METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Dodgers, 9-4, last night...The Mets are 3-2 in their last five games and 7-3 in their last 10 games...New York is 13-2-1 in 17 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, 11-day California road trip (1-2) at the Dodgers (1-2), Padres (three games) and Angels (three games).

CH-CH-CHANGES: Major League Baseball has made the following change...In the top of the third inning of the May 31 game vs. Washington, Juan Soto reached second base on what was originally scored a two-base error by Pete Alonso...This has been changed to a single and an error.

DINGERS: The Mets matched their season-high with four home runs last night...New York has homered in 10 of their last 12 games, hitting 18 home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 34 home runs in their previous 43 games.

MULTIPCITY: Pete Alonso recorded his 13th career multi-homer game last night...that places his seventh on the team's all-time list...Dave Kingman and Lucas Duda are tied for fifth with 16 such games...Darryl Strawberry is the franchise leader with 22 multi-homer games...Since he entered the league in 2019, Alonso's 13 multi-homer game are tied with Aaron Judge and Nelson Cruz for the most in the majors.

CONNECT FOUR: Pete Alonso owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (six) and is tied for second in games with multiple RBI (13) this season...He is the first player since Carlos Lee in 2005 with at least six 4+ RBI games in his team's first 55 contests...The only players with more through 55 team games are Juan Gonzalez (eight in 1998), Jimmie Foxx (seven in 1938) and Lou Gehrig (seven in 1930)...All three of those players finished the season with at least 157 RBI.

DODGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped the season series to the Dodgers in each of the last five seasons...The Mets last won a series at Dodger Stadium from September 3-5, 2018, winning two of the three games.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets lead the majors with a .291 average with runners in scoring position...They rank third in MLB with a .361 OBP and ninth with a .457 SLG in those situations...Several Mets are hitting .300 or better with RISP...Jeff McNeil leads the club with a .395 (17-43) mark in those scenarios...J.D. Davis is hitting .389 (7-18), Tomas Nido is batting .364 (8-22), Francisco Lindor has hit .321 (18-56), Mark Canha is batting .333 (14-42) and Pete Alonso is hitting .347 (17-49)...Alonso leads the majors with 40 RBI in RISP situations and has nine home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, four more than any other hitter in the majors.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has posted a 1.23 ERA (three earned run/22.0 innings) over their last six games...They have allowed 17 hits, walked five and struck out 20 in that span...The team's 3.35 ERA from relievers is third in the National League.

DAY MAN: New York is 16-8 in day games this season...The team's .667 winning percentage in the sunlight is tied for second in the majors and is second in the NL behind the Dodgers (12-5, .706)...The team's 156 wins in the day are the most in the NL and the tied with Minnesota for the most in The Show.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN': Pete Alonso has hit seven home runs in 11 career games at Dodger Stadium...Only Dave Kingman (9 HR/25 Games), Kevin McReynolds (9 HR/31 games) have hit more in Mets history...Alonso's seven home runs ties him with Edgardo Alfonzo (34 games) and Mike Piazza (26 games)...Overall, he is batting .378 (17-45) at Dodger Stadium with nine runs, two doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 15 RBI with a .417 OBP, a .933 SLG and a 1.350 OPS in that span.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 17-11 on the road this year...Their .607 road winning percentage is the fourth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 17th win on the road until June 29 in 2021 in their 40th road game (17-23)...New York is batting .259/.327/.401 away from Citi Field...Their .259 road average ranks second in the majors, while their .327 OBP ranks fourth.

ROAD WARRIOR: Pete Alonso is batting .281/.325/.561 with nine home runs and 30 RBI on the road this year...He owns a lifetime .948 OPS on the road...His .948 OPS is the highest in franchise history (min. 900 PA)...His .586 SLG on the road is also the best in franchise history...In 2022, his nine road homers are tied for third in the majors and are tied for the most in the NL...His 30 RBI on the road are second-most in the majors and top the NL.

LA ISSUES: The Mets are 6-24 (.200) vs. the Dodgers since 2017...It is the club's lowest winning percentage vs. any team during that span (min. 10 games)...The team ERA vs. Los Angeles is 5.72 and the team batting average is .216...New York is 4-14 (.222) at Dodger Stadium since 2017.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: J.D. Davis has recorded multiple hits in four of his last nine games...He is batting .387 (12-31) with six runs, three doubles, three RBI, a walk with a .424 OBP, a .484 SLG and a .908 OPS in that span...Over his last 19 games, Davis is batting .279/.338/.377...He owns a .326/.407/.500 slashline in 17 road games, compared to a .170/.264/.213 slashline in 16 games at Citi Field in 2022.

BY THE WAY: New York has won 36 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .655 winning percentage is third in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 36-19 record through the team's first 55 games...Only the 1986 (39-16) and the 1988 (38-17) teams posted a better record through the first 55 games of the season.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor has 22 RBI in his last 12 games and has 45 RBI this season, nine more than he had in the entire first half last year (87 games)...He did not reach 45 RBI last year until September 7 in his 102nd game of the year...Lindor is fourth in the majors and third in the NL in RBI...He is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 38 runs scored...Over his last 20 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .299 (23-77) with 20 runs, two doubles, two triples, four home runs, 26 RBI, 10 walks, three steals with a .374 OBP, a .532 SLG and a .906 OPS.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the sixth-most in the majors...He leads major league relievers with 40 strikeouts...His 16.62 strikeouts per nine innings also leads the majors...He has struck out 40 of the 88 batters he faced, good for 45.5%...He is 2-1 with 11 saves, a 2.49 ERA (six earned runs/21.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are 21-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodríguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 74 saves, a 3.80 ERA (71 earned runs/168.0 innings) with 69 walks and 278 strikeouts...His 278 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (307) and Josh Hader (297) have struck out more...Additionally, his 278 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 287...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

THE GUILLORME CHEF: Luis Guillorme is one of nine players in the majors with more walks than strikeouts this year (min. 100 PA)...He has 15 walks and 13 strikeouts this season...He has reached base safely in eight straight games dating to May 25, posting a .514 OBP in that span...He is batting .351/.440/.436 with 19 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 15 walks and a steal with this season...After batting .071 (1-14) in his first eight games, Guillorme is batting .400 (32-80) with 19 runs, five doubles, a home run, six RBI, 12 walks, a steal with a .478 OBP, a .500 SLG and a .978 OPS over his last 28 games...Among players with 100 or more plate appearances, Guillorme's .351 batting average is third in the majors and is the best in the NL...His .440 OBP is tied for second in the majors and tied for the best in the National League.

MARTE PARTAY: Starling Marte has safely hit in 14 of his last 17 games and is batting .320 (24-75) in that span with 17 runs, five doubles, two triples, three home runs, 12 RBI, three walks and a .906 OPS in that stretch...He is batting .279 (56-201) with 34 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, six home runs, 32 RBI with a .438 SLG in 47 games this year.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last seven games, Tomás Nido is batting .400 (8-20) with five runs, a double, three RBI, two walks with a .905 OPS...Over his last 16 games, he is batting .298 (14-47) with five runs, two doubles, five RBI, four walks with a .353 OBP.

WILLIAMS NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his first career win as a Met after throwing a season-high 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals on May 31 at Citi Field...Allowed four hits, issued two walks and struck out one batter...Extended his scoreless streak to 10.2 innings.

VS. LOS ANGELES NL: In five career games (four starts) against the Dodgers, Williams is 0-1 with a 6.14 ERA (15 ER/22.0 IP)...As a Met, Williams threw 2.0 scoreless innings out of the bullpen on August 19, 2021 at Dodger Stadium.

LAST FIVE: Williams' last five appearances have included three starts and two relief outings...He has thrown 20.1 total innings in that span and has allowed just four runs, good for a 1.77 ERA, tied for fifth in the NL since May 11 (min. 20.0 IP)...He has allowed 14 hits and five walks with 16 strikeouts...Four of those five outings have been scoreless and he's allowed four hits or fewer in all five.

HOME/ROAD: This season, Williams has made four appearances (two starts) at Citi Field and is 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA (three earned runs/13.1 innings)...By contrast, Williams is 0-3 with a 5.02 ERA (eight earned runs/14.1 innings) in five appearances (two starts) on the road.

WITH THE METS: Since being acquired from the Mets on July 30, 2021, Williams has made 19 appearances (seven starts) with the Amazin's...Williams has a 3.30 ERA (22 earned runs/60.0 innings) with 15 walks and 52 strikeouts.

STARTS/RELIEF: With New York, Williams is 1-2 and has a 3.71 ERA (11 earned runs/26.2 innings) with six walks and 18 strikeouts in six starts...In 12 relief outings, he is 0-1 with a 3.16 ERA (11 earned runs/31.1 innings).

MEET THE MET: Was acquired from Chicago-NL on July 30, 2021 with INF Javier Báez for minor league OF Pete Crow-Armstrong...Aside from baseball, Williams co-hosts a podcast with former teammate Steven Brault (@podcastIMHO)...He is the co-founder of Project 34; a non-profit that assists with the purchasing of medical equipment and assistive devices that may not be otherwise accessible to a patient, as well as providing grants to individuals to afford physical therapy for optimal function (projectcthirtyfour.com)...Wore #34 in Pittsburgh to honor former ASU teammate Cory Hahn, who suffered a career-ending injury in 2011...He has four kids, including the newest addition to the family, a girl in the 2021-22 offseason...Is an avid reader, especially science fiction...Is a big Star Wars fan.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco needs five wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,300 career innings pitched on April 10 at Washington.
