TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Nationals play the third of a four-game set tonight with the 15th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...The teams are scheduled to finish their season series next week in Washington, September 13-15.

A After dropping the first three games against Washington this season, the Braves have won eight of the last 11 despite outscoring the Nationals by only five runs over this stretch (62-57).

A RHP Julio Teheran is set to face the Nationals for the 24th time in his career, all of which are starts.. The righty has started against the Nationals twice this season, with Atlanta winning both games and Teheran going 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (3 ER/12.1 IP).

A RHP Austin Voth will make his third appearance and second career start against Atlanta tonight, after he went 6.0 innings and allowed two runs, earned, in a no-decision on June 23 of this season at Nationals Park...The righty is $1-0$ with a 4.35 ERA (10 ER/20.1 IP) in four starts this season.

SURGING: The Braves won their season high-tying eighth consecutive game last night after a 4-3 victory over Washington...Atlanta has won 19 of their last 23 games and 16 of 18 to move to $88-54$ and a season-best 34 games over . $500 \ldots$ The Braves have not been this many games over .500 since the end of the 2003 season, when that club finished 40 over at 101-61.
A Atlanta has the fourth-best record in baseball, and the second-best mark in the National League, 3.5 games behind Los Angeles.
A Last night's win over Washington pushed the Braves lead in the NL East to a season-most 9.0 games...The magic number for Atlanta to clinch its second consecutive division title is 13 .

A Atlanta last had as good a stretch over 18 games in 2013, when that club also went 16-2 from July 28 to August 16.

A Over their last 18 games, the Braves have compiled a 2.56 ERA (47 ER/165.1 IP) and allowed just 14 home runs.

A With last night's win, the Braves are ensured of at least a split in this series...Atlanta has not lost a multi-game series since July 23-24, when Kansas City swept both games here at SunTrust Park.. They have gone $9-0-3$ in multi-game series play over this stretch.

A The Braves are on pace to win 100 games this season...Eight different teams in franchise history have won triple digits in a season (last, 2003; 101).. They need to finish 12-8 or better to get there.

A The Braves are looking to win nine in a row for the first time since 2014, when they did so from June 27-July 5.

WINNING AT HOME: The Braves have tied a franchise modern-era record with 12 consecutive wins at home after they beat Washington, 4-3, last night...The 2000 Braves first set the record, also winning 12 straight from April 8-May 5.

A The Braves' run started on August 17 vs. Los Angeles and continued with wins over Miami, Chicago (AL), Toronto and Washington.

A The last major league team with a winning run at home was Cleveland in 2016; the Indians won 13 straight, June 1-July 5.

A The Braves have held the opposition to 34 total runs in these 12 games ( 31 earned runs/2.58 ERA).
A The longest home single-season winning streak by any Braves team in franchise history is 18 , set in 1897 by the Boston Beaneaters...Led by 31-game winner Kid Nichols and four other future Hall of Famers (manager Frank Selee, 3B Jimmy Collins, OF Billy Hamilton, OF Hugh Duffy), the Beaneaters won 18 straight at South End Grounds from May 31-June 25.

SCORELESS STARTERS: LHP Dallas Keuchel stretched the Braves' rotation scoreless streak to 18.0 consecutive innings after tossing 6.0 shutout frames last night...RHP Mike Foltynewicz started the run with 5.0 scoreless on Tuesday night, before LHP Max Fried went 7.0 innings on Thursday.

A Since the trade deadline, Braves starting pitchers have the third-best combined ERA in the majors at 3.26 ( $69 \mathrm{ER} / 190.1$ IP)...Their 190.1 innings in this stretch are also the third most in the National League, trailing only Cincinnati (197.1 IP) and New York (193.2 IP).

TEHERAN 30 STARTS: With tonight's game, RHP Julio Teheran will have made at least 30 starts in each of the last seven seasons dating to 2013 , and will be the only pitcher in the majors to do so.

A Mike Leake (28 starts this season), Jon Lester (27), Max Scherzer (23) and José Quintana (27) are the only other pitchers to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2013-2018.

A Since Teheran's first full season in 2013, his 218 starts entering play are fourth most in the majors, and no one has made as many starts for a single team as he has for Atlanta in that span.

35-35-35: 3B Josh Donaldson's seventh-inning home run last night was his 35th of the season...Along with Freddie Freeman's team-leading 38 homers and Ronald Acuña Jr.'s 37, this Braves club became the 16th ever to have three players hit at least 35 home runs in a year.

A Two other Braves teams are on this list...The 1973 team did it first (Hank Aaron, Darrell Evans, Davey Johnson), and it was matched in 2003 (Andruw Jones, Javy Lopez, Gary Sheffield)...The 2016 Orioles (Chris Davis, Manny Machado, Mark Trumbo) were the last MLB team to accomplish the feat.

## Tonight's Game

4 Makes his 30th start of 2019...Is the 226th appearance of his career, and his 223rd start.

A With tonight's game, will have made at least 30 starts in each of the last seven seasons dating to 2013 , and will be the only pitcher in the majors to do so.. Mike Leake (28 starts this season), Jon Lester (27), Max Scherzer (23) and José Quintana (27) are the only other pitchers to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2013-2018.
A Since Teheran's first full season in 2013, his 218 starts entering play are fourth most in the majors, and no one has made as many starts for a single team as he has for Atlanta in that span.

Set for his 24th career start against the Nationals, and his third this season...Is 7-6 with a 3.95 ERA ( 59 ER/134.1 IP) over his first 23 turns.

A Is 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (3 ER/12.1 IP) in two starts this season, including 5.2 innings of one-run baseball in a start here at SunTrust Park on July 19.

A In 12 intradivision starts this season, is 5-3 with a 3.09 ERA (22 ER/64.0 IP)...Among pitchers to make at least 10 starts against the NL East this season, Teheran's 3.09 ERA is fifth lowest, trailing just Mike Soroka (2.47), Jacob deGrom (2.65), Patrick Corbin (2.75) and Stephen Strasburg (2.96).
Pitched 6.0 scoreless innings two turns ago, August 26 at Colorado, his 16th start this season allowing one or fewer earned runs.
A The 16 starts allowing one earned run or fewer are tied for most in the majors among traditional starters... The Dodgers' Hyun-Jin Ryu also has 16.
A Ryne Stanek had 25 such starts while opening for the Rays.
A The Atlanta-franchise record for such starts is 20, set by Greg Maddux in 2002.
Set for his 15 th start at SunTrust Park this season, and is $5-4$ with a 3.00 ERA (25 ER/75.0 IP) over his first 14 turns...Atlanta is 9-5 when Teheran starts at home.
A His ERA 0.72 points better at home than on the road...Has a 3.72 ERA in 15 starts on the road.
A Over the first two seasons at SunTrust Park ('17-'18), he pitched to a 4.89 ERA (104 ER/191.1 IP) in his home park...Had a 3.02 career ERA at Turner Field.

## 2019 Recap

\& Made his fifth start of the season against Miami, 8/21, and pitched 7.0 scoreless innings...Allowed just one earned run in 32.0 innings ( 0.28 ERA) against the Marlins on the season.

A The 32.0 innings marked the most such innings in a season by a Braves pitcher against a single opponent allowing one earned run or less...Pat Jarvis held the previous record, holding Houston to one run over 31.1 innings in 1971.
A Became the 11th pitcher in the live-ball era to allow one or fewer runs in at least that many innings against a single opponent in a season...The last to do so was Chicago-AL's Britt Burns, who did not allow a run in 32.0 innings against the Indians in 1985
\& Started against the Mets on $8 / 15$ at SunTrust Park and allowed eight hits and six runs over just 1.1 innings, the shortest start of his career.
A Was his 219th career start, which passed Rick Mahler for sixth most in Atlanta franchise history...Only Phil Niekro (594), Tom Glavine (518), John Smoltz (466), Greg Maddux (363) and Tim Hudson (243) have started more games for Atlanta.

A Started against the Marlins, $8 / 9$, and allowed five hits and one run over 7.0 innings.
$\mathcal{A}$ Allowed a home run leading off the seventh inning to snap a 24 -inning scoreless streak against Miami to open the season.

A Pitched exactly 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his three starts against the Marlins to open the season...Teheran's run was just the fourth time since 1908 that a Braves starter had three straight such starts against one opponent in a single season.

4 Allowed eight hits and six earned runs, $6 / 18$ vs. NYM...The outing stopped a streak of eight straight starts in which he allowed one earned run or less.
A His run of one-run starts spanned from May 5 to June 13, during which he ranked second in the majors with a 0.81 ERA (4 ER/44.2 IP)...Trailed just Hyun-Jin Ryu of the Dodgers (0.53 ERA).
A Teheran's eight-game streak was tied for the longest in the majors by a traditional starter this season, mathing a run by his rotation-mate Mike Soroka...TB's Ryne Stanek has a 14-game run while opening for the Rays.

A Made his 200th career start, $4 / 30$ vs. SD...Allowed five hits and four runs over a season-most 7.0 innings.

A Became the ninth Braves pitcher to make 200 starts for the club since the team moved to Atlanta in 1966...Joins Phil Niekro (594), Tom Glavine (518), John Smoltz (466), Greg Maddux (363), Tim Hudson (243), Rick Mahler (218), Ron Reed (203) and Steve Avery (201).
