the first time since July 23-Sept. 7, 2021 (15-4).
- ★ Rays baserunners have been caught stealing on each of their last six attempts, tied for the longest streak in franchise history (also: Aug. 28-Sept. 7, 2002)...they had been caught stealing in five straight games (Aug. 21-25) before the streak ended on Wednesday, tied for the third-longest streak in team history.

THE ARMORY—Rays pitchers have yielded nine runs in the last five games (1.43 ERA/44.0IP, 7ER) on the heels of a season-high streak of six straight games permitting five runs or more (Aug. 16-21), which was their longest since May 19-25, 2024 (also 6G)...opponents are slashing .158/173/.266 (25-for-158) in that span with 39 strikeouts against two walks, and Rays pitchers have produced a 0.61 WHIP.

- ★ The Rays have issued no walks in back-to-back games for the 23rd time in team history (last: 2G, July 7-8, 2026) and three of their last four games...their 16 such games this season pace the majors...they have recorded one or zero walks in six straight games, the third-longest streak in franchise history, one game shy of their franchise-record streaks from June 26-July 3, 2026 and May 25-31, 2025...their three walks allowed over their last six games are the fewest in club history over any six-game span.
- ★ Over their last five games (Aug. 22-pres.), Rays starting pitchers have turned in a 0.36 ERA (25.1IP, 1ER) with a .128 (11-for-86) opp. average, .311 opp. OPS, and 20 strikeouts to one walk...it marks the third time this season they have gone five straight starts with one or zero runs allowed (also: July 22-26 & May 19-25), after doing so four times over the previous three seasons (2023-25).
- ★ Rays pitchers have combined to allow nine baserunners or fewer in each of their last five games, tied for the third-longest streak in team history, one game shy of the second-longest streak (May 25-30, 2025) and three games behind the franchise record of eight games from earlier this season (June 25-July 3, 2026).

THE CHAN, THE MYTH, THE LEGEND—Since breaking out of a 3-for-44 skid (May 30-June 17), **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 46 of his last 56 games (June 19-pres.), pacing the majors in average (.366), hits (78), multi-hit games (25, 11st with PIT **Nick Gonzales**), and steals (21) over that timeframe—CLE **Steven Kwan** (.348) is the only other player batting .330 or better in that span...the .366 average is the best any Ray across a 56-game span within a single season (min. 150AB) since **Jason Bartlett** (.370) from April 8-June 29, 2009...on the year, Simpson leads the AL with 45 multi-hit games, ahead of HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (44G)—he could join **Yandy Diaz** (2025, 11st) as the only Rays to pace the AL in the category...Simpson leads the majors in infied hits (54: Baseball Savant) and bunt hits (14) and is tied for the AL lead in triples (6)...he owns the majors' second-lowest strikeout rate (8.3%) and third-lowest whiff rate (10.3%).

- ★ Simpson (.308) is 11 points behind Alvarez (.319) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Diaz** (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he has previously won an NCAA Division I batting title at Georgia Tech in 2022 (.433) and a Minor League Baseball batting crown in 2024 (.355)...Simpson and Diaz (.301) are on pace to become the third pair of qualified Rays teammates to both bat .300 or better—they would join Bartlett (.320)/**Carl Crawford** (.305) in 2009 and Crawford (.315)/**B.J. Upton** (.300) in 2007.
- ★ With 79 SB, Simpson is one steal shy of becoming the 30th player in the modern era (since 1900) to swipe 80 SB across their first two major league seasons...he would join CIN **Elly De La Cruz** (2023-24, 102SB) and SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (2001-02, 87SB) as the only players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to turn the trick.

NO HICK-UPS—**Liam Hicks** has hit safely in four straight games (Aug. 22-pres.), tied for the fourth-longest streak of his career (5x, last: July 11-18, 2026), two games behind his third-longest streak between (6G, May 6-19, 2025)...in 18 games since joining the Rays on Aug. 3, he has slashed .309/.426/.545 (17-for-55) with 4 2B, 3 HR, 11 RBI, and a .972 OPS...he is the fourth player in team history to have a .970 OPS or better and double-digit walks (10) through their first 18 games with the franchise, joining **Jake Bauers** (June 7-25, 2018 - .978 OPS, 13BB), **Carlos Peña** (April 6-25, 2012 - .977 OPS, 12BB), and **José Canseco** (April 5-23, 1999 - 1.064 OPS, 11BB).

- ★ Dating back to Hicks' debut (Aug. 4), Rays clean-up hitters lead the majors in OPS (.984) and are second in on-base pct. (.402) to the Diamondbacks (.415)...entering that span, they ranked 11th and 13th, respectively, in those categories (.756 OPS, .324 OBP).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** converted his 27th consecutive save opportunity on Mon. at DET, extending the longest streak in franchise history...it marks the majors' second-longest streak this season behind SD **Mason Miller's** 28-save run (March 28-July 29) and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since CLE **Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20-Sept. 25, 2024...his MLB-leading 38 saves are seventh most in a season in team history, including the most since **Alex Colomé** had 47 in 2017...his 38 saves are more than 20 clubs have had as a team this season...Baker is on pace for 46 saves, which would mark the third most by a Ray behind **Fernando Rodney** (48) in 2012 and Colomé (47) in 2017...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point after the calendar flips to August, joining Colomé (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernández** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform...with four games to play, Baker is two saves shy of tying Colomé (40) in 2017 for the most in club history before the end of August.

FRIARS IN FLORIDA—The Rays begin their three-game set against the Padres tonight at Tropicana Field...the Rays swept the Padres in their three-game series at Petco Park last season (April 25-27), outscoring them 9-3 on the heels of dropping two straight series (2-4) from 2023-24...the Rays have won 14 of their last 19 games vs. San Diego dating back to 2010 and are 10-8 all-time when facing the club at Tropicana Field, including wins in eight of their last 10.

- ★ In the three-game set last season, **Chandler Simpson** went 6-for-11 (.545) with 1 RBI, 2 BB, and 2 R...the series extended his hitting streak to eight games (April 19-April 27, 2025) to begin his career, the fifth-longest streak to begin a career in team history...on April 27, 2025, he recorded his first career three-hit game.

COMPLEX SITUATION—Yesterday, Rookie-level All-Stars were announced with FCL Rays **INF Kleiver Chauran** and LHP **Jeremy Pilon** earning FCL All-Star honors...additionally, **Sean Smedley** was named Florida Complex League Manager of the Year after leading the team to a 37-20 (.649) record, a South Division title, and an appearance in the FCL Championship Series.

- ★ Chauran earned his All-Star nod a year after being named a DSL Mid-Season All-Star...in the FCL, the infielder slashed .285/.464/.400 (47-for-165) with 3 2B, 5 3B, 2 HR, 34 RBI, and 23 SB.
- ★ Pilon pitched in 12 games (seven starts) to a 3-3 record, 2.96 ERA (48.2IP, 16ER), a .233 (41-for-176) opp. average, and 59 strikeouts...the southpaw paced the FCL in strikeouts and had the second-best ERA...he was promoted to Class-A Charleston on Aug. 1.

TONIGHT’S START–Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his 23rd start of the season and 12th at home tonight...marks his 97th career start and 52nd at home...will mark his third start since being reinstated from the 15-day IL (left mid-back tightness) on Aug. 17, with each of his last two outings coming against the Orioles...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...the Cape Coral High School (Fla.) product was selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- ✦ Min. 100.0 IP, he ranks among AL leaders in opp. OPS (4th, .598), opp. SLG (4th, .317), home runs per 9.0 IP (5th, 0.67), and opp. average (8th, .209).
- ✦ With six strikeouts tonight, McClanahan will tie **Alex Cobb** (323SO) for the seventh-most strikeouts at Tropicana Field...**James Shields** leads the list with 709 punchouts.
- ✦ With a win tonight, he would become the second AL southpaw to earn double-digit wins this season, joining **CLE Parker Messick**...he is currently tied with **KC Noah Cameron**, **CLE Joey Cantillo**, **CWS Anthony Kay**, **BAL Trevor Rogers**, and **TB Ian Seymour** with nine victories...McClanahan would become the first Tampa Bay hurler to record double-digit wins in each of his first four major league campaigns.
- ✦ His 42 career wins are tied for sixth most in franchise history with **Blake Snell**, six shy of tying **Alex Cobb** (48) for fifth...min. 50 career starts, he owns the second-best winning pct. by any pitcher in Rays history (.656/42-22), 11 points behind **Drew Rasmussen** (.672/43-21).
- ✦ Across his last seven starts since July 1, he has logged a 3-1 record with a 2.67 ERA (33.2IP, 10ER), 26 strikeouts, 0.89 WHIP, and a .182 (22-for-121) opp. average...min 30.OIP in that time frame, he ranks highly among AL pitchers in WHIP (3rd) and opp. average (5th).
- ✦ When pitching for the first time through the lineup, he has limited batters to a .189 (35-for-185) clip, the eighth lowest among AL southpaws this season.

LAST TIME OUT–Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in a 3-2 extra-innings loss on Aug. 22 at BAL (5.OIP, 4H, OER, 5SO)...retired eight of his first 10 batters faced before allowing back-to-back singles to **Pete Alonso** and **Coby Mayo** in the 3rd inning...set down seven of his final eight batters faced, three via strikeout, before handing the ball to **Tyler Wells** to begin the 6th inning...has never been dealt a loss in 13 career starts against Baltimore (7-0).

- ✦ The start marked his eighth scoreless outing of the season, tied for the most scoreless outings among AL starters with rotation-mate **Drew Rasmussen**.
- ✦ He has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his last seven starts since July 1.

FRIAR FRIDAY–The southpaw has made one career appearance (one start) opposite the Padres, earning the win after spinning 6.2 innings of one-run ball on June 16, 2023 at Petco Park (W, 6.2IP, 3H, 1ER, 3BB, 5SO, HR)...tonight marks his first home outing against San Diego.

- ✦ Owns a career 2-0 record with a 1.65 ERA (16.1IP, 3ER) and .196 (11-for-56) opp. average in three appearances (all starts) against NL West competition.
- ✦ This season he has made six starts against NL foes, going 1-3 with a 4.55 ERA (27.2IP, 14ER), 28 strikeouts, and a .255 (27-for-106) opp. average...made his most recent start against an NL club on June 17 at LAD (3.2IP, 3H, 2ER, 5BB, 3SO).
- ✦ In Interleague games in his career, he is 9-4 with a 2.65 ERA (105.1IP, 31ER), 121 strikeouts, and a .222 (86-for-388) opp. average...his nine wins against the NL are tied for the fourth-most in franchise history with **Alex Cobb**, **Pete Fairbanks**, and **David Price**...win a win tonight, he would be tied for first with 10 wins with **Drew Rasmussen**, **James Shields**, and **Victor Zambrano**.

HOME IS HOME–McClanahan is 7-1 with a 2.32 ERA (54.1IP, 14ER), 48 strikeouts, and a .189 (37-for-196) opp. average across 11 starts at Tropicana Field this season...the Rays have won 10 of those 11 starts.

- ✦ Min. 50.0 IP in home starts, he ranks highly among AL arms with a 2.32 ERA (1st AL, 9th MLB) and 0.94 WHIP (4th AL, 8th MLB)...his .189 opp. average paces AL southpaws (min. 150AB) at home and ranks fourth in the majors behind **ATL Martín Pérez** (.173), **MIL Kyle Harrison** (.177), and **LAD Justin Wrobleski** (.181).
- ✦ Opponents have gone 5-for-37 (.135) against him with RISP in 11 starts at the Trop compared to 16-for-51 (.314) in 11 road starts.
- ✦ His 28 career wins at Tropicana Field are tied for third most in the venue’s history with **Scott Kazmir**, trailing **James Shields** (48) and **David Price** (37).
- ✦ Min. 40 career starts at Tropicana Field, his .757 winning pct. (28-9) is the highest mark in the venue’s history...under the same parameter, it is tied for the third-highest clip by a southpaw in any single venue before their age-30 season during the modern era (since 1900) with **LAD Julio Uriás** (.757 - Dodger Stadium), trailing **LAD Sandy Koufax** (.815 - Dodger Stadium) and **NY Yankees Ron Guidry** (.782 - Old Yankee Stadium).

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS–Left-handed hitters have gone 11-for-89 (.124) against McClanahan this season...min. 100 AB, the .124 opp. average vs. LHB paces the AL and is second in the majors behind **MIL Jacob Misorowski** (.116).

- ✦ He is allowing left-handed batters to reach base at a .220 clip, third among AL arms (min. 100AB), trailing teammate **Bryan Baker** (.213) and **CWS Trevor Richards** (.217) and ranking fifth in the majors.
- ✦ Both opp. average and opp. on-base pct. are the lowest marks against left-handers he has posted in a season in his career.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP NICK MARTINEZ (13-4, 2.93)

LAST TIME OUT–Picked up his third win of the month and 13th of the season in a 3-1 victory on Aug. 23 at BAL (W, 6.OIP, H, OER, 4SO)...marked his 12th quality start of the year and fifth scoreless outing...became the fourth Rays pitcher to make 25 starts or more in an age 35-or-older season (age as of June 30).

vs. PADRES–He is 1-4 with a 4.88 ERA (24.OIP, 13ER) in five career appearances (four starts) against San Diego...as a starter, he has pitched to a 4.94 ERA (23.2IP, 13ER), with his last start against the club coming on June 27, 2025 at Great American Ball Park (W, 8.OIP, H, ER, 2BB, 6SO), which tied for the second-longest start of his career (3x).
