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THE TWINS: Have gone 1-4 through five games on their nine-game, 10-day roadtrip, losing a series 1-2 at Seattle over the weekend, followed by consecutive losses in Kansas City the last two nights...tonight, they will continue the trip with the three-game series finale against the Royals at Kauffman Stadium...after tonight's game, they will travel to Milwaukee to play three games against the Brewers at American Family Field over the weekend.

TWINS CONTINUE POST-ASG SLIDE: The Twins lost to the Royals last night by a score of 2-1, their third one-run loss on the trip...Dean Kremer made his Twins debut, allowing one run on three hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with two walks and two strikeouts...A.J. Minter was issued the loss, allowing a seventh inning go-ahead home run to Michael Massey...Jeff Hoffman made his Twins debut with 1.0 scoreless innings, striking out two...the offense recorded just two hits, a Ryan Jeffers first-inning single and a Royce Lewis fourth-inning infield single...Minnesota also struck out 10 times, compared to just one walk (Josh Bell).

KEEP FINDING WAYS: Since May 9, the Twins have gone 40-36, for a .526 winning percentage, fifth-highest in the AL since that date:

ROYAL TREATMENT: The Twins and Royals are playing each other today for the 13th and final time in 2026...Twins have gone 4-8 vs. KC this season, 1-4 at Kauffman and 3-4 at Target Field.

After tonight's game, Kansas City will be the only team in the AL Central in which the Twins are done playing this season...these two will meet again to open the 2027 season at Kauffman on March 25.

Twins are looking to avoid winning just one game at Kauffman in a season for the first time since going 1-9 here in 2016.

Since the start of 2023, the Twins have gone 18-9 at home vs. the Royals, compared to 8-16 at Kauffman Stadium.

Twins have 197 wins all-time at Kauffman Stadium, their most in any opposing ballpark in their history (since 1961)...also the most for any opponent in this park (next: CWS - 189).

Josh Bell has eight hits against the Royals this season, four being home runs...Bell is hitting .298 (37-for-124) with seven doubles, nine home runs, 28 RBI and a .956 OPS in 35 career games vs. Kansas City...four of his 14 home runs this season have been against the Royals (April 1 off Falter, April 2 off Cruz, June 7 off Way and Tuesday night off Cruz)...he has seven home runs, 17 RBI and a .984 OPS in 19 career games at Kauffman.

In 10 games against the Royals this season, Kody Clemens is hitting .316 (12-for-38) with three doubles, four home runs, seven RBI and a 1.061 OPS...he has 17 career hits against the Royals, eight of which are home runs.

Over his last 11 games vs. the Royals, Royce Lewis is hitting .351 (13-for-37) with an .898 OPS...he's hit safely in six-straight vs. Kansas City.

JOSHIN' AROUND: Josh Bell is hitting .296 (16-for-54) with an .870 OPS in his last 13 road games...below are Bell's overall number comparisons from Opening Day through May 31 and since June 1:

He has 64 RBI on the season, tied for 13th-most in the AL.
He is on pace to record 90 RBI, which would be tied for second-most of his career (116 - 2019 & 90 in 2017).

ROYCE ROLLS: Royce Lewis has hit safely in a career-long 10-straight games...it marks the longest streak for a Twin since Ryan Jeffers' 12-gamer from July 25-August 10, 2025...Lewis' streak is the second-longest active streak in baseball, trailing Freddie Freeman (15)...during the streak, Lewis is hitting .378 (14-for-37) with three doubles, one triple, two home runs, seven RBI, a .676 slugging percentage and a 1.070 OPS.

Additionally, has reached safely via hit or walk in a career-high 16-straight games.

AMERICA'S NEXT TOP JEFF: Ryan Jeffers has reached base safely in 24 of his last 25 games...over those 25 games, he is hitting .283 (26-for-92) with six doubles, six home runs, 15 RBI, 12 walks, a .371 on-base percentage, a .543 slugging percentage and a .915 OPS.

On the season, among all AL catchers with a minimum of 200 plate appearances, he ranks second in OPS (.887) and on-base percentage (.381) and third in slugging (.505).

THE LAST DANCE: Minnesota is looking to avoid being swept today for the fifth time in 2026, the others being April 17-19 vs. Cincinnati in three games at Target Field, April 24-26 in three games at Tampa Bay, May 29-31 at Pittsburgh in three games and June 22-24 vs. Los Angeles-NL.

Twins are looking to avoid being swept by the Royals for the first time since September 6-8, 2024 at Kauffman Stadium (3 games).

Twins have entered a finale six times this season attempting to avoid the sweep and have gone 2-4 in such instances...their two times avoiding the sweep were April 2 at Kansas City and May 17 vs. Milwaukee.

STARTER STUFF: Over their last 12 games, Twins starters have combined to post a 3.48 ERA (67.1 IP, 26 ER) with five home runs allowed, 27 walks, 55 strikeouts and a .202 opponent batting average...in those 12, they have allowed three runs-or-fewer in 10 of those games.

In those 12, Twins starters have received a run support average of 2.00...Twins have scored just one run for starters four times and zero runs five times.

B-A-N-A-N-A-S: The Savannah Bananas will play three games at Target Field this weekend...all three games will feature the Bananas vs. the Loco Beach Coconut as part of the highly-anticipated 2026 Banana Ball World Tour...the three-game series marks the Savannah Bananas' first-ever appearance in Minnesota, with Minneapolis among 71 cities chosen from a pool of more than 200 applicants to host a 2026 Banana Ball World Tour stop...Target Field is one of 11 Major League Baseball stadiums set to welcome the Bananas this year.
