Jake Bauers is on a 9-game hitting streak during which he is batting .438 (14-for-32) with 2 HR and 8 RBI....he has a .500 OBP/.781 SLG/1.281 OPS through the streak....his career-high streak is 10 games with the Mariners from 6/12-6/22, 2021.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is the fifth game (3-1) of a 6-game road trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Chicago-NL (1-0)....after a Thursday off day, the team returns to American Family Field for 6 games against Los Angeles-NL (3g) and St. Louis (3g)....the next road trip will cover 3 games in Houston from 5/29-5/31.

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: **OF Akil Baddoo** (left quad), **LHP Jared Koenig** (left elbow), **OF Brandon Lockridge** (right knee), **RHP Quinn Priester** (right thoracic outlet), **RHP Brandon Woodruff** (right shoulder), **LHP Rob Zastryzny** (left shoulder) and **LHP Angel Zerpa** (left forearm) are on the injured list....Baddoo and Zastryzny are on the 60-day IL.

MANAGER: **Pat Murphy** (369g, 217-152, .588) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

COACHES: Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

IN THE STANDINGS (54 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: **FIRST:** 16, **SECOND:** 10, **THIRD:** 8, **FOURTH:** 13, **FIFTH:** 7....the Brewers are currently in second place, trailing the first-place Cubs by half a game.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Brewers are 10-4-1 in series play....the team is 5-0-1 in its last six series, including three straight series wins.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 15-9 at home, going 6-2-0 in series play....the team is 8-2 in its last 10 games at American Family Field.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 12-9 on the road, going 4-2-1 in series play.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 14 replay challenges this season, going 11-3....their last challenge (won) came on 5/15 at Minnesota as an out call at first base involving Luis Rengifo was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 790 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (882), Astros (825) and Yankees (817).

MISIOROWSKI AT A GLANCE: Jacob Misiorowski, 24, will be making his 10th start of the season....Misiorowski last started last Wednesday vs. San Diego and had no decision in the Brewers' 3-1 loss (7ip, 4h, Or, Obb, 10k, 93 pitches)....he left the game with a 1-0 lead after experiencing quad cramping while warming up for the eighth inning....he has produced 80 strikeouts in 51.0 innings (14.12 K/9IP)....the team is 4-5 in his starts....he has 4 quality starts....opponents are batting .162 (29-for-179, 4hr)....he has thrown 18.1 consecutive scoreless innings....he was the team's Opening Day starter....Misiorowski was selected by Milwaukee in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft from Crowder (MO) College, where he pitched one season (2022) and became the highest drafted player in school history....name is pronounced "miz-uh-RAO-skee."

LAST SEASON: Misiorowski made his Major League debut and went 5-3 with a 4.36 ERA in 15 games/14 starts....the team went 9-5 in his starts....he had 3 quality starts.... opponents batted .213 (51-for-239, 8hr)....he recorded 87 strikeouts in 66.0 innings (11.86 K/9IP)....his 202 pitches of 100+ MPH ranked fifth in the Major Leagues.... Misiorowski was named an All-Star after just five games under his belt, the fewest in Major League history....he was on the 15-day injured list from 8/3-8/14 with a left tibia contusion, retroactive to 7/31....he went 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA in 2 games in the NLDS against the Cubs with both outings coming in relief (7ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 7k, 1hr)....he appeared in Game 3 of the NLCS against the Dodgers out of the bullpen and took the loss (5ip, 3h, 2r, 1er, 1bb, 9k).

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 5-0 with a 2.75 ERA in 14 games/13 starts (72ip, 22er)....is 3-0 with a 2.04 ERA in 6 starts this season (35.1ip, 8er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 3-5 with a 4.40 ERA in 10 starts (45ip, 22er)....is 1-2 with a 2.30 ERA in 3 starts this season (15.2ip, 4er).

CAREER vs. CUBS: Is 0-1 with a 5.63 ERA in 2 starts (8ip, 4h, 6r, 5er, 5bb, 12k, 0hr)....he also went 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA in 2 relief appearances in the 2025 NLDS against the Cubs (7ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 7k, 1hr).

ODDS & ENDS: Misiorowski graduated from Grain Valley (MO) High School....he got engaged to his fiancée, Elle, this past January and is scheduled to be married this coming winter....he is a supporter of the Wisconsin Parkinson Association....his father, Tom, was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease when Jacob was growing up....Misiorowski enjoys hunting, fishing and collecting baseball and Pokémon cards....he is a Kansas City Chiefs fan.
