TODAY'S GAMES: Are games 5 and 6 (3-1) of an 8-game road trip to Cincinnati (2-1) and Chicago-NL (1-0).....following this trip, the Brewers return to American Family Field for 7 games against San Francisco (3g) and Arizona (4g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE STANDINGS (154 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 40*, SECOND: 57, THIRD: 43, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently in first place, leading the Cubs by 9.0 games (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The team is 26-12-2 in series play. Game 1: 27-14, Game 2: 26-14, Game 3: 23-16, Game 4: 3-1 Sweeps (10): vs. BOS (3g, 5/26-5/28), at PHI (3g, 5/30-6/1), at MIN (3g, 6/20-6/22), vs. LAD (3g, 7/7-7/9), vs. WSH (3g, 7/11-7/13), at LAD (3g, 7/18-7/20), at WSH (3g, 8/1-8/3), at ATL (3g, 8/4-8/6), vs. NYM (3g, 8/8-8/10),

vs. PIT (3g, 8/11-8/13)......Were Swept [1]: at NYY (3g, 3/27-3/30)

AT HOME: The team is a Major League-best 42-20 at home, going 15-5-0 in series play.....are 30-11 in the last 41 games, 19-4 in the last 23 and 9-1 in the last 10 contests with a season-high-tying 6-game winning streak.....also had a 6-game winning streak from 7/7-7/13.

ON THE ROAD: The team is a Major League-best 37-25 on the road, going 11-7-2 in series play.....are 27-7 in the last 34 games and 15-2 in the last 17 contests.....had a franchise-record-tying 9-game winning streak snapped Sunday at Cincinnati.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 21 replay challenges this season, going 14-7.....their last challenge (won) came on 8/15 at Cincinnati as an out call at first base involving Brandon Lockridge was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24).....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 745 wins since 2017 (4th in MLB/2nd in National League).

PATRICK AT A GLANCE: Chad Patrick, 26, will be making his 20th appearance and 19th start of the season.....he last pitched for the Brewers in a start on 7/5 at Miami and had no decision in a 4-2 loss (5ip, 4h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 2k, 1hr, 72 pitches).....the team is 6-12 in his starts.....he has 5 quality starts.....opponents are batting .256 (93-for-363, 10hr).....he was on the Opening Day roster and made his MLB debut on 3/29 at Yankee Stadium, pitching in relief.....Patrick was acquired from Oakland on 11/15/23 for INF Abraham Toro.

PATRICK STAR: The Hebron, Indiana native was supported by 300+ guests for his first Major League start on 4/1 vs. Kansas City, including his parents, coaches, family friends and high school friends.....many of them returned to see his first Major League win on 4/6 vs. Cincinnati.

AT NASHVILLE: Patrick was optioned to Triple-A Nashville on July 6 and went 1-3 with a 4.68 ERA in 6 starts (32.2ip, 29h, 20r, 17er, 14bb, 33k, 7hr).....he last pitched for the Sounds last Tuesday at Durham and earned a 5-4 win (6ip, 6h, 4r, 4er, 1bb, 8k, 4hr, 96 pitches).

LAST SEASON: Patrick went 14-1 with a 2.90 ERA in 26 games/24 starts last season at Triple-A Nashville to earn International League Pitcher of the Year honors.....the 2024 International League All-Star led the league in wins, ERA, strikeouts (145) and WHIP (1.09) while ranking second in opponent batting average (.215)....he was added to the 40-man roster on Nov. 19.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Patrick has gone 24-17 with a 4.12 ERA in 74 games/66 starts while pitching in the Arizona (2021-23), Oakland (2023) and Milwaukee (2024-25) organizations.....he has produced 367 strikeouts in 345.0 innings pitched.....Patrick was selected by Arizona in the fourth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft.....he was traded by Arizona to Oakland on 7/31/23 in exchange for INF Jace Peterson, who is now a consultant to the Brewers' performance psychology department.

AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 2-4 with a 3.05 ERA in 11 starts (59ip, 20er)......ON THE ROAD: Is 1-3 with a 4.29 ERA in 8 games/7 starts (35.2ip, 17er).

vs. CUBS: Patrick took a 5-3 loss in his first start against the Cubs on 6/17 at Wrigley Field (5ip, 6h, 4r, 4er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 1hbp).

WODDRUFF AT A GLANCE: Brandon Woodruff, 32, makes his eighth start of the season and first against the Cubs.....he last started last Wednesday vs. Pittsburgh and had no decision in a 12-5 win (4ip, 4h, 0r, 2bb, 4k, 65 pitches).....the team is 7-0 in his starts.....he has 5 quality starts.....opponents are batting .152 (21-for-138, 7hr).....he missed the 2024 season as he recovered from right shoulder surgery.....he is 19-3 with a 2.30 ERA in his last 39 starts dating back to May 2022 (231ip, 154h, 62r, 59er, 55bb, 276k).....he was selected in the 11th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Mississippi State University.....he is signed through the 2025 season with a mutual option for 2026.

SORRY I'M LATE: Woodruff's return to a Major League mound was delayed twice while on rehab assignment.....the team returned Woodruff from rehab assignment at Triple-A Nashville on May 12 due to right ankle tendinitis and again on June 5 due to a right elbow contusion suffered in a start on 6/3 vs. Gwinnett (struck by line drive).

SIMPLY THE BEST: Woodruff is the all-time franchise leader with a 3.04 ERA [min. 500ip].....his 837 strikeouts rank seventh in franchise history.....Corbin Burnes ranks sixth [870].....at 50-26, his .658 career winning percentage ranks first franchise history [min. 50 decisions].

CAREER: Has gone 50-26 with a 3.04 ERA in 137 games/122 starts (719.2ip, 243er).....is in his ninth Major League season, all with the Brewers (2017-25).....was a 2019 and 2021 All-Star.....underwent surgery on 10/13/23 to repair the anterior capsule in his right shoulder, performed by Dr. Keith Meister.....missed the entire 2024 season.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 27-9 with a 2.79 ERA in 69 games/62 starts (370.2ip, 115er)....is 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA in 4 starts this season (21.1ip, 6er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 23-17 with a 3.30 ERA in 68 games/60 starts (349ip, 128er).....is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA in 3 starts this season (18ip, 3er).
