On the Road

The Braves hit the road tonight for the first time this season, opening a seven-game trip to the Diamondbacks & Angels.

Atlanta went 37-44 (.457) away from Truist Park last season, and their .457 winning percentage in such games ranked tied for 18th in the majors.

The Braves went 0-8 to open its road slate last season, tied for the longest road losing streak to begin a season in modern-era franchise history. The club did, however, close the season with victories in each of its final eight games away from home, and its 17-8 (.680) road winning percentage from August 1 through the end of the season was the best in baseball.

Atlanta's eight consecutive wins on the road dating to last season stands as the longest active road winning streak in the majors.

Scoring Four

Atlanta is undefeated this season when scoring at least four runs, going a perfect 4-0, and winless when scoring no more than three.

Atlanta went just 7-64 (.099) last season when scoring three-or-fewer runs, the lowest winning percentage in baseball. The Braves were 69-22 (.758) when scoring four runs or more.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and D-backs tonight open a four-game weekend series with what is the first of seven scheduled meetings between the clubs this season...The two are set to meet next with three games at Truist Park in Atlanta, August 14-16.

A Atlanta went just 2-4 against Arizona last season, dropping the season set for the first time since 2019...The Braves won both of the first two games before losing each of the last four...Atlanta has not lost five straight games to Arizona since the 2006-07 seasons.

A Both of Atlanta's wins over Arizona last season came here at Chase Field, and the club is 54-42 (.563) all-time here since the facility opened in 1998...The Braves' .563 winning percentage here is third best of any NL team, trailing just the Cardinals (53-40, .570) and Giants (134-104, .563), while Atlanta's 3.94 ERA in this building is the best of any team in baseball.

A RH Ryne Nelson is set for his fourth career start versus Atlanta, and is 1-2 with a 4.32 ERA (8 ER/16.2 IP) over his first three turns...The 6-foot-3, 184-pound Nevada native last faced the Braves in 2024 at Truist Park in Atlanta, and allowed three runs over 5.0 innings to take the loss...The right-hander also took the loss in his season debut on March 27 at Dodger Stadium, allowing four runs and a pair of homers over 4.2 innings.

WILD, WILD, WEST: In each of the previous three seasons, Atlanta has faced a multi-run deficit in the seventh inning or later here at Chase Field and rallied to win...No other visiting team in baseball even has two such wins.

A The Braves trailed, 6-2, entering the seventh on April 26 of last year before rallying to win, 8-7, in extra innings...Michael Harris II lined a go-ahead, two-run double with two outs and two strikes in the eighth to take the lead, and then won it in 10.

A Atlanta was losing, 3-1, entering the top of the ninth on July 8, 2024 when Sean Murphy drove a two-out, two-run homer to knot the score...The Braves would go on to win, 5-4, in 11 innings.

A The Braves entered the seventh on June 4, 2023 trailing, 5-3, before a run in the seventh and a ninth-inning grand slam by Eddie Rosario earned a victory, 8-5.

TURNING TWO: Atlanta erased a one-out single in the top of yesterday's seventh inning with a 5-4-3 double play to end the frame... The Braves have turned seven double plays through six games this season, tied with the Reds for the most in the National League and behind just the Astros (8) in the majors.

A Atlanta ranked 24th in baseball last season after turning just 98 double plays in their infield on the year.

A The Braves have turned their seven double plays despite pitching to a 38.9% ground ball percentage, which ranks tied for 24th in baseball.

BIRTHDAY BOY: 3B Austin Riley celebrates his 29th birthday today...He has played on his birthday in each of the last three seasons, and is 2-for-13 with a pair of singles on the day.

A Dating to his first full, 162-game season in 2021, Riley's 23.0 bWAR stand as most by a primary third baseman in the National League, and trail just José Ramírez's 30.0 in all of baseball.

A In 32 career games against Arizona, Riley has batted .346/.377/.800 with a 1.177 OPS and 39 RBI... He has 30 total extra-base hits in his 32 games, including 15 doubles, 14 homers and a triple.

A Four hundred forty-five players have tallied at least 100 career at-bats against the Diamondbacks since the franchise was founded in 1998...Of those, Riley's 1.177 OPS against the club ranks fourth, behind just Manny Ramirez (1.305), Barry Bonds (1.192) and Dante Bichette (1.192).

REYNALDO LÓPEZ: Makes his second start of the season and the first of his career versus Arizona...He has faced the Diamondbacks twice in his career out of the bullpen, and is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (2 ER/4.2 IP) and three strikeouts against the club.

A He last faced the D-backs in 2022 while with the White Sox, and has faced just two members of Arizona's current roster in more than three plate appearances...Carlos Santana is 3-for-20 (.150) against him, while James McCann is 7-for-16 (.438).

A López went 6.0 innings and allowed just three hits and one run in his season debut, March 28 vs. Kansas City...He averaged 94.4 mph on his four-seam fastball, and touched 97.1 mph with the pitch.

A The right-hander made just one start for Atlanta last season before undergoing season-ending shoulder surgery...In his last full season in 2024, López went 8-5 with a 1.99 ERA (30 ER/135.2 IP) in 26 games, 25 starts...His 1.99 ERA was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 25 starts... He completed 135.2 innings on the season, 26.1 shy of qualifying for the ERA title.

DRAKE BALDWIN: Plated four of Atlanta's five runs yesterday afternoon versus the A's, going 2-for-3 with a walk, double and a run scored...The only out he made, a flyout to center in the bottom of the seventh, was robbed over the fence by Denzel Clarke and would have been a home run in 11 different ballparks.

A The effort was the fourth four-RBI game of his career, tying Ozzie Albies and Austin Riley for the most on the team since 2025...Baldwin has totaled seven RBI through the team's first six games, the first Braves primary catcher to do so since Brian McCann in 2009 (also seven).

A Baldwin has already compiled 0.5 bWAR through the season's first six games, third most by a primary catcher in the majors behind the A's Shea Langeliers (0.7) and Marlins Liam Hicks (0.6).

A He currently leads Atlanta in hits (7, tied), runs (6), homers (3), RBI (7) and OPS (1.196.)

Today's Game

- Set to make his second start of the season and 125th of his career tonight at Chase Field, his first road start of 2026...The 6-foot-1, 225-pound right-hander from San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic, is in his third season with Atlanta and eighth full major league season.
- Allowed one earned run on three hits over 6.0 innings in his season debut on March 28 against Kansas City, striking out three and walking two on 77 pitches (47 strikes)...Allowed a solo home run to Salvador Pérez leading off the seventh inning before being removed...Atlanta won the game, 6-2, scoring all six runs in the eighth inning after López had exited.
- Has made just two career appearances against Arizona, both in relief, and is set to face the Diamondbacks as a starter for the first time tonight...Is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (2 ER/4.2 IP) all-time against the club, with one outing coming during his time with Washington in 2016 and the other with Chicago (AL) in 2022.
- Earned the win against Arizona on September 29, 2016 at Washington, tossing 3.2 innings and allowing two earned runs on three hits with two strikeouts...Tossed a scoreless 1.0-inning relief outing against the Diamondbacks on August 27, 2022 with the White Sox.
- Since joining Atlanta prior to the 2024 season, López's 2.09 ERA (36 ER/146.2 IP) across 27 starts is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least as many starts...He ranks ahead of Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (2.10), Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2.25) and teammate Chris Sale (2.40).
- Went 2-2 with a 4.15 ERA in five Grapefruit League starts this spring, striking out 15 over 17.1 innings with eight walks.
- Has gone 33-42 with a 4.17 ERA in 124 previous career starts, and 14-12 with a 2.99 ERA in 145 outings out of the bullpen.

Braves Recap

- Made just one start in 2025, April 1 at San Diego, allowing three earned runs and nine hits with one strikeout over 5.0 innings...Was placed on the 15-day injured list the following day with right shoulder inflammation...Was transferred to the 60-day injured list on April 3 and underwent arthroscopic right shoulder surgery on April 8...Missed the remainder of the season.
- In his first season with Atlanta in 2024, was named to the National League All-Star team, going 8-5 with a 1.99 ERA (30 ER/135.2 IP) in 26 games, 25 starts...His 2024 NL All-Star selection was the first of his career.
- His 1.99 ERA was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 25 starts in 2024.
- His 1.78 ERA at Truist Park was the lowest among qualifiers at home.
- His 2.00 ERA as a starter was the lowest in a player's first stint with the team in Braves franchise history dating to the Live Ball era (min. 25 starts).
- It was the fourth lowest ERA in baseball history (since 1920) for a player with at least 25 starts to begin a stint with a new franchise in a single season after making their debut with a different team...Only Hall-of-Famer Gaylord Perry (Cleveland, 1972) along with Roger Clemens (Toronto, '97), and Kevin Brown (Florida, '96) had lower ERAs in their first season with a new team.
- Did not allow more than two earned runs in 23 of his 26 outings in 2024.
- Recorded his first double-digit strikeout effort on August 20, 2024...It was the seventh of his career and first since September 5, 2019 at Cleveland.
- Missed 12 games in 2024 after being placed on the 15-day injured list on August 5 with right forearm inflammation...Missed 13 games later in the season with right shoulder inflammation.
- Pitched to a .090 opponent batting average with runners in scoring position in 2024; the lowest rate in the majors among starters with at least 10 outings.
- López's 1.57 ERA (13 ER/74.1 IP) was the lowest by a Brave through 13 starts since Hall-of-Famer Tom Glavine pitched to a 1.57 ERA and a 9-2 record in 2002...Glavine and fellow Hall-of-Famer Greg Maddux (1.41) are the only other starters in the Atlanta era (since 1966) with lower ERAs through 13 starts.

Career Recap

- Signed by the Atlanta Braves to a three-year contract with a club option for 2027 on November 20, 2023.
- Has played for five teams over a 10-year career...Started his career in the rotation, before transitioning to the bullpen in 2021.
- Made his major league debut on July 19, 2016 with Washington...Suffered an 8-4 loss to Los Angeles (NL) after starting the game and going 4.2 innings.
- Acquired by the White Sox on December 7, 2016 in a four-player trade that sent Adam Eaton to Washington...López, Dane Dunning and Lucas Giolito went to Chicago.
- Claimed off waivers by Cleveland from Los Angeles (AL) on July 19, 2022.
- Traded by Chicago (AL) to Los Angeles (AL) on July 26, 2023 along with Lucas Giolito in exchange for Edgar Quero and Ky Bush.
- Traded by Washington to Chicago (AL) along with Lucas Giolito, and Dane Dunning to Adam Eaton.
- Signed by Washington as a minor league free agent on August 8, 2012.

- Appeared in 42 games in his second season as a Brave, pitching to a 3-2 record and a 3.81 ERA (23 ER/54.1 IP) with 51 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP, his lowest since 2020...Was placed on the injured list on August 24 due to left shoulder inflammation and missed the remainder of the season.
- Ranked in the 99th percentile in baseball with a barrel rate of just 3.2% in 2025...His seven total barrels and 2.3% barrel rate allowed since joining the Braves in 2024 are both the best in the majors (min. 400 batters faced).
- Opponents hit ground balls off him 55.8% of the time last season (league average 42.4%)...Since his debut in 2017, Bummer's career ground ball rate of 64.2% is highest in the majors (min. 350 games).
- Tossed his curveball a career-high 35.1% of the time in 2025, the most of any major league pitcher with at least 900 total pitches last season...Utilized a curveball for the first time in 2024 at a 2.3% clip.

- In his third full season with Atlanta, appeared in a career-high 70 games and went 29-for-34 in save opportunities...Pitched to a 3.21 ERA (24 ER/67.1 IP)...Ranked fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors in saves.
- Among active pitchers with as many appearances since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022 (222 apps.), Iglesias owns the best WHIP (0.94) and second-best ERA (2.35, 57 ER/218.2 IP).
- Ranks second among Braves pitchers in franchise history (min. 100 G) in WHIP and ERA+ (180), third in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.88), fourth in hits-per-nine-innings (6.5) and fifth in ERA and saves (97).
- Did not allow a run in 42 of 45 appearances from June 9 until the end of the season...Led major league pitchers in this span (min. 40.0 IP) in hits-per-nine-innings (4.15) and saves (21), tied for the most fWAR among relievers (1.5) and ranked second in ERA (1.25, 6 ER/43.1 IP) and WHIP (0.69).
- Was named the NL Reliever of the Month for August for the third consecutive season after converting all 10 of his save opportunities and allowing a 0.69 ERA (1 ER/13.0 IP) in the month.

- Pitched to a 5-0 record with a 0.72 ERA (2 ER/25.0 IP), a 0.68 WHIP and 22 strikeouts in 24 outings with Atlanta to conclude the 2025 season.
- Allowed a run in his third appearance with the Braves, August 5, and then allowed one additional tally over his final 21 games...Strung together a career-high scoreless streak of 19.1 innings between runs.
- From his Braves debut on July 31 until the end of the season, Kinley led major league pitchers (min. 25.0 IP) in ERA and ranked third in WHIP and opponent's batting average (.126).

- Set a career high and led the team with 74 appearances, going 2-4 with a 3.29 ERA (25 ER/68.1 IP) and matching a career high with 76 punchouts...Collected the first two saves of his major league career.
- Did not allow a run in 31 of his first 38 appearances through June 29, tying for the sixth-lowest ERA (1.67, 7 ER/37.2 IP) among major league pitchers in that span (min. 35.0 IP).
- Ranked in the 90th percentile or better in baseball in expected ERA (91st, 2.91), walk percentage (92nd, 5.3%), hard-hit percentage (93rd, 33.5%), and whiff percentage (95th, 33.6%).
- Threw his slider 612 times and surrendered just 22 hits on it...Among pitchers that threw as many on the season, those 22 hits were the fewest in MLB...His slider carried a run value of 10, also ranking in the 95th percentile.
- Dating to his first full season in 2022, Lee's 2.76 ERA ranks fourth among all left-handed relievers in baseball to make at least 175 appearances...Among those pitchers, Lee's rate of 4.80 strikeouts-per-walk is best in the majors.
