METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned home yesterday and defeated the Phillies, 2-0...The Mets are seeking their eighth series win of the season and their fifth series win at home...New York continues a six-game homestand (1-0) against Philadelphia (1-0) and Toronto (three games).

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization...A collection on the Mets Virtual Vault highlighting this year's Mets Hall of Fame 2023 inductees and Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award recipient is now live at metsheritage.com.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won six straight home games, the longest streak since winning nine consecutive from May 18-June 14, 2022...The Mets have played 22 games at Citi Field, the fewest home games in the majors this season...The team is 13-9 at Citi Field this year...The team won 54 games at home last year.

DOUBLE DARE: Francisco Lindor drove in his 40th run of the season last night...The Mets feature two players Lindor (40) and Pete Alonso (46) who have drove in 40 or more runs this season...New York joins the Texas Rangers (Marcus Semien and Adolis García) as one of two teams with two players with 40 or more RBI this season.

ESC KEY: Over his last 13 games, Eduardo Escobar is batting .444 (12-27) with three runs, one double, one home runs, five RBI, two waks with a steal, a .483 OBP and a .593 SLG...In 16 games this month, Escobar is slashing .394/.444/.606.

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high 13 straight contests, hitting 22 home runs in that span...It is the longest active streak in the majors...The Mets are 23-13 when hitting a home run this season and 9-7 when hitting multiple homers...In 2022, the Mets longest home run streak was nine games (September 9-17)...The team hit 14 home runs in that span...The last time the Mets had a longer streak was in 2019...From June 20-July 5 the Mets homered in 14 straight games, socking 24 dingers in that span...The 14-game homer streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga became the 10th rookie hurler in franchise history and the first since Steven Matz (August 14, 2016) to throw 7.0 or more innings and allow one or zero hits...He joined Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without issuing a walk...He has 70 strikeouts through his first 10 major league games, tied with Matt Harvey for the third-most by a Met...Only Dwight Gooden (80) and Nolan Ryan (74) have more in their first 10 career starts...The 70 strikeouts are the third-most by a Japanese-born player in a player's first 10 starts...Only Hideo Nomo (83) and Masahiro Tanaka (79) recorded more.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has hit 20 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 46 RBI are third in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 426 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in all 54 of the Mets games this year.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets take on the Phillies for the first time this season...The Mets have won seven of their last eight games against the Phillies at Citi Field.

IT'S GONNA BE MAY: Pete Alonso has socked 10 home runs in May, one shy of his career high for any month...Alonso recorded 11 in September of 2019...This is the fifth time Alonso has clubbed at least 10 homers in a single month, the most ever by a Met...Howard Johnson is second with three such months, while Carlos Beltran, Dave Kingman and Darryl Strawberry reached 10 homers in a month twice each...Courtesy Sportradar.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is batting .299 (23-77) with six doubles, seven home runs, five walks with a .357 OBP and a .649 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 22 games in May, Alvarez is batting .292 (21-72) with 11 runs, six doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI, six walks with a 1.029 OPS.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez has hit eight home runs this season...That puts him tied for the fourth-most by a rookie in the majors and third in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's nine career homers before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 10-8 against the division this year...They are 5-5 against the division at Citi Field in 2023...The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022.

IF YOU START ME OFF: The Mets are 14-0 this season when the starter goes at least 6.0 innings and 5-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 17-3 (.850) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 11-24 (.314) when their opponent scores first...Since the start of 2022, the Mets are 98-19 when scoring first...Their .838 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets are tied for the lead in the major leagues with a 86.4% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 15 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 329 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 25-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 120 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games...From October 1, 1990- September 2, 1992, the Mets also won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 18 errors in 55 games this year, the fewest errors in the majors...That gives the team a .991 fielding percentage...Their .991 fielding percentage also leads the major leagues.

COMMUNITY HERO: The Mets are recognizing staff from local non-profit organizations that have gone above and beyond to make a positive impact on our community...In honor of Mental Health Awareness Month, the Mets are highlighting Mental and Behavioral Health staff at the New York Foundling... The New York Foundling is one of New York's longest-serving non-profit human services organizations and believes that all individuals have the opportunity to reach their full potential...Today, their staff will be honored with tickets, gift bags, and a pregame ceremony before tonight's game.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 6.2 innings against the Cubs at Wrigley Field on May 25...Allowed one run on five hits and two walks while striking out four...Picked up his first win of the season and his first quality start since September 15, 2022 against the Pirates at Citi Field.

FIGHTIN' THE PHILS: Tonight, Carrasco will face Philadelphia for the fifth time in his career...In his last start against the Phillies on May 27, 2022, he earned the win after throwing 5.2 innings, during which he allowed five earned runs on six hits and one walk while striking out seven batters...Throughout his career, Carrasco has made four appearances (two starts) against Philadelphia, pitching to a 2-1 record with a 4.02 ERA (7 ER/15.2 IP)...Carrasco has only ever faced the Phillies while pitching at home.

HE'S GOT THE MONTH OF MAY: In 40 appearances and 33 starts in the month of May, Carrasco has pitched to an 19-8 record with a 4.22 ERA (103 ER/219.2 IP)...His .704 winning percentage in May is the best mark of any month during the season...In those appearances, Carrasco has thrown three complete games, including one shutout, and has tallied 205 strikeouts compared to 50 walks.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with .628...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA (3 ER/30.0 IP) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

MILESTONES & MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1466.2...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 287 and 240, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 16 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (4-2, 3.54)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 7.0 innings against the Rockies at Coors Field on May 26, during which he allowed one earned run on six hits...Had a season-high eight strikeouts in route to his fourth win of the season.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).
