## ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (50-53) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (42-61) July 25, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #104/Home #54 RHP Ryne Nelson (6-2, 3.52 ERA) vs. RHP Mike Burrows (1-3, 4.70 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** had the day off on Thursday...Ended a stretch of 15 straight games against American League teams on Wednesday...Have gone 29-24 at home this season...Are 35-0 when leading after eight innings this season (one of four in teams in all of MLB that has yet to lose when leading after eight innings in 2025)...Are hitting .276 (59-for-214) with 82 RBI with runners in scoring position since June 22 vs. Texas (the sixth-highest batting average and the fifth-most RBI among all National League teams during that time)...Are starting a stretch of 12 straight games against the National League West tonight.

**HOME COOKIN':** The Pirates have swept three of their last four series here at PNC Park...Pittsburgh's three sweeps came from June 27-29 vs. New York (NL), June 30-July 2 vs. St. Louis and Monday-Wednesday vs. Detroit...Pittsburgh's pitching staff has recorded a 3.57 ERA at home this season, the fifth-best mark among all National League teams...The Pirates have four sweeps this season, all of which have come at PNC Park (also June 6-8 vs. Philadelphia)...The last time Pittsburgh swept more than four home series in a season was 2018, when it had six sweeps here.

**PLAY RENEGADE:** David Bednar comes into today with the longest-active save streak (15) in Major League Baseball...His next save will make him one of five Pirates with at least 100 saves since 1969, when saves became an official statistic...Since he joined Pittsburgh in 2021, his 99 saves are the sixth-most in the National League (tied for the 10th-most in Major League Baseball).

**CRUZ CONTROL:** Oneil Cruz enters today tied with Tampa Bay's José Caballero for the MLB lead in stolen bases (33)...He has a stolen base in back-to-back games for the seventh time in his career (he's done that in three straight games twice in his career, last from March 27-29 at Miami)...The 33 steals are the most by a Pirate in a season since Starling Marte (also 33) in 2018...The last Pirate with more than 33 steals in a season was Marte (47) in 2016...Cruz is one of four players in MLB with at least 15 home runs and 25 stolen bases, along with Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong, Cincinnati's Elly De La Cruz and Cleveland's José Ramírez.

**BACK TO THE SENIOR CIRCUIT:** Tonight will be Pittsburgh's first game against a National League team since beating St. Louis on July 2 here at PNC Park...The Pirates have won each of their last six games against National League teams (streak began on June 27 vs. New York), their longest single-season winning streak against the senior circuit since May 30-June 9, 2023 (also six)...Their last seven-game winning streak against the National League came from April 17-23, 2023.

**DISPENCING THE HITS:** Spencer Horwitz has hit safely in four straight games (since Sunday vs. Chicago-AL), going 8-for-16 with two doubles, a grand slam, seven RBI and four runs scored (he's recorded at least one RBI in three straight games for the first time in his career)...The Pirates have won seven straight and eight of their last nine games when he records at least one RBI, a stretch that started on June 22 vs. Texas.

**PHAMTASTIC:** Tommy Pham is hitting at a .389 clip (28-for-72) with six doubles, four home runs and 18 RBI over his last 21 games, dating back to June 22 vs. Texas...Pham's .389 batting average during that stretch is the best in all of Major League Baseball among those with at least 75 plate appearances, while his 18 RBI in that time are tied for 10th-most in the National League.

**THE MAN BEHIND THE MASK:** Henry Davis has recorded a 2.78 catcher's ERA in his 385.2 innings behind the plate this season...That's the third-lowest mark among all Major League backstops with at least 350.0 innings caught this season, trailing only Kansas City's Freddy Fermin (2.75) and Texas' Kyle Higashioka (2.76)...The last Pittsburgh backstop to catch at least 350.0 innings and have a lower catcher's ERA in a season was Chris Stewart (2.46) in 2015.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 25, 1956: Roberto Clemente hit the only walkoff, inside-the-park grand slam in Major League history, giving the Pirates a 9-8 win over the Cubs at Forbes Field. Pittsburgh led, 4-0, after seven innings, but Chicago responded with seven runs in the eighth inning and had an 8-5 lead heading into the bottom of the ninth inning. Bill Virdon had four hits and a run scored in the victory.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the 11th round of the 2018 Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Burrows allowed two runs on three hits and two walks (six strikeouts) over 5.0 innings on July 19 vs. Chicago (AL), having a no-decision in the team’s 10-4 loss...He had a no-hitter through 4.1 innings before the White Sox’ Luis Robert Jr. broke up the no-hit bid with an infield single.

**START ME UP:** Burrows earned his first win as a starter in the Major Leagues, pitching 5.1 innings while striking out six batters en route to a 3-0 win on June 4 vs. Houston at PNC Park...It was tied for the second-longest outing of Burrows’ professional career (also July 7, 2021 for High-A Greensboro vs. Asheville), trailing only an outing of 7.0 scoreless innings for Double-A Altoona on May 26, 2022 at Harrisburg...Burrows became one of just 10 Pittsburgh rookies (11 instances) since at least 1901 to pitch 5.1-plus scoreless innings with six-plus strikeouts while issuing zero walks in any outing.

**AGAINST THE DIAMONDBACKS:** Burrows faced Arizona for the first time in his career on May 27 at Chase Field, his second start (third appearance) in the big leagues...He allowed five runs (four earned) over 3.1 innings, having a no-decision in the team’s 9-6 victory (Pittsburgh erased a 6-0 deficit, highlighted by a seven-run eighth inning).

**IN THE SHOW:** Burrows will make his 11th start of the season with Pittsburgh tonight.. His ten starts so far this season are the fourth-most among National League rookies, behind Milwaukee’s Chad Patrick (18), Colorado’s Chase Dollander (15) and Chicago’s Cade Horton (11)...Burrows’ 48 strikeouts are tied for the sixth-most among NL rookies.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** Burrows has limited opposing hitters to a .206 batting average against (7-for-34) with runners in scoring position...Opposing batters are also 1-for-16 against him with runners in scoring position and two outs.

**JUNE BLOOM:** Burrows recorded a 2.73 ERA (26.1ip/8er) in six appearances (five starts) during the month of June, tied with Los Angeles (NL)’s Justin Wrobleski for the second-lowest ERA among all Major League rookies with at least 26.0 innings pitched in the month...The only one with a lower ERA was the Athletics’ Jacob Lopez (2.64).

**PROVIDING RELIEF:** Burrows made his only relief appearance of the season in the 4-2 loss on June 25 at Milwaukee, tossing 2.1 scoreless innings in relief of Paul Skenes.

**DEBUT DAY:** Burrows made his MLB debut in relief of Paul Skenes last season on September 28 at Yankee Stadium...In that game, he earned the win, allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits, three walks, two strikeouts and one home run in 3.1 innings...He was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis this April 24, but did not pitch before being optioned back to Triple-A after the team’s April 25 victory in Los Angeles.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** Burrows went 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1ip/9er) and 41 strikeouts over his eight appearances (seven starts) at Triple-A Indianapolis...At the time of his promotion to Pittsburgh on May 21, Burrows ranked second in the International League with a 1.02 ERA, 28 strikeouts and a 0.85 WHIP, as well as third with a .175 batting average against, in the month of May (four games/three starts).
