RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (3-0), Mariners (2-0, one to play), and Athletics (three to play) today at T-Mobile Park...have won five straight games or more for the time this season and have won 14 of their last 18 games on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...lead the AL with a 70-46 record, second in the majors...have spent 84 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 43 consecutive days in first (June 27-pres.)...the 84 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (131), Braves (129), Brewers (99), and Guardians (95)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 82 of those days, the second most in team history behind 2023 (106), per Stats Perform...have held a 4.5-game lead over the second-place Yankees each of the last four days, their largest lead since July 8 (5.0)...their 70-46 record is tied for the second best in team history through 116 games (also: 2010, 2008), one game behind the 2021 club (71-45).

- ✦ The Rays took the three-game set against the Mariners with a 3-2 win last night...with the win, they are the first AL club to 70 wins, marking their second time in team history accomplishing the feat along with 2021, according to Elias.
- ✦ The club has won three straight games scoring four runs or fewer in each contest...marks the second time this season (April 26-28) they have turned the trick...only twice in team history has the club won four straight games or more scoring four runs or fewer (Sept. 19-22, 2024 & Aug. 25-29, 2020 - both 4G).
- ✦ The Rays earned their fifth series win in their last six sets (July 20-pres.) and improved to 9-3-2 over their last 14 series (June 19-pres.)...they also won their third straight road series, matching their longest streak of the campaign (also: April 27-May 13).
- ✦ **Bryan Baker** converted his 23rd consecutive save opportunity (May 17-pres.), surpassing **Fernando Rodney's** franchise record (22, May 27-Aug. 13, 2012).
- ✦ They improved to a season-high 24 games above .500, their first time reaching the mark since the conclusion of the 2023 season (99-63).
- ✦ The Rays improved to 29-28 on the road, the first time since June 6 (16-15) they have been above .500 on the road.
- ✦ With a win today, the Rays can sweep back-to-back series for the fourth time this season (last: June 26-28 vs. AZ & June 30-July 2 at KC) - see more in "Sweep Sweep Revenge" note below.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed **RHP Griffin Jax** (right elbow discomfort) on the 15-day IL (retro Aug. 6) and recalled **RHP Michael Grove** from Triple-A Durham...this is Grove's third stint on the active roster, joining June 25-28 and Aug. 3-4.

SWEEP SWEEP REVENGE—After being swept in Seattle last season, the Rays would sweep the Mariners for the first time at T-Mobile Park since Aug. 9-11, 2019 (3-0) with a win today...they look to claim their MLB-best 12th sweep today and fourth on the road (last: Aug. 3-5 at COL)...12 sweeps would tie the second most in a single season in Rays history (see table on the right)...as it stands, their 11 sweeps are already second most in franchise history before the calendar flips to September (2021, 13x).

BAKER THE SAVE MAKER—**Bryan Baker** converted his franchise-record 23rd straight save opportunity (see table on the right) last night to earn his MLB-best 34th save, as many or more than 24 major league clubs have as a team this season...Baker has earned a save in eight of the Rays last 10 wins and nine of their last 12 (July 22-pres.)...min. 25.0 IP, he leads the AL with a 0.64 ERA (28.0IP, 3ER) and 0.68 WHIP and ranks second in opp. average (.128/.12-for-95) since the 23-save streak began on May 17...he worked a season-high-tying 13 straight scoreless outings from June 27-Aug. 4 (also: May 17-June 21), the second-longest streak by a Ray this season behind **Kevin Kelly's** 14-appearance span from April 22-May 22.

- ✦ Baker is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47) as the only Rays pitchers to lead the majors in saves over a full season...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point from Aug. 1 on, joining **Colomé**, **Fernando Rodney** (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.
- ✦ The Rays have won each of the last 21 games Baker has pitched in, the fourth-longest streak in a pitcher's outings in team history, trailing **Emilio Pagan** (25G, 2019), **Soriano** (24G, 2010), and **Percival** (24G, 2008)...across the season, the Rays are 43-5 when he pitches.
- ✦ Collectively, the Rays have recorded an MLB-leading 47 saves, tied for the most through 116 games in club history (also 2015)...that's good for a pace of 66 saves over a 162-game season, which would establish a team record and tie the second-highest total by any club since saves became an official statistic in 1969 (also: 2008 LAA), trailing the 1990 White Sox (68).
- ✦ The Rays own the majors' best winning pct. in games decided by three runs or fewer (.662/45-23).

ALL HEART, ALL HUSTLE—This week, **Chandler Simpson** was named the Rays 2026 Heart & Hustle Award winner...the award is presented annually to an active player who demonstrates a passion for the game of baseball and best embodies the values, spirit, and traditions of the game.

- ✦ He swiped his 31st base of the season last night, tied for the second most in the majors with **KC Bobby Witt Jr.** behind **WSH Nasim Nunez** (40)...he is one of 18 players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 30 stolen bases in each of his first two big-league seasons...he also became one of 13 players in the modern era with 100 hits and 30 stolen bases in each of his first two major league seasons (last: **Witt Jr.**, 2022-23).
- ✦ **Simpson** has 75 stolen bases across his first two major league seasons, joining **CIN Elly De La Cruz** (102), **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (87), **Witt Jr.** (79), and **MIL Bryce Turang** (76) as the only players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) with 75 stolen bases or more across his first two campaigns.

THE STAFF HAS THE STUFF—Since the beginning of their last homestand on July 24, the Rays pitching staff has turned in a 2.74 ERA (128.0IP, 39ER) in 14 games, with the team going 11-3 over that span...the staff has allowed three runs or fewer in nine of the 14 contests with five shutouts...their five shutout performances came over an 11-game stretch (July 25-Aug. 5), marking their most shutout victories over any 11-game span in team history...opponents have produced a 199/252/356 (92-for-463) slash line with a .609 OPS against Rays pitchers since July 24...their opp. AVG and opp. OBP pace the majors, while their opp. OPS is second best over that stretch.

- ✦ Rays starters have turned in five quality starts in the 14 performances with three runs or fewer allowed in 12 of 14...starters over that span have produced more double-digit strikeout contests (2) than outings with three walks or more (1).
- ✦ The bullpen has converted each of its nine save opportunities during that timeframe, pacing the majors in saves...it has held teams to a .185 (39-for-211) average and allowed just 15.8 pct. (3/19) of inherited runners to cross the plate, including none of their last nine inherited runners.

LA MÁXIMA—**Junior Caminero** launched his 33rd home run of the season Wed. at COL...the blast tied him with **Randy Arozarena** (85) for the 10th-most long balls in franchise history...he is 14 homers behind **Fred McGriff** (99) for ninth on the list...he reached 85 career home runs in 318 career games, tied for the eighth-most home runs in the modern era (since 1900) within a player's first 318 games...he is the first player to reach the mark since within as few games since **SD Fernando Tatis Jr.** (March 28, 2019-June 11, 2023; 93HR).

- ✦ The homer marked his 78th between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), second most in the modern era (since 1900) behind **MLN Eddie Mathews** (87).
- ✦ He is pacing for 46 HR—if he were to reach that mark, he would become the first player in team history with multiple 40-HR seasons and join **Mathews** (1953-54) as the only players in the modern era with multiple such seasons before their age-23 campaign...he would also tie **Carlos Peña's** single-season franchise record (2007).

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 34-1 when out-homering their opponent, 19-10 when home runs are even, and 17-35 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays .971 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era (since 1900), trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (16-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1924 Montreal Expos (34-2/947)...the Rays have won 21 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.)...they have dropped 22 of 29 contests they have been out-homered in since May 25...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (32-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated 20 of their 38 runs over the last 10 games via 13 HR.

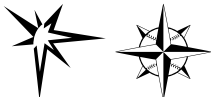
- ✦ They are 28-5 in multi-homer games, including seven straight wins (July 20-pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
- ✦ Over their last 39 games since June 25, the Rays pace the AL in multi-homer efforts (18) and are second behind the Tigers (57) for the AL lead in homers (56) over that span over that span.

THE SOUND—The Rays conclude their stay in the PNW and their season series with the Mariners today...the Rays have won each of their last three sets opposite the Mariners, winning seven of their last eight contests since being swept in Seattle between Aug. 8-10, 2025...they clinched their first series win at T-Mobile Park since May 5-8, 2022 (3-1) last night...since 2016, they have lost seven of their last 10 sets (3-7-0) at the ballpark (clubs did not meet in 2020)...with the win last night, the Rays have won or split the season series with the Mariners each of the last five seasons since 2022 (3-0-2).

TODAY'S START—**Ian Seymour** is scheduled to take the mound today for his ninth start and 38th appearance of the season...marks his 14th career start and 57th appearance...selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- In his last eight outings (five starts) since June 25, he ranks highly among AL southpaws (min. 30.0IP) in opp. average (2nd, .199), WHIP (2nd, 0.95), wins (2nd, 5), and strikeouts per 9.0 IP (4th, 11.85), and walks per 9.0 IP (4th, 1.98).
- His out-of-zone swing pct. (33.2%) has increased 6.8 points from his mark last season (26.4%).
- He is 1 strikeout away from recording his first 100-strikeout season (99SO)... would join **Drew Rasmussen** (130 SO) and **Griffin Jax** (100 SO) as Rays pitchers to reach the 100-strikeout mark this year.
- Since transitioning to a starter/bulk relief role on June 8, Seymour has turned in a 3.71 ERA (53.1IP, 22ER), 0.99 WHIP, and .203 (40-for-197) opp. average compared to a 5.23 ERA (31.0IP, 18ER), 1.35 WHIP, and .239 (27-for-113) across his first 26 appearances of the year (March 26–June 2).
- Over his last 13 road outings (April 18–pres.), he has gone 4-1 with a 3.67 ERA (34.1IP, 14ER), 45 SO, and a .223 (29-for-130) opp. AVG.

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his eighth win of the season after tossing his second quality start of the year (W, 6.0IP, 7H, 2ER, HR, 9SO) on Aug. 3 at COL...made it through two scoreless frames before allowing an **Ezequiel Tovar** solo home run to lead off the the 3rd...an RBI-single from **Kyle Karros** in the 5th scored the second Colorado run and made it 10-4...four of the seven hits Seymour yielded came in the 5th and 6th innings, his final two frames of the outing.

- Marked his second career outing (both starts) in which he fanned nine batters or more, joining July 7 vs. NYY, when he fanned a career-high 12.
- Marked his first career outing in which he worked 6.0 innings or more while not allowing a walk...July 7 vs. NYY was his previous longest outing with zero walks allowed.

THREADING THE (SPACE) NEEDLE—Seymour will be making his third career outing (second start) against the Mariners...is 0-1 with an 8.44 ERA (5.1IP, 5ER) and a .333 (7-for-21) opp. AVG in two career appearances against Seattle...was dealt the loss after allowing 6 R (5ER) over 3.1 IP in his last contest vs. SEA on July 12 (L, 3.1IP, 6H, 6R-5ER, HR, 3BB, HBP, 3SO)...in six games (one start) against AL West clubs, he is 1-1 with a 4.32 ERA (16.2IP, 8ER) and a .186 (11-for-59) opp. AVG.

- The Rays are 18-6 in his appearances against AL clubs this season, going 6-2 with a 4.01 ERA (60.2IP, 27ER) and 74 strikeouts in 24 appearances (five starts).

ROADS UNTRAVELED—Seymour has appeared in 17 games (three starts) on the road this season...over his last 13 road appearances (three starts) as a visitor dating back to April 18 at PIT, he has gone 4-1 with a 3.67 ERA (34.1IP, 14ER), 45 strikeouts, and a .223 (29-for-130) opp. average, allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...the Rays have gone 9-4 in those games.

WHIFF WATCH—He boasts a 29.2 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking second among active AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to CLE **Joey Cantillo** (30.5%)...81 of his 99 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, tied with **Griffin Jax** for second most on the Rays behind **Drew Rasmussen** (107).

FOOT OFF THE GAS—Seymour's offspeed run value (8) ranks in the 98th percentile of major league pitchers, according to Baseball Savant...min. 100 AB vs. offspeed pitches, his .164 (19-for-116) opp. AVG is the sixth lowest among AL pitchers, and second among AL lefties behind teammate **Shane Bieber** (.137/17-for-124)...under the same parameters, he ranks fourth in opp. OBP (.189) and eighth in opp. SLG (.250).

THE SEYMOUR SHOW—On June 25 vs. KC, Seymour was utilized as a bulk reliever behind opener **Casey Legumina** and delivered 6.2 hitless innings with one walk and seven strikeouts...the pairing carried a perfect game through 5.1 innings and a no-hitter through the 8th inning before turning the ball over to **Craig Kimbrel**...it marked the 16th time in franchise history Rays pitchers have made it through 5.0 innings with no baserunners allowed (last: June 24, 2025 at KC).

- Became the third pitcher in the majors since 1980 to throw 6.2 hitless innings or more in relief, joining LAA **Félix Peña** (July 12, 2019 vs. SEA) and CLE **Jake Westbrook** (April 19, 2004 vs. DET)...was the sixth southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick alongside BAL **Tippy Martinez** (July 23, 1979 vs. OAK), STL **Al Brazle** (Aug. 1, 1951 vs. BSN), BOS **Herb Pennock** (Sept. 3, 1917 vs. NYY [G2]), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29, 1917 vs. SLB [G2]), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (July 20, 1914 vs. DET)...all six of these instances occurred at home...it was the most innings pitched by a Rays reliever since **Jalen Beeks** (6.2IP) on May 1, 2019 at KC.
- Seymour's seven strikeouts were the most by a Rays reliever since **Jesse Scholtens** struck out nine batters on Sept. 25, 2025 at BAL.
- He became the seventh southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to pitch 6.0 hitless innings of relief or more and start his next outing (July 2 at KC), joining LAD **Eric Lauer** (June 22-29, 2026), DET **Ed Glynn** (Sept. 5-12, 1976), CAL **Clyde Wright** (Aug. 20-27, 1968), MLN **Juan Pizarro** (April 29–April 15, 1960), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29–Sept. 1, 1917), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (Sept. 20-25, 1914).
