METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Dodgers, 10-0, in Los Angeles yesterday...The loss snapped a season-high six game winning streak...The Amazins' earned their fifth straight series victory of the season... Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 12-4...The Mets are in the midst of their second trip of the season, a six-game trip (2-1) to Los Angeles-NL (2-1) and San Francisco (three games)...The Mets are off on Thursday before returning home for a seven-game home stand against the Cardinals (three games) and Cubs (four games).

ROSTERMOVES: The Mets announced the following roster moves...RHP Grant Hartwig was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse following yesterday's game...RHP Michael Tonkin has been designated for assignment...RHP Sean Reid-Foley has been reinstated from the injured list...LHP Josh Walker has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse.

REEDING RAINBOW: On Saturday, Reed Garrett earned his first career save yesterday...He has made six appearances this year and has yet to allow a run in 10.2 innings...He is 3-0 and has allowed two unearned runs, five hits and three walks...He has struck out 21 of the 41 batters he faced... His 21 strikeouts are the most in the major leagues.

THEY MIGHT BE GIANTS: Jeff McNeil is a .348 (23-66) hitter with 15 runs, four doubles, three home runs, eight RBI with a .419 OBP and a .545 SLG in 17 games at Oracle Park...Harrison Bader is 14-53 with six extra-base hits in 16 games at the ballpark...Pete Alonso has homered six times in 14 games at the ballpark.

HEY MR. DJ: DJ Stewart has reached base safely in 11 straight games, posting a .474 OBP in that span...Over his last 11 games, Stewart is 8-27 (.296) with four runs, two doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, eight walks, one steal with a 1.177 OPS...He has posted a .426 OBP in 14 games this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is in the midst of their second road trip of the year...The team is 6-3 away from Citi Field...New York is batting .282/.355/.433 on the road this year...Their .282 batting average is the third-best in the majors, while their .355 OBP is the second-best...The Mets have outscored their opponents 56-47 on the road this season... The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401...The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: In 14 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .287/.358/.440 with 86 runs, 25 doubles, one triple, 16 home runs, 48 walks with an .798 OPS...Their .287 average and .358 OBP are the best in the majors, while their .798 OPS is third-best...The Mets have outscored their opponents 86-63 in that span...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

ADAM'S SONG: After allowing two runs in his first two appearances, Adam Ottavino has made six scoreless appearances...He has not allowed a hit or a walk in those 6.1 innings, striking out 11 in that span and stranding one inherited runner...He is 1-0 with a 2.16 ERA (2 ER/8.1 IP) this season.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets have taken the season series from the Giants in each of the last two years...The Mets have won the season series against the Giants in five of the last seven seasons they've matched up against each other.

HERE'S THE PITCH: New York owns the second-lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.48 (73 ER/189.0 IP) mark...Their 204 strikeouts are fourth in the Senior Circuit...The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.95 ERA (28 ER/85.1 IP) with 38 walks and 106 strikeouts...Their 2.95 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit...Their 106 strikeouts from the bullpen lead the major leagues.

SAN FRANCISCO LINDOR: Francisco Lindor has safely reached base in 13 straight games...He has posted a .339 OBP in that span...He has safely hit in six of his last seven games, hitting .370 (10-27) with five runs, two doubles, one home run, two walks, one steal, four RBI with a .414 OBP and a .556 SLG...He is batting .286 (6-21) against left-handed pitchers in 2024...This includes a .524 SLG.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte is batting .311 (19-61) with 13 runs, two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, five steals with an .846 OPS in 14 games since April 6...He has safely hit in 11 of those 14 games...The Mets are 12-4 in that span...He is 9-20 with three-extra base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...Overall, Marte is batting .276/.323/.448 with seven extra-base hits in 21 contests in 2024.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: As a team, the Mets are batting .270/.336/.435 against left-handed pitchers this year...Their .270 average is seventh in the major leagues, and fourth in the National League...Their .442 SLG ranks fifth in MLB...This compares to a .241/.328/.365 slashline against righties.

SWING AND NO MISS: Mets batters have struck out 159 times this year...That is the third-fewest in the major leagues...Overall, the team has posted an 19.5 strikeout percentage, which is the fourth-lowest in the majors and second in the National League...Jeff McNeil ranks sixth in the majors, striking out only 10.3% of the time, while Francisco Lindor places 15th at 12.4%.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his no decision in the Mets 3-1 win over the Pirates on April 16...Allowed one run on four hits over 5.0 innings, issued three walks and struck out four batters.

OPENING UP: Quintana took the mound for Opening Day on March 29 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...He became the 30th Opening Day starter in franchise history...He was the first southpaw since Jon Neise (2013) to be named the Mets Opening Day starter...Quintana started the opener just once prior to today (2017, with Chicago-AL).

PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN: In March of 2024, the Colombian-born Quintana passed his naturalization test in Miami to become an American citizen.

METS DEBUT SEASON: After starting his first season with the Mets in 2023 on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage, Quintana made his first start for the club on July 20, 2023, against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...The southpaw finished the last season 3-6 with a 3.57 ERA (30 ER/75.2 IP) in 13 starts.

300 CLUB: In his start on September 17, 2023, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed pitchers with 300 or more career starts.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12, 2023, at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,592) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,944), Chris Sale (2,189), Madison Bumgarner (2,070).

YOU GOTTA MAKE 'EM EARN IT: Quintana allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 19 starts from July 23, 2022 to August 23, 2023...Is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1, 2023.

A PERFECT 10: The lefty pitcher struck out a season-high 10 batters on September 23, 2023 in Philadelphia...The fifth highest amount of strikeouts he has ever recorded in a game throughout his career...Was his first double-digit strikeout game since August 13, 2019 when he struck out a career-high 14 batters.

ON THE LEADERBOARD: Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September...It was the lowest ERA in any month in his career...Since 2022, Quintana has allowed 15 home runs, tied for the lowest total during that span (min 150.0 IP).

2023 REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (0-1, 3.60)

LAST TIME OUT: Luis Severino earned his second win as a Met on April 17 vs. Pittsburgh...He allowed one run on five hits, issuing three walks with four strikeouts to lower his ERA to 2.14 on the season.

STRIKE THAT: Severino has recorded 809 career strikeouts...That ranks second among active Dominican pitchers...Only Luis Castillo (1,192) has recorded more.

- Is batting .317/.417/.659 with four home runs, two doubles, eight RBI, 10 runs and seven walks over his last 11 games.
- Since April 9, is tied for sixth in the majors in runs (10)...In the NL, ranks ninth in OPS (1.135) and in SLG (.659) during that span (Min. 30 plate appearances).
- Is tied for fourth in the majors with six home runs and tied for 13th in runs with 16.
- Was named NL Player of the Week for the period ending April 14...Batted .429 (9-21) with four homers, seven RBI, eight runs and seven walks during the week...Was his fourth career NL player of the week selection (Also: 6/24/19, 9/26/22 and 7/31/23).
- Went 3-3 with a two homers and three RBI on April 13 vs. Kansas City...Was his 20th career multi-homer game, the third most such games in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry (22) and David Wright (21)...Are the second most such games since 2019 behind only Aaron Judge.
- Hit a game-tying solo home run in the ninth inning in the second game of a doubleheader on April 4 vs. Detroit...Was his 500th career RBI...Became the 10th Met to reach the 500-career RBI mark...José Reyes and Cleon Jones are next (521)...Is the third player in major league history to record 194 or more home runs and 500 or more RBI within their first 690 games joining Ralph Kiner and Ryan Howard...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein...His 198 home runs and 509 RBI are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

- Launched his 150th career home run on April 17 vs. Pittsburgh...Became the 34th player in major league history to record 150+ home runs and 300+ stolen bases...Is the only active player to accomplish the feat and is the third Dominican-born player to accomplish the feat joining Juan Samuel and César Cedeño.
- Is batting .311/.354/.492 with three homers, two doubles 13 runs and 11 RBI over his last 14 games...Is tied for fifth in the majors in runs (13) and tied for 12th in hits (19) since April 6...His seven multi-hit efforts during that span are tied for fourth in the majors.
- Went 2-4 with a run, a walk and two stolen bases on April 6 vs. Cincinnati...Was his 40th career game with multiple stolen bases, the third-most such games in the majors since 2012.
- Is batting .450 (9-20) against left-handed pitchers, the second-best mark in the majors (Min. 20 at-bats vs. LHP).
- Lined a solo home run in his first at-bat of the season on March 29 vs. Milwaukee...Has homered in each of his three home openers as a Met.
- Finished tied for 16th in the National League with 24 stolen bases in 2023...Ranks first among active players with 343 stolen bases...Posted his ninth season with 20 or more stolen bases...Only 35 players in the Integration Era (since 1947) have had more 20-steal seasons...He has swiped 20 or more bags in nine of 11 seasons since 2013...No other player in the majors has done so more than seven times during that span.
