RAYS REPORT—The Rays open a seven-game homestand against the Orioles (four to play) and Tigers (three to play) tonight at Steinbrenner Field...are coming off a 4-2 road trip against the Red Sox (1-2) and Mets (3-0)...are a season-high seven games above .500 for the first time since the end of the 2023 season (.79-.63)...have won three straight, five of seven, nine of 12, 12 of 17, 18 of 24, 20 of 29, 23 of 34, 25 of 39 and 30 of their last 48 games following a 9-14 start...are 9-4 in June, tied with three other clubs (AZ, BAL, BOS) for second in the majors behind the Astros (10-3)...are 3-0 on a stretch of 19 games in 20 days from June 13–July 2...53 of their remaining 91 games will be on the road, including 16 of their next 26 before the All-Star break...have played the fewest road games in the majors (26) and the most home games (43)...are third in the AL/sixth in MLB in run differential (+62)...have held a winning record for 19 straight days after spending 51 consecutive days at or below .500 from April 5–May 25...have sole possession of second in the AL East for the first time since entering play on May 30 (29-28)...are 3.5 GB the first-place Yankees (43-28), their smallest deficit since entering play on May 7 (3.5 GB)...pending tonight's results, they could potentially reach as few as 2.5 GB for the first time since entering play on April 27 (2.5 GB)...have been in second or third for 23 consecutive days after spending 16 days in fourth from May 8-23...on the season, they have spent two days in first, 19 in second, 23 in third, 30 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays completed a three-game sweep with a 9-0 win over the Mets on Father's Day...it marked their sixth shutout win, tied for sixth most in the AL, and third by seven runs or more, tied with the Padres for second most in MLB behind the Cubs (4).
- ✦ They drew a season-high nine walks in the win, their most since May 5, 2024 vs. NYM (9BB) and most on the road since Aug. 5, 2022 at DET (13BB).
- ✦ The Rays are an MLB-best 18-6 over their last 24 games since May 20, increasing their postseason odds from 11.2 pct. to 55.7 pct. (+44.5%), per FanGraphs...see the table to the right for a full breakdown of their statistical rankings over that span.
- ✦ The Rays bullpen carries a 16.2 scoreless inning streak into tonight's contest...the streak has lowered their season ERA to an AL-best 3.05 (233.0IP, 79ER), third in the majors behind the Giants (2.60) and Mets (3.01).
- ✦ The Rays MLB-leading 97 SB are seven more than the next closest team (CHC - 90SB)...they are on pace for 221 SB—the current club record is 194 SB, set in 2009.
- ✦ Tampa Bay has scored first in three straight, nine of 12, 12 of 17, 16 of 22 and 22 of its last 32 games...the club is 14-2 in its last 16 games when scoring first, and its 26-8 (.765) record when doing so ranks second in the AL behind the Tigers (33-7/.825).
- ✦ This marks the Rays third of seven four-game series this season...in the previous two, they lost three of four to the Yankees at Steinbrenner Field (April 17-20) and split with the Astros in Houston (May 29–June 1).
- ✦ The Rays have won seven consecutive series openers, their longest streak since claiming nine straight from July 25–Aug. 22, 2023...their 14-9 (.609) record in openers ranks second in the AL behind the Tigers (19-4/.826).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Earlier today, the Rays added **RHP Forrest Whitley** to the active roster and optioned **RHP Mason Englert** to Triple-A Durham...Whitley was acquired from the Astros for cash considerations on Friday...he will wear No. 38.

HOW SWEEP IT IS—The Rays three-game sweep over the Mets was their first on the road in June or later against a team that entered with the best record in the majors in franchise history, excluding the abbreviated 2020 season (Stats Perform)...it was the fourth time accomplishing the feat regardless of venue, joining Aug. 24-26, 2018 vs. BOS, June 22-24, 2018 vs. NYY and June 17-19, 2008 vs. CHC...the Rays (4) are one of seven AL teams with four sweeps or more this season...they are 6-1-1 in their last eight series and 12-4-1 in their last 17.

- ✦ The Rays are an MLB-best 29-21 against clubs that currently have a .500 or better record...they are 10-11 against sub-.500 teams, 28th in MLB.
- 24/7**—The Rays have scored seven runs or more in three straight games, their longest streak since May 13-17, 2023 (4G)...they have reached the mark in five of their last eight games and nine of their last 20, playing 6.3 runs per contest in the latter span...their 19 games with seven runs or more this season are tied with the Tigers for second most in the AL behind the Yankees (21G) and are tied for sixth in the majors...the Rays are averaging an AL-best 5.02 runs per game since the start of May (41G), second in the majors behind the Dodgers (5.66)...they scored 3.67 runs per game in March/April, seventh in the AL/tied for 17th in MLB.

- ✦ The Rays are 25-2 (.926) when scoring five runs or more, tied with the Blue Jays (25-2) for second best in the majors behind the Twins (26-2/.929).
- HOME COOKING**—The Rays will play 10 of their next 16 games at Steinbrenner Field before embarking on a 10-game, 11-day road trip through Minnesota, Detroit and Boston from July 4-13 to close their pre-All-Star-break schedule...they have won five of their last six home games and are 12-2 in their last 14...each of their last five home games have been one-run affairs, tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history behind runs of seven (Aug. 3-20, 2018) and six games (Sept. 1-18, 2010)...each of their last five home losses have come by two runs or fewer, and their last four wins in Tampa were one-run games.

- ✦ **Jonathan Aranda** ranks third in the majors with a .369 (.45-for-122) home batting average, and his .448 on-base pct. is second behind NYY **Aaron Judge** (.485)...he is 12-for-28 (.414) over his last nine home games...**Brandon Lowe** has homered six times across his last 13 games in Tampa, batting .340 (17-for-50) while adding 4 2B and 10 RBI...**Yandy Diaz** is 7-for-18 (.389) over a five-game home hitting streak.

HOT, HOT, HOT—**Junior Caminero** has homered in back-to-back games for the third time this season and fourth time in his career...the 21-year-old has 8 HR in his last 17 games since May 28, tied with NYY **Aaron Judge** for the most in the majors in that stretch...Caminero also has an MLB-leading 18 XBH (9 2B, 9 HR) in his last 22 games since May 23—his .698 slugging pct. in that span trails only **Judge** (.787) and SEA **Cal Raleigh** (.701) among AL hitters...**Jonathan Aranda** is slashing .377/.487/.541 (23-for-61) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 14 RBI, 10 BB and 14 R over his last 19 games...**Taylor Walls** is 10-for-27 (.370) with 5 XBH in his last nine.

DÍAZ DIALED IN—**Yandy Diaz**, who is riding a 10-game on-base streak, has collected multiple hits in five of his last six games, going 13-for-26 (.500) with 2 HR and 15 hard-hit balls (95 mph or more)...he has hit safely in 11 of his last 14 contests, batting .379/.431/.621 (22-for-58) with 3 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 12 RBI, 6 BB and 8 SO...Diaz has recorded 123 hard-hit balls on the season, third in the majors behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (126) and TOR **Bo Bichette** (124)...both Ohtani (326PA) and Bichette (321PA) have more plate appearances than Diaz (287PA)...he is on pace for 280 hard-hit balls, which would shatter his own team record set in 2023 (234) and mark the fourth-highest total by any hitter in the Statcast era (since 2015), trailing ATL **Ronald Acuña Jr.** in 2023 (310), Ohtani in 2024 (288) and TOR **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** in 2024 (287).

- ✦ Diaz, **Junior Caminero** (106), **Brandon Lowe** (87) and **Jonathan Aranda** (86) have combined for over half of the Rays hard-hit balls (54.9% - 402/732).

BIRDS FLY SOUTH—The Rays and Orioles will begin a 13-game, four-series season series tonight...the Rays will meet the Orioles, the last AL East club Tampa Bay has faced this season, seven times in the next 11 days, including a three-game set in Baltimore from June 27-29...after dropping nine of 13 games last season and eight of 13 in 2023, the Rays have lost consecutive season series to Baltimore for the first time since 2014-16...they are 4-11 in the last 15 matchups and 8-17 in the last 25...the Rays are 3-8-2 in their last 13 series against the Orioles, including 1-5-2 since the start of 2023...they have lost seven of their last eight home games to Baltimore, a stretch that began on July 22, 2023.

- ✦ The Rays are 8-3 in their last 11 games vs. AL East opponents and have won four of their last five home games against the division.
- ✦ **Yandy Diaz** went 11-for-32 (.344) with 1 HR in his last eight games vs. the Orioles last season...**José Caballero** was 6-for-18 (.333) with 2 2B and 1 HR in his last six.
- ✦ **OF Dylan Carlson** (2024), **RHP Zach Eflin** (2023-24), **RHP Andrew Kittredge** (2017-23) and **RHP Charlie Morton** (2019-20) are all former Rays.
- ✦ Orioles interim manager **Tony Mansolino** appeared in 22 games for Class-A Clearwater in 2008 during his time in the Phillies system.

DOWN ON THE FARM—**INF Bob Seymour** was named International League Player of the Week for June 9-15 after going 8-for-21 (.381) with 1 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 9 RBI, 4 BB and 1 SO over six games in the Bulls series win vs. Charlotte...it marks the first weekly league honor of Seymour's minor league career...the 26-year-old leads the IL in both home runs (16) and RBI (55)...Rays farmhands have combined for 14 weekly awards, tied with the Giants and Mariners for second most in baseball behind the Brewers organization (15).

TONIGHT'S START—Ryan Pepiot (PEP-ee-oh) gets the ball for his team-leading 15th start of the season and 10th at home...marks his 51st career start (58th appearance) and 30th at home (34th appearance)...has thrown quality starts in six of his last seven outings (2.49 ERA/43.1IP, 12ER)...is 1-0 with a 2.16 ERA (25.0IP, 6ER), 0.88 WHIP and .195 (16-for-82) opp. average over his last four starts...is five strikeouts shy of 300 for his career...acquired from the Dodgers along with **OF Jonny DeLuca** for **RHP Tyler Glasnow**, **OF Manuel Margot** and cash considerations, Dec. 16, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT—Pepiot fanned a season-high nine batters on a career-high 108 pitches, but took the loss in the Rays 3-1 loss to the Red Sox on June 10 at Fenway Park (L, 5.2IP, 5H, 3ER, 2BB, 9SO, HR)...he surrendered multiple earned runs in the 1st inning for the first time since June 4, 2024 at MIA (3ER) after allowing a single, a double and then a two-run double from **Roman Anthony** that made it 2-0 Red Sox...Pepiot followed that up by putting away seven of his next nine batters (4SO, 2BB) before he allowed a single to **Trevor Story** in the 4th...he then retired eight in a row before allowing a solo home run to Story in the 6th that ended his day.

- ✦ The nine strikeouts were the most for Pepiot since he struck out a career-high 12 batters on Sept. 18, 2024 vs. BOS...he has tallied nine strikeouts or more in five career games, but his teams have gone 1-4 in those outings.
- ✦ He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last 10 starts...has gone 2-4 and pitched to a 2.72 ERA (59.2IP, 18ER) with a 0.97 WHIP and a .206 (43-for-209) opp. average in that span...his WHIP and opp. average in that span (since April 20) rank eighth among qualified AL pitchers, while his ERA ranks ninth.
- ✦ Pepiot allowed his 13th home run of the season...21 of the 31 runs (67.7%) he has allowed have come on his 30 extra-base hits allowed, with 16 (51.6%) of those runs coming on the 13 HR against him.

BIRD IS THE WORD—Pepiot will be making his third career start opposite the Orioles and his second at home, with the previous two occurring during the 2024 campaign...he went 1-1 with a 3.97 ERA (11.1IP, 5ER) over those outings...in his lone start at home on June 10, he went 6.0 innings but allowed four earned runs on nine hits (2HR) with nine strikeouts in a 5-2 defeat at Tropicana Field...in his other start on Sept. 7, he earned the win after tossing 5.1 innings of one-run ball on six hits (1HR) and two walks with four strikeouts in a 7-1 victory.

- ✦ Pepiot is 3-7 with a 3.82 ERA (66.0IP, 28ER) in his 12 career starts vs. AL East opponents...has posted a 3.80 ERA (45.0IP, 19ER) with 54 strikeouts and a .230 (40-for-174) opp. average in his last eight starts against the division dating back to Sept. 18, 2024 vs. BOS, but the Rays are 1-7 in those games.

HOME COOKIN'—He has pitched to a 2.61 ERA (31.0IP, 9ER) in his last five home starts (April 20–pres.) compared to his 4.91 ERA (22.0IP, 12ER) in his first four starts at Steinbrenner Field...the right-hander has also held a .208 (22-for-106) opp. average with five home runs in his last five against his .286 (26-for-91) opp. average and six home runs in his first four...he has gone 5.0 innings or more in 10 straight starts and 16 of his last 17 (May 29, 2024–pres.).

QUALITY IN QUANTITY—Pepiot has recorded a quality start in six of his last seven starts dating back to May 8 vs. PHI...this stretch includes a career-high six-game quality start streak (May 8–June 5), the longest single-season streak by a Rays pitcher since **Shane McClanahan's** club-record 13-start run from May 11–July 26, 2022...he became the 19th Rays pitcher (28x) to record six consecutive quality starts within a calendar year, and he joined McClanahan as the club's only pitchers to do so over the last six seasons since 2020...over his last seven starts, Pepiot is 1-2 with a 2.49 ERA (43.1IP, 12ER) and 0.90 WHIP, holding opponents to a .195/.244/.322 (29-for-149) line...his nine quality starts this season are tied with **Zack Littell** for the team lead and are tied for fourth most in the AL with seven other pitchers, trailing **HOU Hunter Brown** (11QS) and **NY Yankees Max Fried** and **HOU Framber Valdez** (both 10QS).

- ✦ The Rays have lost when Pepiot throws a quality start five times, tied with three others for third most in the majors behind **PIT Mitch Keller** (8G) and **WSH MacKenzie Gore** (6G)...excluding a 13-0 win over the Blue Jays on May 25, the Rays have provided him with 2.03 runs of support per 9.0 IP in his quality starts.
- ✦ He has recorded quality starts in eight of his last 10 outings overall and tossed 6.0 IP or more in nine of his last 11.
- ✦ Pepiot has allowed three runs or fewer in 26 of his last 28 starts dating back to June 21, 2024 at PIT.

REVERSE, REVERSE—He has limited lefties to a .179 (22-for-123) average, including an 9-for-64 (.141) clip with 22 SO over his last seven starts...the opp. AVG since May 2 is the fourth-lowest mark among major league starting right-handed pitchers, trailing **PHI Zack Wheeler** (.138), **MIA Cal Quantrill** (.140), and **HOU Lance McCullers Jr.** (.140)...Pepiot's .143 (6-for-42) opp. average vs. lefties in May was the lowest among AL pitchers (min. 40AB) during the month.

- ✦ RHH are batting .266 (47-for-177) against Pepiot, but this includes a 9-for-55 (.164) clip across his last four starts (.321 in first 10GS).

AMBUSHED—Opponents are 14-for-44 (.318) against Pepiot when putting the first pitch in play, including 8-for-18 (.444) off his four-seam fastball...they are batting .346 (28-for-81) when putting one of his first two offerings in play and .187 (41-for-219) in at-bats of three pitches or more.

TOP HEAVY—The first three spots in opposing lineups are batting .296/.344/.539 (34-for-115) against Pepiot, but 4-9 hitters have produced a .189/.252/.357 (35-for-185) line...this includes a .121 (4-for-33) average against cleanup hitters, tied with **KC Kris Bubic** (4-for-33) for the second-lowest mark among qualified AL pitchers behind **TOR Kevin Gausman** (.118/4-for-34) and tied for fifth lowest in MLB behind **MIL Freddy Peralta** (.057/2-for-35), **NY Yankees Kodai Senga** (.069/2-for-29), **Gausman** and **SF Robbie Ray** (.118/4-for-34).
