THE WRIGHT WAY: Today, David Wright will become the eighth Mets player in franchise history to have his number retired by the organization, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31), Jerry Koosman (#36), Keith Hernandez (#17), Willie Mays (#24), Dwight Gooden (#16) and Darryl Strawberry (#18)...In addition, the Mets have retired three other numbers, including Manager Gil Hodges (#14), Manager Casey Stengel (#37) and Jackie Robinson (#42)...Wright joins Seaver as the only players to have their number retired and enter the Mets Hall of Fame on the same day.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have posted a 33-15 record at home...Their .688 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors...Their 33 wins are tied for the most in The Show...New York has posted a 3.21 ERA at home this year, which is the fourth-best in MLB and third in the NL.

FIRST-HALF DUBS: New York collected 55 wins prior to the All-Star break...That is the third-most wins in franchise history in the first-half behind 59 wins in 1986 and 58 victories in 2022.

GRAND GROUP: Four players in franchise history have played in 1,000 or more games, hit 100 or more homers and walked 500 or more times...Darryl Strawberry, Howard Johnson, David Wright and Brandon Nimmo.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in 12 straight games...He is batting .333 (15-45) with 11 runs, three doubles, three homers, 10 RBI, four walks, four steals, a .412 OBP and a .600 SLG in that span...In 40 games since the start of June, Nimmo has hit .301/.367/.529 with 24 runs, eight doubles, nine homers, 24 RBI, 13 walks, 10 steals and an .896 OPS...He has stolen 11 bases in 94 games this year...He stole a career-high 15 in 151 contests in 2024.

WALK THIS WAY: Juan Soto has drawn 77 walks, the most in team history prior to the All-Star Game...John Olerud is second with 74 walks in 1999...Soto had 83 free passes in 2023 with San Diego, the most prior to the break for him...The last players other than Soto with more walks in the first half was Mike Trout with 84 and Bryce Harper with 78 free passes in 2018.

DON'T STEAL THIS ALBUM: Among catchers with 250 or more innings behind the plate this year, Luis Torrens ranks second in the majors with 41.9 percent caught stealing (18 SB, 13 CS, 435.2 IP)...Only Salvador Perez is better (50.0 percent caught stealing, 9 SB, 9 CS, 428.0 IP).

JUAN OF A KIND: Soto hit his 24th homer of the season last night, which is tied for the ninth-most in the majors...His 24 home runs are his most through his first 97 games of a single season and are the fifth-most by a Met in their first 97 games with the franchise...He trails only Pete Alonso (33), Yoenis Céspedes (32), Carlos Delgado (26) and Dave Kingman (25)...Since May 30, has hit .315/.453/.685 (45-143) with 37 runs, five doubles, 16 home runs, 32 RBI, 35 walks and four stolen bases...In that span, leads among qualified Major League batters in OBP and OPS (1.138), is second in walks and runs scored, and third in home runs, SLG and total bases.

KEEPIN' IT 200: Francisco Lindor collected his 200th career stolen base on July 12 at Kansas City...He is one of nine active players with 200 or more stolen bases...He joins Roberto Alomar and Carlos Beltrán as the only Puerto Rico-born players with 200 homers and 200 stolen bases.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to *Elias*, Francisco Lindor has hit 258 home runs and stolen 198 bases as a *shortstop*...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

RONNY RAKES: Ronny Mauricio is batting .277/.358/.468 with nine runs scored, three doubles, two homers, three RBI and six walks over his last 15 games dating to June 24...In 13 home games, Mauricio has a .268/.333/.463 (11-41) slashline with two homers, two doubles, three walks, three RBI and seven runs.

POLAR BEAR POWER: Pete Alonso has six seasons of 20 or more homers, tying Mike Piazza and David Wright for the second-most such seasons in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is first with eight seasons with 20 or more homers.

PEAK PETE PERFORMANCE: Alonso is second in the majors with 26 doubles, tied for eighth in the NL with 21 homers, eighth with a .898 OPS and 10th a .372 OBP and 11th with a .526 slugging percentage.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 19 saves in 20 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Díaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for third in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors with 19 saves...He has not allowed a run in 25 of his last 26 games dating back to April 26 with 38 strikeouts covering 27.0 innings.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty is hitting .296 (16-54) with five runs, four doubles, one homer, six RBI, a .361 OBP and a .787 OPS in his last 20 games dating to June 23...In 43 home games this season, Baty has an .871 OPS with eight home runs, three doubles, one triple, 22 RBI and 17 runs.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings in the Mets' 3-2 loss at Kansas City on July 13...Both runs allowed came on a two-run double by LF John Rave in the second innings...Issued one walk and recorded two strikeouts...Marked the first time Holmes has issued one or zero walks in consecutive starts since June 1 -7.

THE GAME OF RISP: Over his last two starts, opposing batters are 5-7 with two doubles and seven RBI against Holmes with runners in scoring position...In his first 17 starts of the season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .111 (7-63) average with runners in scoring position...Overall, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .170 (12-70) average with runners in scoring position, the seventh-best mark in the majors (min. 70 batters faced w/RISP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.5% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 65.7% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.1% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

HOLMES SWEET HOLMES: In nine starts at Citi Field this season, Holmes is 4-1 with a 3.16 ERA (18 ER/51.1 IP)...Holmes has allowed two or fewer runs in six of his nine home starts and one or zero runs in five of his nine starts...At Home, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .193 (35-181) average, the seventh-best mark in the NL and the 14th-best mark in the majors (min. 150 batters faced).

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last 12 starts, Holmes has allowed 11 home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established career highs in both innings (103.1) and strikeouts (83)...He has also earned a career-high-tying eight wins...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 9-6 with a 3.88 ERA (51 ER/118.1 IP) in 22 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1

with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
