PITTSBURGH PIRATES (45-62) vs. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (54-53)

July 29, 2025 - Oracle Park - San Francisco, CA - 6:45 PDT - Game #108/Road #52

LHP Bailey Falter (7-5, 3.82 ERA) vs. RHP Justin Verlander (1-8, 4.70 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won six of their last seven games, including Monday night's series-opening win over the Giants at Oracle Park...Are one of four teams in Major League Baseball that has yet to lose when leading after eight innings this season (38-0)...Are 33-36 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta (their 19 errors since Kelly's debut are the second-fewest in MLB)...Are 15-2 over their last 17 games when scoring at least four runs (since June 6).

OLD FRIENDS MEET AGAIN: Pirates manager Don Kelly and Giants starting pitcher Justin Verlander were teammates with the Tigers from 2009-14...In that stretch, Detroit won the 2012 American League pennant, as well as four straight American League Central titles from 2011-14...In the 2012 World Series, a four-game sweep by the Giants, Kelly entered Game Two here in San Francisco as a defensive replacement, while also pinch hitting in Game Four.

WALK THIS WAY: Roberto Clemente was among the group of 10 inductees that were named to the inaugural Pittsburgh Walk of Fame class on Monday...Other notable members include actor Michael Keaton, children's television host Fred Rogers and artist Andy Warhol... The group will have their names featured on bronze stars that will be embedded in the sidewalk at the Strip District Terminal...The induction ceremony is scheduled for October 20.

BAILEY ON THE BUMP: Bailey Falter will get the start tonight for Pittsburgh in the middle game of this three-game series against the Giants at Oracle Park...Falter ranks seventh among all qualifed left-handed pitchers in the National League with a 3.82 ERA this season.

A HISTORIC HOMER: Andrew McCutchen hit his 10th home run of the season in the seventh inning of Monday's 6-4 victory, a go-ahead, two-run shot off San Francisco's Carson Seymour... He's now hit at least 10 home runs in each of his first 17 big-league seasons (since 2009)... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is one of 11 Major League players ever to accomplish that.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Liover Peguero started at first base on Monday at San Francisco, his first career game at the position...He was the seventh different player to start a game at first base for Pittsburgh (also Matt Gorski, Spencer Horwitz, Endy Rodríguez, Nick Solak, Jared Triolo and Enmanuel Valdez)...The last time the Pirates had that many players start a game at first base in a season was 2022, when they had nine different players do it (Diego Castillo, Yu Chang, Michael Chavis, Zack Collins, Ben Gamel, Bligh Madris, Kevin Padlo, Yoshi Tsutsugo and Josh VanMeter).

GOING THE EXTRA MILE: Four of Pittsburgh's nine hits in Monday's 6-4 win at San Francisco went for extra bases...Over their last six games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the Pirates' 21 extra-base hits are tied for the eighth-most in MLB.

PLAYING THE FIELD: Pittsburgh has not committed an error in its last 70.0 innings, dating back to the fifth inning on July 20 vs. Chicago (AL)... Pittsburgh's longest errorless streak of 2025 is 75.1 innings (from June 10-19).

PHAMTASTIC: Tommy Pham went 2-for-4 with an RBI, a walk and a run scored on Monday night at Oracle Park...In his last 25 games (since June 22 vs. Texas), Pham is batting .395 (34-for-86) with seven doubles, a triple, four home runs, 20 RBI and 12 runs scored...That's the highest average in all of Major League Baseball (minimum 95 plate appearances) in that span...Pham is also batting .414 (12-for-29) with four extra-base hits and four RBI during his current eight-game hitting streak (since July 19 vs. Chicago-AL), his longest hitting streak since a 15-game streak from August 8-25, 2023 (with Arizona).

<u>July 29, 2013</u>: Pittsburgh used a four-run first inning and a five-run seventh inning to power its way to a 9-2 win over St. Louis in the first game of a five-game series at PNC Park. Pedro Alvarez punctuated the first inning with his 27th home run of the season, a three-run shot off Jake Westbrook. Francisco Liriano improved to 11-4 after striking out eight batters over 7.0 innings of work.

AGE: 28 SIGNED: Thru 2025

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia for INF Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023.

STARTING OFE: The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He's in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Falter allowed one run on four hits and zero walks while striking out a career-high-tying eight batters in a season-high-tying 7.0 innings on July 23 vs. Detroit, winning a 6-1 decision vs. Troy Melton, who made his Major League debut.

AGAINST THE GIANTS: Falter is 0-1 with a 1.23 ERA (7.1ip/1er) and seven strikeouts in two career relief appearances (both with Philadelphia) against San Francisco, both of which have come at Oracle Park...He allowed one run and struck out five batters while tossing 3.0 innings in a 5-3 loss on June 18, 2021...Falter also gave up six unearned runs and struck out two batters over 4.1 innings in a 6-3 loss here on May 15, 2023.

RISPY BUSINESS: Since his outing on May 9 vs. Atlanta, Falter has limited opposing hitters to a .189 batting average against (10-for-53) with runners in scoring position.

SOUTHPAW SIGHTING: Falter's 21 starts this season are tied with six others for the second-most among National League lefties, trailing San Francisco's Robbie Ray (22).

FIRST-HALF HIGHLIGHTS: Falter ended the first half of the season with a 3.79 ERA (97.1ip/41er), the seventh-lowest ERA among left-handed pitchers in the National League with at least 95.0 innings pitched...The only pitchers on that list with a lower first-half ERA than Falter were Chicago's Matthew Boyd (2.34), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (2.50), San Francisco's Robbie Ray (2.65), Washington's MacKenzie Gore (3.02), New York's David Peterson (3.06) and Cincinnati's Nick Lodolo (3.38).

WINNING THE DAY: Falter had his career-high-tying five-game winning streak come to an end in his outing on July 4 at Seattle...He had a 2.54 ERA (49.2ip/14er) and a .225 batting average against during the streak (began on May 9 vs. Atlanta)...He also won five consecutive decisions from August 20 [G2]-September 13, 2022 with Philadelphia.

THE MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Falter finished the month of May with a 0.76 ERA (35.2ip/3er), the third-lowest mark among qualified Major League pitchers during the month, behind Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (0.55) and Kansas City's Kris Bubic (0.56)... Falter's 0.76 ERA was the lowest by any Pirates pitcher in a single month (minimum six starts) during the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...In his outing on May 31 at San Diego, he became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to throw 6.1-plus scoreless innings on one/zero strikeouts since Jeff Locke (9.0ip/1k) did in a 10-0 win on May 30, 2016 at Miami.

NOTHING TO SEE HERE: Falter has recorded three separate scoreless streaks of at least 11.0 innings this season...He had his most-recent 11.0-inning scoreless streak end in the first inning on June 6 vs. Philadelphia...Falter also had a scoreless streak of 11.0 innings from April 11-22, as well as a 16.2-inning streak that stretched from May 9-20.

PESKY LEFTIES: According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Falter (7.0ip/0r) on April 16) and Andrew Heaney (7.1ip/0r on April 17) became the first pair of Pirates left-handed teammates to pitch 7.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive team games since John Candelaria (9.0ip) and Larry McWilliams (7.0ip) did so on July 25 and July 27, 1982.
