In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (88), HR (32), RBI batting average (.305), slugging percentage (.583) and on-base percentage (.367)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 88-56, and are 27-7 when leading after the first inning...5 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first...3B Eugenio Suárez is hitting .329 in the first frame, leads the National League with 10 HR that inning while ranking T3rd with 20 RBI...1B Joey Votto is among NL first inning leaders in extra-base hits (14, 1st), doubles (8, T2nd), hits (31, 3rd) and batting average (.341, 10th)...in 2018, Reds batters produced 22 HR and 77 runs in the first inning.

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 4 (1-2) of a 4-game series vs Jared Burlevson's Braves...the Reds are coming off a 4-2 homestand that included a 2-1 series win vs the Rockies and a 2-1 series win vs the Pirates...Cin has won each of its last 3 series (also: 2-1 at Mil) and 8 of its last 14 games... following today's game, the Reds will return home to Great American Ball Park for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the Angels (2g) and Cubs 4g).

SERIES NOTES: The season series is tied 3-3 going into this afternoon's finale (2-1, 4/23-4/25 at GABP; 1-2, 8/1-8/4 at Att)...haven't lost a season series to the Braves since **2014** (2-5) and since then are **4-0-1** in **5 season** series and 18-15 in 33 games...the Reds went 2-1 in both of their previous series in Atlanta at SunTrust Park, including a 5-3 win on 8/18/17 in their inaugural game at the new park...from 1997-2016 Cin went 27-42 at Turner Field and didn't win a series there after 9/4-9/6, 2009 (0-3-4 in 7 series, 8-14 in 22 games)...in the final 2 exhibition games of 2019 spring training, the Braves earned 8-5 and 7-5 wins at SunTrust Park.

ANGELS UP NEXT: The upcoming series will be the Redlegs' sixth overall series vs LAA, the second of the season and their first meeting at Great American Ball Park since the 2013 season-opening series...the Reds are **4-10 all-time** vs the **Angels**, including **1-2** in **2002**, **0-3** in **2016** & **0-2** in **2019** in Anaheim and 1-2 in 2007 & 2-1 in 2013 at Great American Ball Park... in 2013 the Reds and Angels played the first interleague Opening Day game in Major League history, a 3-1 Angels win in 13 innings in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opening game (Cin pitchers 17, LAA pitchers 13).

- DEADLINE DEALS: The Reds on Wednesday made the following transactions:
   Acquired from the Cleveland Indians RHP Trevor Bauer as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds OF Yasiel Puig and LHP Scott Moss and from the San Diego Padres OF Franmil Reyes, LHP Logan Allen and IF Victor Nova...the Padres received from the Reds OF Taylor Trammell.
- Acquired from the Oakland Athletics minor league OF Jameson Hannah for RHP Tanner Roark.
- Acquired from the San Francisco Giants a player to be named for 2B Scooter Gennett and cash.
- The Reds also yesterday reinstated from the 10-day injured list RHP David Hernandez.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used 5 catchers this season, including Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol and Ryan Lavarnway...the 3 catchers on the club's Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) & Farmer (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for 8 days (7/18-7/25) until Barnhart came off the injured list prior to the game on 7/26...Barnhart and Farmer have returned to the active roster...on 7/26, Barnhart filled the roster spot vacated by Graterol, who went on the 7-day concussion list...Farmer was reinstated from the 7-day concusion list prior to last Sun's game...he relaced Lavarnway, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used 6 catchers in a season just 7 times in their history, most recently in 1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)...also used 6 catchers in 1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895...the 1909 Reds used a club-record 8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pauxtis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP Michael Lorenzen has appeared in 68 of the Reds' 109 games so far this season, including 45 times solely as a pitcher, twice as a pinch hitter/pitcher, once as a pitcher/LF/RF (7/22 at Mil), once as a pitcher/LF (6/2 vs Wsh), twice as a P/RF (including Fri at Atl), 3 times as a CF, 3 times as a LF, 7 times solely as a pinch runner, once as a pinch runner/CF (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a pinch runner/LF (5/9 at Oak) and once as a pinch runner/RF (5/24 at Chi) and once as a CF/P (7/17 at Chi)...9 times in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...Lorenzen this year became the first player in Reds history, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (382.1) to play center field since Hal Jeffcoat (474.1ip) in 1958...Ron Mahay was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...Mahay played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK & BLUE: Derek Dietrich has been hit by a pitch 22 times, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 & Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit by a pitch 6 times in the 4-game series at Mil from 6/20-6/23 and was hit by a pitch 4 times in the 3-game series at Chi from 7/15-7/17...he is the only player in modern Major League history to get hit by a pitch 6 times in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be hit by a pitch 3 times in a game, tying the Major League record accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 15 apps this season vs the Brewers, Dietrich has been hit by a pitch 8 times...he has been hit by a pitch 115 times in his career...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS ....: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman is in his 46th and final season calling Reds games fo 700 WLW Radio...ioined the Reds radio team in 1974 and for 31 seasons (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher Joe Nuxhall, tying LA's Vin Scully and Jerry **Doggett** for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining Scully (67 seasons, 1950-2016), **Ralph Kiner** of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's **Denny Matthews** (51, 1969-2019), Mil's **Bob Uecker** (49, 1971-2019), Jack Buck (48, 1954-2001) & Mike Shannon (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's **Jaime Jarrín** (47, 1973-2019)...in the top of the first inning in his first regular-season game as a Major League broadcaster on 4/4/74 at Riverfront Stadium, Brennaman provided the call when Hank Aaron belted his record-tying 714th home run...over 45 years later, both Aaron and Brennaman were in attendance for Friday's game between the Reds and Braves at SunTrust Park.

## Today's Pitcher - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

## **RED HOTS**

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...in his last 6 starts is 3-1, 2.33 with 5 quality starts...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings and 12 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season...was added to the National League All-Star roster to replace Wsh's Max Scherzer...was Gray's second All-Star selection...he was an American League All-Star in 2015 but did not pitch in the game at Cin's Great American Ball Park...he joined RHP Luis Castillo, selected by his peers, as the first pair of Reds starting pitchers named to the All-Star team since Johnny Cueto and Alfredo Simon in 2014...Gray did not pitch in the NL's 4-3 loss at Cle's Progressive Field, but Castillo threw a perfect fourth inning...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since...with the completion of the second inning on 7/17 at Cubs reached 1,000 career innings pitched...on 7/12 at Col, his strikeout of Charlie Blackmon to end the fifth inning was the 900th strikeout of his career.
