TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Chase Remme's Rays** and the fifth game (4-0) of a 6-game road trip that includes a 3-game weekend sweep of the **Twins at Target Field**.

- Following tomorrow's game at **TB**, the Redlegs will return to **Cincinnati** for a 6-game homestand vs **Det** (4/24-4/26) and **Col** (4/28-4/30).
- The Reds went 3-3 in their most recent homestand (4/10-4/16) vs **LAA** (1-2) and **SF** (2-1) in which they batted .180 (32-for-178), their lowest in any homestand since they went 0-6 and batted .172 from 5/3-5/9, 2024 vs **Bal** & **AZ**.

BEST START SINCE 2006

- At 15-8 (.652), the Reds are off to their best start after 23 games since 2006 when they opened the year 16-7 (.696).
- For the third straight day, Cin is alone in first place in the NL Central for the first time since entering the 8/3/23 game at **Chc** (+0.5).
- The Reds are a season-high 7 games over .500 for the first time since they were 67-60 in August 2025...haven't been 8g over since they entered the aforementioned 8/3/23 game at **Chc** (59-51).

BIG ROAD MACHINE: The Reds have won 9 of their first 11 road games for the first time since the **1990 World Championship team** won 12 of their first 14.

- The Reds' .818 road winning pct is tops in the majors.
- Have pitched to a 2.45 ERA thus far in away games, third-lowest mark in the majors (99ip, 27er, .220/.310/.314, 5 quality starts).

BRING 'EM ON: The Reds own a Major League-best 12-2 (.846) record this season against opponents entering play with a .500-or-better winning percentage (min. 4g)...the 2025 Reds went 44-42 (.512) vs teams that finished the year at or above .500.

DECIDED BY 2 RUNS OR FEWER: The Reds are 10-0 in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, tying them with **StL** (10-2) for the most such wins in the majors...Cin's last loss in a 2-run game came on 9/28/25 at **Mil** (lost, 4-2).

- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.

WON RUN GAMES: Cin is 6-0 in 1-run games...have won 2 one-run games on this road trip (Fri 2-1 at **Min**, Sat 5-4 at **Min**)...the 2025 Reds lost 10 of their first 15 one-run games (finished 22-22).

15 WINS / 84 RUNS: The 2026 Reds are just the second **Cincinnati** team since 1898 to win 15 of their first 23 games while scoring 84 or fewer runs...the 1924 Reds started 15-8 and plated just 79 runs over their first 23 games.

- This is the first Cin in any 23-game span to score 84 or fewer runs and win 15 times since the 2012 club did it.

NOMERS: Reds pitchers haven't allowed a home run since 4/14 vs **SF** (**Willy Adames**, 5th inning off **Brady Singer**)...the 6-game homerless streak is the longest-active streak in the majors and the club's longest within a single season since 6/22-6/28, 1996 (7 games without a HR).

BULLISH ON THE PEN: Reds relievers lead the majors with a 2.23 ERA.

- Have gone 2-1 with 4 saves and a 0.39 ERA over their last 7 games (23.1ip, 4r/1er, 11bb, 27k, .216/.310/.273).
- Entered Mon's game having not allowed an ER in 18.1 consecutive innings...that streak was snapped when the **Twins** plated a 9th-inning, game-tying run off **RHP Emilio Pagán**.
- Have allowed just 5 HR on the year, the last coming on 4/10 vs **LAA** (**Jorge Soler** off **Kyle Nicolas** in the 8th inning)

HE'S GRRRRRRRRREAT! RHP **Tony Santillan** has yet to allow a run in 10 apps this season (1-0, 9.0ip, 3h, 6bb, 10k).

- Is the fourth Reds pitcher since 1900 to begin a season by producing 10 or more consecutive relief apps without a run or extra-base hit, joining **Logan Ondrusek** (17g, 2012), **Gabe White** (11g, 2002), and **John Franco** (11g, 1987).

SERIES NOTES: Cin and **TB** are meeting for the first and only time in 2026.

- Since the teams first met in 2003, the Reds are 19-9 vs the **Rays**, including winning each of the first 7 games from 6/10/03 to 6/27/11.
- Cin has won each of the last 4 games and 9 of the last 13 games vs **TB** dating back to 2022.
- The Reds swept the 3-game season series last season at **GABP** (7/25-7/27)...was Cin's first sweep of **TB** since 7/8-7/10, 2022 in **Ohio**.

3-4-5: Reds' 3,4,5 batters have combined to slash .272/.355/.521 in the first 23 games of the 2026 season (71-for-261, 17hr, 47rbi, 105 times on base).

- The 17 combined HRs from the 3-4-5 spots are the most in the majors.
- The rest of the batting order has combined for a .168/.265/.233 slash (83-for-494, 5 HR, 28 RBI, 149 times on base).

EL CABALLO DE HIERRO: SS **Ely De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last 241 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's tied for the fourth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

OUR PAL SAL: 1b **Sal Stewart** has hit safely in 17 of his 23 games this season and reached base in 20 of 23 (24-for-83, .289/.388/.639).

- Is the eighth Major League rookie since 1920 with at least 8 home runs and 20 RBI before the end of April.
- Is just the third Reds batter since RBI became an official stat in 1920 to enter May with at least 8 homers and 20 RBI (**Austin Kearns** 2003 & **Tony Perez** 1970).
- Has 13 HR through his first 41 career games, tied for second-most by any Red through his first 41g since 1900 (**Adam Dunn** 13hr, **Aristides Aquino** 15hr).
- Is on pace for 169 hits, 56 HR, 35 doubles, and 147 RBI.

GOOD VIBES ONLY: 3b/DH **Eugenio Suárez** has reached safely in each of his last 13 games dating back to 4/7 at **Mia**...during that time, he has as many hits as strikeouts (13) and is slashing .295/.392/.432 with a home run, 3 doubles, and 20 times on base.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-0 loss vs SF on Thu, 4/16 (6.0ip, 2h, 0r, 1bb, 4k, 87TP).

- The 6.0 scoreless innings marked the longest scoreless outing of his career.
- Was his second quality start of the season, the fourth of his career.
- Allowed just 3 base runners and no hard-hit balls.
- The Reds have scored 6 total runs in his 4 starts and yet are 2-2 in games he pitches.

APRIL 10 vs LAA: Suffered the 10-2 loss on Fri, 4/10 vs LAA (5.1ip, 7h, 5r/5er, 4bb, 2k, 2hr, 92TP).

- Allowed 21 batted balls in play, 9 hard-hit balls, 11 base runners, and 2 home runs - all career highs.
- Was ahead in the count to 13 of his 27 batters.
- For the third time in his 3 starts, the Reds plated just 2 runs.

APRIL 5 at TEX: Did not factor in the decision in the 2-1 win at Tex on 4/5 (6.0ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 9k, 1hr, 87TP).

- Tied his career high with 6.0 innings pitched (3x).
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 18 of his 24 batters.
- Was the first time as a Major League starting pitcher that he pitched into the 7th inning (7 pitches).
- Had his career-high 14.2 scoreless innings streak snapped after allowing a game-tying solo homer to Joc Pederson in the 7th inning.
- Turned it over to Pierce Johnson and Sam Moll in the 7th with no outs and a runner on first (Evan Carter single)...the relievers combined to strand the runner.

MARCH 30 vs PIT: Earned his first Major League win in the 2-0 victory vs Pit on 3/30 (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP).

- Was his 2026 season debut...became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with 5.0+ scoreless innings pitched, and fewer than 2 hits with at least 7 strikeouts in his season debut (last: Brady Singer in 2025).
- Carried a no-hitter into the 5th inning before allowing a single to Spencer Horwitz to lead off the inning...at 4.0 innings, marked the longest no-hit bid of his big league career.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: In the 2-0 win vs Pit on 3/30, RHP Chase Burns earned his first career win (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP) and RHP Connor Phillips picked up his first career save (1.0ip, 0h, 2bb, 1k).

- Burns and Phillips became the eighth pair of Reds teammates since saves became an official stat in 1969 to earn their first win and save, respectively, in the same game...the last duo to do it was RHP Julian Aguiar and RHP Casey Kelly on 8/24/24 at Pit.

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: On 6/24 vs NYG made his Major League debut after having his contract selected from AAA-Louisville earlier in the day...became the first Major League starting pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961) to strike out the first 5 batters he faced in his Major League debut...struck out 8 batters total that day, becoming just the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 8 strikeouts in his Major League debut.

PERSONAL: Was born in Italy where his parents were stationed with the US Navy...his sister was born in Japan...grew up in Hendersonville, TN which is about 20 miles northeast of Nashville...pitched collegiately at Tennessee (2022-2023) before transferring to Wake Forest (2024)...graduated from Beech High School in Hendersonville, TN where he was selected by Baseball America as a 2021 First Team High School All-American...his father, David, played college football at Division II North Greenville College.

ACQUIRED: Was selected by the Reds in the first round (second overall) in the 2024 First-Year Player Draft...was signed by Eddie Lehr.
