METSCOLLANEANOUS: The Mets fell to the Nationals, 7-1, last night...The Mets have won six of their last nine contests...The Mets are 68-13 when scoring first this season... New York is 30-8-3 in 41 series this year...Today, the Mets finish an 11-day, 10-game homestand (6-3), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (3-1), Dodgers (2-1) and Nationals (1-1)...Following this series, New York hits the road for a seven-day, six-game trip to Pittsburgh (three games) and Miami (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Mike Piazza celebrates his 54th birthday today...Piazza became the second player to have his number retired by the Mets...He was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 2016 and was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2013... Piazza hit 220 home runs and had 655 RBI during his Mets career (1998-2005) and was a seven-time All-Star with the Mets and helped guide the club to back-to-back playoff appearances in 1999-2000.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 44-20 against the NL East this season...New York's .688 winning percentage in the division is the highest in franchise history...They are right above the 1986 team who went 59-31 in the division for a .656 winning pct...The 2015 Mets owned the best intradivision winning percentage (47-29, .619) since divisions expanded to their current format in 1994...Since 1994, only the 2015 Mets (47) and the 2006 Mets (45) had more wins within the NL East.

RUBBERBAND MAN: The Mets are 15-3 in rubber games this season...According to Elias, that's the best winning percentage (.833) in such games this season...The franchise record for wins and winning percentage in rubber matches was set in 1999 (17-7, .708)... The last team with a higher winning percentage in rubber games (min. 10 games) was the 2001 Mariners (16-2, .889)...No other team has had 15 wins in rubber games in a season since 2016, when the Dodgers went 16-6.

DAY TRIPPER: The Mets have won nine of their last 10 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 34-16 in day games this season...The team's .680 winning percentage in the sunlight is the second-best in the majors and the best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.02 ERA with 132 walks and 486 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.02 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL.

I GET KNOCKED DOWN, BUT I GET UP AGAIN: The Mets are 36-12 (.750) record this season in the game immediately following a loss...That is the best such record in the majors.

FOGO POWER: Eduardo Escobar has homered in back-to-back games...Since 2018, Escobar has hit 104 home runs...Among switch hitters, only José Ramírez (141) and Francisco Lindor (119) have recorded more home runs during that stretch...Courtesy of Sportradar...Escobar's 360 RBI during that span trails only Ramirez (443) among batters who swing from both sides of the plate.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco is slated to return from the IL today and make the start...He is 13-5 with a 3.92 ERA (55 earned runs/126.1 innings) with 33 walks and 124 strikeouts in 23 starts this season...In 13 starts this season at Citi Field, Carrasco is 8-1 with a 3.35 ERA (28 earned runs/75.1 innings) with 23 walks and 74 strikeouts...With a win today, Carrasco would be the first Mets pitcher with at least nine wins at home since R.A. Dickey recorded 12 victories in 2012...Carrasco is set to make his 11th start against the NL East today...He is 7-1 with a 2.91 ERA (19 earned runs/58.2 innings) with 16 walks and 53 strikeouts this season.

COOKIE'S KIDS CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS CLINIC: In honor of Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, the Mets hosted a youth baseball clinic at Citi Field for pediatric cancer patients and their siblings...Yesterday's clinic was part of the Cookie's Kids program, where Carlos Carrasco invites patients from Cohen Children's Medical Center to Citi Field or visits patients in the hospital to share his inspiring story of overcoming cancer...The participants took part in baseball drills on the outfield grass with Mets infielder Luis Guillorme, interacted with Mr. Met and Shea the Mets VetDog, and had their names announced on field by the Mets PA announcer...The families enjoyed lunch and received Mets tickets for an upcoming game.

MARTE PARTY: Starling Marte is 22-65 (.338) with 11 runs, four doubles, a triple, four home runs, 12 RBI, four walks, three steals with a .403 OBP and a .615 SLG over his last 17 games...He is batting .310 with 41 runs, 12 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 32 RBI, 13 walks with a .360 OBP, a .528 SLG and a .889 OPS in 60 games at home...This compares to a .279/.336/.416 slashline with a .752 OPS in 56 road contests.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 11 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 27 second-half wins.

WASHINGTON D.C. IS PARADISE TO ME: Pete Alonso is a lifetime .329 (75-228) hitter with 42 runs, 16 doubles, a triple, 22 home runs, 49 RBI, 29 walks with a .419 OBP and a .697 SLG in 63 career games against the Nationals...It's his highest home run and RBI total against any one opponent...Only Darryl Strawberry (31), Howard Johnson (24) and David Wright (24) have hit more home runs against the franchise.

WASH AND FOLD: The Mets have won four of their five games against the Nationals at Citi Field this year...They are 11-3 against Washington at Citi Field since the start of last season...In 2022, the Mets are 11-4 against the Nationals, posting a 2.93 ERA and a .292/.370/.461 slashline...They have outscored the Nats 83-47 in 2022...The Mets have recorded 10 or more wins in four of their last five seasons against Washington...The franchise record for total wins against Washington/Montreal in a single-season is 14 accomplished in 1991...Since the team moved to D.C., the Mets have recorded a record 12 wins against the club three times (2019, 2008 and 2006).

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 46-87 Nationals today...Each of their next 14 games and 22 of their 28 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 46-19 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .701 winning percentage...Their .701 winning percentage is the third-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

WHEN YOU'RE 15: Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte have record at least 15 doubles, 15 home runs and stolen 15 bases this season...They are the first pair of Mets teammates to accomplish that feat in the same season since Carlos Beltrán, José Reyes and David Wright did so in 2008...Lindor and Marte joined Texas's Adolis García and Marcus Semien as the only pair of teammates to hit 15 or more home runs and record 15 or more stolen bases this season...Lindor also joined Trea Turner, Tim Anderson and José Ramírez as the only players with four seasons of 15 or more homers and 15 or more steals since 2017.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .659 winning percentage following the All-Star break...That is the second-highest winning percentage in franchise history, right below the 1969 (.671) team and above 1988 (.644) squad...The Mets are 27-14 in the second-half...The team's 27 wins are tied for the third-most in the majors...The team is batting .266/.335/.431 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and rank fourth in SLG and sixth in average following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 188-155 following the break.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 145 consecutive days...According to Elias, it's the fourth longest-streak in franchise history.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won 14 of its last 18 games at home...Overall, the Mets are 46-22 at Citi Field...New York's 46 wins at home are tied for the most in the majors...They are fourth in the majors and second in National League with a .676 winning percentage at home...The team's .676 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.07 ERA with 192 walks and 667 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 667 at home this year, which is the second-most in the majors...That is already the eighth most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in 10 of his last 11 appearances...He has tossed 11.0 innings in that span, allowed eight hits, four walks, struck out 15 and posted a 0.82 ERA (one earned run/11.0 innings)...In 17 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.56 ERA (three earned runs/17.1 innings) with seven walks and 20 strikeouts...Lugo ranks ninth in Mets history with 319 strikeouts as a reliever.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,263 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,281 have struck out more...The team's 1,263 strikeouts are already the eighth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.53 K/9 IP, a rate... Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.5 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 49.0% of batters faced (100/201), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 53 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.04 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 3-1 with 29 saves, a 1.52 ERA (nine earned runs/52.1 IP), allowing 31 hits and 17 walks...The Mets are 47-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is tied for fourth in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Carrasco exited his start on August 15 at Atlanta after 2.0 innings with left side tightness...He took the loss after giving up three runs on four hits (two home runs) and a walk with one strikeout...He was placed on the 15-day Injured List on August 16 with a low-grade left oblique strain.

WINNER, WINNER: Prior to his last start, Carrasco had won each of his five previous decisions from July 3-August 9, his second-longest win-streak of the season...Won six consecutive decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...His 13 wins on the season are tied for the sixth-most in the majors...He has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career (also, 2015-2018) and earned 10 wins prior to the All-Star break for the fourth time in his career (also, 2015, 2017 & 2018).

THAT'S QUALITY STUFF: Has nine quality starts this season after notching just two such starts last year...Registered three straight quality starts from July 30-August 9 for the first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...Has made seven starts with more than 6.0 innings this year, the third-most on the club...Has 14 starts with two earned runs or fewer this season, tied for second on the club behind Chris Bassitt's 15 such starts.

VS. WASHINGTON: Will be facing the Nationals for the fourth time this season...Earned the win against the Nats on June 1 at Citi Field, tossing 5.0 scoreless frames with four hits, a career-high-tying five walks and five strikeouts...Carrasco has gone 10-4 with a 3.24 ERA (40 earned runs/111.0 innings) in 24 career games (19 starts) against National League East foes...It is his lowest ERA against any division in the majors (min. 15 games)...This season, his seven wins against the NL East are tied for the most in the majors with teammates Chris Bassitt and Max Scherzer.

CLUTCH COOKIE: Carrasco did not allow a run in 22.2 consecutive innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018...His six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings are tied for fifth-most in the National League.

JULY HEAT: Carrasco went 3-0 with a 0.90 ERA (three earned runs/30.0 innings), nine walks and 27 strikeouts in five starts in the month of July...It is his lowest ERA for any month in his career and the third-lowest for any single month in Mets history since 1990 (min. 30.0 IP)...In that time frame, he joins Frank Viola (0.86 ERA, April 1991), Al Leiter (0.92 ERA, April 2002), R.A. Dickey (0.93 ERA, June 2012) and Jacob deGrom (0.51 ERA, April 2021) as the only Mets pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA in a single month.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat when he did so in his 274th career game on July 30 at Miami.
