The Cardinals are broadcasting 18 Spring Training games on their radio flagship station KMOX 1120 AM...Mike Shannon, John Rooney, Mike Claiborne and Ricky Horton will be on the call...the 50,000-watt station can sometimes be heard as far south as Jupiter on a clear day...Six games will not be broadcast on KMOX this spring and can be heard on [cardinals.com](http://cardinals.com).

## ON THE TUBE

FOX Sports Midwest (rebranding as Bally Sports Midwest in the coming weeks) is scheduled to televise 12 games in 2021 (subject to change)...every telecast will be streamed live on the FOX Sports GO app and at [FOXSportsGO.com](http://FOXSportsGO.com)...Dan McLaughlin will call the action with Jim Edmonds, Brad Thompson and Ricky Horton.

## LAST SEASON

The Cardinals captured 2nd place (via head-to-head tie breaker over Cincinnati) in the NL Central and a 5th seed in the National League Playoffs, going 30-28, as they concluded their 129th season of play in the Senior Circuit, finishing 3.0 games back of 1st place Chicago...the Cardinals lost to the San Diego Padres, 2-1, in the Wild Card Series...St. Louis has recorded 13-straight winning seasons dating to 2008.

**February 17:** Opened camp with 39 roster players and 28 non-roster invitees.

**February 14:** Signed OF Matt Szczur to a minor league contract and invited him to spring training.

**February 12:** Acquired C Ali Sánchez from the New York Mets in exchange for cash considerations.

**February 10:** Acquired RHP Johan Quezada from the Philadelphia Phillies in exchange for cash considerations.

**February 9:** Signed C Yadier Molina to a one-year contract for 2021.

**February 1:** Acquired 3B Nolan Arenado and cash considerations from the Colorado Rockies in exchange for LHP Austin Gomber, 3B Elehuris Montero, RHP Tony Locey, SS Mateo Gil, and RHP Jake Sommers.

**January 29:** Signed RHP Adam Wainwright to a one-year contract for 2021.

## CARDINALS APPROVED TO HOST FANS AT BUSCH

**IN 2021:** The Cardinals, in cooperation with the City of St. Louis and Major League Baseball, have received approval to welcome guests back to Busch Stadium for the 2021 season, beginning Thursday, April 8. To begin the season, up to approximately 32% of capacity will be allowed to attend games at Busch Stadium. The organization will begin selling tickets to April home games soon, with Cardinals Season Ticket Holders receiving first opportunity to secure tickets for the first two homestands. If inventory allows, ticket on-sale dates for the general public will be determined and announced at a later date. **SETTING UP CAMP:** The Cardinals have 67 players on their spring roster, including 28 non-roster invitees...there are eight Cardinals first round picks in camp: RHP Jack Flaherty (2014), RHP Jake Woodford (2015), Delvin Pérez (2016), RHP Dakota Hudson (2016), OF Dylan Carlson (2016), INF Nolan Gorman (2018), RHP Griffin Roberts (2018) and LHP Zack Thompson (2019)...RHP Dakota Hudson (right elbow) is expected to start the season on the Injured List...seven Cardinals sport 7+ years of MLB service time (Yadier Molina, Adam Wainwright, Andrew Miller, Paul Goldschmidt, Matt Carpenter, Nolan Arenado, Carlos Martínez).

**ANOTHER ONE FOR THE TROPHY CASE:** In December, pitcher Adam Wainwright was the recipient of the prestigious 2020 Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award for his outstanding philanthropy work around the world through his Big League Impact charitable foundation...Wainwright is the 6th Cardinal to win the award, most by any MLB Club, joining Lou Brock (1975), Ozzie Smith (1995), Albert Pujols (2008), Carlos Beltrán (2013) and Yadier Molina (2018).

**GOLD LEATHER:** Left fielder Tyler O'Neill was the recipient of the 2020 NL Rawlings Gold Glove award, first of his career and the first left fielder in Cardinals history to win the coveted defensive trophy...First baseman Paul Goldschmidt finished as a Gold Glove finalist, while former Cardinal Kolton Wong took home the honor for second base...the Cardinals infield now boasts 20 Gold Gloves between Yadier Molina (9), Nolan Arenado (8) and Goldschmidt (3), while the 91 Gold Glove Awards are most all-time among MLB franchises.

**FANS IN THE STANDS:** Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium is allowing approx. 1,500 fans (21% of typical capacity) into the stadium for the team's contests in March...There will be a minimum distance of six feet between seated groups and all fans and staff are required to wear masks...Social distancing and proper hygiene will be enforced and encouraged by staff and guests entering the stadium throughout Spring.

**NEW FACES:** Players acquired during the offseason and appearing in their first Cardinals spring camp include 3B Nolan Arenado, catchers Tyler Heineman (FA) and Ali Sánchez (NYM), infielders Max Moroff (FA) and José Rondón (FA), outfielder Matt Szczur (FA) and pitchers Johan Quezada (PHI) and Garrett Williams (LAA-Rule 5 AAA).

**ARENADO JOINS ST. LOUIS:** In early February, the Cardinals acquired five-time National League All-Star 3B Nolan Arenado and cash considerations from the Colorado Rockies in exchange for LHP Austin Gomber, INF Elehuris Montero, RHP Tony Locey, INF Mateo Gil and RHP Jake Sommers...The 29-year-old is regarded as the premier third baseman in Major League Baseball, winning the Rawlings Gold Glove Award for eight consecutive seasons to begin his professional career and the Rawlings Platinum Glove Award, honoring him as the league's best overall defender, in each of the last four seasons.

**THE BATTERY IS BACK:** The Cardinals re-signed franchise icons Yadier Molina and Adam Wainwright to one-year contracts this offseason. The duo have paired up in 274 starts, ranking 6th all-time in MLB history as batterymates...Molina will move into 2nd this year with 18 seasons played solely for the Cardinals, trailing only Stan Musial's record 22 seasons...Wainwright enters his 17th season with the Cardinals, matching Bob Gibson (1959-75) for the 2nd-most as a pitcher in a Redbirds uniform behind Jesse Haines (18 years, 1920-37).

**10 YEARS LATER:** The 2021 season marks the 10th anniversary of the 2011 championship winning team that earned a Wild Card berth on the last day of the regular season after being 10.5 games back in late August and ultimately defeating the Texas Rangers in a thrilling seven-game series to earn the club's 11th World Series title.

# TODAY'S PITCHERS

## #50 • Adam Wainwright • RHP • 39 yrs

- The 2021 season is Wainwright's 17th in the Cardinals organization and 16th as an active player (2005-10, '12-21), tying Lou Brock (1964-79) for 5th-most in franchise history, and 3rd-most by a pitcher behind Jesse Haines (18 years, 1920-37) and Bob Gibson (17 years, 1959-75).
- Among players to appear exclusively as a Cardinal in their career, only Stan Musial (22, 1941-44, '46-63), Yadier Molina (18, 2004-21), and Bob Gibson (17, 1959-75) have been a Cardinal longer than Wainwright.
- Wainwright is tied with Washington's Ryan Zimmerman (16 seasons, 2005-19, '21) as the 2nd-longest tenured active Major Leaguer to appear with the same franchise, trailing only teammate Yadier Molina (18, 2004-21).
- Enters 2021 as the oldest active player in the National League (6th-oldest in MLB).
- Wainwright and Molina have been a starting battery for 274 career regular season games, most in Cardinals history and 6th-most in Major League history (since 1901).
- Winner of the prestigious 2020 Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, annually given by Major League Baseball to the player "who best represents the game of baseball through positive contributions on and off the field, including sportsmanship and community involvement. Joined Yadier Molina (2018), Carlos Beltran (2013), Albert Pujols (2008), Ozzie Smith (1995) and Lou Brock (1975) as former Cardinals winners.

## #40 • Jake Woodford • LHP • 24 yrs

- Enters 2021 ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 24 prospect in the Cardinals organization.
- A three-time Minor League All-Star in his first five professional seasons: Pacific Coast League (2019), Texas League (2018) and Midwest League (2016).
- Started 20 or more games and pitched 108 innings or more in each of his first four full minor league seasons.
- Leads all Cardinals minor league pitchers in games started (75) and innings pitched (415.2) since 2017.

## #52 • Matthew Liberatore • RHP • 26 yrs

- Ranked as the No. 2 prospect in the Cardinals organization behind outfielder Dylan Carlson by *Baseball America* and No. 3 in *MLB.com*, in the 2021 preseason rankings.
- Has allowed just two home runs over 111.0 career innings facing 459 total batters over his first two professional seasons (2018-19). Has yet to allow a home run to a right-handed batter during his professional career.
- Has been a teammate, since youth through the 2017 18U World Cup, with his close friend and Cardinals minor league third baseman Nolan Gorman.
- Did not pitch during the 2020 season, but was at the Alternate Training Site in Springfield. Made two relief appearances for St. Louis at Major League Spring Training as a 20-year old.

## #61 • Seth Elledge • RHP • 24 yrs

- Enters 2021 ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 21 prospect in the Cardinals organization.
- Made his MLB debut at Chicago White Sox (8/16) and struck out five batters over 2.1 scoreless innings, becoming the first Cardinals reliever since Tom Cheney (4/21/57) to strike out five or more batters in 2.1 or more scoreless innings in his MLB debut.
- Earned his first Major League win vs. Cincinnati as the Cardinals rallied for their first walk-off win of the 2020 season (5-4) in his 3rd career appearance.
- Averages 11.64 strikeouts/9 IP over 147.2 minor league innings.
