TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners conclude a 2-city, 7-day, 7-game road trip tonight with the final (1-1) of three games at the Los Angeles Angels...began the road trip with four games at the Astros (1-3)...following this series, will return to T-Mobile Park for a 10-day, 10-game homestand against the Athletics (4 G), Angels (3 G) and Rockies (3 G)...tonight's game will be broadcast live on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...won yesterday and are 1-1 in this current 3-game series vs. the Angels...are playing their seventh (2-4) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season....are next scheduled to have an offday on Aug. 13.

- Young \& Old - third baseman Kyle Seager (32 years, 269 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners active roster...left-handed pitcher Nick Margevicius (24 years, 41 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners active roster.
-Rule 5 Looking Good - RHP Yohan Ramirez (5th pick) is one of 5 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft to break Summer Camp with the big league team...Ramirez pitched in 2 games at Houston, whom Seattle selected him from, throwing 3.0 scoreless innings and striking out 4 without allowing a hit.
- 2019 in Review - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the AL West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road. - 25 and under - 26 of the Mariners 53 hits this season have come from players 25-year or younger (Kyle Lewis-11, J.P. Crawford-7, Shed Long Jr.-4 \& Evan White-4).
LET'S GO STREAKING...Kyle Lewis has hit safely in each of the first 6 games of the season (.458/11x24, 5 R, 2 HR, 5 RBI, 3 BB ), including a multi-hit contest in last 4 straight games (.529/9x17, 3 R, 3 RBI, 2 BB )... his 6 -game hitting streak is tied with Michael Brantley-HOU, Nick Castellanos-CIN, Carlos Correa-HOU, Adam Eaton-WAS, Whit Merrifield-KC and Luis Robert-CWS for the longest in the Majors this season... Lewis leads the Majors in hits (11), while also ranking T1st in multi-hit games (4) and times on base (14), 3rd in average (.458), 5th in on-base percentage (.519), T5th in home runs (2) and total bases (17).
CALLING ALL ANGELS...Marco Gonzales is $3-0$ with a 3.12 ERA ( 12 ER, 34.2 IP) in 6 starts vs. the Angels at Angel Stadium....he has allowed 3 earned runs or fewer in each of his 6 starts, limiting Angels batters to a $.227(29 \times 128)$ average with 11 walks and 31 strikeouts.
SCORE!...the Mariners have allowed at least 6 runs in each of the first 6 games of the season... are the 8 th team in baseball history to allow 6-or-more runs in each of their first 6 games of a season and first since the White Sox (7 games) and Reds (6 games) each did so in 1995...marks the longest streak to start a season in club history (previous: 5 in 1998) and T4th-longest (also: Cincinnati-1995, San Diego-1974, Baltimore-1955 and St. Loius-1936) season-opening streak in the Modern Era (since 1900), trailing Chicago-NL (9 G in 1901), Chicago-AL (7 G in 1995) and Boston ( 7 G in 1901)...lead the Majors in runs allowed this season with 46, ahead of Boston (36), Chicago-AL (36) and Detroit (34).
KYLE'S CLOSING IN...Kyle Seager scored his 600th run in his career last night vs. the Angels...he becomes only the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner, joining Edgar Martinez (1,219), Ichiro Suzuki (1,181), Ken Griffey Jr. (1,113), Jay Buhner (790) and Alex Rodriguez (627).
-Enters tonight's game with 199 career home runs... with his next homer, will become one of four
Mariners in club history to reach 200 career home runs (Griffey Jr., 417; Martinez, 309; Buhner, 307).
- Enters tonight's game with 1,226 career hits, 29 shy of tying Jay Buhner $(1,255)$ for 4th in club history. WHAT A RELIEF...Bryan Shaw picked up his 31st career win last night vs. the Angels, including his 29th win dating back to 2013...since 2013, Shaw's 29 wins are T6th-most in the Major League among acitve relievers (also: Tyler Clippard, Wade Davis, Joe Smith and Craig Stammen), trailing only David Robertson (37), Brad Brach (34), Tony Watson (32), Andrew Millers (30) and Justin Wilson (30).

SAVE ME...Dan Altavilla allowed 1 hit and struck out 1 in a scoreless 9th inning to earn his first career Major League save last night vs. the Angels...the save came in his 97 th career appearance...dating back to Sept. 15, 2019, Altavilla is $2-0$ with 1 save over his last 7 relief appearances with the Mariners...during this stretch he has allowed only 2 hits while striking out 7 and walking 0 in 7.0 scoreless innings...over his last 9 road appearance, dating back to June 27, 2019, Altavilla has tossed 8.2 scoreless innings ( $4 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{BB}, 11 \mathrm{~K}$ ). YOUTH MOVEMENT ...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.
HOME SWEET HOME...the Mariners 2020 home opener, presented by T-Mobile, against the Oakland Athletics is Friday, July 31 at 6:40 pm at T-Mobile Park...the game will be broadcast on ROOT SPORTS NW, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network...while there won't be fans at the ballpark, there will still be an Opening Day pregame ceremony featuring many of the elements that have become a Mariners tradition, whether they are previously videotaped or live at T-Mobile Park...the pregame ceremony will begin at 6:00 pm and will be carried live on ROOT SPORTS NW...the program begins with a special performance by Seattle-based singer-songwriter Ben Gibbard, lead vocalist for Death Cab for Cutie and the Postal Service...the National Anthem will be performed by Madisen Hallberg, a Portland State University senior, and Emmanuel Henreid, a Portland-based opera singer...6-year old Lily of Snohomish will complete the ceremonial First Run Around the Bases...delivery of the game ball will get an assist from health care workers who sent in video of themselves passing a ball on and off screen...Washington Governor Jay Inslee will be on the mound at T-Mobile Park to throw out the ceremonial first pitch live.
AS YOU KNOW...Kyle Seager currently ranks T8th in the Majors and T4th in the American League with 6 RBI this season...BUT, DID YOU KNOW?...dating back to July 28, 2019, Seager currently ranks 6th in the Majors with 49 RBI?...he trails only Nelson Cruz-MIN (59), Anthony Rendon-WAS/LAA (55), Alex BregmanHOU (54), Jose Abreu-CWS (53) and Matt Olson-OAK (52), while ranking ahead of Aristides Aquino-CIN (48), J.D. Martinez-BOS (48), Kyle Schwarber-CHI (48), Jorge Soler-KC (48) and Corey Seager-LAD (47).

- 28 -year-old left-hander is making his second start of the season, 87th career appearance (79th career start) and his 13th career appearance (13th career start) vs. Los Angeles-AL, tonight at Angel Stadium.
- Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21, 2017.
- Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 years (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 9th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University ..became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program
- Made his MLB debut with Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado. Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA ( 3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and
2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason earned 2 wins 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Ro-driguez-LAA, 2002).
