METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Nationals, 9-8, last night...The win snapped a four-game losing streak, which was a season-high...New York recorded a season-high 16 hits in the win... The Mets continue a seven-game homestand (1-2) against the Nationals (0-2) and Braves (1-0).

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty recorded a career-high three hits last night, finishing 3-3 with a run, a home run, one RBI and a walk...He is on a six-game on-base streak, batting .400 (8-20) with two runs, a double, one home run, two RBI and two walks in that span...This comes after he went 1-8 in his first three games with the club.

JEFF McHITS: Over his last 11 games, Jeff McNeil is batting .415 (17-41) with seven runs, two doubles, a home run, a triple, four RBI, four walks with a .489 OBP and a .585 SLG...Since April 16, he has raised his batting average from .212 to .301 and his OBP from .359 to .414... His .414 OBP is the eighth-best in the majors and sixth-highest in the National League.

MULTIPLICITY: McNeil logged his eighth multi-hit game of the year last night...He has recorded multiple hits in three of his last four games...It was the 171st multi-hit game of his career, which places him 19th on the Mets all-time list...He has 61 multi-hit games since the start of last season, which is the third-most during that span behind Bo Bichette and Freddie Freeman who each have 65 multi-hit games since 2022.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: The Mets are tied for fifth in the NL with 22 steals this season...Starling Marte is tied for ninth in the majors and tied for sixth in the NL with eight steals...He ranks third among active players with 322 career SB...Only Elvis Andrus (338) and Billy Hamilton (324) have more.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 5-4 at Citi Field this year...The team's nine home games are tied for the fewest in the major leagues...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...The last time the team won more than 50 games in New York was in 2000 when they went 55-26... Overall, the Mets went 54-27 at Citi Field...The team's .667 winning percentage was the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of seven straight games against the National League East...They are 1-2 in the current stretch...Overall, the Mets are 6-4 against the division this season... New York went 50-26 against the East last year, including 26-11 at home.

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets have collected 35 infield hits this season, which is the second-most in the majors...Last year, the Mets collected 186 infield hits, which was the fifth-most in franchise history and the third-most in the majors in 2022.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 11 games and has allowed one run in 11.1 innings of work, good for a 0.79 ERA...He has allowed five hits, three walks while striking out 14 in that span...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .100 (2-20) batting average this season...He has converted all five save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 162 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: Going back to last season, the Mets have lost four straight and six of their last seven to the Braves...New York is 56-70 against Braves all-time at Citi Field.

WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Brandon Nimmo is second in the major leagues with a 1.7 fWAR...Over the last 16 games, Nimmo is batting .400 (26-65) with 12 runs, five doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks, one steal with a .459 OBP and a .569 SLG... He has raised his batting average from .192 to .341 in that span... The Wyoming native is third in the majors with a .446 OBP, fourth in batting average (.341) and is tied for eighth in the majors with 17 walks this season.

WALK, DON'T STRIKE: The Mets are second in the majors with 108 walks this season...As a team, New York has struck out 200 times this season, tied for the sixth-fewest in the majors...Brandon Nimmo has drawn 17 walks and struck out just 14 times this season...Jeff McNeil has 14 walks and has struck out only nine times...McNeil ranks fifth in the majors in strikeout rate, whiffing in just 8.1 percent of his plate appearances.

GUESS WHO'S BACH?: Over the last 10 games, Daniel Vogelbach is 9-25 (.360) with two runs, one double, one home run, six RBI, four walks with a .448 OBP and a .520 SLG...He has posted a .417 OBP in 20 games this season, which is only behind Brandon Nimmo (.446) for the team lead.

AW SNAP: Pete Alonso snapped an 0-19 skid last night, collecting two hits and driving in a pair of runs...He ranks second in the majors with 10 home runs and is third in the majors and leads the NL with 25 RBI...Alonso is tied for eighth in MLB and tied for sixth in the NL with 20 runs scored and is 14th in the majors and eighth in the NL with a .561 SLG.

APRIL, SHE WILL COME: Pete Alonso has become the first player in Mets history with 10 home runs before May 1...The last time a player hit 10+ home runs in his team's first 21 games of a season was in 2019, when Christian Yelich (11), Cody Bellinger, Khris Davis and Eddie Rosario all accomplished the feat.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Went 5.0 innings on April 22 against the Giants at Oracle Park... Let up a season-high seven runs on seven hits and six strikeouts...Also recorded a season-high eight strikeouts.

VS ATLANTA: Tonight, Peterson will make his eighth career start and ninth career appearance against the Braves...Through his first nine appearances against Atlanta, Peterson is 3-3 with a 4.50 ERA (18 earned runs/36.0 innings)...His last appearance against the Braves, he pitched 0.2 innings of relief, allowed one hit and struck out two in the Mets' 4-2 loss on October 1, 2022 at Truist Park.

HOME SWEET HOME: Today is Peterson's second home start of the season...He is 10-5 lifetime at home...Peterson has pitched to a career 3.82 ERA (46 earned runs/108.1 innings) at Citi Field...He has 109 strikeouts and 50 walks at home through 26 games (21 starts) at home.

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .211 (24-114) average since 2022...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third-highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: The southpaw allowed four hits or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and 21 of his 28 appearances overall last season...He has held the opposition to four hits or fewer in 39 of his 54 career games.

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL: Peterson made four appearances (three starts) during spring training...He threw 12.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit over those four outings...Struck out 13 and walked eight...Peterson last pitched in a minor league game on March 25...In his last Grapefruit League appearance of the spring, allowed one hit, struck out four and walked four over 4.0 scoreless frames vs. the Cardinals on March 19.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (3-1, 3.96)

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched 4.0 innings against the Giants at Oracle Field...Allowed four runs on six hits, walked one and struck out two in the Mets' 5-4 loss.

BIG DRIP VS THE BRAVES: Megill will make his sixth career start and seventh career appearance against the Braves...Megill is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (11 ER/25.2 IP) through his first six career appearances against the Braves...In his three starts against the Braves at Citi Field, Megill has allowed six runs on twelve hits, five walks and 19 strikeouts over 15.0 innings.
